

PREFACE.

The stranger, or the citizen, who reverently and carefully walks among the ancient graves, on "The Burying Hill," at Plymouth, Mass., may read upon a memorial stone that marks the grave of one of the fathers, the following inscription:

"Here lies buried ye body of Mr. Thomas Clark, aged 98 years. Departed this life March 24, 1697."

From this man, whose mortal resting place is thus kept in remembrance, and who severed the instinctive ties that bound him to his native land, and left, forever, all the sacred associations of boyhood that clustered around his home in the old world, to assist in laying the foundation of a great republic in the new, an extensive and intelligent race have sprung, if not like the descendants of Abraham, numerous as the "stars of heaven," yet great in numbers, and great in influence, as the following pages will show.

From the hardy and pious ancestors, who established themselves, in hardship, in hunger, in peril and in toil, on the wild and comparatively sterile shores of New England, many distinguished families have descended, but not many of these can show a better record than the descendants of the mate of the Mayflower. Owing to the location of these descendants, in close proximity to the sea, many of them, like their great ancestor, have spent life in the midst of ocean perils, but among them, all the varied avocations of life are well represented, the learned professions prominently appear, and art and science, in all their extensive domain, have but few abler advocates.

In presenting this work to the numerous descendants of Thomas Clarke, of Plymouth, whose records are contained herein, the compiler desires to call attention to a few facts in connection with the work.

In 1869, Mr. Samuel C. Clarke, now of Marietta, Ga., issued from the press of D. Clapp & Son, of Boston, Mass., a genealogical pamphlet compiled with great research and care, entitled, "Records of some of the Descendants of Thomas Clarke, Plymouth, 1623–1697."

In the year 1881, a desire was expressed by several of the descendants, for a revision and continuation of the work, and a correspondence arose between Mr. Clarke and the present compiler, by which an arrangement was made that the latter should undertake the work, Mr. Clarke generously offering him the pamphlet above referred to as the basis of a new work, assuring him, also, that he would aid him in the collection of new rec-

ords. In accordance with this arrangement the work was commenced, and the first eighteen pages of the said pamphlet, almost entire, will appear in the new work. During the past two years the compiler has put forth persevering efforts to collect, in a thorough manner, the records of the numerous branches of this great family, and he desires to say that he has received hearty co-operation and assistance from many who have manifested a deep interest in the movement, and, without personal mention, would extend his sincere thanks to all such, and to those, also, who have made the work interesting by liberally contributing the means to illustrate it with valuable portraits.

The general arrangement of the work is the same as the arrangement in the pamphlet of Mr. Clarke. Genealogical works have become numerous, and they appear in different forms, but the compiler has seen no form that he prefers to this.

The records are presented in the order of the generations, and families of the same generation appear in connection in the book. The descendants are numbered in the regular order of descent, from the first to the last, and this descendant number is found on the right hand side of the page; and when any descendant becomes the head of a family the descendant number is placed before the name of that person, in connection with his family record, on the left hand side, and in its new location may appropriately be called the family number. Thus, if the reader desires to know anything more of a descendant in a future direction, he will turn forward until he finds his descendant number on the left; or, if he desires to see the record of the family of this descendant's father, he will note his family number and turn back until he finds this number on the right. Thus the book, in its general arrangement, is an index to itself.

The compiler designs to give the birthplace and parentage of each descendant, not by having these facts appear with his name in connection with his own family record, but by referring to the record of his father's family, especially when the children were all born in the same place. But there are some instances where birthplace was not given, and of course must be omitted. There are difficulties connected with the production of a genealogical work, which none, but those who have had experience in it, can fully know. The information, especially the later records, must be obtained by correspondence. Many letters must be written. Some will be promptly answered while others will remain unanswered, and a second, and sometimes a third, must be sent before the desired information comes. if it comes at all. Meanwhile the compiler hopefully, and patiently, must wait. With all the care and scrutiny that he can command to make the dates correct, there still will be some errors. Different members of the same family have sent to the compiler different birthdates of the same person. One of these must be used, it may be the right one, or it may be the wrong

one, he must use his own discretion and let it pass in that way.

It may be appropriate to express a thought in regard to the spelling of the Clark name. By some of the descendants of the same ancestor it is spelled with the final *e*, and by others without it. Even the name of Thomas Clarke is spelled both ways. On his gravestone it appears without the final *e*, also in the name of Clark's Island. But this different spelling is not confined to the Clark name alone. Burk, Kirk, Wild, Wait, Brown, and others are spelled with the final *e*, as well as without it, and yet the identity of the name is not questioned. It seems to be a matter of taste more than of essentiality.

