

## REPORT, &c.

## To their Worship the Magistrates in Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace assembled:

The Committee appointed by an order of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at London in and for the District of London on the 11th day of April 1837-for the purpose of enquiring into and reporting to your honourable Bench, upon the several Acts of the Legislature, and orders of Sessions relative to fees payable to the different Officers of this Court, and to recommend a Table of Fees for adoption, submit their report—and before enturing into the subject matter referred to them, beg to state the reasons

which have delayed their earlier action upon the said order.-

On assuming the duties assigned your Committee, they found it necessary to refer to the Provincial Statutes, and orders of the Court of Quarter Sessions relating to Fees authorized to be taken by the several officers of your Honourable Court; and the Acts of Parliament for the previous Session not having been received, which contained important provisions coming within the Enquiries of your Committee, and a press of Public business of more immediate importance claiming their attention; prevented them from reporting during the two succeeding Sessions; from which time, the disturbed state of the Country, added to an unusual press of Public business, have prevented your Committee from bringing their labour to an earlier conclusion.

On referring to the Records of this District your Committee and that in January Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Vittoria in January 1821, a Table of es was established by the Magistrates upon the submission by the Clerk Clerks of the Poace in the & gara, Gore, and Home Districts, and an order the Peace of several Papers obtained from the of the same Session was passed directing the charges against this District,

and parties litigant should be made accordingly.

Your Committee have also examined a large number of Bills of Costs and accounts against the District (submitted by the Clerk of the Peace for a period of nearly eighteen years) and find a most rigid observance has been had to the said order, and to acts of Parliament authorising fees: and they do not observe in any one instance, a departure therefrom.

Your committee also find that an allowance of £17 per annum, was granted in lieu of Stationary & Fuel, which continued to be charged against the Funds of the district, until the April Court of General Quarter Sessions, 1835, when an order passed extending the said allowance to the sum of £25 per annum, which order is at present acted upon.

Your Committee likewise find the sum of £17 per annum has been granted to the same officer for transcribing all the lands in detail, which are returned by the several Assessors of Townships, for the Treasurer's Office; a

service which your Committee consider very inadequately paid.

Your Committee also find by an order of the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at London in January 1831 a Table of Fees was established authorising the Clerk of the Peace to receive from all applicants for Tavern Licences the sum of eleven shillings Cy. for the performance of the following services required by Law previously to obtaining Licence (that is to say) for taking recognizance five shillings, for copy of Regulations two shillings and six pence and for certificate, that Becognizance has been entered into, two shillings and six pence.

Upon a close examination of the accounts against the District, your committee do not perceive any deviation from the Charges established by Statute or Orders of Court of General Quarter Sessions, with the exception of some small matters of claim which may be considered as incidental to circumstances, and of which your Committee conceive the Court could as well judge of, for form an opinion, as at any other period—that for the year of 1836 and 1837, the Clerk of the Peace received the sum of £186 1 9½ each year—and for 1838 the sum of £187 17 6, as for his current charges against the District in the opinion of your Committee a very limited remuneration for the extent of services performed as compared with other Districts.

The Sheriff of the District has been paid his account annually by order of the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for Services performed for the District, as set forth in the Table of Fees Established by the Honourable the Judges of the Court of King's Bench, and by orders of Sessions,—and for the transmission of Prisoners, under sentence to the Penitentiary at Kingston, the Expenses actually disbursed, and a fixed allowance for guards, graduated according to the number of Prisoners in charge, has hitherto been

paid.

The Coroner has heretofore been allowed the sum of two pounds tenshillings for taking each inquisition. Your Committee recommend these services hereafter be paid according to the scale or Tariff of Fees as annexed.

The Treasurer has by Law a rate of per centage on all monies passing through his hands (4 per cent) with the exception of Road Grants—also the sum of £5 for each return of absentee lands, and an allowance in money is made to him in lieu of Stationary equal to the actual disbursments.

The Crier of the Court by the order of the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace passed in April 1832, is allowed the sum of £25 per annum.—His salary prior to that date, was fixed at £20, but owing to the increase of duties of his situation it was found necessary to pay him a small additional allowance.

1831, the sum of £20 per annum. Your Committee recommend the sum of £25 per annum to be hereafter paid to that officer.

The Gaoler receives by order of Sessions under authority of the 32 Geo. 3 Ch. 8, the sum of £100 per annum. In extreme cases of difficulty a turn key & assistants have been allowed their claims, on being submitted and shewn to the satisfaction of the Court of General Qr. Sessions such to have been required.

