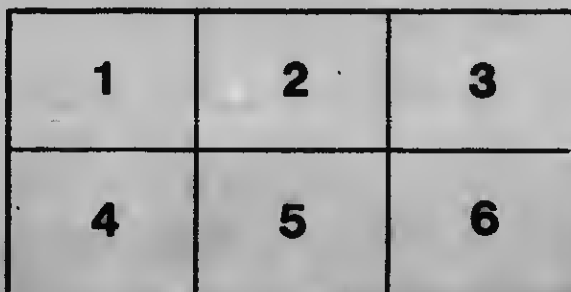

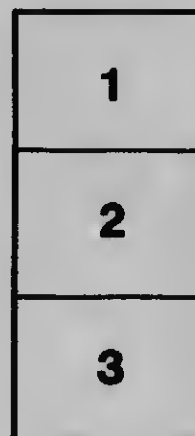

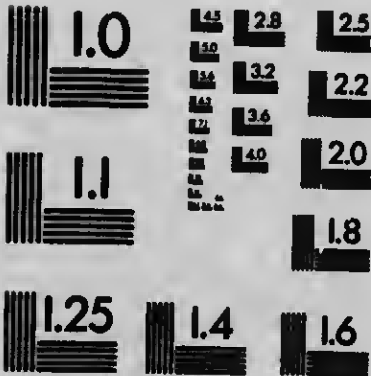

FOREWORD

The movement for celebrating the Hundred Years of Peace between the British Empire and the United States is rapidly taking hold in Canada, Great Britain and the United States, and there is every indication that the public festivities which are to be held in 1915 will be exceedingly successful and of great value in promoting the cause of international goodwill.

Since the formation of the Canadian Peace Centenary Association in 1912, four circulars have been issued. No. 1 contained a copy of the notice calling a first meeting, which was held in Ottawa on June 4th, 1912, and also the names of the members of the General Committee appointed at that meeting. No. 2 gave a synopsis of the proposals submitted to the Association by a large number of prominent Canadians; many of these have been incorporated in the general programme. No. 3 contained the report of a meeting of the General Committee held on February 11, 1913, and No. 4 set forth the detailed proposals passed at a conference held in May 1913, in New York, at which representatives from Great Britain, Australia, Newfoundland, the City of Ghent, the United States and Canada were present.

Since the issue of this last circular a great deal of organizing work has been accomplished, and, in Canada and the United States, a large number of centres have been mapped out where celebrations will be held during the Spring and Summer of 1915. Further, there have been great accessions to the numerical strength of the Association, and it seems proper, not only to report progress, but, in addition, to make public the names of those who have joined its ranks. The list appended has been corrected to May 20th, 1915.

PROGRAMME OF CELEBRATION

The general proposals of the joint Committees include four main features:—

1. **Erection of monuments and other visible memorials.**
2. **Services of thanksgiving in the churches.**
3. **An educational propaganda in the schools and universities.**
4. **Public festivities in certain centres.**

1. **Monuments and other memorials.** Many proposals have been submitted for permanent memorials of the Centenary of Peace, most of which would necessitate large expenditure. These proposals include: A monument in each of the three Capitals, Ottawa, London and Washington; Archways on the Pacific Highway from Vancouver to Los Angeles, at the British Columbia-Washington border, and on the Highway from Quebec to Miami, at Rouse's Point; A bridge or bridges across the Niagara River; Water-gates between Windsor and Detroit; Monuments at certain points on the international boundary and at some of the centres of celebration.

The Executive Committee has referred all these matters to an International Committee, the Canadian members of which are:—Sir Edmund Walker, C.V.O., the Hon. Senator Raoul Dandurand, Travers Lewis Esq., K.C., D.C.L., and C. A. Magrath Esq.

2. **Thanksgiving Services in the Churches.** It has been decided to set aside one Sunday for special thanksgiving services in all the churches of the British Empire and the United States. The date fixed is February 14th, 1915. The Treaty of Ghent, though signed on Christmas eve, 1814, was ratified by the United States, and, therefore, went into complete operation, on February 17th, 1815, so that February 14th, 1915, will be the nearest Sunday to the centenary of ratification. It is hoped that the services of this day, including the Sunday School exercises, will be devoted to the consideration of the blessings which have attended the two great nations during a Hundred Years of Peace. Most gratifying letters have been received from leaders in

the various churches, promising active co-operation in this feature of the celebration.

