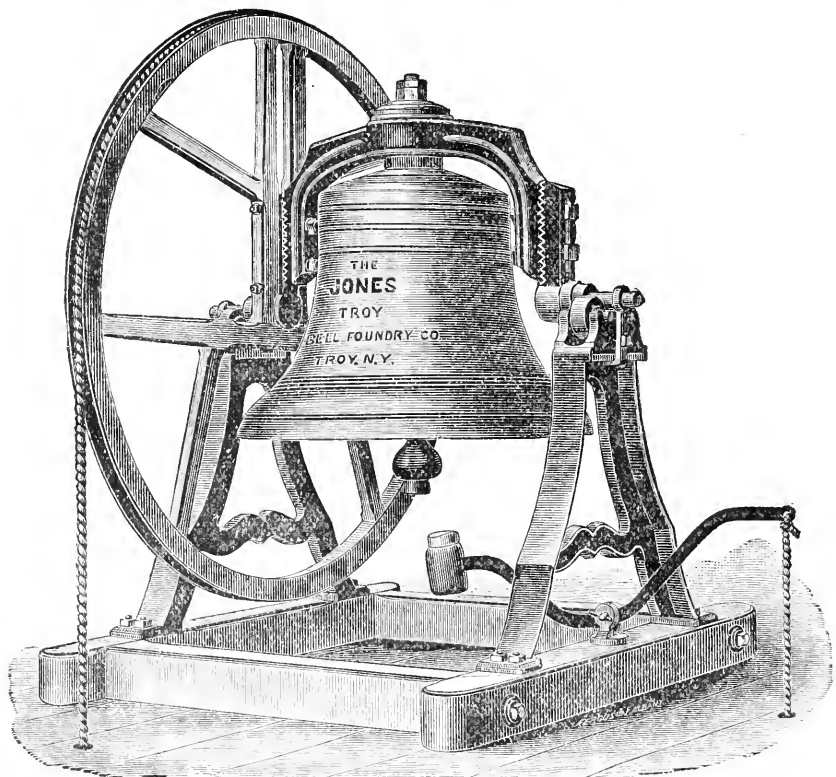


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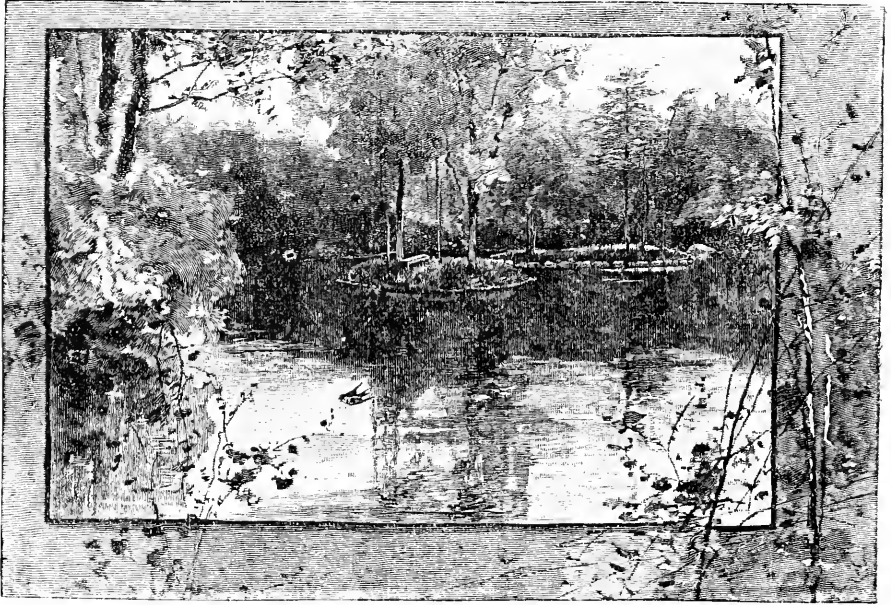
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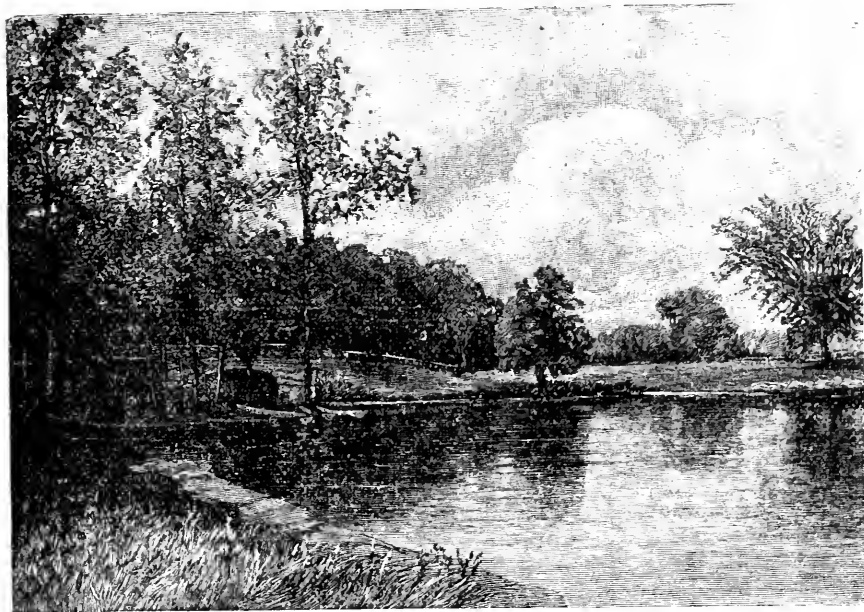
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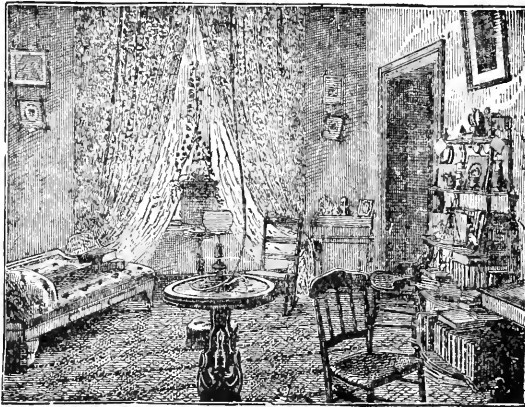
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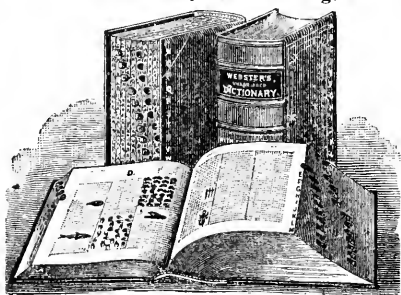
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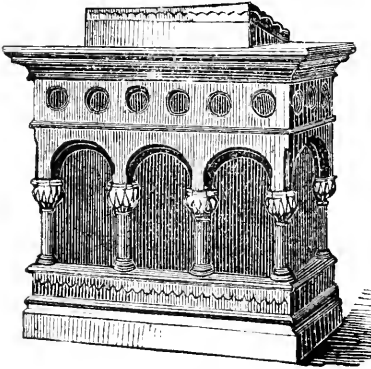
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THIS issue is made by the direction of the National Council of the Congregational Churches assembled at Concord, N. H., in 1883.

By order of the Council a copy is sent to each church and one to each minister by mail, post-paid.

The next session of the National Council will be held with the Union Park Church, Chicago, Ill., beginning Wednesday, Oct. 13, 1886, at 10 o'clock A. M., and will doubtless continue into the following week. A partial programme of the sessions of the Council will be found on the last page of the cover of this Year-Book.

The following extracts from the Constitution and By-Laws show the composition of the Council, and the ratio of representation of its constituent bodies. Blank forms for credentials of delegates will be furnished the State Secretaries by the Secretary of the Council: —

II. *Representation.* — The churches shall be represented, at each session, by delegates, either ministers or laymen, appointed in number and manner as follows: —

1. The churches, assembled in their local organizations, appoint one delegate for every ten churches in their respective organizations, and one for a fraction of ten greater than one half; it being understood that wherever the churches of any State are directly united in a general organization, they may, at their option, appoint the delegates in such body, instead of in local organizations, but in the above ratio of churches so united.

2. In addition to the above, the churches united in State organizations appoint by such body one delegate, and one for each ten thousand communicants in their fellowship, and one for a major fraction thereof: —

3. It being recommended that the number of delegates be, in all cases, divided between ministers and laymen, as nearly equally as is practicable.

4. Such Congregational general societies for Christian work, and the faculties of such theological seminaries as may be recognized by this Council, may be represented by one delegate each, such representatives having the right of discussion only.

III. Statistical secretaries of state and territorial bodies, ministers serving the churches entertaining the Council, and persons selected as preachers, or to prepare papers, or to serve upon committees chosen by this body, shall be entitled to seats in the session in which they are to serve, without the privilege of voting.

