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
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

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BY-LAWS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RALEIGH

No. 613.-A BY-LAW

1895

To amend By-law No. 557, intituled "A By-law respecting Statute Labor

BE IT ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent.

1. That the said By-law No 557, respecting Statute Labor, be amended by substituting the words "One dollar per day" in place of the words "Fifty cents per day" where they occur in the first clause thereof. Also by adding at the end of said clause the words "All persons liable for Statute Labor, other than those assessed for property, may commute for fifty cents per day, provided they pay in the manner and time as stated above."

2. That clause 2 be amended so as to read, after the word "hereafter" in the third line thereof, where the property is assessed \$200; and under and under two days, over \$200 up to \$1000; three days and one day additional for each \$1000 or fraction thereof. Also to read after the word "provided" in the tenth line, "All persons shall be compelled to perform Statute Labor in the division in which their property lies."

3. No refund for Statute Labor performed after the 1st day of September in each year will be given to any ratepayer, nor any receipt from the Overseer entertained.

No. 614-A BY-LAW

To amend By-law No. 612, intituled a By-law to appropriate certain sums of money.

BE IT ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh as follows:

1. That the sixth clause of the said By-law No 612 be repealed and the following substituted therefore.

6. That Charles Crow be, and he is hereby appointed Commissioner to superintend the Pike Pumping Work, and that the said Commissioner report to the Council all contracts or jobs sold by him, who will issue orders on the Treasurer for the same when passed by the Council.

No. 615-A BY-LAW

To raise the sum of \$10,000, to aid in the construction of tile, stone and timber drains.

1. That the Reeve of the said Township may, from time to time, subject to the provisions of this By-law, borrow on the credit of the corporation of the said municipality such sums of money, not exceeding in the whole, ten thousand dollars, as may be decided by the said Council, and may in manner horeinafter provided, issue debentures of the said ('orporation in sums of one hundred dollars each for the amount so borrowed; the said debentures to have coupons attached as provided in Section 5, of the said Act.

2. That when the Council shall be of opinion that the application of any person or persons who may be assessed as owner of land in the said municipality, to borrow money for the purpose of constructing tile, stone or timber drains should be granted in whole or in part, then the said Council may, 'y resolution, instruct the said Reeve to issue debentures as aforesaid, and borrow such sum of money as does not exceed the amount applied for, and may loan the same to the said applicant on the completion of said drainage works.

3. A special annual rate shall be imposed, levied and collected, over and above all other rates, upon the land in respect of which the said money shall be borrowed, sufficient for the payment of the interest and sinking fund, as provided in the said Act.

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No. 616-A BY-LAW

To provide for the maintenance, repairing and otherwise improving certain

portions of "The Pike Drainage Works," and works connected therewith, in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$633.14 for completing the same.

As amended by By-law No. 618,

Provisionally adopted the 19th day of March, A.D. 1894.

WHEREAS The Pike Drainage Works were originally constructed in or about the year A. D. 1892, under the provisions of the Municipal Acts then in force, for the reclamation of marsh lands by embankment and pumping.

And Whereas the said works as subsequently improved, have been since and are now in operation.

And Whereas it has been represented to this Council that the efficiency of the said works would be greatly increased and the expense of pumping reduced by deepening and otherwise improving the flood gate which prole, stone and

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tain erefor for vides an outlet to the River Thames, and by raising the River Road across Lot No One so as to form a higher embankment to prevent the overflow of water from the River Thames.

And Whereas thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P.L.S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality, and of the said flood-gate and other proposed works, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be tenefitted by such proposed work, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which in his opinion will be derived in consequence of such proposed work, by every lot or portion of lot; the said assessment so made being the assessment hereinafter by this Bylaw enacted to be assessed and levied upon the lots and parts of lots hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, and the report of the said W. G. McGeorge in respect thereof, and of the said proposed work being as follows :

Chatham, 7th March, 1894.

To the Reeve, Deputy Reeves and Municipal Council of Raleigh :

GENTLEMEN,—Having received from your Honorable Body a resolution based on the petitition of P. D. McKellar and others regarding improvements in the Pike Drainage Works.

