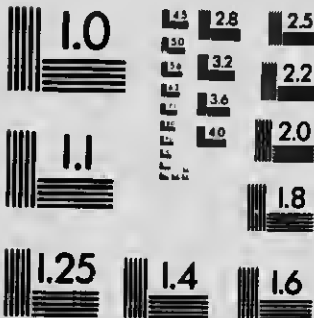

The Calgary Fire Department



If a city is to be judged by the efficiency of its Fire Department, the City of Calgary should, and does, occupy an enviable position in the mercantile and insurance world. In twenty-five years the place has grown from a conglomeration of tents and shacks to a modern city of forty-five thousand people, and the Fire Department has developed from a bucket brigade to one of the best and most up-to-date departments on the continent. Although the department has always been progressive, the strides of the last two or three years have been exceptional. Last year three more stations were added, making a total of six, and three carloads of apparatus were required to equip same, including a Flying Squadron Motor Chemical Car. At the same time the volunteers, who had given good service in the past, were retired, and a full paid body of thirty-six men was installed.

The alarm system of the department has also been augmented by the addition of a Six-circuit Ganewell Repeater and Switchboard, controlling at present fifty-six fire alarm boxes, well distributed throughout the city. The controlling boards are capable of much greater extensions, which will likely be made during the coming year.

The stations of the department are substantial buildings, and are comfortably arranged for both the men and horses, with the exception of Headquarters, which is not in keeping with the pretensions of the City of Calgary. This building was erected about twenty-three years ago, for the accommodation of the village fire brigade, and has consequently outgrown its usefulness. However, it is anticipated that the citizens will undertake to build a new headquarters in the near future, in keeping with the requirements of the department and the development of the city.

The promptness and efficiency of the department is a matter of comment, both by citizens and visitors, and this, in a great measure, is accountable for the city's freedom from serious fires, although the brigade averages about twenty calls per month.

The Chief is ably seconded in the directing of the department by Arthur Turner, who was appointed to the position of Assistant Chief in 1909, after many years' experience in the department, and as captain of No. 2 Station.

Apart from the actual work of furnishing fire protection, the brigade for many years took an active interest in athletic and firemen's sports, and their celebrations were the largest in the Territories. The Fire Department also maintained a first class band, up to a few years ago, under the leadership of Mr. Crispin E. Smith, now Police Magistrate, and were always free and generous with their services.

In matters of entertainment their minstrel shows and amateur performances were looked forward to with interest, and the annual ball given by the department was the social event of the season.

The associations of the department with other bodies in the city have always been the most cordial, and they look for the continuance of the same good feeling.

Firemen's Benefit Association

As the title of this book will indicate, the department have in connection a strongly organized Benefit Association, for the assistance of its members in case of sickness or accident. They have been enabled to carry on this work through the generous assistance of many of our leading citizens, and it is hoped by the publication of this souvenir to still further augment the funds.

Fortunately, very few calls have been made thus far, but in the hazardous work of fire-fighting the men are always taking their lives in their hands, and it is some consolation to know that in case of accident they have even a small measure of protection.

It is the ultimate object of the department to organize a pension fund as well, and they consider that there should be steps taken by the City Council to assist in this matter.