In this work, the female branches of descent are traced, as fully and as extensively as the male branches. The descendants of a female ancestor, not bearing the patronymic name, are considered worthy of the same attention, as the descendants of a male ancestor But, without discussing the question in regard to the propriety of tracing the female lines in a genealogical work, we would refer our readers to the able discussion of this question, by Dr. D. P. Holton in his preface to the Winslow Memorial, Vol. I.

The compiler is not a Clark descendant, but his children are Clark descendants; and he takes a deep interest in the work, and has neglected no means that would help to crown it with success. And he desires and expects, that the intelligent, the educated, the generous hearted, and the wealthy, whose records are found in the book, will give their patronage to it, to such an extent as will enable him to receive back the amount of money, which he has expended in the publication of the same, but for the persevering labor which he has bestowed, he expects nothing but the satisfaction of having given to the world the records of a race, ranking high among the descendants of a sterling and pious ancestry, who rescued New England from its pristine wildness, and made it the land of the free, and the home of the brave.

THOMAS CLARKE.*

The question whether Thomas Clarke, of Plymouth, 1623-1697; was one of the officers of the Mayflower in 1620, cannot now be settled with any certainty. General tradition among the descendants of the pilgrims, and particular tradition among the descendants of Thomas Clarke, bear testimony in the affirmative.

Thacher, one of the early historians of Plymouth, who was brought up among the descendants of the pilgrims, says of Thomas Clarke: "It is a well-received tradition that this ancient man was the mate of the Mayflower, and the one who first anded on the island which bears his name. It may be conectured that he was considered merely an officer of the ship, and that he returned to England in her with Capt. Jones, and subsequently came over and settled in this town."—Hist. of Plymouth, 2d ed., p. 168.

In confirmation of this tradition, we find in Palfrey's History f New England (Vol. I., p. 171): "This land (on which the ilgrims first landed), was Clark's Island, in Plymouth harbor, aid by Morton to have been afterwards so named from the nate of the Mayflower."

Nathaniel Clarke, grandson of Thomas Clarke, of Plymouth,

Notes on the Mayflower.—Rev. Joseph Hunter, of London, in his "Founders of ew Plymouth" (London, 1854), mentions many vessels of this name in the Irth pntury—eight between 1618 and 1648. In the latter year, a vessel of this name, of o tons burden, was engaged in the slave trade between London, Africa and the est Indies. The Mayflower which brought the pilgrims, in 1620, was of only 180 ns burden, and she brought over another company of emigrants to Charleston, 1630. It is true, as charged by some, that the Mayflower was a slave-trader, but was not the immortal ship which brought the founders of NewEngland. The ayflower left Plymouth, England, on Wednesday, the 6th of September, 1620, S. J., and anchored in Provincetown harbor November 11th, a voyage of sixty-k days. The first landing on the main at New Plymouth was made on Monday, scember 11th, O. S. (Mourt's Relation, Boston, 1865).
The name of the master of the Mayflower was Jones. The master's mates, or lots, were Thomas Clarke and Robert Coppin. The editor of Mourt's Relation, enry M. Dexter, supposes that Clarke was the original pilot of the ship, and that ppin was transferred from the Speedwell, her consort, with her passengers, hen the latter vessel put back to Plymouth, "We have another pilot here, one r. 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lived about 1726, in Lyme, Conn., and left descendants there. Among them the tradition has come down to the present day, that their first ancestor was mate of the Mayflower, and gave his name to Clark's Island, in Plymouth harbor. That tradition must have come from Nathaniel Clarke, who was seventeen years old when his grandfather, Thomas Clarke, died. Nathaniel Clarke, known as Counsellor Clarke, re-ceived from Andros, the royal governor, a grant of Clark's Island, probably because his father was the first to land thereon.* On the other hand, James Savage, high authority, doubts. He says (Geneal. Dict., Vol. I., p. 401): "We can hardly doubt that the oldest survivor of that memorable voyage must have been too well known to need a weak tradition to lean on." In this case the tradition, instead of being weak, was a strong and general one. In the absence of positive testimony, however, each one must decide the question for himself.

