## BY-LAWS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RALEIGH.

### A BY-LAW

To Raise certain sums of Money therein mentioned in the Township of Raleigh, for the year 1867.

[Passed 27th July, 1867.]

WHEREAS, by By-Law by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Kent, passed on the 15th day of June, 1867, and entitled a By-Law to raise the sum of \$18,811,71, to meet the current expenses of the County of Kent, and for other purposes.

And, whereas, the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh is required to raise the sum of (\$2020,53) two thousand and twenty dollars fifty-three cents, as their portion for said year, to be paid to the Treasurer of the County of Kent, without any deduction on or before the 31st day of December, 1867.

And, whereas the apportionment of the Legislative School Grant for the Township of Raleigh, for the year 1867, amounts to \$360, according to the apportionment of the Chief Superintendent of Schools, the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh is required to levy at least an equal sum of money according to Law in such case made and provided.

And, whereas, it is necessary to raise the following sums of money to meet the current expenses of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, for the year 1867, viz:—

For the Salaries of Township Officers	the sum of	-	\$400
For the support of the poor in the Township,	the sum of	200	
For non-resident School Accounts, the sum of	-	480	
For miscellaneous accounts, the sum of	-	180	

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Acts 29 & 30, Vic., Chap. 51 & 52 of the Annual Statutes of Upper Canada, 1866

1. That there shall be raised, levied, assessed and collected, upon all the rateable, real and personal property in the Township of Raleigh, the sum or rate of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  mills on every dollar thereof for the aforesaid County purposes. The sum or rate of 1 mill on every dollar thereof for the aforesaid School purposes, excepting the property of certain Roman Catholic supporters of Separate Schools. The sum or rate of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  mills on every dollar thereof, to meet the current expenses of the Township of Raleigh for the

current year. The sum or rate of \$1 upon the owner or harborer of every dog, and the sum or rate of two dollars upon the owner or harborer of every bitch entered upon the assessment roll of the Township of Raleigh for the year 1867.

2. That if the above sums of money so raised and collected by the said rates shall exceed in any case the amounts so required for the said purposes, respectively the Treasurer of this Corporation shall pass such excess to any deficiency that may arise to any or either of the other purposes mentioned in this By-Law, and if no such deficiency shall happen, then all such excess, if any, shall be kept by the Treasurer and appropriated to the general purposes of the Township, under the direction and control of the Council thereof, as all the public monies are, which may come into his hands.

3. That the Clerk of this Municipality is required to levy a special rate over and above all other rates against the estate, real and personal, of any School Section within this Municipality, on the request of the Trustees, who shall furnish him on or before the first day of August, with a written statement, signed by such Trustees, of the amount of money to be raised, levied, assessed and collected by this Council for Common School purposes in such School Section, such a rate pro rata on all the rateable property in such School Section as will amount to the sum of money required by such Trustees for the aforesaid purposes together with the sum of six per cent. on said amount of money to defray the expenses of levying and collecting the same.

4. That the Collector is hereby authorized and required to collect, according to law, the Special Rates levied on the freeholders and householders of such School Sections, the sums of money set opposite those respective names, and to pay the amounts so collected on or before the 14th day of December next, after retaining the sum of five per cent. as his fees, to the Treasurer of this Corporation, whose duty it shall be to pay over the same to the Secretary, Treasurer of the School Sections, from which the money was collected.

5. It shall be the duty of the Collector of this Corporation to pay over all monies collected by him to the Treasurer of this Corporation every two weeks, with a report of all the taxes he has received in bank notes or other current funds, and to pay over such current funds under a penalty of the forfeiture of his salary.

6. That the Collector shall be allowed the same fees as are now allowed to Bailiffs of the Division Courts, for all property seized, appraised, advertised, and sold by him by virtue of his office.

## A BY-LAW

To make provisions for Draining certain Localities in the Township of Raleigh hereinafter named.

[Passed September 3rd, 1867.

1. Whereas a majority of the resident owners of lots No. 3, 4, 5 & 6, in concession 7 and A, in the Township of Raleigh.

2. And, whereas, a majority of the resident owners of the S. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of lots 3, 4 5 & 6, in the 6th concession, and the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of lots 3, 4, 5 & 6, in the 7th concession.