3. The Educational Propaganda. The most important feature of the whole celebration will concern the children, and it is a matter for congratulation that all the Departments of Education in Canada have promised to lend assistance to the movement. The following points cover the main proposals which are being worked out by the Canadian Executive. Fuller details will be issued in due course.

(a) The preparation of a series of leaflets or of pamphlets dealing with the various treaties with the United States, the events which led up to such Treaties, the negotiations which took place and the general results secured.

(b) The issue of literature dealing with the results of the long peace and setting forth the efforts which from time to time have been necessary to preserve it.

(c) Arrangements for an interchange of shields between schools in cities, towns and villages in Canada with cities towns and villages in the United States where such places bear identical names.

(d) The preparation and issue of a general programme for all the schools which are taking part in the celebration in the centres of celebration, to include details of suitable pageants etc.

(e) The preparation of tableaux and masques depicting the signing of the Treaty of Ghent or other historical events for production in every school in Canada.

(f) The issue of a number of recitations and patriotic songs, with music, for use in schools or in connection with the general celebration, such recitations and songs to be issued either specially or with some of the foregoing.

(g) Arrangements for competitive essays in schools, to be planned for the different grades.

4. Festivities. According to present indications special celebrations will be held in about one hundred places in Canada, probably starting in May 1915 and continuing until

September 1915. Preliminary arrangements have been made in the following and local committees arranged for:—

Ontario. Barrie, Belleville, Berlin, Cobalt, Galt, Guelph, Hamilton, Fort William, Kingston, Midland, Niagara Falls, Orillia, Ottawa, Owen Sound, Peterborough, Port Arthur, Renfrew, Sault Ste. Marie, St. Thomas, Smith's Falls, Stratford, Toronto, and Welland County.

Quebec. Fraserville, Montreal, Quebec. Rimouski. Three Rivers.

Nova Scotia. Amherst, Annapolis Royal, Halifax, Truro, Yarmouth.

New Brunswick. Campbellton, Fredericton, St. John, Moncton, St. Stephen.

Manitoba. Brandon, Dauphin, Emerson, Winnipeg.

British Columbia. Cranbrook, Nelson, New Westminster, Kamloops, Revelstoke, Vancouver, Vernon, Victoria.

Prince Edward Island. Charlottetown.

Saskatchewan. Moose Jaw, North Battleford, North Portal, Prince Albert, Regina, Saskatoon, Swift Current, Yorkton.

Alberta. Calgary, Edmonton, Lethbridge, Medicine Hat, Red Deer.

Subject to the desire of the City Councils and citizens, the following places also will be centres of celebration:—

Ontario. Brantford, Brockville, Chatham, Fort Frances, London, St. Catharines, Sarnia, Windsor and Walkerville, Woodstock.

Quebec. Chicoutimi, Farnham, Joliette, St. Johns, Sherbrooke, Sorel, Thetford Mines, Valleyfield.

Nova Scotia. Bridgewater including Lunenburg; Glace Bay; New Glasgow, including Pictou, Stellarton and Westville; Sydney.

New Brunswick. Chatham, Edmundston, Woodstock.

British Columbia. Nanaimo, Prince Rupert.

Manitoba. Portage la Prairie.

Prince Edward Island. Souris, Summerside, Tignish,

Saskatchewan. Outlook.

When the last of the centres is completed, and local committees have been appointed, a suggested programme will be issued. This programme will include pageants, in which the school-children will take the leading part, and speeches by prominent men. In some centres there will be sports, either field or aquatic, fire-works displays and other features of a local character.

Each centre will include not only the city in which the celebration is held, but neighbouring towns, villages, and municipalities, covering a considerable area. It is intended that excursions shall be run and holidays granted.

It is proposed that there shall be a Canadian speaker at the principal American centres and an American speaker at the principal Canadian centres.

RESOLUTIONS PASSED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON JANUARY 8, 1914.

International Celebration on Niagara Frontier. That in view of the advantages offered by Niagara Falls for purposes of celebration, as well as of its special associations with the War of 1812, a proposal be submitted to the American Committee to hold the final gathering of the celebration at this point.

Bridges, Tunnels, &c. That the question of erection of Bridges and other large memorials be referred to the Canadian members of the Joint International Committee for report.

Medals. That the President be empowered to procure designs for appropriate medals in commemoration of the Hundred Years of Peace.