1st. The lowering of the flood-gates or the construction of a new one alongside the present one.

2nd. The raising of the roadway near the river at Lot Number One.

I beg to report thereon as follows: In regard to the flood-gates, I recommend that they be lowered fifteen inches lower than at present. The work to be as follows: The present flooring and brick-work and concrete to be removed and the space underneath the flooring to be excavated a sufficient depth to relay the flooring, concrete and brick-work in such a way as to bring its surface height to an elevation of fifteen inches below its present height. The apron and walings at the front of the flooring to be removed and the sheet piling at the front to be driven down to a level with the flooring, and the waling to be re-attached at this elevation, also the apron replaced at the lower elevation and secured as formerly. Then the gates to be lowered to suit and to be swivelled as at present, and lifting chains lengthened to suit. The work to be done according to attached specifications.

Again, I recommend that in connection with the work on the floodgates, the Railway Drain leading to the flood-gates be deepened to the level of the new flooring, and to a bottom width of 20 feet from the gates to the middle of the run at the railway culvert, on Lot One, and a branch be made with the same bottom elevation and a bottom width of ten feet to the deep water under the culvert, on lot one, and a branch be made with the same bottom elevation and a bottom width of ten feet to the deep water under the culvert, on lot one, and a branch be made with the same bottom elevation and a bottom width of ten feet to the deep water under the culvert. This is merely a short branch to give the water a clean flow from the railway culvert. Then that the drain along the south side of the railway be deepened with the same bottom elevation and a bottom width of 12 feet onward from the railway, convert to the line of Lots 1 and 2. The whole, with side slopes, I to I and berm of 4 feet. This work is chiefly removing bars and accumulations to give a free flow to the water from the north side of the railway and to the water from the plains to the south at seasons of low water in the cut outside of the flood-gates and will very materially lower the expense of pumping.

I find the River road at Lot One in a very bad state, both for public travel and for a preventative to inflow of water from the river in time of flood, and I recommend that the allowance be widened to a width of fifty feet, and that the road be raised with a top width of 20 feet to the elevations shown on the profile hereto attached, the material to be taken from the north side of the road and the excavation to be graduated along the bottom so as to drain freely westward to the dredge, cut berm, 2 feet slope of bank 1 to 1:

In my opinion the widening of the road is rendered necessary from the exigencies of public travel and convenience and that the cost of this would be a proper charge against the municipality. The rest is for the purpose of reducing the cost of pumping, and I consider it should be assessed against all lands whose waters are disposed of in that way. I therefore assess the cost against all the lands that will be benefitted. I recommend that the work of lowering the flooring of the flood gate and other work in and about it be done by day's work under reliable supervision, say of the Commissioner of the Pike works, as until the old floor is torn up and the foundation expected it is impossible to tell more than in a general way all that will be required. References in the specifications are to the original plan of the flood gate. Owing to the depth of water over the lands, I could not stake out the work of the Railway Drain, but backwater level will enable the work to be done just as well. I have the honor to be, gentlemen,

SPECIFICATIONS.—The work will consist of the removal of the old flooring and the lowering of the bottom to such a depth underneath as will on the replacing of the new flooring leave the surface fifteen inches lower than at present. The removal of the waling from the sheet piling at the flood gate openings and of the apron in front, and the driving down of said sheet I to I and alations to a and to a the cut expense of

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pling to a further depth of fifteen inches, and the relaying of the waling and apron at the lower relative depth, securing the same as formerly, and the lowering of the gates to correspond, and the planking up of the front above the gates, to prevent inflow at high flood. The flooring shall be related at the lower depth in the same way as formerly, with brick, stone and gravel, well cleaned, and with Akron cement mortar, freshly mixed, with one part cement to two parts clean, sharp sand, by measure, thoroughly mixed dry and water added till the proper consistency is attained ; no mortar to be used after standing two hours.

If it be found on exposing the foundation that the work specified in the foregoing can be still further lowered to a further depth of three inches, the Commissioner to be at liberty to have this done.