The first appearance of our Thomas Clarke as a settler, is in July, 1623, when he arrived at Plymouth in the Anne, of 140 tons, Wm. Peirce, master, among a company of forty-two adult passengers, besides children. He brought with him considerable property, especially cattle, and had land allotted to him near Eel river, now Chiltonville, where he lived for a time.

In 1627, Thomas Clarke was the only person of that name in Plymouth Colony.—Baylies' Hist., Vol. I., p. 264.

In 1640, Thomas Clarke is included in the list of 58 "purchasers or old comers" in Plymouth.—Baylies' Hist., Vol. I., p. 309.

In documents of the period he is sometimes called a carpenter, sometimes yeoman, merchant, or gentleman. He seems to have been a good man of business, for the was at one time employed to audit the accounts of Plymouth Colony, and was Representative to General Court in 1651 and 1655. In the tax list of the Colony for 1632, Thomas Clarke is put down at £1³ 4s. 0d., there being 12 of the 90 only assessed higher than he. ably of this marriage. Between 1655 and 1660, he removed to Boston, where he lived in the vicinity of Scottow's Lane (from Ann St. N. W. to Creek Lane), and when his son Andrew mar-ried Mehitable, daughter of Thomas Scotto, Thomas Clarke gave him a house in that region. Thomas Clarke married, for his second wife, Mrs. Alice Nichols, daughter of Richard Hallett, in Boston, in 1664. When his son Andrew removed to Harwich, Thomas Clarke seems to have followed him, as he and Andrew were among the earliest proprietors of that town. his latter days he was much with his daughtér, Susanna Lothrop, at Barnstable. Thomas Clarke was a deacon of the Plymouth church from 1654 to 1697, the year of his death. He died in Plymouth, and was buried on the summit of the Burying Hill, which commands a view of the harbor into which he is supposed to have brought the first English vessel, and the island on which he landed 77 years before. His gravestone is still to be seen, with the following inscription:-

Here lies buried ye body of Mr. Thomas Clark, aged 98 years. Departed this life March 24th, 1697.

Thomas Clarke, the pilgrim and his sons spelled their name with the final e, but it seems to have been dropped by many of the family in the third generation, perhaps from the fact that his name given to the island, and inscribed upon his gravestone, appears without the final e.

The following extracts from the Old Colony records throw some light upon the manners and customs of those times, as well as upon the character of Thomas Clarke.

THOMAS CLARKE, PLYMOUTH.

1633. Took the Freeman's oath.

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Was assessed for the Colony tax, \pounds 4s. 0d.

- 1634. Takes Wm. Shuttle as apprentice for 11 years. At end of time T. C. was to give him 2 suits of clothes and 8 bushels of corn.
- 1637. Thomas Clarke heads the list of volunteers to act against the Pequin Indians.* Is mentioned as Thomas Clarke, yeoman, of Eel river.
- 1638. A tract of land called Slowly Field is granted to T. C. He is presented to the Court for stopping the highway to Eel river.
- 1639. Simeon Trott agrees to serve Thomas Clarke for 7 years, he to receive a calf and 12 bushels of corn at end of time.
- 1639. Abraham Pierce sould to Thomas Clarke one acre of land lying on ye S. side of ye towne abutting on Hobb's hole with one end, and bounded on ye one side with the ground of Ralph Wallen, on the other

a *Pequin Indians—Old Colony Records—Probably Pequots, a warlike tribe, who, doout this time, attacked the new Colony on the Connecticut river, and were performed by the Connecticut troops under Col. John Mason, and the Masanchusetts men under Capt. Underhill. side with common ground, for the sum of 30 pounds of good merchantable tobacco, to him and his heirs forever.

- 1639. T. Clarke is fined 30s. for selling a pair of boots and spurs for 15s., which he bought for 10s.
- 1641. He is constable and surveyor of highways for the years 1642, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7.
- 1644. Thos. Clarké sells 12 acres of land at Duxbury for one Dutch cow, valued at £6. Has a suit with Matthew Fuller, which T. C. gains. Has a suit with Wm. Powell, which T. C. gains.
- 1648. Has a suit with —— Gromes, which is settled by T. C. receiving 14 bushels of wheat and 5 bushels of corn.
- 1650. Thomas Clarke is allowed to draw and sell a cask of strong waters. Is one of the Committee of Plymouth Colony.
- 1652. Is presented for staying and drinking at James Cole's —acquitted.
- 1654. Is on a Committee to raise means to fit out an expedition ordered by the Lord Protector.
- 1655. Is presented to the court for taking $\pounds 6$ for the use of $\pounds 20$ for one year—acquitted.