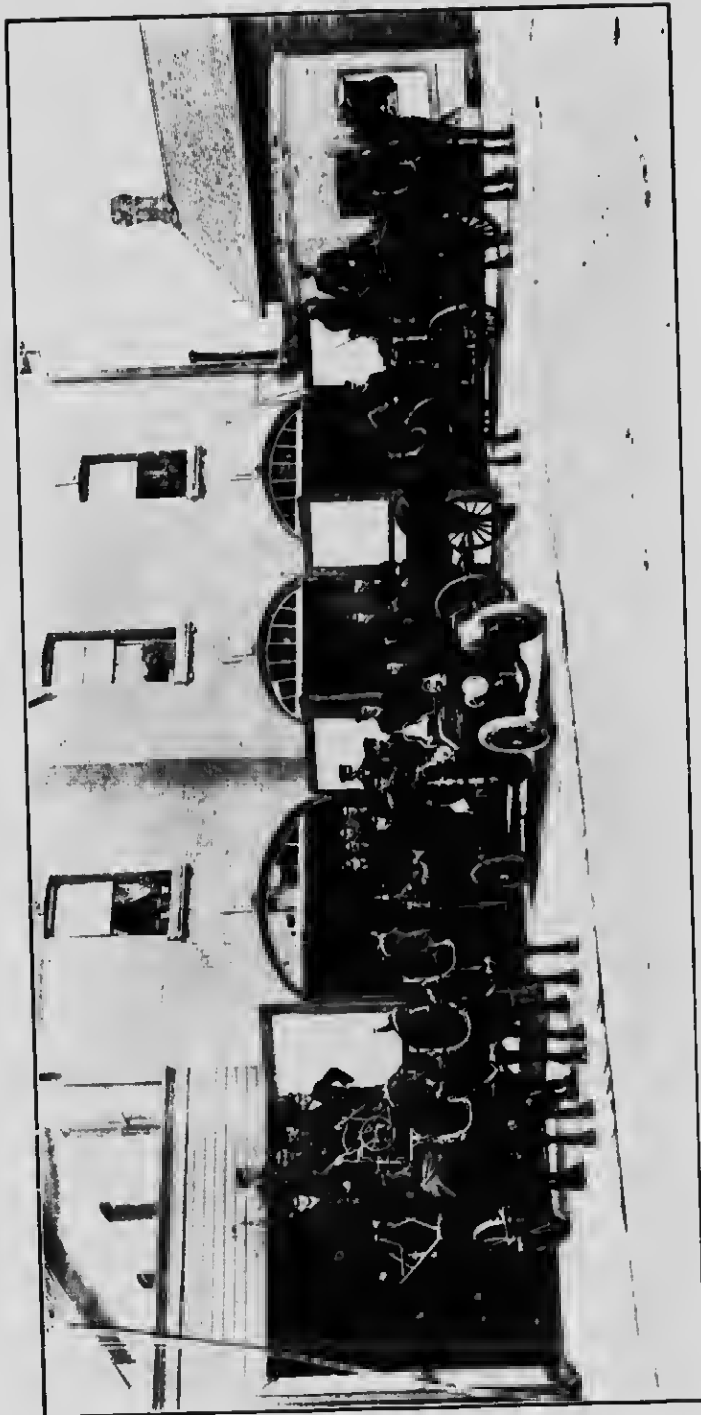

... Historical Sketch ...



OR some time prior to 1885, a Bucket Brigade had partially existed in the little Western Town of Calgary, which had been moved from East of the Elbow River to its present location. The first real organization took place on August 25th, 1885, when a hook and ladder company and a bucket corps was organized, and a chemical engine procured. George Constantine was elected Captain, Ed. Donohue, Lieutenant, and T. A. Boys, Secretary. On the 1st September Constantine resigned, and a re-organization and election took place, the following officers being elected: Captain, Steve Jarrett; Lieutenant, Ed. Donohue; Treasurer, W. H. Cushing; Laddermen, Joe Rodway, James Smart; Hookmen, Jack Summers and Walter Jarrett; Axemen, S. N. Jordan and S. J. Clarke; Truckman, Mr. Shaw; Finance Committee, S. J. Clarke, J. H. Millward, J. Lambert; Property Committee, John Soules, — Turnbull, J. Ellis.

There was only one member without an office, a Mr. Barton.

Shortly after this a big fire took place, starting on a Sunday morning where the Windsor Hotel now stands, and burning East to the Grand Central Hotel and North to the old I. G. Baker Stores

on the site now occupied by the Burns Block. A high wind prevailed at the time, but at about noon the fire was got under control through the heroic efforts of the Brigade and Citizens. After this fire a Ronald engine and two hose reels and 2,000 ft. of hose were purchased.

This fire was the means of considerable dissatisfaction, and on November 1st of 1886 a meeting was held, with Archie Grant in the chair, Steve Jarrett was elected Chief, Bob Oglburn Assistant Chief, and W. J. Creighton, Secretary. It was recommended that a Fire Hall be built. This was approved of by the Council, and the present Hall constructed.

On April 12th, 1887, Chief Jarrett resigned and Frank Dick was elected to the position, with Bob Oglburn Assistant Chief.

In May, 1887, the new Fire Hall was completed and the citizens contributed \$500 towards furnishing. It was informally opened on May 24th, by a concert and dance and an inaugural dance took place on June 9th.

About this time a digression occurred. The Town Council became greatly enamored of their new handiwork in the shape of the new Fire Hall and proceeded to hold their meetings therein and make it a general place of civic business. This did not meet with the approval of the brigade, so Chief Dick and his members stepped down and out, sold their furniture and donated the proceeds to the hospital.

After the tried brigade resigned the Mayor and Council proceeded to appoint a high salaried chief and organize a brigade consisting of the Mayor and Council and would-be fire-fighters. The new body was well organized on paper, but, when it came to a serious fire, they weren't in it, and in a short time the citizens were clamoring for the reinstatement of the old brigade.

