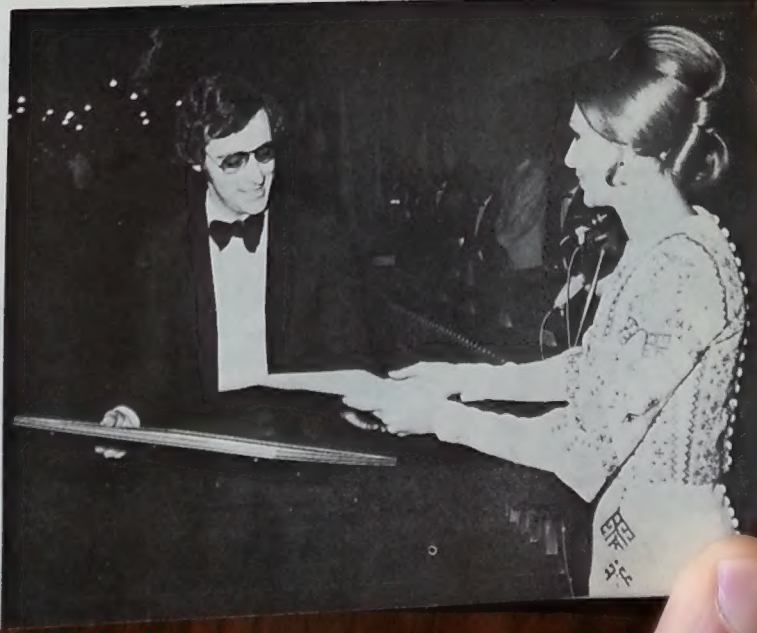

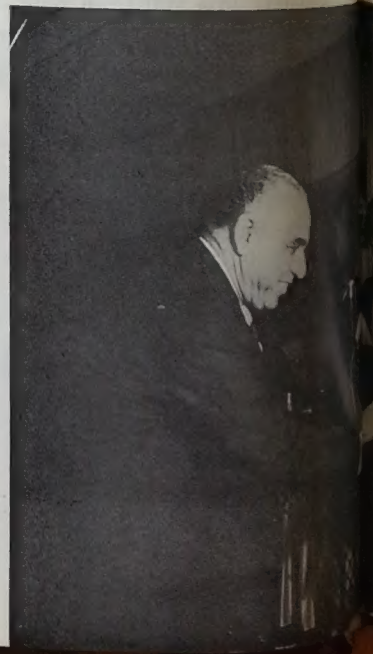

GALA END FOR A SUCCESSFUL FESTIVAL

The first Tehran International Film Festival was concluded here last night with a grand gala at the Arya-Sheraton Hotel. The gala was attended by Her Imperial Majesty Empress Farah.

An international jury consisting of distinguished personalities from 11 countries announced its decision on the 19 feature-length film and 10 short films shown as part of the festival's official competition programme.

The Russian version of Shakespeare's «King Lear» won the awards for best feature film and best actor at the close of the festival.

Empress Farah handed out the prizes at the gala the income from which will be allocated to the earthquake relief fund.

«King Lear», directed by Grigori Kozintsev won the Grand Prix of the Winged-Ibex Statuette for the best film in the absolute sense. In awarding the prize to the Soviet film the jury said that it had won by a large majority and was «memorable» not only for being a superb transcription of one of Shakespeare's greatest and most and most difficult works but also for the masterly orchestration of all the resources of cinema.

The Winged Ibex Plaque for the best actor went to the principal actor in «King Lear», Yuri Yarvet. It was unanimously awarded to Yarvet for his «subtle and deeply moving portrayal of King Lear».

The awards were accepted by Vladimir Golovnia, a deputy mi-

nister of cinematography and head of the Soviet delegation to the first TIFF.

The Grand Prix of the Winged-Ibex Statuette for the best short film shown at the competition section of the festival went to India's «Vilaap» directed by Surendar Chaudhary.

