A selection of beautiful pieces

Some of these exquisite orders were obtained by one Russian hero at Borodino. They stayed the property of this one family until in the early 20th Century, the present owner obtained these from the last member of the family.

- 1760 **St. Alexander–Newsky order.** Silver star and gold badge with scarlet ribbon. First awarded in 1775 and exists only in 1 class. (St. Alexander “of the Neva” was a hero of the city of Vladimir who conquered the Swedes around 1250 and freed Russia of Foreign occupation) **Badge.** Magnificent red enamel and gold cross with the Russian eagle in gold between each limb. In the centre a beautiful multicolored enamel presentation of St. Alexander on horseback. **Star.** 8 pointed, silver, beaded edges, consisting of 56 graduated rays, 7 to each point. Center white and red enamel with monogram of St. Alexander Newsky in gold and in gold letters around “For merit to the Fatherland”. The perfect 4” wide scarlet sash ends in a bow. A **severely** damaged set sold in Lucerne Nov. 1968 (Hess–Leu) lot 577 for 3300 francs. Our lot is one of the most beautiful we ever saw. **PHOTO** (\$1,500.–2,000.)
- 1761 **St. Stanislas order.** (order founded 1765 in honor of St. Stanislas by Stanislas Augustus Poniatowsky, last independent King of Poland. It took various phases before it finally became Russian order after 1831) Grand Cross set of magnificent gold and enamel badge, silver and gold star, scarlet ribbon 4 inches wide with white edges and a scarlet line. **Badge** – Red enameled maltese cross with double points, edged gold with tiny gold ball on each point and a double headed eagle in gold between each limb. Scarlet sash with narrow yellow borders, 4 inches wide, ending in fringe. Beautiful gem set. **PHOTO** (\$900.–1,000.)