The difficulty of tracing the history of our Thomas Clarke is much increased by the fact that there are twelve persons of the name to be found in the N. E. records, between 1623 and 1680, viz:—

In the Boston "Book of Possessions" two persons of this name are mentioned as land owners in Boston.

There is a deed on record, dated Oct. 6, 1668:—"Henry Kimball, blacksmith, of Boston, to Thomas Clarke, sometime of New Plymouth, merchant, for £140—all his piece or parcel of ground lying and being near the lesser draw-bridge near Sheltee Creek, in Boston, 24 feet in breadth in the rear, and in front 24 feet, and extended in length with the wharf and warehouse these being a part of said ground."

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Extract from Deed of Gift of Thomas Clarke to son Andrew Clarke, Boston, June 18, 1673:---

"I the said Thomas Clarke for divers good causes and valuable considerations me thereunto moving, but especially in consideration of my parental love and affection unto my well beloved son Andrew Clarke, and also in consideration of his filial affection and dutiful carriage unto me, I do give, grant, etc., all that my house and ground lying and being in Boston, that I received from the estate of John Nichols by virtue of a judgment granted me at the Court of Assistants sitting in Boston, March 5th, 1672, which house and ground is bounded by the street that goeth from the mill bridge to Charles river, northwest is the front of said ground, and is there in breadth 22 feet 6 inches, and on the northeast with the garden of Mr. John Clark, and is there in length towards John Nichols 48 feet, which line from John Clark's garden towards Wakefield's house takes in one half of the wall, etc., etc."

In the collection of relics at Forefather's Hall, Plymouth, is a china mug and leather wallet bearing the name of Thomas Clarke.

Thomas Clarke married, first, Susanna, daughter of Mary Ring, 1634, and second, widow Alice Nichols, of Boston, daughter of Richard Hallett, 1664.

He must have been at the time of his death the Patriarch of the colony. Born in 1599, the same year with Cromwell, and our years before the death of Queen Elizabeth, he lived through he reigns of James I., Charles I., the Commonwealth, the Proectorate of Cromwell, the reigns of James II., and Charles II., Villiam and Mary, and a great part of the reign of William II. He died three days before the decease of Governor Simon Bradstreet, at Salem, who was called the Patriarch of that colony, though he was four years younger than Thomas Clarke, having been born in 1603.

There was a Thomas Clarke living in Scituate in 1674, who has been supposed to have been the eldest son of Thomas

* These dates are conjectural, as I have not been able to find any record of the births of the three eldest sons of 'Thomas Clarke. It is probable, I think, that andrew was the eldest, as he appears to have received the largest share of his lather's goods. On the other hand James and William married many years before Andrew, which looks as if they were the oldest. We have the dates of birth at Susan and Nathaniel Clarke. As for John, if he was the same man who testistic in 1681 that he was thirty years old, he must have been born about 1651. Clarke, the Pilgrim. So says Dean in his History of Scituate.* Savage doubts it. There is a copy of a Deed of Gift from Thomas Clarke (dated June 6, 1693) to his sons and grandsons, in the possession of Lot Clark, Esq., of Dorchester, which throws light on this question. In this deed he makes gifts of land to his sons Andrew, William, James, Nathaniel and John, giving a larger share, however, to Andrew. He gives land to Andrew's sons Thomas, Scotto and Nathaniel, a larger share to the eldest ^k grandson Thomas—all which was in conformity to the customs of the period, by which a larger share fell to the eldest son.³ This entire omission of the name of Thomas seems to be good evidence that he had no son of that name; and that Andrew was the eldest and favorite son, is shown by his having a larger share than the others. Daughter Susanna is not mentioned in these gifts of land, but this probably arose from the strong desire entertained by the early settlers to keep the land in the name, † which could only be done by leaving it to sons, and en-1s joining it upon them not to sell it out of the family, which Thomas Clarke does in this document. This was a notion brought from England, where position and respectability follow the ownership of land, more than any other kind of prop-In a Deed of Gift from John Fuller, of Newton, to his's erty. sons, the same thing is enjoined upon them. Thomas Clarke, being evidently a man of considerable property for those times,ⁿ probably made his only daughter, Susanna, amends in other ways for omitting her name in the distribution of his landed³ estate.