This occurred on July 23rd, 1880, when a meeting was held in the office of E. R. Rogers, and a decision arrived at to have the regular brigade again take charge. A memorial was presented to the Council embodying the wishes of the men, and was adopted with slight changes, thus securing harmony between the two bodies. The hall and appliances were accordingly turned over to the original brigade.

From this time on the brigade forged ahead. More water tanks were established throughout the town and approaches were made to the Bow River on the North and the Elbow River on the South, for the purpose of filling them.

In the year 1860 the brigade began to look for other fields of action, and on January 11th steps were taken to purchase a set of land instruments from the Oddfellows, but before they could be executed Mr. D. W. Marsh, out of his own munificence presented the band with the instruments, uniforms, music stands, etc. A band was organized which was carried on with varied success under different leaders for a number of years.

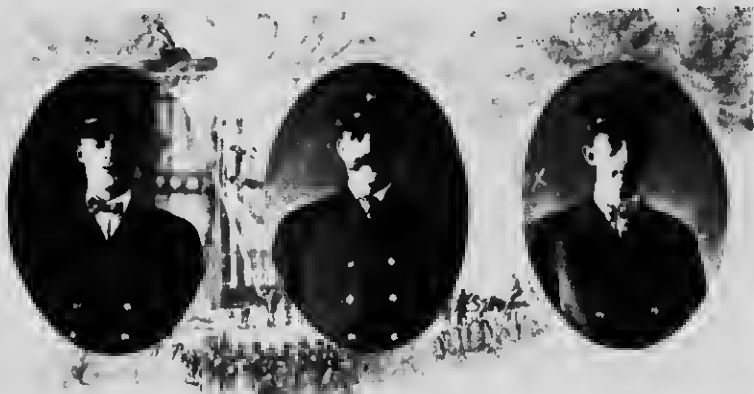

A gymnasium was also organized and conducted successfully for some time. About this time a dispute arose as to qualifications for membership in the department, and it was declared that no man be disqualified for membership on account of his religious belief, the only qualifications necessary being honesty, respectability and fitness for the position.

1895—Improvements were made on the suggestion of the brigade, although the members had to threaten to resign if same were not granted. The additions consisted of matched team of horses, chemical hose, grappling hooks, repairs to hall, salary to chief, etc.

1896—On March 9th of this year J. Wilson, now Superintendent of Waterworks, was appointed to the paid position of engineer and handed in his resignation as chief of the brigade. H. McClelland was elected to the position of chief.

1897—In June of this year the brigade turned their hand to fighting water instead of fire. A serious flood of the Bow River occurred. The brigade was called out and did heroic work rescuing residents on the water front. They were voted \$75 by the Council for services.

1898—H. McClelland, chief; Jas. Smart, assistant chief and secretary-treasurer. On March 7th Chief McClelland resigned, and on the 21st James Smart was elected to the head of the brigade, and H. B. Wilson was elected secretary-treasurer. After the 24th of May sports of this year the brigade undertook to purchase uniforms out of their own funds. Thirty men were uniformed at a cost of about \$18.00 per man.

1900—The close of this year is memorable in the history of the brigade on account of the big Clarence Block fire on Christmas. The fire started shortly after midnight, and the boys were kept at it all Christmas day, in the cold, missing their share of the plum pudding, roast turkey and other dainties of the festive season.

1901—This was a memorable year, in that the brigade held their first church parade. New uniforms were purchased for the band at a cost of about \$500. During the visit of the Duke and Duchess of York the brigade acted as special police, and had their hall elaborately decorated but the royal eyes were not cast upon it. Through the efforts of Bandmaster Smith and Chief Smart a band stand was erected in the C. P. R. park. Chief appointed Fire Inspector.

1902—Benefit Association organized to provide for members injured at fires or practises. This association began its good work of assisting sick and disabled members at a special meeting called on March 25th, at which Chief James Smart explained the objects of the association as being similar to those attached to all well regulated fire departments throughout the larger cities of Canada and the United States. He urged that the time had now arrived when the Calgary Fire Department should be more prepared than ever for the care of its members, because the City was increasing rapidly, and its buildings were every year gaining greater proportions, consequently more dangers would have to be faced and greater would be the casualties, and that a step in the direction of creating a fund for relief purposes could not fail to be for the benefit of all and the department in general.