The general construction of the flood gates is shown on the general plan, and the posts, side walls and parts other than those specified, will remain undisturbed, the chains for lifting the gates only being lengthened to suit. W. G. McGEORGE

And Whereas, the said Council are of opinion that the work to reported on by the Engineer is necessary and desirable.

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, pursuant to the provisions of "The Consolidated Municipal Act, 1892, and amendments thereto.

1. That the said report, plans and estimates be adopted, and the said drain and the works connected therewith be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2. That the Reeve of the said Township may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, the sum of six hundred and thirty-three dollars and fourteen cents, being the funds necessary for the work not hereinafter otherwise provided for, and may issue Debentures of the Corporation for that amount and interest, in sums of not less than one hundred dollars each, payable within five years from the date thereof, with interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum, that is to say, in five consecutive annual payments, to be of such amount that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year shall be equal as nearly as may be to the amount payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of such period of five years, such Debentures to be made payable at the Branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, in the Town of Chatham.

3. That for the purpose of paying the sum of six hundred and thirtythree 14-100 dollars, being the amount charged against the said lands so to be benefitted as aforesaid, other than roads belonging to the municipality, and to cover interest thereon for five years at the rate of five per centum per annum, the following special rates, over and above all other rates, shall be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied), upon the undermentioned lots and parts of lots, and the amount of the said special rates and in interest assessed as aforesaid against each lot or part of lot respectively shall be divided into five equal parts and one such part shall be assessed and levied as aforesaid in each year for five years

after the final passing of this By-law during which the said Debentures have to run.

4. That the sum of two hundred and seventy-eight 86/100 dollars, being the total amount assessed as aforesaid against the said mads of the said municipality, shall be paid by the Treasurer of this Corporation out of the general funds of the municipality.

5. That Albert H. White be and is hereby appointed Commissioner to let the contract or contracts for the repair of the said drain and works connected therewith (not exceeding the estimate), but every such contractor with one good and sufficient surety, shall be required forthwith to enter into bonds for the due performance and completion of such contract according to said plans and specifications, and within the time mentioned in such bond (unless other wise ordered by the Council); and it shall be the duty of the said Commissioner to cause the said works to be made and completed in accordance with such plans and specifications, and to grant orders on the Treasurer to each contractor, less twenty per cent. of the amount due, until the contract is fully completed and duly accepted by a competent Engineer.

6. That this By-law shall be published as provided in Sec. 571, ss. 2, of the Co. Mun. Act, three weeks previous to the final passing thereof, and may be cited and referred to as "The Pike Drainage Repair By law, No. 3," and shall take effect on and after the final passing thereof.

To amend By-law No. 616, which see as amended.

No. 619-A BY-LAW

For the appointment of an Inspector under the Tile, Stone and Timber Drainage Act.

THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, enacts as follows :---

1. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 15, of "The Tile, Stone and Timber Drainage Act," Milton Backus, of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent is hereby appointed Inspector for this Municipality to carry out the provisions of the said Act.

2. The said Inspector shall be paid at the rate of the Two Dollars per day and Ten Cents per mile one way, for services rendered under the said Act.

3. The clerk shall be paid one and one-half per centum on all debentures issued under this Act. One per cent. thereof to be paid on completion of the work, and one-half per cent. on all sums as placed on the Collector's Roll.

4. This By-law shall take effect from and after the final passing thereof.

Imposing a special drainage rate upon the west 4-5 of lot numbered Seven, in the Front Range of the Township of Raleigh

WHEREAS, Albert Williams, the owner of the west 4.5 of lot numbered Seven, in the Front Range of this Township, applied under the provitions of the Act respecting Tile, Stone, Timber Drainage Debentures, for a loan to be made to him for the purpose of draining the said land.

And whereas, the Municipal Council has, upon his said application, loaned the said Albert M. Williams, the sum of Two Hundred Dollars, to be repaid with interest by means of the rate hereinafter imposed.

Be it therefore enacted, by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, that an annual rate of fourteen dollars and seventytwo cents per annum is hereby imposed upon the said fand, for a period of twenty years, such rate to be levied and collected at the same time and manner as ordinary taxes are levied and collected.

