PREFACE

The schedules for PN, PR, and PS were originally prepared by Dr. Edwin Wiley, under the supervision of Charles Martel, then chief classifier. The schedules were printed, with revisions to date, in 1915 and were reissued with supplementary pages in 1964. As with the earlier edition, the main purpose of this work is to furnish an aid to classification and not to give a complete list of authors represented in these classes of the Library's collection. Emphasis has been placed on representing authors born before 1875.

This second edition of **Class P: Subclasses PN, PR, PS, PZ** is a cumulative edition rather than a revised edition. The objective stated by Edward J. Blume, chief of the Subject Cataloging Division, was to produce a cumulative edition incorporating all additions and changes since the first edition of 1915 through September 1977. The cumulation was completed in six months and was made possible by the utilization of a videotype text processor. Senior editorial staff members not only cumulated past additions and changes into the basic schedule, but also updated terminology, arranged notes and references to conform to current practice, and deleted many parenthesized numbers while they prepared the final copy on the text processor.

We believe that this rapidly produced cumulative edition is a desirable and useful product which will be of great assistance to catalogers, and we intend to produce future cumulative schedules in the same manner.

This span of alternative class numbers for Canadian literature was developed by Mr. T.R. McCloy under contract to the National Library of Canada. Its purpose is to provide a more specific treatment of the topic than that provided by the regular class numbers, PR9180-9199.3, PQ3900-3919.2, and PM1-2711, of the Library of Congress Classification System. In the Canadian context a comprehensive classification scheme for Canadian literature regardless of language is considered preferable to the LC System which separates Canadian literature by language.

It is not possible for the Library of Congress to adopt these class numbers and to incorporate them into its own system because they differ in principle from LC practice both in their assembling of Canadian literature regardless of language and in keeping novels with the rest of Canadian literature instead of placing them in PZ. The Library of Congress, however, recognizes a need for the PS8000 area and endorses its use as an official alternative classification scheme. In order to eliminate the danger of a conflict in numbers, the PS8000 area will not be developed by LC in the future for other purposes.

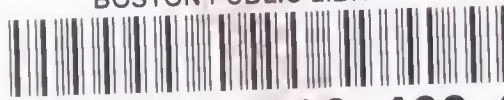

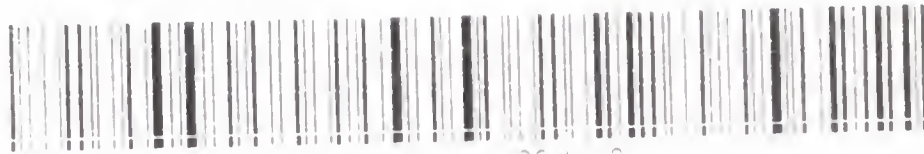