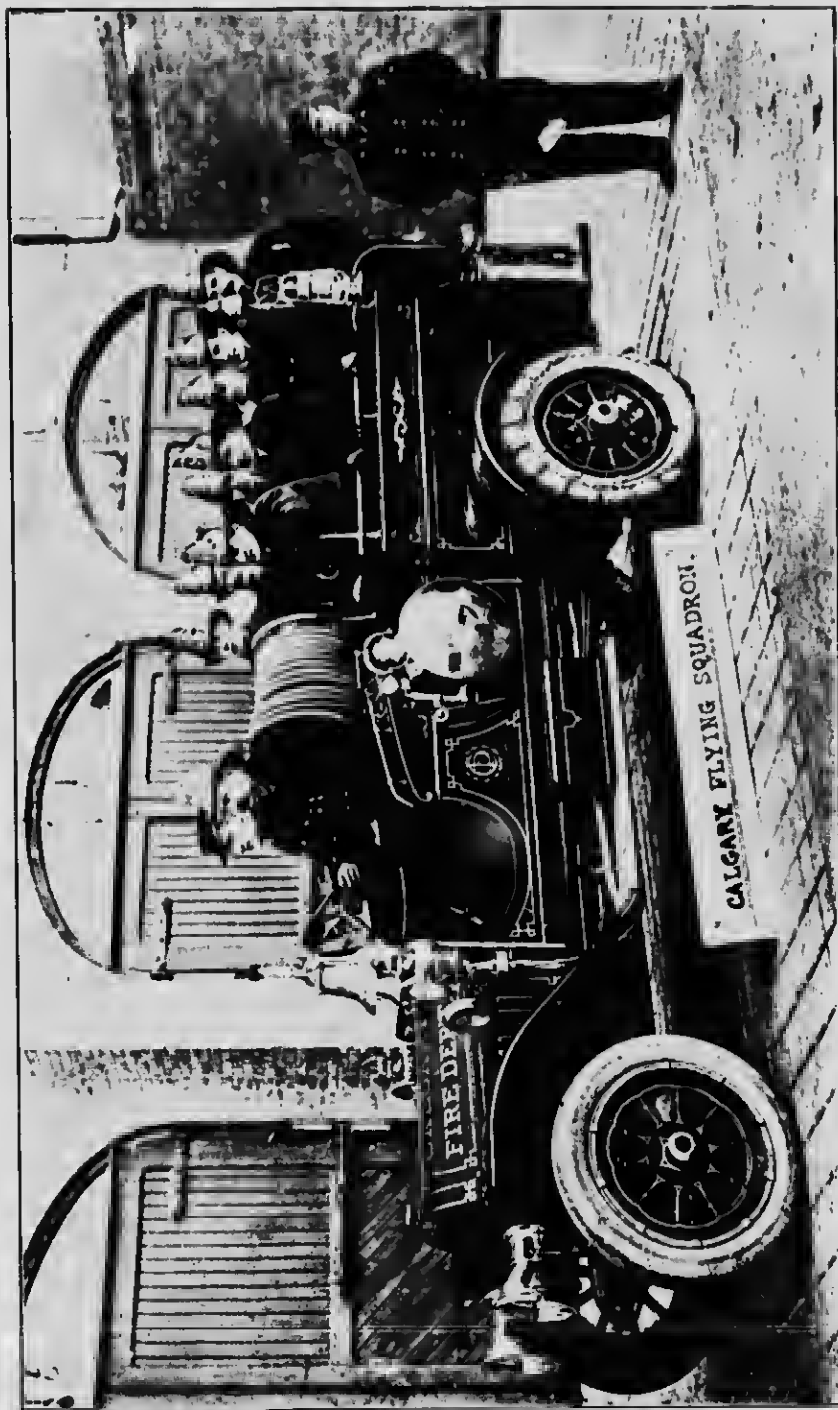

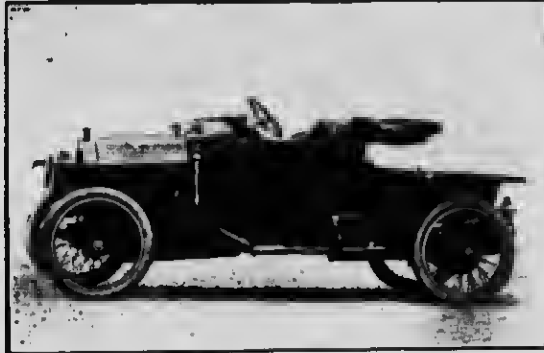

It was then decided unanimously to organize under the name of The Calgary Firemen's Benefit Association.

The object of the Association is to create, maintain and disburse a fund for benevolent purposes among its members.

Automatic up-to-date alarm system installed with 1300 lb. bell.

1903—New uniforms purchased for brigade at cost of about \$600.00 out of their own funds. Four more boxes added to alarm system and chemical extinguishers added to each rig. An order was made this year that two or three firemen should attend at the Opera House during performances to guard against accident.

