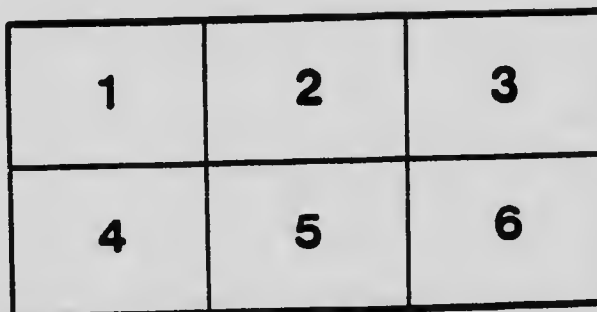
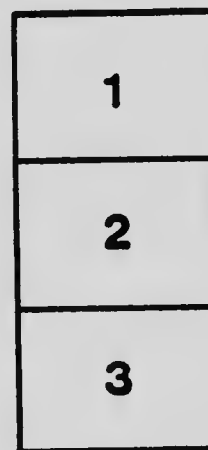

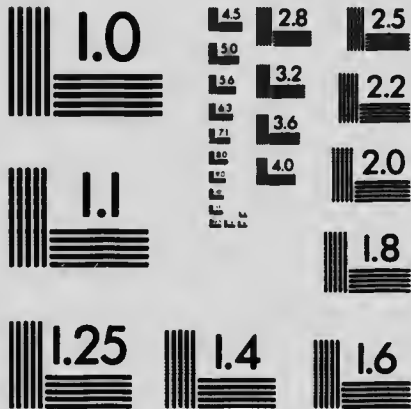

The author makes a strong case against the dispersion of the Acadians, relying on documents not much known before.

This is the music accompanying "Nouveau Recueil de Cantiques" by Messire Danlé, published in 1819 and often missing to the book. The last 180 pages of music are engraved.

The annotations by Laverdière are full of erudition and very valuable to the historian. As far as typography is concerned, it is one of the finest sample printed in Canada to that time.