ANDREW CLARKE, of Plymouth, son of Thomas 2. Clarke, born 1635, removed to Boston, and married, in 1671 d Mehitable, daughter of Thomas Scotto. His name is found ir the tax-lists of Boston for 1674. He lived in Scotto's Lane where his father bought him a house, and he carried on the shoe business. He was Assistant Counsellor, and several times⁰ Representative to the General Court. Finally he removed to Harwich, of which town he and his father were among the criginal proprietors, in 1694. He died there in 1706. Mehitable Scotto, daughter of Thomas and Joan (Sanford) Scotto,^D was baptized February 11, 1649.

Thomas Scotto had a house and garden in School street, which he sold in 1645 for £55. It joined the Burying Place on he east, and seems to have included the same property which his great-great-grandson, Samuel Clarke, owned and occupied 33 years after, which estate remained in the family till about 1825, when it was sold to the city by Dr. Samuel Clarke, and now forms part of the City Hall Square. Thomas Scotto was overseer of graves, gates and fences in .644, and we find the following in the Town Records, February, .646: "Thomas Scotto to see yt ye graves be digged five foot leep."—Drake's History of Boston, p. 302.

Joshua Scotto was one of the founders of the South Church, in 1662. He was, by commission, from James II., Chief Justice if the Court of Common Pleas for the Province of Maine, 1687. He was author of two tracts, one printed in 1691, called "Old ten's Tears,"* the other a narrative of the "Planting of the Massachusetts Colony," printed in Boston, 1694, by Benjamin Harris, at the sign of the Bible. This last has been reprinted in the Massachusetts Historical Coll., 4th series, Vol. IV. toshua Scotto's house was in Sudbury street, and he died January 20, 1698, aged 83.

The family is said to trace back to the year 1120, and the name was originally Scot-howe, which signifies a portion on the hillside. In the early records it is written variously, Scotto, Scottoe, Scottow and Scottoa. Joshua spelled his name Scotto.

JAMES CLARKE, of Plymouth, (born 1636); marrial 3. Abigail, daughter of Rev. John Lothrop, of Barnstable, Oct. 15, 1657. Was made freeman in 1670, appears often on juries from 1657 to 1670. In 1668 he brought suit for defamation against Sarah Barlow and Mary Bartlett, for reporting "that they sau him kisse his mayd on the Lord's day." They were fined ter shillings each. In 1671, he was one of those chosen to asses damages for injury done to Indians by the horses and hogs d the English.

4. WILLIAM CLARKE, son of Thomas, born 1639; married Sarah Woolcot, of Plymouth, March 1, 1659. He lived in a garrison house by Eel river, which was surprised by the Indians on a Sunday, March 12, 1676, while he was at church. His wife, several of his children, and some other persons, eleven in all, were killed in this attack, which is said to have been the only serious one ever made on the settlement. A son of William Clarke, named Thomas, was left for dead, but afterwards recovered, and had a silver plate put over his exposed brain, by the celebrated surgeon Dr. John Clarke, of Boston. He ever afterwards was known as "Silver-headed Tom."

In July 1676, two hundred Indians surrendered themselves to the Plymouth Governor, and were pardoned, with the exception of those who had been concerned in the slaughter at Clarke's garrison at Plymouth; these were put to death.—Baylies' History.

The colony records give the names of these Indians, and state that they were decapitated.

William Clarke seems to have been an active and enterprising man, having extensive operations in lands, etc., as appears by the colony records. In 1670, William Clarke and Edward Gray, of Plymouth; Richard Bourne and William Swift, of Sandwich; Thomas Hinckley and Thomas Huckins, of Barnstable; Samuel Sturgis, of Yarmouth, and John Freeman, of

Eastham, formed a company to engage and regulate the making and disposing of all the tar made in the colony, at the plice of eight shillings for every small barrel, and twelve shillings for every great barrel, during the full term of two years.

In 1679, Joseph and Barnabas Lothrop, of Barnstable; Kenelm Winslow, of Marshfield; and William Clarke, of Plymouth, as the agents of thirty partners, purchased for the sum of £200, the remainder of the lands not already granted, between Dartmouth on the west, Plymouth purchase on the east, and Middleboro' and Plymouth on the north, "to be settled in four years with an Orthodox Ministry." These grants include the present towns of Rochester and Marion.—Baylies' History.