A Medical attendant on the Prisoners in the Gaol has been allowed the sum of £25 per annum by order of the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace in April, 1836. Prior to that period, that Gentleman received the sum of £20.

Your Committee find that the mode heretofore adopted for the payment of constables services have been both irregular and inconvenient and to obviate further difficulties, have formed a scale of fees which your committee believe

will embrace every description of service required.

Your Committee invite the attention of your honourable Court to the circumstances that this District will, in a very short period, be limited to the County of Middlesex, which will materially reduce the income of the several District officers without a corresponding relief from their most important duties. this will more seriously effect the Clerk of the Peace who will necessarily be compelled to devote his time and attention daily to the business of the District in addition to the employment of a Clerk.

Your Committee believe that your Honorable Court will unite with them in opinion, that the several officers of the District should be sufficiently but not extravagantly paid for all services performed for public or District purposes. With this principle in view they have recommended such a scale or Tariff of Fees, as they trust will meet with the concurrence of your honorable Court—and in conclusion your Committee append a Table or Scale of Fees, shewing the sums to be hereafter paid, and chargeable against the funds of the District.

## Report on Petition, &c.

To their Worships the Magistrates of the District of London Assembled in General Quarter Sessions of the Peace in April 1839.

BY ORDER, 12th of April, 1839, a printed Petition to the Magistrates, bearing the Subscription of John Burwell, J. P. was referred to a Committee to examine and Report, and by two orders of 13th April, the same Petition with further signatures

The reference to your Committee is confined to the duty of examining into the allegations contained in the Petition, which would render irrelevant any observations your Committee were otherwise disposed to make on the means taken to circulate the

Your Committee find as stated in the Petition, that 27 Magistrates were present at. the April General Quarter Sessions for 1837, and that a Committee of 7 was appointed to agree upon a Scale of Fees, and to report, also that the Chairman made out some Extracts of Fees, but these on reference were found to be incorrect by the Committee and afforded them no assistance in the prosecution of their labours.

Your Committee have called before them and examined Mr. Whitehead the Chairman of the Committee on the Table of Fees, who has stated several reasons for the delay which has occurred, and which he has informed your Committee are entered at full length in a report from that Committee about to be presented.

But whatever may have been the conduct of the Committee on Fees, your Committee cannot but condemn the strong language made use of in the Petition, as regards the want of a Table of Fees; a measure adopted in all Courts merely as matter of convenience, that the time of those appointed to examine accounts, may not be unnecessarily taken up in discussing charges for duties of every day occurence, for whether there be

When therefore your Committee look at the pompous verbosity of the 1st and 2d. Reasons, stating the acknowledged truism of the pure source of Justice and the necessity for its equal administration, and find it gravely stated that the purity of the stream may be sullied, or the balance of the Beam destroyed by the discussion, whether a constable shall be paid 6d or 4d per mile for apprehending a thief, your Committee think that Mr. Burwell has arrived at a "most lame and impotent conclusion."

As regards the 4th Reason, taken by itself the accusation is too general to admit of examination. If the Bench permit the Clerk of the Peace to dictate to them, that Officer becomes the master instead of the servant of the Court, and in Justice to the Individual now holding that important station, your Committee feel bound to record their high opinion of his useful services, and to repudiate the idea of any attempt on his part, so far as is consistent with their own experience "to use the authority of the Bench as a Cloak."

In prosecuting their enquiry on the 5th Reason your Committee having called Mr. Burwell before them, find that the order for £186 was paid to the Clerk of the Peace by the recommendation of the Committee of accounts in April 1837, on application from that Officer that he had not then time to make up his accounts, and the amount of the previous year was fixed upon as the guide. Your Committee have examined the members of that Committee, who all state that Mr. Burwell as one of their number concurred in the recommendation. This statement is denied by Mr. Burwell, who asserts that he protested against the order on the ground, that payment of certain Extra services had been made in the previous year, which could not occur again, and that consideration was not had of this circumstance in the payment recommended by the Committee of accounts. Your Committee are of opinion on the evidence brought before them, that Mr. Burwell's assertion is entitled to no credit, and is contradicted by the written and oral testimony before them; Mr. Whitehead the Chairman of that Committee expressly states that the amount was to be subject to revision on production of the accounts in detail.

Your Committee do not conceive any further remark necessary, and in concluding their report have to state that the two charges made against the Bench are in their opinion frivolous and vexatious, and even supposing them not to be so, Mr. Burwell was a member of the Committee on the Table of Fees, and of that for the account of 1837, which passed the order mentioned in the 5th Reason; this must throw upon himself a portion of the blame he is so anxious should be entirely borne by others of the Magistracy.