3. And, whereas, a majority of the resident owners of the lots No. 21, in the 11th concession, lots 20&21, in the 10th concession, lots 19 & 20, in the 9th concession, and lots 19 & 20 in the 8th concession.

4 And, whereas, a majority of the resident owners of lots No. S. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  21 & 22, in the 9th concession, and the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of lots 21 & 22, in the 10th concession, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, that the lots of land above described may be drained. And, whereas the Council being of the opinion that it would greatly benefit those portions of the Township to drain said lands and road allowances, have ordered surveys to be made and received reports thereon, with plans and estimates of the costs of said drainage, amounting in the first mentioned locality, to the sum of \$480; in the second mentioned locality, to the sum of \$474; in the third mentioned locality, to the sum of \$643,22; and, in the fourth and last mentioned locality, to the sum of \$58.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Acts, Chap. 51 & 52, 29 & 30 Vic.

1. That the said lots of land hereinfore described in the two first mentioned localities, shall be drained in accordance with the plans and estimates of the same made by Arthur Jones, Esq, Provincial Land Surveyor

2. That the aforementioned 3rd & 4th localities shall be drained in accordance with the plans and estimates furnished to this Council by Thomas Jenner and Richard Jordan, two competent persons appointed by this Council to furnish said estimates.

3. That there shall be raised and collected, the sum of \$1431,72, for the purpose of paying one part of the costs of said drainage and the costs incidental thereto, assessed upon the lands in the localities aforesaid, in proportion to the benefit to be derived therefrom by each lot as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed and forming a part of this By-Law, subject, nevertheless, to an appeal by the parties interested in each case.

4. That the aforesaid sum of \$1431,72 shall be paid by the

proprietors of said lands at the times and in manner following, that is to say, one-third thereof shall be collected and paid along with the ordinary assessed taxes for the present year; one third thereof along with the ordinary assessed taxes for the year 1868; and one-third thereof along with the ordinary assessed taxes for the year 1869, and to be paid to the Collector in each case on or before the 14th day of December in each year.

5. That the sum of \$223 50, assessed on the road allowances in each case, for the purposes aforesaid, shall be paid by the Treasurer, out of the general funds of the Municipality, on the order of the Reeve.

6. That the work to be performed, under the provisions of this By-Law, shall be let by public contract to the lowest bidder, (and not to exceed, in any case, the estimate,) who shall give sufficient security for the due performance of the work contracted for. The work in the first and second mentioned localities to be subject to the approval of Arthur Jones, Esq., Township Surveyor for this Municipality.

7. That the following Commissioners be appointed for letting and superintending the work, viz: in the first mentioned locality, A. D. Shadd; in the second mentioned locality, Patrick Rice; in the third mentioned locality, Thomas Jenner; in the fourth mentioned locality, Thomas Jenner.

8. That the said Commissioners shall be paid the sum of \$1 per day for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending said work, and the Reeve shall give orders for payment on account of the certificate of the Commissioner, who shall retain the sum of fifteen per cent. back on work performed until finally received as hereintofore provided, and also for payment in full when the work has been finally approved of.

9. That it shall and may be lawful for the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh, to raise, by way of loan, and at a rate of interest not exceeding the sum of ten per cent. per annum, the sum of \$954,48, to meet the second and third payments enumerated in this By-Law, to be paid as follows, viz: one-half thereof payable on the first day of January, 1869, and the remainder to be paid on the first day of January, 1870, and the Clerk is hereby authorized and required in making up the Collector's Roll to add the interest above stated in proportion to the amount assessed in each case.

10. That it shall and may be lawful for the Reeve to cause debentures to be made not exceeding the aforesaid sum of \$954,48, such debentures to be under the seal of the Corporation, and to be signed by the Reeve and Treasurer.

11. That this By-Law shall be published in the Chatham Banner newspaper for one month before the final passing thereof.

### A BY-LAW

For stopping up and sale of the original allowance of road between Lots 148 and 149, Talbot Road.