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INTRODUCTION.

THE Dakota statistics were not received until Dec. 15; Kansas, Dec. 18; those of New York, Dec. 21, and the list of ministers of New York, not until Dec. 26. As the tables cannot be completed, nor the summaries of the *Year-Book*, and its list of ministers prepared for the printer until these are all in hand, the reasons for the delay of this issue, beyond Jan. 1, will be manifest. Four weeks, at least, are needed, to prepare and print the last sixty pages of the *Year-Book*, with any sufficient care. The statistics of every State should be furnished to the compiler by Nov. 1, if the *Year-Book* is to be completed in December. Any which are later must share the responsibility for delay. Nor is it manifest why any should not be ready in October. The date of State meetings is not such a reason; for the reports from churches can be gathered as easily before as after these meetings. Most of the States do this, and have the results ready for any use they may serve at that time. Delay and uncertainty in the issue of the *Year-Book* are a serious disappointment to many, and prevent the securing of much valuable advertising patronage. Will not all concerned see to it that for such cause it does not happen again? The returns from some of the Theological Seminaries were very inconveniently late this year.

Attention is invited to the new table of general Congregational statistics, at pages 75-77; also to the Quinquennial statistics, gathered for the first time in 1885, by the recommendation of the National Council. They will be found at page 219, and though incomplete, as a first attempt must needs be, furnish matter for some instructive inferences.

The fact is interesting, that the net gain of church members this year reported, 17,015, is larger than we have ever before recorded. The progress, also, of our Sunday-school work is favorably shown in the accession of 32,000 to the total membership of the schools reported.

The National Council, by a change in its articles at the last session, constituted the statistical secretaries of the several States honorary members of that body. It is hoped that they will respond to this action by a full attendance at the coming session in Chicago. A meeting of these secretaries is invited for Tuesday, Oct. 12, at 2 o'clock P. M., at the Union Park Church. Fraternal conference may shed much light on various questions which we have to meet, and help us all. A few topics, among many, likely to claim consideration at this meeting, may be suggested here.

I. A common date for all our statistics. Is it practicable and is it expedient? If so, what should it be? And is any change in the date of issue of the *Year-Book* desirable?

II. Forms of statistical blanks and methods of securing the annual returns with promptness from the churches. Shall it be done by the State secretary directly, or through the scribes of local conferences and associations? Two of the States whose work is among the best, Connecticut and New Hampshire, have adopted the first method.

III. The State Minutes; their form and essential contents. Under this head a few hints from the present compiler's brief experience may be in place. They are not new. Probably every one of them has been set forth forcibly, in the *Year-Book*

and *quarterlies* of other years; but some of them will need repetition until they are heeded.

Good State Minutes should contain:—

1. An alphabetical list of *all* the churches in that State. If some churches are associated with another State, these should not be ignored or omitted; and if churches of another State are associated, they should not be counted and included in summaries of *that State*. Other and more comprehensive summaries can be added if desirable, but each State should give in one distinct summary its own totals, and no others. Churches in the same city or town should be arranged together in the order of organization, and if the name of the post-office differs from that of the church, it should be added in the same place, and not in some other column or page. The table should include all the items of the *Year-Book* table, and in the same order. The minister's first name should stand in full and not by a mere initial. If he belongs to another denomination, let that fact be recorded against his name. If he is a licentiate, say so, and do not leave others to infer that he is, what he is not, an ordained minister.

2. One alphabetical list of all ordained Congregational ministers, properly within the range of the secretary's report, and of no others. This list should never include licentiates or ministers of other denominations, who chance to be serving our churches. It should include (*a*) all members of associations and conferences by which they are reported, and (*b*) all who are reported in the regular service of the churches, although not members of local associations. The imperfect standing of the latter class should be designated by the star of the *Year-Book*. The convenience of a common usage running through the Minutes and *Year-Book* is so great that we do not hesitate to urge this method, until a better is agreed upon. And usage, which seems to be safe and approved, suggests (*c*) a small class of cases, of whom some eminent theological professors and worthy returned missionaries are examples,—men so well and favorably known that a State secretary need not hesitate to take all the responsibility of enrolling their names with a star.

Give every ordination date, as a certificate, in part, of the right of the name to stand in the list; and indicate the fact of membership in local associations, if it be a fact, in the alphabetical list of the State.

3. One separate list of all licentiates reported by associations, or known to be serving churches, the latter class being indicated by a star.