Imposing a Special Drainage Rate upon the west half of the west half of lot No. Ten, in the Front Range of the Township of Raleigh.

WHEREAS, George W. Brown, the owner of the west half of the west half of lot numbered Ten, in the Front Range of this Township, applied under the provisions of the Act respecting Tile, Stone and Timber Drainage Debentures, for a loan to be made to him for the purpose of draining the said land.

And whereas, the Municipal Council has, upon his said application, loaned the said George W. Brown, the sum of three hundred dollars, to be repaid with interest by means of the rate hereinafter imposed.

Be it therefore enacted, by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, that an annual rate of twenty-two dollars and eight cents per annum is hereby imposed upon the said land for a period of twenty years, such rate to be levied and collected at the same time and manner as ordinary taxes are levied and collected.

No. 622-A BY-LAW

To amend By law No. 3871 known as "The Pike Drainage Works By-law.' WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Consolidated Municipal Act,' 1899, Municipal Councils may pass By-laws to amend By-laws which may have been passed for the construction and maintenance of drainage works, and which may have been acted upon in whole or in part, and which do

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not provide sufficient means for the completion of the work or redemption of the debentures authorized to be issued thereunder.

And whereas, the pumping account of the said Pike Drainage Works is now overdrawn to the extent of at least four hundred dollars, as shown by the report of the Treasurer.

And whereas, it is necessary to provide for the said amount zo overdrawn.

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh.

1. That there shall be raised, levied and collected upon and from all the lands and roads assessed for the said Pike Drainage Works, the said sum of four hundred dollars, by a rate pro rate on all the lands and roads so assessed therefore, sufficient to discharge the said sum, and in addition to the annual rate authorized by the said By-law No. 3871 for the redemption of the Debentures and maintenance of the said works in the year 1894.

No. 623-A BY-LAW

(Seal.)

As amended by By-law No. 625

To assess and levy rates for County, Township and School purposes for the year 1894.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent.

1. That the following sums shall be levied and collected upon and from all the ratable property of the Township of Raleigh in the year of our Lord 1894.

(1) The sum of \$5,048.86 for the general purposes of the County of Kent by a rate of 2 1/10 mills in the dollar.

(2) The sum of \$6,800 for the general purposes of the Township of Raleigh, as per Schedule "A" hereunto annexed, by a rate of 2 8/10 mills on the dollar.

(3) The sum of one thousand nine hundred and ninety-one 50/100 dollars, being an amount equal to the Legislative school grant of \$469 and \$1,522.50, the amount required to be raised for each school section by general rate as provided in Section 109 of "The Public Schools Act, 1891," exclusive of the property of certain supporters of Separate schools, by a rate of 91/100 of a mill on the dollar.

2. That the Clerk of this Corporation is hereby required to levy a special rate (over and above all other rates) upon, and which shall be collected from all the ratable property included in each and every School Section the Trustees of which shall furnish him, on or before the 24th day of August, with a written statement signed by the Secretary-Treasurer, and

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certified by the seal thereof, of the amount required for Public or Separate School purposes in each School Section (less the amount required to be raised as aforesaid by general rate), such a rate pro rata as will amount to the sum so required, as near as may be; and the Treasurer of this Corporation is hereby authorized and instructed to pay to the order of the Secretary-Treasurer or Trustees of each School Section all moneys so levied and credited to such School Section.

3. That the rates so imposed by this by-law shall be collected by the Collector of rates for the said Township of Raleigh, and paid over to the Treasurer of this Corporation, in bankable funds, on or before the fourteenth day of December, A.D. 1894, in so far as the law will enable him so to do, unless otherwise ordered by this Council.

4. That John Johnston be and he is hereby appointed Collector of rates for the said Township of Raleigh during the current year and until the said rates are all collected and a due return made to the Treasurer of this Corporation, (the amount so collected to be paid at least every two weeks), conditionally upon his furnishing bonds duly executed by himself, and good and sufficient sureties, to be approved by this Council, in the sum of twenty thousand dollars. And for the due performance of these and all duties of Collector, as provided by the Statutes of Ontario and the Bylaws of this Municipality, he shall be paid the sum of one hundred dollars, inclusive of all duties that do, or may pertain thereto.