1904—Recommendations made to the Council for a double chemical engine, new up-to-date hose wagon, new fire engine, and fire stations south of track and east of Elbow River, all of which were carried out.

On January 15th—a bitterly cold night—the Fire Department was called out to fight what proved to be a most disastrous fire. The fire started in the two-storey stone building, known as the Norman Block, and owned by Hon. J. A. Langheed. Considering the poor water pressure, and the breaking down of the pumps at the pumping station, the firemen had a difficult proposition, but stopped what might have proved a conflagration.

On December 10th a double 60 gal. chemical and standard hose wagon were received and added to the equipment of the department.

1905—The most serious fire of this year occurred on the cold, stormy evening of February 8th, the thermometer registering 49 below zero.

On March 14th a Waterous engine of 800 gal. capacity was added to the department, and on June 26th a Seagrave aerial truck and a standard hose wagon were received and put into commission.

1906—On January 4th the department was asked for assistance from the town of High River, which was threatened. A special train was in waiting at the station, and the Waterous engine, 2,000 feet of hose and 12 men, under Chief Smart, were sent inside of an hour after receiving the word. Water had to be pumped from the river, and after three hours' hard work the apparatus was again loaded and returned to the City.

July 10th gave Calgary a substantial reduction in insurance rates. The table of the old and new rates was as follows:

On August 28th the 14th annual convention of the Pacific Coast Association of Fire Chiefs was held in the City of Calgary, delegates being present from as far west as California, and east to Port Arthur.

1907—This year was one of Calgary's fortunate years, no serious fires having occurred. The total loss for the year was kept down to \$37,378, while the total risk amounted to \$756,215.

Nothing of an unusual nature transpired in the life of the department.

1908—In March of this year six new full paid men were added to the department.

The most disastrous fire during the year occurred on Friday, September 25th, at 6:20 p.m. The fire was raging fiercely in a three-storey brick factory building of the Standard Soap Works, East Calgary. The general alarm was sounded, and after about two hours' hard fighting the fire was got under control. By the efforts of the brigade the fire was kept confined to the east end of the factory, where a large quantity of tallow, grease and resin was stored.

1909—In this year great advancement and improvements were made towards the fire protection of the City.

In the month of May the new gravity system of water supply was turned on, which was a great relief to the citizens in general. The water is brought eleven miles through 30 in. flume, to a reservoir on the hill west of the City. This reservoir has a capacity of 16,000,000 gals. This, combined with the pumps at the pumping station, which have a capacity of about 5,000,000 gals., gives the City one of the best plants in Canada, and the best water in the world, both for fire extinguishing and quenching thirst.

During the latter part of the year three new Sub-Stations were erected and a full paid department was inaugurated in December.

The largest fire during the year occurred on January 2nd, at the Western Milling Co.'s elevator, East Calgary. It was a bitter cold night and an all night job. The elevator was a total loss, but the mill and other buildings were saved.

1910—On February 10th two car loads of fire apparatus were received, consisting of one Motor Chemical, one Combination Wagon and four Hose Wagons, which were then all duly installed at sub-stations in Riverside, Mount Royal and Hillhurst. The Motor Chemical was kept at Headquarters, for the purpose of responding to all fires in the city, carrying eight men to re-enforce outside stations.

The installing of one of the most up-to-date alarm systems was also completed, consisting of one six-circuit Gamewell switchboard, one six-circuit repeater and twelve additional alarm boxes, making in all

fifty-six boxes. These are placed to advantage throughout the City, and are indicated by a red incandescent light, suspended from the pole.

The most serious fire so far during the present year occurred at the elevators of the Calgary Milling Co., at 2:45 a.m. April 14th, and one elevator was almost totally destroyed, but the department saved almost \$40,000 salvage to the owners.

On August 10th the Milling Co. were again unfortunate in having to call the services of the department, this time for a fire in the large flouring mill and warehouse. The building was a good save; but there was considerable damage to goods.

.. Facts about Calgary ..



CALGARY is the commercial centre of 50,000,000 acres of rich farm, grazing, timber and coal lands, the development of which has hardly begun.

Calgary is the headquarters of the five Alberta Associations of cattle, horse, poultry, sheep and swine breeders, holding annual shows and auction sales of pure bred cattle. The Horse Show of 1909 had over 600 entries, and in 1910 there were 900 entries.

Calgary has four grain elevators, capacity 657,900 bushels. Her four flour mills have a daily capacity of 1,457 barrels.