In 1684, William Clarke hires the bass fishing at Cape Cod, of the town of Plymouth, at £30 a year.—Plymouth Records. In 1697, he received a grant of land from the town of Plym-

outh, where he was living in 1714.

1682, "The Court have agreed with Mr. William Clarke, of Plymouth, to provide suitably for the Governor and Magistrates diet, lodging, etc., in the County House at Plymouth, for four Courts, viz: October, March, June, and July, and to pay him forty pounds in money for the same; if it shall happen that the General Court be adjourned, or special courts called within the time of the year, he is to be allowed for those Courts according to his just account."—Records.

William Clarke was deputy in 1674, 1680, 1681. Was a selectman for many years. He married for 2d wife, March 7, 1677, Hannah Griswold. She died in 1687, aged 29 years. Third wife, Abiah Wilder, Aug. 3, 1692. There is a gravestone on Burying Hill, to the 2d. wife, but none to the others, or to himself.

6. NATHANIEL CLARKE, of Plymouth, born 1643. He was educated in the law office of Secretary Morton, and was known as Counsellor Clarke. He was appointed Secretary of the colony by Sir E. Andros, in 1686, and shared in the unpopularity of that officer, so much so, that when Sir Edmund was sent to England a prisoner, Nathaniel Clarke was sent with him. He soon, however, returned to Plymouth, a favorite with the Court of England, and continued the practice of the law. His house was on the main street, the same afterwards occupied by Judge Thomas. Andros made him a grant of Clark's Island, which the people refused to confirm, and he failed of securing the property.

He married Dorothy Lettice Gray, widow of Edward Gray, a rich merchant of Plymouth, but they did not live together comfortably, and after much scandal she left him; but afterwards, says James Thacher, returned to live with him. He died without issue, Jan. 31, 1717, and was buried on Burial Hill, where his gravestone may yet be seen. She died in 1728, aged 80.

7. JOHN CLARKE, of Plymouth, born 1645, married Mary Benjamin, Aug. 16, 1695. He lived afterwards at Barnstable, then at Yarmouth, where he taught a school, being a well-educated man.

"Mr. John Clarke was schoolmaster in Yarmouth in 1701, and besides his salary he was furnished with a horse, the school being movatle from one village to another."—Freeman's Hist. of Cape Cod, Vol. II., p. 206.

The Plymouth Records say that John Clarke, in 1681, testified that he was then about 30 years old; but whether this was the son of Thomas Clarke, the pilgrim, is a question. He died at Yarmouth, Aug. 16, 1705, aged 60.

This John Clarke died Jan. 19, 1712. His wife was made administrator June 20, 1712, and names children as above, and that five of them were under 14 years of age. Mr. Lot Clark thinks that this John was son of the first James, but I have no record that James Clarke had a son called John. He also thinks that the Yarmouth schoolmaster was not the son of Thomas Clarke, the pilgrim.

8. THOMAS CLARKE, of Harwich, born 1672, in Boston. He went to Harwich with his father about 1694, and in 1699 was made high constable of that town; became a member of the church in 1701, and was a selectman from 1704 to 1710. Was Representative to General Court from 1715 to 1723, and trustee for the town debt of $\pounds 50,000$. He and his father, Andrew Clarke, were large land owners, and their property is said to have extended across the Cape from sea to sea. Through their land ran Stony and Bound brooks, on which they had mills. A long and expensive lawsuit for these mill privileges, with the Winslow family, is said to have impoverished Lieut. Thomas Clarke. His descendants, however, continued to be large proprietors in the vicinity, which was called Setucket.

Lieut. Thomas Clarke married, first, Sarah —, in 1699; second, Patience (Hall) Rider, Dec. 14, 1743. He died Nov. 18, 1759, aged 88. She died Aug. 10, 1756, aged 76.