No. 624-A BY-LAW

To provide for the construction of "The Burns, Drain," in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the municipality, the sum of \$2947.35 for completing the same.

Provisionally adopted the Thirtieth day of July, 1894. WHEREAS, the majority in number of the resident and non-resident owners (exclusive of farmers sons not actual owners), as shown by the last revised assessment roll, of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefitted by drainage work, have petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh, praying that the area of land within the said Township, and being described as follows: that is to say, the west half of lot 145, lots 146 and 147, and the east three-quarters of lot 148, all in the Talbot Road Range in the said Township, may be drained by means of a drain commencing at the rear of said lots, thence southerly to Lake Erie.

And whereas, thereupon, the said Council has procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said area proposed to be drained and the means suggested for the drainage thereof, and of other lands and roads liable to assessment under the said Act, and has also procured plans, specifications and estimates of the drainage work to be made by the said W. G. Mc-George, and an assessment to be made by him of the lands and roads to be benefitted by such drainage work, and of other lands and roads liable for contribution thereto stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit, outlet liability and injuring liability which, in his opinion, will be derived or incurred in consequence of such drainage work, by every road or lot or portion of lot; the said assessment so made, being the assessment herein-. after by this By law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the roads and lots or parts of lots, hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, and the report of the said W. G. McGeorge in respect thereof, and of the said drainage work being as follows :

Chatham, June 30th, 1894.

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GENTLEMEN,—I beg to report to your Honorable Body that I have made an examination and survey of the proposed Burns Drain in the Township of Raleigh, as petitioned for by Thomas Moore and others.

I submit a plan with this report and a profile of the ground in the course of the proposed drain, with date for its construction if deemed desirable.

The lots described in the petition and the roads along which the drain runs are among the most difficult to drain in the Township, as a large portion of them are in a swampy depression in which the water settles, and from which it cannot be removed without expensive excavation, either, southward to Lake Erie, or northward to Government Drain No. One, which would have to be made very deep to provide an outfall. I have laid out the work to begin at the southerly side of the road in rear of the Talbot Road lots as travelled, and in the range of the line between the east half and the west half of Lot 145, and will thence run south-westerly along the southerly side of the wagon-way of said road, to the road in the middle of Lot 147, then southeasterly, along the easterly side of the wagon-way of this road to Station 65 of my survey, then southwesterly along the line of stakes of my survey to the line of lots 147 and 148, then southeasterly on this line, taking half the drain on each side to Station 100, near Lake Erie, where there is already a sufficient drain. The owners of west half 147 and east half 148 have arranged to give, without charge, the lands, &c., for the work.

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Where the drain runs on a road, the excavated earth will be cast three feet clear of the drain, and spread evenly on the road to a width of eighteen feet. On the rest of the drain it will be cast on each side three feet clear of the drain

I have given the bottom of the drain a fall of one inch in twelve rods, and even this small fall has the effect of making the drain very deep in the low lands towards the centre of lot 147. Without this it will not work at the rear of the lots, and besides it would be useless for the drainage of west half of lot 145 and lot 146 if the drain were made shallow there and had less fall. As these lands are at the present time they seem to be of very little use even for pasture, I mean those in the depression before mentioned, and indeed there is only a little of the front of each lot now fit for cultivation. The advantages of draining south would be permanency of work and relief from liability for outlet tax a d injuring liability tax, which would come against these lands on improving the Raleigh Plains Drain and Government Drain No. One from time to time.

My estimate of the cost of the work is as follows:

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I cannot recommend the use of title in the deep cut, say from Station 77 to 99 as using 18-inch tile, I make the cost of this part some \$300 more than for the open drain, and the open drain will be the best, as the fall is sure to improve in time from erosion of the bottom of the drain.

I assess the cost of the work against the lands and roads benefitted in the schedule hereto annexed. The drain when completed to be kept in repair and maintained at the cost of the lands and roads assessed for its construction, said lands and roads paying in the same relative proportion as for construction.