The average yield per bushel per acre for the Calgary district, 1909, was: Spring wheat 25, winter wheat 25, oats 40, and barley 25. Wheat frequently yields 35 to 45 bushels and oats 75 to 100 bushels per acre. Alberta oats are from 4 to 12 pounds over legal weight.

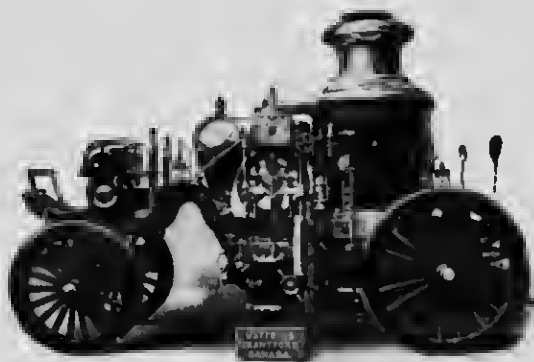

Calgary has a large oatmeal and breakfast food factory, daily capacity 300 barrels of cereals.

Fifteen elevator companies have their head offices at Calgary and operate 147 elevators throughout Alberta.

Thirty-one farm implement and machine companies have wholesale warehouses in Calgary, employing 175 travelling salesmen.

Calgary has three meat cold storage plants and one meat packing plant, which has invested over \$1,000,000, employs 125 men in Calgary, has a daily capacity of 400 cattle, 2,000 sheep and 2,500 hogs, and has fifty retail stores throughout the West.

In the Calgary district horses and cattle run throughout the year on the open range. Pure water and invigorating air, abundant fodder and freedom from disease render this district the natural breeding ground of champion stock.

The Alberta Provincial Exhibition will be held in Calgary June 30th to July 7th, 1910. \$60,000 will be expended. Average attendance 1008 and 1000, 80,000.

The Canadian Pacific Railway Company have spent \$5,000,000 to irrigate 1,500,000 acres of land east of Calgary, moving 45,750,000 cubic yards of material from 2,000 miles of ditches, and will spend \$12,000,000 more in extending and completing the works. This is America's Greatest Irrigation Project. The Company purpose making this the most densely settled agricultural district in Canada; estimated value of its future business to Calgary \$50,000,000 (gross) per year.

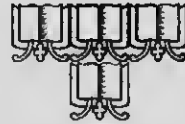

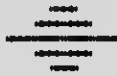

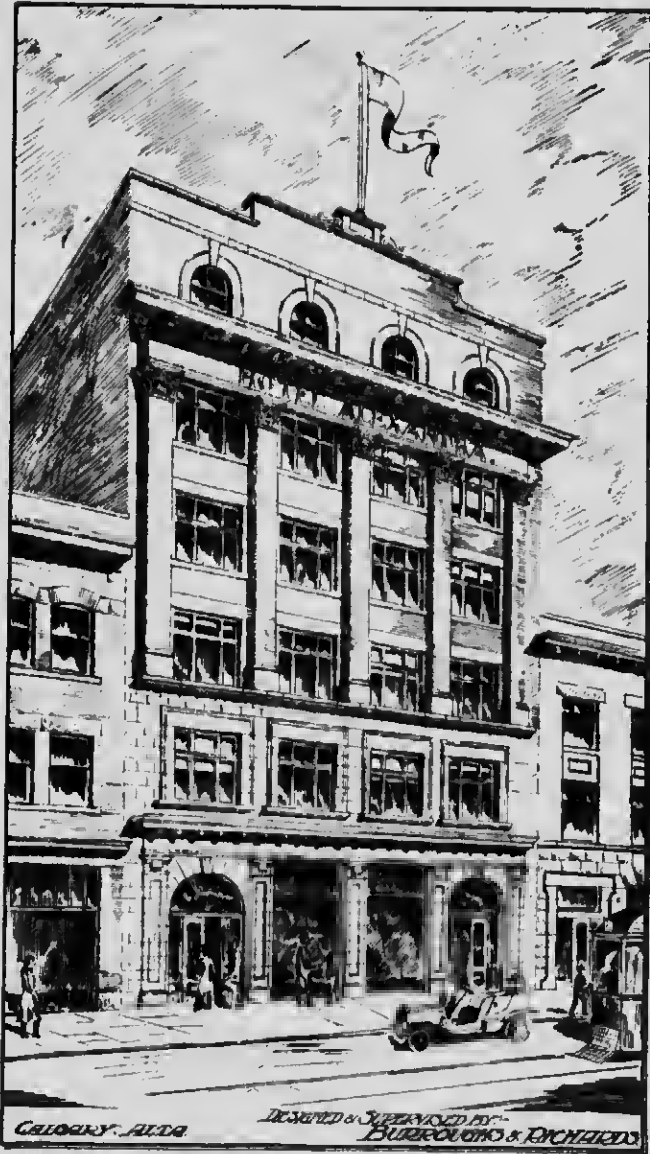

The Calgary Grain Exchange, incorporated in 1909, has eighty members, seats \$500 each.