4. Lists, with full dates of all pastors ordained, pastors installed, and, as the usage of a few States would now require, pastors inducted without installation by council, pastors died or dismissed, and of all ordinations without installation.

5. Full summaries, giving separately and distinctly each item of the *Year-Book's* summary, and as many more as are called for and desirable. Especially name each church, new, omitted or changed from last year's list, so that every church may be accounted for, from year to year. Some minutes scatter these and other explanations through a dozen conferences, and the process of securing consistent totals is not easy. A few States give the *Year-Book's* summary of items exactly, with any additions they please; and the comfort which they afford the *Year-Book* compiler is great. Why may not all do likewise? Blanks will be furnished to any who will use them.

IV. The *Year-Book*; what changes in date, form, or contents would make it more useful to ministers and churches, and to the common cause of the Master?

At this point we leave the floor to others.

TREASURER'S STATEMENT.

WHEN the present Treasurer was appointed at St. Louis, a debt of \$2,681.71 rested upon the National Council, which individuals assured him should be provided for at once. Of this amount, \$2,105.00 was contributed by individuals and churches within a year, of which \$655.00 came from Connecticut, whose churches had paid in full, and promptly, their assessments. But the returns from some of the States were two or three years behind, and some had paid nothing, so that at the end of the first year the debt was increased rather than diminished. The treasury has been overdrawn from that time to this, as follows:—

Yet there has been no time during these years when the prompt payment by the States of their quota as requested by the Council would not have left several hundred dollars in the treasury over all expenses.

Until now the Treasurer has had no legal security whatever against risk of pecuniary loss by thus standing between the churches and the non-payment of bills ordered by them. But he has never wavered in the confidence that their moral sense, if appealed to by their spiritual guides, would honorably discharge every obligation. Pleasing evidence of this is seen in the increasing disposition expressed by the State bodies to meet their fair proportion of the expenses ordered by the Council. The trouble arises more from want of system, or from variety of methods, in collecting money for church expenses in the constituent bodies of the Council, than from any radical defect in the character of that large body of Christians represented in it.

At the meeting in Concord, the Council, following the advice of their Finance Committee, "Voted, That the Treasurer, assisted by the chairman of the Provisional Committee and Committee on Finance, be, and is hereby, authorized to solicit of individuals and churches the sum of \$3,000.00, to be held as a reserve to meet exigencies." At the meeting of the Provisional Committee in Boston, Sept. 19, 1884, Rev. Dr. Noble, of Illinois, Rev. Henry Fairbanks, of Vermont, and Samuel B. Capen, Esq., of Massachusetts, were made a committee to aid the Treasurer in securing this fund, and it was voted to ask for the sum of \$3,500. By agreement between them, Mr. Noble was to canvass the field west of New York, Mr. Capen, Massachusetts and Rhode Island; Mr. Fairbanks, all north of Massachusetts; and the Treasurer, Connecticut and New York. Special credit is due to Dr. Noble for the promptness and vigor with which he gathered fruit from his wide field, and turned into the treasury \$1,578.50. The amount received from all sources for this "Security Fund" is \$3,038.74, and it has been contributed by individuals and churches in the following order. In some cases, doubtless, an individual name should be understood as representing a church, where the fact was not known to the Treasurer. Where it has been so ordered by the donors, these gifts have been set to the credit of the States from which they came as payments of arrearages, but not without such special request of the contributor.

It will be seen from this list that seventeen States and Territories have shared in this effort to meet the wish of the Council in establishing a basis of financial credit. Of these States Illinois gave \$578.50, Massachusetts \$575.00, and Connecticut \$575.00, or the three together more than half the entire sum. This money is now deposited in three savings banks of Connecticut to the credit of the Council, \$1,000 in each bank, the small surplus being carried to the current account of the Treasurer.

As a charter is necessary to enable the Council to hold and administer funds, and as the Treasurer was thought by some to be the person to attend to the matter and prepare the way for the Council at its next meeting to sanction a charter, if so disposed, I have procured from the Legislature of Connecticut the following act of incorporation, which will be rendered valid, as its terms state, by a vote of the Council to accept it. It is given in this statement, that the ministers and churches may be informed of its character before they are called to act upon it.

This charter has been unanimously approved by the Provisional Committee, and recommended to the Council for its acceptance.

RESOLUTION

INCORPORATING THE TRUSTEES OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF THE CONGREGATIONAL CHURCHES OF THE UNITED STATES.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY,
JANUARY SESSION, A. D. 1885.