G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the lands and roads to be benefitted by the said repairs or other improvements, and of other lands or roads liable for contribution thereto, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit, outlet, liability and injuring liability which, in his opinion, will be derived or incurred in consequence of such drainage work, by every road and lot or portion of lot; the said assessment so made being the assessment hereinafter by this by law enacted, to be assessed and levied upon the roads and lots and parts of lots, hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, and the report of the said W. G McGeorge, in respect thereof, and of the said drainage work being as follows:

TO THE REEVE AND MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RALEIGH :

Gentlemen,-Having made, under instructions from your honorable body, an examination and survey of the Backus Drain with a view to its being repaired to its original depth and capacity. I beg to report that I have made such examination and survey, and I recommend that work be done in said drain from the line between lots 19 and 20, in the Fifth Concession, to a point near the River Road at station 130 at the line of lots 15 and 16 of the Front Concession, and in the branch on lot 19 aforesaid, from the main drain to the Grand Trunk Railway, to the depths given on the profile accompanying this my report, and to a bottom width of three feet; the side slopes to be 1 to 1, excepting that where the sides are well sodded the slope given need not be adhered to, removing only such parts as are liable to fall into the drain, leaving it to the commissioner in charge of the work to decide as to the work to be done in the side slopes of the drain. The excavated earth will be placed three feet clear of the drain and to be spread evenly to admit of easy cultivation. Where the land on one side of the drain is seeded, the earth to be placed on the other side, unless by consent of the owner. The drain requires the repair to perfect the drainage and to provide proper outfall for underdrains made.

No. 630.—A BY-LAW

Respecting Statute Labor.

BE IT ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh.

1. Every male inhabitant of the municipality of the age of twenty-one years and under sixty years, who is not assessed for taxable property and not exempt by law, shall perform two days of Statute Labor on the Public Highways, but may commute for the same on payment of One Dollar to the Overseer within three days from the time he was notified to perform Statute Labor, and in case of neglect or refusal to perform the said Statute Labor or pay the commutation money as herein provided, it shall be the duty of the Overseer to lay a complaint before a Justice of the Peace, as provided in Clause 12 of this By-law. And such labor shall not be returned by the Overseer as undone to the Clerk, except in case of removal or absence from the division, or for other good and sufficient reasons to be clearly stated in his report. And no person shall be exempt from the tax in this Clause mentioned unless he produces a certificate of his having performed Statute Labor or paid the tax elsewhere.

2. All persons assessed for taxable property shall perform Statute Labor on the public highways, and in the respective Statute 1 abor Divisions in which their property is situated as follows: For property assessed at \$200 and under, two days; over \$200 up to and inclusive of \$500, two and one-half days, and for each \$500 or part thereof above the first \$500, one-half day additional; but the said labor may be commuted at One Dollar for each day's labor, or a proportionate sum for any part of a day's labor, if tendered in money to the Overseer within three days from the time he was notified to perform Statute Labor; and in case the work is not performed or the money tendered as aforesaid, the Overseer shall return the said labor to the Clerk as unperformed, and the Clerk shall place the same on the Col-

lector's Roll at the rate of one dollar per day. Provided that no person shall be required to perform a greater amount of Statute Labor in the aggregate, by reason of his property being divided into several parcels, or situated in different Statute Labor Divisions, than he would be required to perform according to the above scale were his land all in one parcel; and the Assessor and Clerk shall see that such labor is distributed equitably according to the assessed value of each parcel as nearly as may be. Provided that village lots or other small parcels asso sed to any person jointly with other lands, the assessment of which would not increase the aggregate of his Statute Labor, shall be exempt.

3 It shall be the duty of Overseers, after having received notice of their appointment, to make the declaration of office, at or before the time named in such notice, before the Reeve, Deputy-Reeves, Clerk, or any Justice of the Peace, and shall deposit the same with the Clerk of the Municipality, from whom he shall receive the names of all persons appearing by the Assessment Roll as liable to perform Statute Labor, and shall add thereto the names of all persons liabl + under the first clause of this By-law; and shall give to all persons resident in the division, and liable to perform Statute Labor, at least three days notice, stating the time and place at which they will be required to work and what implements will be required. Provided that no person shall be required to furnish implements not in their possession.