Life-Saving Apparatus below Niagara Falls. That in view of the loss of life which has constantly occurred on the Niagara River, this Committee would recommend to the favourable consideration of the Government or Governments concerned any practical suggestions for the placing of life-saving apparatus on the banks or across the Niagara River, as a memorial to the Hundred Years of Peace.

WORK IN THE UNITED STATES AND GREAT BRITAIN

The United States. On December 3rd, and 4th, 1913, a conference of the American Committee was held in Richmond, Va., representatives being present from 31 States and 53 cities and towns, exclusive of those present from the city of Richmond. The conference was attended by Major C. F. Hamilton and Mr. E. H. Scammell representing the Canadian Peace Centenary Association. The Canadian representatives were invited to address the conference and to assist at the committees' deliberations. Sessions of the following committees were held:—

- Committee on International Celebration.
- Committee on National Celebrations.
- Committee on Official Celebrations by the States.
- Committee on Local Celebrations.
- Committee on Plan and Scope of Co-operation by Patriotic Organizations.
- Committee on Co-operation of Universities and Schools.
- Committee on Legislation.
- Committee on Resolutions.
- Committee on Address to the People of the United States.

The following address was issued by the last named committee and bears the signatures of a large number of leading men, including Mr. Thomas F. Bayard, grandson of one of the signatories of the Treaty of Ghent; Hon. W. J. Bryan, Secretary of State; President Nicholas Murray Butler, Mr. Andrew Carnegie, Mr. Joseph Choate, late Ambassador to Great Britain; James, Cardinal Gibbons, Mr. Samuel Gompers, Mr. A. E. Gallatin, grandson of one of the signatories of the treaty of Ghent, Judge Alton B. Parker, Hon. W. H. Taft, ex-President of the United States and Mr. J. A. Stewart, Chairman of the Executive Committee of the American Peace Centenary Committee.

To the People of the United States:

"On Christmas Eve, 1814, Messrs. John Quincy Adams, James A. Bayard, Henry Clay, Albert Gallatin and Jonathan Russell, on behalf of the United States, and Lord Gambier,

Dr. Adams and Henry Goulburn, Esq., on behalf of Great Britain, signed the Treaty of Ghent, which ended the war between the two countries.

"Shortly thereafter Mr. John Quincy Adams expressed the hope, so wonderfully realized, that the peace thus restored should be enduring, saying, 'May the gates of the temple of Janus closed here never be opened during the century.'

"A few months later peace societies sprang into being in both America and England; and within three years, by formal agreement, the boundary line between the United States and Canada became a mere political limitation, like the peaceful boundaries that separate the States of the American Union, instead of a series of fortifications between two nations mutually distrustful of one another.

"Believing that the blessings that have followed in the train of the peace thus established cannot better be brought to the attention of the world at large than by a fitting celebration, the American committee at its initial meeting, held four years ago, formulated a plan for this purpose. The proposal was soon thereafter laid before the people of Great Britain and the self-governing colonies of the British Empire.

"The American committee was animated by a patriotic impulse and the belief that through an adequate world-wide celebration of a century of peace great good would be accomplished towards the rational settlement of international disputes. And it hoped and hopes to effect this through the creation of a sentiment which shall educate the peoples of the world to regard forbearance and mutual understanding as virtues to be cultivated by governments and nations, as well as by individuals.

"The Committee also considered that through the association of the peoples of many nationalities in a common commemoration necessarily there would result increased acquaintance, friendship and mutual understanding which are essential to permanent peace.

"Therefore, the undersigned, a special committee acting for the American Committee, a body whose many thousand members are representative of every section of the United States, of every walk in life, and of every profession and calling and of the different elements from which our population is drawn, invite and urge co-operation throughout the United States, and the active, sympathetic interest of the citizens or subjects of all countries.

"It is sincerely hoped that all will take part with the American Committee, or with similar committees in other lands in the preparation and execution of an adequate and fitting programme that shall signalize, as no other occurrence in

the past would enable us to do, the realization of Mr. Adams' prophetic wish that the twentieth century might find the peace still unbroken.

"That our country has been such an active factor in this wonderful achievement prompts us to celebrate the event—for peace as well as war is an event between nations—and arouses the hope that the hundred years which have passed since the treaty of Ghent was signed on Christmas eve, 1814, may be not only the precursor of a perpetual peace between Great Britain and the United States, but the promise of a broadening era of enduring peace between all nations."