55. BARNABAS CLARKE, born at Harwich, 1722, eldest son of Nathaniel, was, about 1740-50, a shipmaster sailing from Boston to London and the Provinces. April 25, 1748, he married Hepzibah, youngest daughter of Thornton Barrett, of Boston. After some years Capt. Clarke quitted the sea and became a merchant in Boston. He was a member of the New North Church in 1749, one of those, who, as the church record tells us, "labored under such doubts and fears with respect to ye Lord's Supper, that they were afraid immediately to approach unto it." ^{*}Abigail Clark married Capt. Joseph Luce, of Martha's Vineyard, and had two sons, Barnabas and James C. Barnabas died without issue, by a boiler explosion, on a steamer of which he was 2d mate, and James Clark Luce, the youngest son, was a distinguished sea captain, and became commander of the steamship Arctic, one of the Collins Line. On the morning of Sept. 20, 1854, the Arctic, with 233 passengers, and a crew of 150 men, sailed from Liverpool, for New York, and on the 27th of September, in a dense fog on the banks of Newfoundland, came in collision with the Vesta, a French iron screw steamer, commanded by Capt. Duchesne. The Arctic went down, and of the 353 persons on board only 97 were saved. Capt. Luce, after floating on a piece of the wreck two days, was rescued by the Cambria and taken to Quebec. The Massachusetts Court Records, April 21, 1777, have the following: "Wm. Dennie prays the Court for leave to send his brig Dolphin, Samuel Clarke, master, with fish in a perishing condition to Hispaniola, and return with a cargo of molasses and warlike stores."

He married May 19, 1778, Martha, daughter of Obadiah Curtis, who lived at the corner of Rawson's Lane and Marlboro' street. At the beginning of the Revolutionary War, he owned parts of several vessels, and some real estate in Boston, among other property the house in School street (No. 20) where he lived, and an estate in Cold Lane (Portland street), which he bought of Samuel Snow, of Providence, for \$7,625. He was Major in one of Gov. Hancock's regiments of Boston troops, and served with it in the Rhode Island campaign of 1778, when it acted in cooperation with the French forces under the Marquis La Fayette. The regiment lay under canvass near Newport, during the terrible gale of Aug. 12, 1778, long known as the "French Storm." Here Major Clarke contracted disease of the lungs, from which he never recovered, and which obliged him to leave the service. He died at his house in Boston, Oct. 15, 1780, aged 26 years. Will dated July 25, 1780.

He occupies a high position among distinguished men in both hemispheres. Was born among the hills in Ashfield, Franklin county, Mass. Nature designed him for a great artist, and in the development of his native talents, nature's design was not frustrated. Schools did but little to bring to light his inherent powers. The common school of a sparsely populated district was all the seminary of learning that ever opened its portals to him; yet such has been his perseverance, and his personal effort in art and in science, that our colleges have conferred on him high degrees of honor in consideration of his great attainments, and crowned heads in the old world have recognized his superiority as the greatest telescope maker of the age.