The City of Calgary maintains a produce market, market days being Wednesday and Saturday. More market gardeners are needed.

Farm lands within easy hauling distance of Calgary can be purchased from \$15 to \$30 per acre, and market gardens from \$50 to \$100 per acre.

AMUSEMENTS.

Calgary has two theatres and five vaudeville houses.

All the Canadian inland sports and games are enjoyed at Calgary, except those which require snow. Riding, driving and motoring are popular pastimes at all seasons of the year.

In the Calgary district there is excellent shooting for wild duck, geese and prairie chicken, while the streams abound in trout. In the neighboring Rockies big game is plentiful.

Week-end excursions are run during the summer to the Rocky Mountains' Park of Canada, and many Calgarians there enjoy bathing in the Hot Springs, boating and mountain climbing. Sixteen members of the Alpine Club of Canada reside in Calgary.

Calgary has many social organizations devoted to amateur theatricals, cards, dancing, debates, literary and scientific pursuits and music.

AREA.

The city of Calgary covers twelve square miles, or 1,680 acres, and is three miles from north to south and five miles from east to west.

Calgary has 130 miles of streets, 47 miles of granolithic sidewalks, 20 miles of plank sidewalks, six miles of boulevards, 44 miles of sewers, eight miles of pavements, and 49 miles of water mains, exclusive of a complete gravity system.

ATHLETICS.

Amateur sports in Calgary are controlled by the Calgary Amateur Athletic Association.

Calgary has 48 athletic clubs, with 1,455 members, holding many championships, including the Association Football Championship of Canada, 1907, 1908, and 1909.

BUILDINGS.

Calgary is sometimes called "The Sandstone City," on account of the abundance and excellence of this stone for building purposes.