A considerable amount of work has been done by the American Committee and a large number of centres of celebration have been arranged for. A bill is at present before Congress, asking for an appropriation, and similar bills are under consideration by a number of the State Legislatures. Mr. J. A. Stewart, Chairman of the American Executive Committee, has proved himself an indefatigable worker and most of the success in the United States will be the result of his whole-souled activities.

Great Britain. The work of the British Committee of which H. H. the Duke of Teck is Honorary President and the Rt. Hon. Earl Grey, late Governor-General of Canada, President, is progressing satisfactorily. At a meeting at the Mansion House, London on February 5, 1914, presided over by the Lord Mayor of London, the Rt. Hon. H. H. Asquith, Prime Minister, was the principal speaker. At the conclusion of his address he referred to the educational proposals and said:—

"Americans take pride in the great names of our old English history, alike in the spheres of war, of administration, of literature and of art. But we take an equal pride in the great men whom America has contributed since the formal separation—a separation which is not inconsistent with real unity of spirit and feeling—men like Washington, Lincoln and the other great heroes whom America has produced and with whom America has illuminated and illustrated the British traditions of history.

"What could be a better and more human and fruitful way of celebrating this great centenary than that we should establish in both our countries—a systematized, organized teaching of these common traditions and this common history which will lead us both by reverencing and appreciating

the examples of the great men whom we share in common to realize more fully what is the depth and breadth of our common heritage and our common responsibility in the history of the world.

"I earnestly commend to you and to the larger public outside the opportunity which this centenary so appropriately provides of commemorating not merely by statues and by other outward memorials—valuable and important as they are—but by the persistent teaching of the essential unity of our British race, the greatest security which history has yet afforded to any two sovereign communities to contribute their share to the permanent pacification of the world."

The British Committee has purchased for £10,000 Sulgrave Manor, one of the ancestral homes of the Washington family, and is arranging to convert it, with 10 acres of ground surrounding, into a museum and national park. Over the entrance to this manor house is the coat of arms, consisting of three stars and two stripes, which became the inspiration for the national flag of the Republic. This house was erected by Lawrence Washington, an ancestor of George Washington in the 16th century, the land having been given to him by Henry VIII. It has now been vested in a Committee of which the American Ambassador in London is Chairman, to be held in trust for all time.

APPROPRIATION BY THE DOMINION GOVERNMENT

In answer to a question put by Mr. W. G. Weichel, Member of Parliament for North Waterloo, Ont, as to whether it were the intention of the Government to grant assistance to the Canadian Peace Centenary Association, the Prime Minister made the following statement:—

"On June 5, 1913, a somewhat similar question to that now asked by my hon. friend (Mr. Weichel) was asked by the hon. member for Welland (Mr. German), who has taken a worthy interest in this important subject. The Canadian Peace Centenary Association had then been in existence for upwards of a year, under the presidency of Sir Edmund Walker, of Toronto, and had done valuable work of a preparatory nature. I find on that date I said in part:

"While the Canadian Peace Centenary Association is an unofficial body, the Government strongly sympathizes with and approves of its object and purpose of promoting

good will and peace between the nations of the world. The Government is disposed to give favourable consideration to a grant such as that mentioned in the question in case similar action should be taken in other countries.'

"That statement still holds good so far as this Government is concerned. Indeed, this Government is disposed to go a step further. The cause which the Canadian Peace Centenary Association and the corresponding bodies in the United Kingdom and the United States have set before them is one with which we are warmly sympathetic. It is a triumph of humanity that during a century of rapid development, despite the existence of serious international differences and problems, the British Empire and the United States have found wiser and more humane methods of adjusting differences than the arbitrament of war. We welcome the achievement of a century of peace, and hope that it will prove to be but the first century of peace, the forerunner of a long series stretching into the future as far as human anticipation can trust itself.

"The Government is informed that during the eight or nine months which have elapsed since I made my statement last year active organizing work has been carried on by the Canadian Peace Centenary Association. An organizing secretary has been appointed, offices have been opened, visits have been made to important centres in every province of the Dominion, and every necessary preparation for the holding of an adequate celebration a year hence has been made. It is gratifying to note that the organizing secretary, Mr. E. H. Scammell, reports that the response to the efforts of the association has been exceedingly cordial in the numerous centres visited. Strong local committees have been formed, valuable assistance has been rendered by the press, and in general public opinion has manifested an encouraging interest and friendliness. I understand that similar work also has been done in the United Kingdom and in the United States in particular. I am informed that a Bill appropriating a sum of money for the purposes of the celebration is now pending in the United States Congress.