[Passed September 3rd, 1867.]

Whereas application has been made and all the notices required by law given to have the original allowance of road between lots 148 and 149, Talbot Road, stopped up, and a road of the same dimensions laid out on the west side of the east half of lot 147, and, whereas, Philip A. Toll has agreed to exchange the land above mentioned for said road allowance with a sufficient quantity of land near the lake bank for a gravel pit.

Be it therefore enacted, &c.

1. That the original allowance of road between lots 148 and 149, Talbot Road, in the Township of Raleigh, be diverted and

closed, and that a new road be laid out on the west side of the east half of lot 147, in lieu thereof, and that the original allowance of road above described be exchanged with Philip A. Toll for the new road, and that a sufficient quantity of land near the lake for a gravel pit.

2. That this By-Law shall take effect as soon as approved of by the Council of the County of Kent, and releases from Philip A. Toll and the Corporation of Raleigh have been given.

### A BY-LAW

To appropriate the sum of (\$310) Three-Hundred and Ten Dollars for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the Township of Raleigh.

[Passed 14th October, 1867.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Acts 29 & 30 Vic., Chap. 51 & 52 of the Annual Statutes of Upper Canada.

1. That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars be appropriated for the improvement of the roads and bridges in the Township of Raleigh, as follows, viz :

To the first Rural Road Division the sum of fifty dollars.

To the second Rural Road Division the sum of fifty dollars.

To the third Rural Road Division the sum of fifty dollars.

To the fourth Rural Road Division the sum of fifty dollars, and to the fifth Rural Road Division the sum of fifty dollars.

2. That each Commissioner is hereby authorized and empowered to expend the same in his respective Division, and to grant certificates to the Clerk of this Corporation to parties working therefor, stating what work has been done for each amount.

3. That \$60 dollars be, and is hereby appropriated on the Four Rod Road, to be expended in deepening the ditch on the east side of said road, from the line between the 13th & 14th concessions, to the south side of the bridge at William Taylor's, and that the same be deducted out of the grant for the 5th Division next year, and that John A. Little be the Commissioner to expend the same.

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## A BY-LAW

A By-Law to appoint Returning Officers for the Municipal Elections in the Township of Raleigh for the year 1868.

[Passed November 15th, 1867.

Whereas the Township of Raleigh is divided into three Electoral Divisions for the purpose of electing a Reeve, Deputy Reeve and three Councillors for the year 1868.

And, whereas it is expedient and necessary to appoint Returning Officers therefor, be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Act, Chap. 51, as amended by Chap. 52, 29 and 30 Vic., passed the 15th August, 1866.

1. That William Holmes is hereby appointed Returning Officer for the first Electoral Division.

2. That John Jenner is hereby appointed Returning Officer for the second Electoral Division.

3. That Alexander Goulett is hereby appointed Returning Officer for the third Electoral Division.

## A BY-LAW

To open up the Line of Road between the First and Second or Seventeenth and Eighteenth Concessions, in the Township of Raleigh.

[Passed 15th November, 1867.

Whereas certain rate payers of the Township of Raleigh have petitioned the Council of said Township to have the allowance of road between the 1st and 2nd, or 17th and 18th concessions, in the Township of Raleigh. (as numbered from the eastern boundary of said Township,) opened up for public travel; and, whereas all the notices required by law have been given, and it being necessary, in the opinion of the Council, that said line of road should be opened.

It is therefore enacted, by the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh, assembled under, and by virtue of an Act, Chap. 51, as amended by Chap. 50, 29 & 30 Vic., passed in the year 1866.

1. That the line of road between the 1st and 2nd, or 17th and 18th concessions, eastern boundary line of the Township of Raleigh, be opened up for public travel, from the Town Line, between Harwich and Raleigh, to the Talbot Road.

2. That Arthur Jones, Esq., P. L. S., survey and stake out



said line of road according to the field notes filed in the Crown Lands Office of the Province of Ontario.