Resolved by this Assembly:

SECTION 1. That Julius H. Seelye, Frederick A. Noble, Henry Fairbanks, William M. Taylor, George F. Magoun, E. S. Jones, Samuel B. Capen, Henry A. Hazen, William H. Moore, Lavalette Perrin, and such other persons as may be associated with them, and their successors, be and they hereby are constituted a body politic and corporate under the name of The Trustees of the National Council of the Congregational Churches of the United States.

SECT. 2. The object of the corporation is to do and promote charitable and Christian work for the advancement of the general interests of the Congregational churches of this country, in accordance with resolutions and declarations made from time to time by the National Council of the Congregational churches of the United States; and said corporation may co-operate with any other societies under the charge and control of churches of the Congregational order in the United States.

SECT. 3. Said corporation may acquire, by purchase, gift, devise, or otherwise, and hold and dispose of real and personal property for the purposes of its creation not exceeding sixty thousand dollars in value, and may make any contracts for promoting its objects and purposes not inconsistent with law.

SECT. 4. The said National Council may make rules, orders and regulations for the government of said board of trustees, and said board shall at all times be subject to the direction and control of said Council.

SECT. 5. The persons named in the first section of this resolution shall be the corporators under this charter, until the appointment of trustees by said National Council at its next regular meeting, which trustees when so appointed shall be the successors of said corporators, with all the powers conferred upon this corporation, and said Council may fix the number of said trustees and their terms of office, and may provide for filling vacancies in their number.

SECT. 6. This act of incorporation shall take effect when accepted by a majority of the persons mentioned in section one hereof, and by said National Council at its next regular meeting.

Warren H. and Elizabeth L. (Worcester) Beaman, of Amherst, Mass. One son. Died of brain fever, 1885, July 24, aged 28 years, 10 months, and 24 days.

NOTE. — The limitations of the tables do not in all cases admit exactness. In the table of theological education, students who did not graduate are counted, and without distinction from graduates; but a name occurring in more than one seminary list is not repeated; and in the college lists, a few students who were not alumni are counted with the graduates.

The editor renews his earnest request to friends and to the secretaries of the State bodies for prompt information of the death of Congregational ministers, and for full and exact information on the model of the sketches above given. Obituary and eulogy beyond, it is impossible to use here.

THE NATIONAL SOCIETIES.

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The American Board, the oldest Foreign Missionary Society in the United States, was formed at Bradford, Mass., June 29, 1810, and held its first meeting at Farmington, Conn., Sept. 5 of the same year. Its record of seventy-five years was reviewed at its last annual meeting, held in Boston, Oct. 13-16, 1885. Its mission fields now occupied are, Northern and Western Mexico; the Hawaiian and Micronesian Islands of the Pacific; Northern and Southern Japan; Northern China; Szechuan in Northwestern China; Foochow and Hong Kong in Southern China; Ceylon; Madras, in Southern India; the Maratha field in Western India, including the important centres of Bombay and Ahmednagar; East Central Africa; the Zulus of Southern Africa; West Central Africa; Eastern Turkey from Mardin to Erzroom, including the educational centre Harpoot; Central Turkey, including the important cities of Aintab and Marash; Western Turkey, from Trebizond to Constantinople, including Cesarea, Marsovan, Smyrna, Broosa, and Nicomedia; European Turkey, from Constantinople to Samokov in Bulgaria, including Monastir in Macedonia and Philippopolis in East Roumelia; Austria, emphasizing the Bohemian work in Prague; and Northern and Northwestern Spain, this work centring in San Sebastian on the Bay of Biscay, and in Zaragoza, in the Province of Aragon.

This wide-extended work embraces direct evangelistic effort through missionaries and native helpers; an immense educational trust, extending from the primary school to the college and theological seminary; Sunday-school instruction; the preparation, publication, and circulation in different languages, of books, tracts, and newspapers; assistance in the erection of buildings for churches and schools; grants in aid to feeble churches and to native home-missionary societies; the humane service of missionary physicians, sometimes in the care of large dispensaries and hospitals; also charitable ministry, continuous and varied, to the sick, the poor, and the oppressed.

Pastors in presenting the foreign work to their churches are desired to emphasize this fact, that these several departments of labor on the foreign field are carried on under one administration, and that contributions, therefore, should be proportionately enlarged. If one half of the benevolent contributions of the churches should be given to this broad work of reaching the unevangelized millions of other lands, it would probably not be too large a proportion.

