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
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




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The Supreme Court of Canada.

The Supreme Court holds three sessions annually, beginning as follows : The third Tuesday in February, the first Tuesday in May, and the first Tuesday in October.

Date of Autumn Session, 1900.....Tuesday, 2nd Oct. Last day for filing cases.......Tuesday, 11th Sept. Last day for depositing factum...Saturday, 15th Sept. Last day for inscribing appeal Monday, 17th Sept.

The Court of Appeal for Ontario.

There are five sittings of the Court held eacl: year, at such times as the Judges may from time to time appoint. The dates now fixed are the first Tuesday in March and September, and the second Tuesday in January, May and November.

By 7 Will. IV., c. 2, a Chancery Court was established for Upper Canada, of which the Governor of the Province was Chancellor, the judicial power being exercised by a Judge, known as the Vice-Chancellor. By 12 Vic., ch. 64, the appointment of a Chancellor and two Vice-Chancellors was authorized.

Hon. William Hume Blake.—Born in Ireland on 10th March, 1809; called to the Bar 14th February, 1838; appointed Chancellor 29th September, 1849; retired 18th March, 1862; appointed to Court of Error and Appeal 12th March, 1864; died 17th Nov., 1870.

Hon. Philip M. M. S. Van Koughnet.—Born at Cornwall, Ontario, 26th January, 1823; called to the Bar 8th November, 1843; appointed Chancellor 19th March, 1862; died 7th November, 1869.

Hon. John Godfrey Spragge.—See under Chief Justices Court of Appea¹.

Hon. Sir John Alexander Boyd.—Born at Torento, on 23rd April, 1837; called to the Bar 16th November, 1863; appointed Chancellor 3rd May, 1881; still acting.

Hon. Robert Sympson Jameson.—Born in England, about 1800; called to the English Bar in 1823, and to the Canadian Bar 24th June, 1833; appointed to the Bench 23rd March, 1837; died in 1854. (V. C. Jameson was the first Judge of a Court of Chancery in Upper Canada).

Hon. James C. P. Esten. –Born at Island of Ber. muda; called to the Bar 11th June, 1838, (having been previously admitted to the English Bar); appointed to the Bench 29th September, 1849; died 29th October, 1864.

Hon. John Godfrey Spragge.—See under Chief Justices Court of Appeal.

Hon. Oliver Mowat.—Born at Kingston, on 22nd July, 1820; called to the Bar 13th November, 1841; appointed to the Bench 14th November, 1864; resigned 26th October, 1872.

Hon. Samuel Henry Strong.—See under Chief Justices Supreme Court.

Hon. Samuel Hume Blake.—Born at Toronto, on 31st August, 1835; called to the Bar 6th February, 1860; appointed to the Bench 2nd December, 1872; resigned 15th May, 1881.

Hon. William Proudfoot.—Born in Perthsbire, Scotland, on 9th November, 1823; called to the Bar 13th November, 1849; appointed to the Bench 30th May, 1874; resigned 8th May, 1890; living in Toronto.

Hon. Thomas Ferguson. — Born at Rockside, Ontario, on 31st October, 1838; called to the Bar 1st September, 1863; appointed to the Bench 24th May, 1881; still acting.

Hon. Thomas Robertson.—Born at Ancaster, Ontario, on 25th June, 1827; called to the Bar 2nd February, 1852; appointed to the Bench 11th Feb. ruary, 1887; still acting.

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COURT OF CHANCERY

Hon. Richard Martin Meredith.—Born at London, on 27th March, 1847; called to the Bar 15th May, 1876; appointed to the Bench 1st October, 1890; still acting.

High Court of Justice for Ontario.

By 44 Vic., c. 5, O. the Courts of Queen's Bench, Common Pleas, and Chancery, were consolidated and continued as Divisions of the High Court of Justice for Ontario. Subsequently, the Divisions were done away with, but seem to still exist for the appointment of Judges, and possibly for other purposes.