The jury praised it for its «remarkable qualities of poetry and imagination.»

Young Iranian director Bahram Bayzai was awarded the special jury prize, the Winged-Ibex Plaque for his first feature-film «Ragbar» (Rain Storm) of which he also wrote the screenplay.

Bayzai's film was praised for its «skilfull and humourous approach to an authentic and human subject» and for being a notable first work by a director of considerable promise.

American film star Jane Fonda who won the Oscar for her role as a call-girl in the American film «Klute», was again chosen best actress here for her brilliant and deeply felt performance.

The award for best direction went to Italy's Damiano Damiani for his film «The Preliminary Proceeding is Closed : Forget.» The jury singled out Damiani for his effective and courageous treatment of an important social theme.

The special jury prize for short films went to the Swiss film «Iran» directed by Jacques Pinoteau. The jury said that it was a most effective evocation of Iran by an observant and sympathetic outsider.

Diplomas of honour were awarded to the Canadian short film «Epilogue» directed by Bill Pettigrew;

the French film «Voyage en Camardie» directed by Lucien Clergue; the first Kuwaiti feature-film «The Cruel Sea» directed by Khalid Siddiq and Nina Companeez's first feature-film «Faustine et le bel Ete» from France.

Muriel Catala, the leading actress in «Faustine . . .» collected the award on behalf of Miss Companeez.

The jury also made special mentions of the performance of Iranian actor Parviz Fannizadeh as a downtown Tehran teacher in «Rain Storm» and Egyptian actress Fatten Hamama for her role in «Love and Position.»

The jury's decisions were announced by its President Abdol Majid Majidi who is Iran's Minister of Labour and Social Affairs and the President of the High Council of Arts here.

The gala was attended by Prime Minister Amir Abbas Hoveyda, Court Minister Assadollah Alam, Foreign Minister Abbas Ali Khalatbari, Ministtr of Culture and Arts Mehrdad Pahlbod and a large number of other top officials in addition to festival guests from abroad and film-makers, actors, actresses and film critics of Iran.

Before the gala began Empress Farah received members of the festival's central council in audience.

Her Imperial Majesty, accompanied by H.E. Pahlbod, then arrived at the Emerald Hall of the hotel where she hear H.E. Majidi's report on the work of the jury and the results of the festival.

The National Iranian Orchestra and Ballet Company later offered an entertainment programme in the presence of Her Imperial Majesty.

DIPLOMA FOR FAUSTINE — Empress Farah presents a diploma of honour to Muriel Catala who played the leading role in «Faustine and the beautiful summer» on behalf of the festival jury. Miss Catala received the prize on behalf of the film's director Nina Companeez.

THE FOLLOWING IS THE FULL TEXT OF SPEECH MADE BY H.E. ABDOL MAJID MAJIDI, PRESIDENT OF THE TIFF JURY

The Jury of the First Tehran International Film Festival, composed of Salah Abou-seif (Egypt), Grigori Chukhrai (U.S.S.R.), Thorold Dickinson (United Kingdom), Imre Gyongyossey (Hungary), Kashino Kawakita (Japan), Michael Kutza (U.S.A.), Alberto Lattuada (Italy), Satyajit Ray (India), Paulo Emilio Sales Gomes (Brazil), Odile Versois (France) and presided over by Abdol-Majid Majidi (Iran) viewed 10 short and 19 feature films in competition from 20 countries.

Films came from countries with a long tradition of film-making such as U.S.A., U.K., U.S.S.R., Japan and France. There were also welcome glimpses of new and recently emerged national cinemas.

In judging the films the Jury kept in mind the expressed aim of the Festival, which was to point out films not only for their artistic excellence but also, for the quality of humanism as revealed in their content.

In the Short Films Category the Jury wished to see a greater number of high quality films in competition.

Directed by Khaled Siddik

for the human merits of this film, which is not only a first work by its director but also the first feature film ever produced in Kuwait.

for its being a remarkable directorial-debut.