4. It shall be the duty of the Overseers to superintend, make and keep in good repair, the highways, ditches and sidewalks within their, divisions, and expend faithfully to the best of their ability, all moneys received by thein in lieu of Statute Labor, as directed in the Ninth Clause hereof; to cause sufficient guards to be erected at all dangerous places, and to see that all work of ditching or grading is completed before the first day of August in each year; to prevent any person from ditching or grading after the said date. But if for any unforeseen or unavoidable reason the work cannot be performed before the said first day of August, the Overseer may, with the consent of the Commissioner, allow the work to be performed afterwards, but no Overse r shall allow work to be performed under any circumstances, later than the first day of September, and no certificate from an Overseer will. be entertained or allowance made for work so performed except so authorized under Clause 5 hereof. Provided that all persons whose lands abut on Sidelines or Townlines shall, to the extent of at least one hundred acres in each complete lot, perform their statute labor on such Sidelines or Townlines, unless otherwise ordered by the Council.

5. It shall be the duty of the Overseers, in case of any serious damage to bridge or embankment, or in case of impediment by snow or other cause, to call out the ratepayers of their division to repair such damage or remove such impediment to the extent of their statute labor for the ensuing year, and the Overseer's certificate shall be sufficient to exempt all such persons from the amount of Statute Labor so performed, and in case the amount of Statute Labor at the disposal of the Overseer is not sufficient for such purpose, then, the Overseer shall immediately report to the Commissioner of

6. It shall be the duty of the Overseers to make a correct return to the Clerk of the Municipality not later than the first day of September in each year, of all Statute Labor performed and unperformed. Also, an account of r moneys received by him in virtue of his office and how expended; and the Clerk is hereby required to place on the Collector's Roll the sum of two dollars against every Overseer who has not made his return at said date, and one dollar for each days labor not then reported as having been performed.

7. It shall be the duty of the Overseers to impound all horses, cattle and pigs, etc., running at large or injuring the public highway, as provided in By-law No. 437, respecting pounds, and to prosecute before any Justice of the Peace any person or persons who shall injure or destroy any tree or shrub growing or planted for shade or ornament upon any public highway, or who shall cut down or deface any signboards, or any printed or written notices, or who shall place any timber, stone, wood, fences or any other incumbrance upon any public highway, or who shall commit any wiful injury to any bridge, embankment, ditch or sidewalk upon any public highway. Such persons being convicted thereof before any Justice of the Peace, shall be liable to the penalties hereinafter imposed.

8. It shall be the duty of the Overseer to cause to be cut down all noxious weeds growing on the highway, and to prevent their going to seed, and in every o her way to enforce and to assist in enforcing the provisions of "The Act to prevent the spreading of Noxious Weeds."

9. It shall be the duty of the Overseers to expend the money received by them in commutation of Statute Labor, in letting work by public sale to the lowest bidder, after posting notice of such sale in at least three public places in the locality three days prior to the sale, except where such work will not exceed the sum of five dollars, or in case any bridge, culvert, embankment or other part of any highway gives away so as to endanger public travel thereon, then in such case the work may be proceeded with at once on the most favorable terms without such notice.

10. For the purposes of this By-law eight hours shall constitute one day's labor, and eight hours of one man and team, with plow, scraper or waton, shall constitute three days labor. All damage to animals or implements to be at the risk of the owner.

11. Overseers shall be allowed to the extent of their Statute Labor, not exceeding eight days, for the performance of their duties as Overseer, and no more.

12. Any person or persons neglecting or refusing to perform the duties herein imposed, shall, upon conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace, incur a penalty of not less than two dollars, and not exceeding twenty dollars, together with the costs of prosecution and distress, which shall be recovered by distress of the offendors goods and chattels; and in case there is not sufficient distress such offendor may be committed to the common gool of the County and there put to hard labor for any time not

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he duties e of the xceeding s, which and in d to the time not exceeding ten days, unless such penalty and costs and the costs of the warrant of commitment and of conveying the said person to gaol be sooner paid; and all such fines, other than costs recovered under this Section, shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation.