The steps by which he ascended to his high position in art may be seen in the following summary of events in his life. In 1821, commenced copper-plate engraving, and soon after, miniature and portrait painting. In 1826–27 engraving for calico printing at Lowell, Mass. From 1827 to 1829, engraving at Providence, R. I. From 1829 to 1832 engraving, and painting miniatures, in New York. 1832–35 at Fall River. 1835–36, painted miniatures in Boston. Settled in Cambridgeport, Mass., 1836, but kept open a studio in Boston, until 1860. Meanwhile (commencing in 1845) he engaged with his son George in the working of lenses for telescopes, first reflectors, but afterwards refractors, the latter a very difficult thing, but with success. From 1852 to 1860 discovered twenty new double stars. In 1859 went to England, by invitation of Rev. W. R. Dawes, a distinguished astronomer, of Haddenham, Thame. In the observatory of Mr. Dawes, with one of his own telescopes, discovered five new double stars, among them 99 Herculis^{*}. From that time, until now (1883) he and his sons have been engaged in the manufacture of large telescopes, one of which is mounted in the Dearborn tower at Chicago, with which his son Alvan G. discovered the companion of Sirius; another is mounted in the Naval Observatory at Washington, D. C., with which Prof. Hall discovered the satellites of Mars. But their last great work is the 30-inch object glass made for the government of Russia on the order of Dr. Otto Struve, the Royal Astronomer. Although Mr. Clark has attained his greatest distinction in the field of art, yet as an astronomer he ranks high. He gleaned the northern heavens, which had been minutely harvested by the Struves, and the result was the discovery, by himself and his son Alvan G., of some 40 new double stars, and among them the companion of Sirius.[†] He invented a new micrometer, an instrument of great value to astronomers, and by means of an invention of his own has compared the magnitude of a Lyræ with our sun, arriving at a result that will give him rank among standard astronomers and mathematicians. Deprived at a tender age of the fostering care of a worthy father, yet, by the counsel and aid of a kind mother, he has risen to a position which comparatively few ever attain. The gradation, by which he rose to his present elevated standing as a scientist, may be presented in the following events in his educational course. In 1864, entered prepara-tory department of Antioch College, at Yellow Springs, Ohio. In 1866, was at Union School, Ann Arbor, Mich., where his record showed, on a scale of ten, nine and nine-tenths on all studies for the whole year. In 1867, at the age of 16, not having the means to proceed, he left Ann Arbor and went to Chicago to earn by personal effort and industry the means to enable him to pursue his studies. At the end of five years he returned to Antioch and took a special course, for one year, in Chemistry and Geology. In 1873, was at the Sheffield Scientific School at Yale College, as a special student in Zoology and Modern Languages, and became assistant in Zoology, and in the U.S. Fish Commission under Prof. Baird. In 1876, was appointed Fellow in Johns Hopkins University, and became assistant in Biology. In 1878, received from the Sheffield Scientific School, the degree of Ph. 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^{*} In the year 1857 Mr. Childs was engaged in mercantile business and had large interests in the California trade, and was suddenly called to San Francisco. Having completed his business there, he returned by way of Panama. At Aspinwall he took passage on the steamship "Central America," commanded by Lieut. Herndon, of the U. S. Navy, whose daughter became the wife of Gen. Chester A. Arthur, now President of the United States. After leaving Havana, Cuba, the vessel encountered a terrific storm, which continued some 36 hours, during which time the steamer sprang a leak, and finally foundered in the Gulf Stream, off the South Carolina coast, some 250 miles from land, and about 500 persons went down with the ship, among them Mr. Childs, who, being an expert swinmer, kept himself afloat six hours, and was finally rescued by a Norwegian bark, nearly exhausted, but immediately went to work to save the lives of others. Only 49 were rescued; the rest all perished, among them Capt. Herndon, who was the last one Mr. Childs saw while in the water—they recognized each other, and spoke, but the next wave separated them forever. The next day Mr. Childs was transferred to a vessel bound to Savannah, where he landed six days after the disaster and telegraphed to New York the first information respecting the fate of the missing steamship.



Clarke, Sir William Henry, of Hitcham, County Buckingham, born Sept. 13, 1793, succeeded as Ninth Baronet on the demise of his father, who was lineally descended from Sir John Clarke, of Weston, Knt., a military man of great valor, who had the fortune to make prisoner Louis d'Orleans, Duc de Longueville, at Blandy near Terrovane, Aug. 14, 1513, in the 5th year of Henry VIII.

This action was fought at Blandy, the object of the French being to relieve Terrovane, which was besieged by Henry VIII. The French were defeated and most of their leaders captured, among whom were the Duke de Longueville, La Fayette, Bayard and Bussy d'Amboise. Sir John was for this service rewarded by the King with an honorary addition to his arms; namely, in the sinister part of the shield, "A canton azure with a demiram salient, argent; in chief two fleur des lis, or; and over all, a baton, trunked," being the arms of the Duke, which by martial law belonged to his captor. Sir John Clarke died in 1539.

This coat of arms has no crest; on the shield is a bend to show that he was not the first owner.

Another family of Clarkes, in Durham, has the same shield, with the crest added.

"A swan ducally gorged, and with a chain d'or. With her foot on an ogress."

An ogress or pellet is a cannon ball, or bullet; painted black, it signifies war. When these are painted yellow, they are called bezants, and signify money or commerce. When red, they are called torteaux, and are Roman Catholic emblems, signifying the Holy Wafer.

Richard Trevor Clarke, of Northamptonshire, has these arms:

Argent, on a bend gules, three swans proper between three torteaux.

MOTTO. "Erectus non elatus."

Samuel Clarke, of Boston, when in London, about 1774, made inquiry at the Herald's Office for the Clarke arms, and a shield was given him which is the same as that of Sir John Clarke, of Weston, but we have no evidence that Thomas Clarke, of Plymouth, came from that Buckingham family. As, however, most of the name in England bear the swans and pellets, it is probable that the American branch is entitled to them. The Indian and Ship, supporting this shield, were assumed by Samuel Clarke, as well as the motto, when he had the engraving made in London, which he used as a book-plate. The supporters indicate his country and profession, and the motto, "Sace pro rege, semper pro patria," shows the popular feeling at that period in America, when something of loyalty for the crown remained, but was not identified with patriotism, as in Old England.

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