3. That it shall be the duty of the Overseer of Statute Labor, Division number 57, of said Township of Raleigh, as soon as the road is surveyed out, to notify all parties in possession of said road allowance, that he or they must remove all fences, buildings, or other obstructions from, and off said line of road, within fourteen days from such notice.

4. Should the party or parties in possession of said allowance of road, refuse or neglect to remove all fences or other obstructions, from and off said line of road within the fourteen days as notified; it shall be the further duty of the said Overseer, to call out a sufficient number of persons in his Statute Labor Division, liable to perform Statute Labor for the present or next year, and cause them to remove all fences, and other obstructions, from and off said allowance of road, so that the same may be opened out for public travel, giving to the persons so called out, a receipt for the time so employed to be applied by them against the first Statute Labor assessed against them.

### A BY-LAW

To provide for the constructing of a Drain from the rear of the Talbot Road Lots, along the north east side of the road, between Lots No. 6 and 7 to the 11th Concession, in the Township of Raleigh

[Passed December 30th, 1867.

Whereas a majority of the resident owners of lots No. 7 and the E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of lot 6 in the 12th concession, lots 6 and 7, and the S E  $\frac{1}{2}$  of lot 8, in the 13th concession, lots No. 6, 7 and 8 in the 14th concession, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh to have a drain to be made on the north east side of the road, between lots 6 and 7, from the Talbot Road lots to the 11th concession.

And, whereas, the Council being of the opinion that it would greatly benefit that portion of the Township to drain said lands and road allowances, have ordered an examination to be made, and have received a report thereon, with an estimate of the costs of said drain, amounting to the sum of \$940.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of an Act, Chap. 51 as amended by Chap. 52, 29 and 30 Vic., passed in the year 1866.

1. That the said lots of land hereinbefore described, shall be

drained in accordance with the report, and estimate of the same furnished to this Council by John A. Little, a competent person appointed by this Council to furnish said estimates.

2. That there shall be raised, levied and collected, the sum of \$705 for the purpose of paying one part of the costs of said drainage, and the costs incidental thereto, assessed upon the lands in the locality aforesaid, in proportion to the benefit to be derived therefrom by each lot, as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed and forming a part of this By-Law, subject, nevertheless, to an appeal by the parties interested in each case.

3. That the aforesaid sum of \$705 shall be paid by the proprietors of said lands at the times and in manner following, that is to say: one-third thereof shall be collected and paid, along with the ordinary assessed taxes for the year 1868; one-third thereof along with the ordinary assessed taxes for the year 1869; and one-third thereof along with the ordinary assessed taxes for the year 1870, and to be paid to the Collector in each case on or before the 14th day of December, in each year.

4. That the sum of \$235 assessed on the road allowances for the purposes aforesaid, shall be paid by the Treasurer out of the general funds of the Municipality on the order of the Reeve.

5. That the work to be performed under the provisions of this By-Law, shall be let by public contract to the lowest bidder (and not to exceed in any case the estimate) who shall give sufficient security for the due performance of the work contracted for.

6. That John A. Little is hereby appointed Commissioner to let and superintend the work.

7. That the said Commissioner shall be paid the sum of \$1 per day for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending said work, and the Reeve shall give orders for payment on account of the certificates of the Commissioner.

8. That it shall and may be lawful for the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh to raise, by way of loan, and at a rate of interest not exceeding the sum of ten per cent. per annum, the sum of \$627 to meet the payment of two-thirds of the cost of the drain enumerated in this By-Law, in the first instance; said amount to be made out in two debentures and made payable as follows: the first on the first of January, 1870, and the other on the first of January, 1871. And the Clerk is hereby authorized in making up the Collector's roll, to add the interest above stated in proportion to the amount assessed in each case.

9. That it shall and may be lawful for the Reeve of Raleigh to cause debentures to be made not exceeding the aforesaid sum of \$627, such debentures to be under the seal of the Corporation and to be signed by the Reeve and Treasurer.

10. That this By-Law shall be published in the *Chatham Ban-*

ner newspaper for one month before the final passing thereof.

### A BY-LAW

To appoint and confirm the appointment of certain Municipal Officers of the Township of Raleigh and to provide for the Salaries of the same for the year 1868.