"In answer to my hon. friend from North Waterloo (Mr. Weichel), I beg to say that, subject to the approval of His Royal Highness the Governor General, it is the purpose of the Government to insert in the Supplementary Estimates to be introduced this session the sum of \$25,000 for the purpose of defraying the preliminary expenditures incurred in the work of organization."

GREAT WORLD POWERS AND THE CELEBRATION

While the celebration more immediately concerns the United States, Great Britain and Canada, it would be incomplete if the other great powers, with all of whom the principal participants enjoy the most cordial and friendly relations, were not invited to take a prominent part.

The following Manifesto to the Nations, reprinted from Circular No. 4, was issued by the International Conference, held in May, 1913, in New York:

"Representatives of Great Britain, of Newfoundland, of the United States, of the Dominion of Canada, of the Commonwealth of Australia, and of the Municipality of Ghent, having been in conference concerning an appropriate celebration of the centenary of the signing of the Treaty of Ghent, which marked the end of the last international war between the British and the American peoples, unite in offering to the governments and the peoples of the civilized world an earnest invitation to take part in making this celebration in every way worthy of the one hundred years of peace that it commemorates.

"We invite such co-operation to the end that it may be made clear and unmistakable to public opinion everywhere that the time has come when international rivalries and differences, though numerous and severe, may be settled without the carnage and the horrors of war. Although it be unreasonable to disregard the possibility of conflict arising in the future, out of mutual or partial misunderstanding, yet we gratefully recognize that the chances of misunderstanding have been largely eliminated by the degree in which modern science has facilitated intercourse and accelerated communication. We are, therefore, encouraged to hope that the development of letters, science and the arts of commerce, industry and finance, of mutual knowledge, trust and good feeling on the part of those who owe different allegiances and who speak different tongues, may profitably absorb the energy of mankind, as well as offer opportunity for the display of the noblest and finest traits of mind and character.

"Great Britain has been a colonizing nation, and the United States has drawn to its population various and powerful elements from different countries and from different flags. Therefore, a century of peace between Great Britain and her Dominions beyond the seas on the one hand, and the United

States on the other hand, touches directly both the interest and the imagination of every land to which Great Britain's sons have gone, as well as those of every nation from which the present day population of the United States has been drawn. Such a celebration will not only mark the close of a century of exceptional significance and importance, but it will call attention to an example and an ideal that we earnestly hope may be followed and pursued in the years to come. What nations have done nations can do.

"We respectfully request that his Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and the Secretary of State of the United States transmit this invitation, through the proper official channels, to the governments of the world, to the end that both by the participation of governments and by the co-operation of men of good will in every land, this celebration may be so carried out as to mark not merely the close of one hundred years of peace between English speaking peoples, but the opening of what we sincerely trust will be a fresh era of peace and goodwill between all the nations of the world."

In pursuance of this Manifesto, the New York World, at the instance of the American Peace Centenary Committee, sent a 1913 Christmas message from the Committee, referring to the coming celebration of the hundred years of peace, to the heads of the Governments of the world. The message closed with an expression of hope "that this century of peace may be an example to all the nations of the earth".

Numerous replies were received, from which the following extracts are taken:—

H. M. THE KING—

"I am commanded by the King to thank the members of the Committee for their telegram conveying kind Christmas greetings, and to say that His Majesty reciprocates their expressions of good will".

H. R. H. THE DUKE OF CONNAUGHT—

"Cordially thank you for your Christmas greeting and heartily reciprocate your good wishes".

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE R. L. BORDEN—

"On my return to Ottawa to-day I received with greatest pleasure and appreciation your message on behalf of the American committee charged with preparations for the celebration of one hundred years of peace.

"My colleagues and I, on behalf of the people of Canada, send our warmest thanks and Christmas greetings.

"As we approach the consummation of a century of peace, which I trust will be worthily commemorated, we are profoundly thankful that the relations between our countries are of the most happy and cordial character.

"Neither nation ever won a nobler victory than that which is embodied in that century triumph of friendship and good will over every temporary difficulty and discord.

"United by the ties of kinship, possessing like institutions and a common language and literature, inheriting like liberties, duties and responsibilities, each nation owes not only to the other but to itself, for the cause of civilization and humanity, the solemn duty and obligation of preserving and keeping constant that tradition of friendship and peace in the centuries to come".