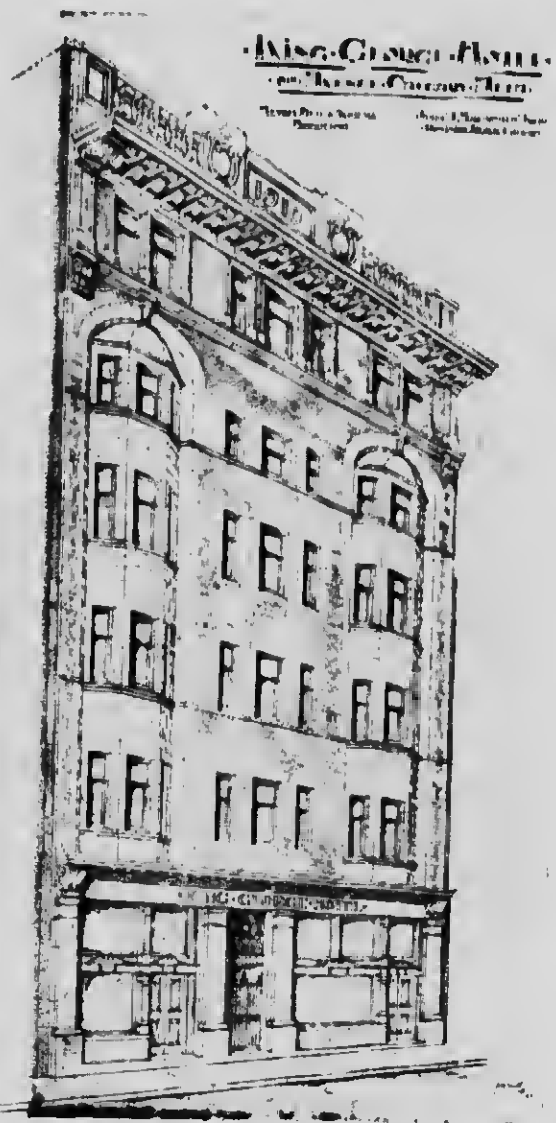

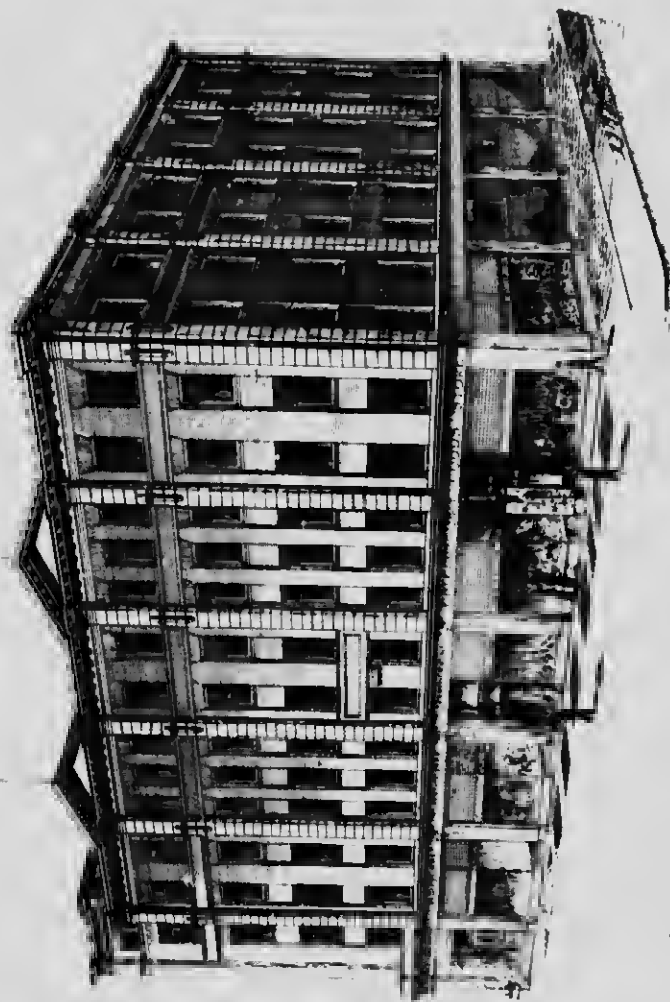

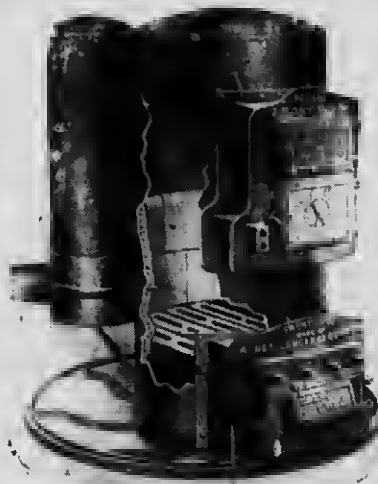

Some of the principal buildings in Calgary, completed or now under construction, are: City Hall, \$200,000; Normal School, \$150,000; High School, \$85,000; Canadian Pacific Railway Depot, \$225,000; Land Titles Office, \$150,000; Court House, \$225,000; Grain Exchange Building, \$150,000; Globe Elevator, \$150,000; Exhibition Buildings, \$100,000; Post Office, \$145,000; Y.M.C.A., \$95,000; Carnegie Library, \$70,000; Y.W.C.A., \$50,000.

777 building permits were issued in Calgary, 1909; total, \$2,904,542. These were for fifteen wholesale warehouses, fifty-two business blocks and 617 residences.

Calgary needs more stores, more offices, and more houses.

Calgary has five stone quarries, six brick yards and forty building contractors. More are needed.

Calgary has a large Portland Cement Factory, representing an investment of \$750,000 and employing 180 men.

Calgary has four planing mills, one of which covers an area of 10 acres and employs 110 men.

Calgary has a lumber mill deriving its power from the Bow River, capacity 10,000,000 feet per year.

SITUATION.

Calgary is 3,380 feet above sea level.

Calgary is in the same latitude as Southampton, England, and Brussels, Belgium. It is south of London, England, and Berlin, Germany, and is 600 miles south of St. Petersburg, Russia.

The mean temperature at Calgary for the last ten years has been: Spring, 36.2; summer, 56.9; autumn, 39.9; winter, 18.5. Mean annual, 37.9.

July is the warmest month in Calgary; average for the last ten years, 60.1. February is the coldest month, average for the same time being 14.7.

The average annual rainfall at Calgary for the last ten years has been 19.43 inches, of which 15.88 inches fell during the crop season.

Summer days in Calgary are very long, warm and sunny. The nights are short, cool and restful.

In 1909 Calgary had 286 sunny days, and 85 cloudy days.

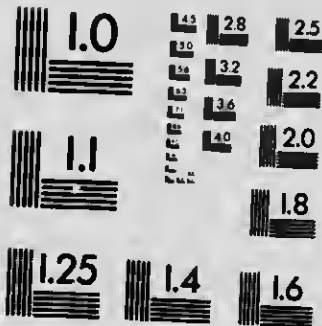