[Passed 10th February, 1868.]

Whereas it is necessary that the Municipal officers appointed by this Corporation in each year should be appointed under the seal thereof.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of an Act, Chap. 51, as amended by Chap. 52, 29 and 30 Vic., of the Annual Statutes of Upper Canada.

1. That George Coutts, nominated by the Reeve, and Hugh McPherson, nominated by the Council, are hereby confirmed in the office of Auditors, and that their salary shall be the sum of \$6 each and no more.

2. That James Dillon is hereby confirmed in the office of Assessor, and it shall be his duty to complete and return his roll to the Clerk, not later than the fifteenth day of April next, and that his salary shall be the sum of \$70 and no more.

3. That James Gilhula is hereby confirmed in the office of Collector, and he is hereby required to enter into bonds on or before the meeting of the Council, in the month of May, himself in the sum of \$4000 and other good freehold sureties to the amount of \$8000, which bonds will require him to collect all rates levied on the Collector's roll, and to pay over the same to the Treasurer of this Corporation in manner following, that is to say: on his receiving the Collector's roll he shall commence to collect the rates and shall pay in all monies received by him for taxes at least every two weeks, and shall finally collect and make the return to the said Treasures as required by law, salary \$50 and no more, except what is allowed for special school per centage; and it shall be the duty of the Collector, in settling with the Treasurer, to make a report of all the taxes he has received in bank notes, or other current funds, and to pay over the same under a penalty of the forfeiture of his salary.

4. That Arthur Jones is hereby appointed to the office of Township Surveyor.

## A BY-LAW

To appropriate certain sums of money for the improvement of Roads and Bridges in the five Rural Road Divisions in the Township of Raleigh, and to appoint Commissioners to expend the same.

[Passed March 23rd, 1868.

Whereas it is necessary to appropriate certain sums of money for the improvement of the roads and bridges in the Township of Raleigh and to appoint Commissioners to expend the same.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Act 29 and 30 Vic, Chap. 51, as amended by Chap. 52, passed in the year A. D. 1866.

1. That the sum of \$2204.04 be, and is hereby appropriated for the improvement of the roads and bridges in the Township of Raleigh, as set forth in a report made by the Clerk of this Council under By-Law No. 38 of the Consolidated By-Law of 1865, that is to say:—

2. It shall be the duty of the said Commissioners to examine all the roads and bridges in their respective Divisions and see that the monies hereinbefore granted are properly expended, and where most required on the lines to which they are appropriated, and

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the balance in their respective Division, on any road or bridge, where most needed, in the repair of any sudden calamity that may occur in the Division.

3. That all jobs shall be let at a public sale, of which due notice shall be given, and each Commissioner is hereby empowered to grant orders on the Treasurer for all work properly performed and inspected by him, which orders shall be paid by the Treasurer when countersigned by the Reeve, Deputy Reeve or Councillor in said Township of Raleigh.

4. And it shall be the duty of the said Commissioners, on or before the last meeting of the Council, to send in a report of all monies expended in their respective Divisions, and the said Commissioners shall be allowed the sum of six per centum on all monies properly expended and reported on.

5. That for, and notwithstanding anything contained in the By-Laws, numbered ten and sixteen, of the Consolidated By-Laws of the Township of Raleigh, published in the year 1865, it shall be the duty of the said Commissioners to attend to all the duties enjoined on the Overseers in said By-Laws numbered ten and sixteen as aforesaid with regard to the removal of obstructions from streams and water courses in the Township of Raleigh, which duties are hereby transferred from the Overseers to the said Commissioners, who shall be entitled to the same fees, and liable to the same penalties as set forth in the hereibefore recited By-Laws with regard to the duties of Overseers.

6. That in case any party or parties call the Commissioner to inspect and receive any job or jobs that he or they may have taken, and on the Commissioner so inspecting the job or jobs and finding them not properly done, according to contract, he may deduct fifty cents from the job, to be allowed the Commissioner for his trouble, on his making a report to the Council, of parties whom he has made the deduction from.