H. I. M. THE EMPEROR OF GERMANY—

"I am desired to acknowledge receipt of the Christmas greetings which the Committee for the celebration of the centenary of peace kindly addressed to the Emperor, and to express to you His Majesty's thanks for this courtesy".

THE PRESIDENT OF FRANCE—

"I beg to convey to you the sincere thanks of the President of the French Republic for your friendly message and to say that he heartily joins you in wishing that peace may be firmly and honorably maintained among nations".

H. I. M. THE EMPEROR OF AUSTRIA—

"I most heartily thank the National Peace Committee in New York for their kindly greeting which I have received with genuine satisfaction and with the assurance that I follow with keen interest the Committee's efforts, which are dedicated to an eminently humane idea".

H. M. THE QUEEN OF HOLLAND—

"Her Majesty thanks the committee for kind greetings and sends good will and approval".

H. M. THE KING OF SPAIN—

"I am sincerely grateful for the kind message and congratulations, which I highly appreciate. I heartily reciprocate these friendly feelings and desire nothing more than the complete success of all these labours of peace and harmony".

H. M. THE KING OF NORWAY—

"I thank the Committee for kind Christmas greetings and express good wishes".

H. M. THE KING OF SWEDEN—

"The king has directed me to express his best thanks for your kind telegram".

THE PRESIDENT OF PORTUGAL—

"Most pleasantly affected by the kindly greetings you have sent me for Christmas, I convey to you with my sincere thanks my best wishes for your personal happiness as well as for the success of the splendid peace movement which you are carrying on in a manner that entitles you and your great country to the grateful admiration of all civilized nations".

H. M. THE CZAR OF BULGARIA—

"Please accept with my best Christmas greetings my heartfelt good wishes for the celebration of one hundred years of peace. This century has brought to the great nation of the United States the blessings of peace, prosperity, progress in all ways, of civilization and highest development of every virtue. I cannot find a better opportunity to express my deepest sympathy with your initiative than to-day, when we remember that the Almighty sent on earth his Son to preach by His divine word and example love, forgiveness and peace."

H. M. THE KING OF THE BELGIANS—

"I am deeply touched by your telegram and the honor that you pay to Belgium. I send you my cordial felicitations upon the high aim of your efforts, and I convey to you my sincere wishes that those efforts may effectively aid in developing constantly more and more among peoples the beautiful ideas of concord which receive renewed affirmation in the anniversary you celebrate".

H. I. M. THE EMPEROR OF JAPAN—

"In the judgment of His Majesty the occasion is well worthy of international commemoration. The century's peaceful progress, in which the United States and Great Britain have borne so conspicuous a part and from which the world at large has so greatly benefitted, has been marvelous. The record will serve in a striking manner to illustrate to coming generations the blessings of peace. The relations of friendship and good understanding which have so long and so closely united Japan with America and the United Kingdom give to the Japanese Empire a deep and abiding interest in the celebration which you have in charge; accordingly His Majesty extends to the undertaking his cordial goodwill and best wishes".

THE PRESIDENT OF CHINA—

"It gives me pleasure to receive your message of greeting and I reciprocate to you, gentlemen, the cordial sentiments embodied therein. I am happy to indorse the noble idea of celebrating one hundred years of peaceful intercourse between the United States, China, Great Britain, Germany and other nations. A glorious chapter in history. I wish another century of peace not only between these few countries but the entire world."

H. M. THE KING OF MONTENEGRO—

"Thanks for your telegram and your very good wishes which I have received and which I keenly appreciate. You are preparing a very beautiful celebration of a century of peace and concord between two great sister nations, so highly civilized. I approve with all my heart of that aim toward an ideal of peace, of justice and of liberty, which I wish might for ever reign among all nations."

THE PRESIDENT OF CHILI—

"In the name of the President of the Republic, I acknowledge and cordially reciprocate the friendly Christmas greetings of the American committee charged with preparations for the celebration of one hundred years of peace between the United States and Great Britain and other nations."

THE PRESIDENT OF NICARAGUA—

"Reciprocating your kindly Christmas greetings on the occasion of the celebration of one hundred years of peace between the United States and other nations, which I look upon as the most worthy title of the various governments to the gratitude of their peoples, and as the most noble stimulus of universal brotherhood, the Government and the people of Nicaragua join most fervently in this noble sentiment".

THE PRESIDENT OF PANAMA—

"Deeply grateful for the cordial Christmas greetings of this honorable committee, I sincerely join in the most important celebration of the century of peace."