The Woman's Boards, which co-operate with the American Board, are doing a royal service, not only securing, mainly from the women of the churches, large contributions, — the annual average of which, during recent years, has been over \$120,000, — but also educating and training children and young people to an intelligent interest in missionary work. These boards can be addressed at No. 1 Congregational House, Boston, at 75 Madison Street, Chicago, and at 1312 Taylor Street, San Francisco.

The latest statistics of the American Board report 22 missions, 909 stations and out-stations, 422 missionaries and assistant missionaries, 2,183 native laborers, 303 churches with over 23,000 members, over 3,000 of these received on confession of faith during the past year; 90 high schools and seminaries for young men and young women, with nearly 4,000 students, and a total of nearly 36,000 children and youth under Christian

instruction. The appropriations for 1886 already amount to \$600,000, and it is desirable that the receipts for this memorable year should reach, if possible, \$750,000, — a thank-offering of \$10,000 for each of the 75 years of our history. An average advance in donations of about fifty per cent will secure this honorable record. Attention is called to the *Missionary Herald*, the *Mission Dayspring* and *Life and Light*; also to the CHILDREN'S MORNING STAR MISSION, a special for Sunday schools. Our main instrumental reliance is upon the pastors of churches, themselves full of missionary information and zeal.

The most urgent want instrumentally, just now, upon the foreign field, is a reënforcement of at least fifty new missionaries. The laborers at the front are not only few, but are falling at their posts, overburdened. The harvest, which was never so white for the reapers as to-day, is perishing. The Master's call rings in our ears more imperatively than at any previous period of our history: "Pray ye the Lord of the harvest that he will send forth laborers into his harvest."

AMERICAN COLLEGE AND EDUCATION SOCIETY.

FORMED by the Union, in 1874, of the "American Education Society," and the "Society for the Promotion of Collegiate and Theological Education." The American Education Society was organized and received its charter from Massachusetts in the year 1816. The College Society, as the other organization was popularly called, was formed in 1843. It was for years a voluntary association without a charter. In 1872 it received a charter also from the State of Massachusetts. These two organizations were brought together under a new charter from the same State in May, 1874.

Income for the year ending April 30, 1885, \$60,124.85. Of the whole income, \$39,534.80 was contributed for colleges and paid to them. The sum of \$22,175.00 was paid to students fitting for the ministry. The expenses were \$4,145.62, leaving a balance of debt of \$5,736.57.

In both departments the Society has had a large agency in the formation of society throughout the great West. The men who were pioneers in the work of preaching the gospel in the new settlements, and in the founding of churches and schools, were largely educated by this Society. The colleges which are now among the foremost in these Western fields were largely built up by the same agency.

The whole number of young men assisted by the Society in their studies for the ministry since 1816 is 7,076. The institutions at the West which have been assisted by the Society since 1843 are the following, viz.: Western Reserve, Illinois, Wabash, and Marietta Colleges, and Lane Theological Seminary. These five are the institutions which the Society took under its care at the beginning, in 1843. Those which have since been received on the list are Knox, Beloit, Thayer, Wittenburg, Oberlin, and Berea Colleges, the College of California, Pacific University, Olivet, Ripon, Iowa, Carleton, Doane, Drury, Washburn, and Colorado Colleges, Pacific Theological Seminary, and Yankton College.

During the past year Olivet and Washburn Colleges and Pacific Theological Seminary have passed off the list, and Whitman College, Walla Walla, Washington Territory, has been taken on.

The number of young men receiving assistance from the Society during the last financial year is 309.

At the time when the Education Society began its work of helping young men into the Christian ministry, in the year 1816, the condition of things in this country was very peculiar. The great movement of emigration toward the West was setting in with strength. The American Board had been organized a few years before, and the cause of foreign missions was taking strong hold upon the churches. But "the laborers were few." Ever since the close of the Revolutionary war, the churches had been in a confused and preoccupied state, and the number of men coming forward for the work of the ministry was alarmingly small. It was in such a state of things that this Society began its enterprise. Through the aid thus afforded, and through the impulses thus imparted, a host of living preachers was raised up to go with the moving colonies out into the fields of the West, or to go far hence to the Gentiles, to proclaim the Gospel of salvation through Jesus Christ. A work of inestimable importance for the Christianizing and civilizing of our own land was accomplished by this instrumentality. The ministers raised up by this Society became to a large extent the pioneers in the way of founding churches, schools, colleges, throughout all those Western fields, while in foreign lands half the missionaries laboring under the care of the American Board had been brought forward in the same way.

The object of this Association is to "establish and perpetuate the religious history and literature of New England, and for the holding of a suitable building for the accommodation of the same, and for the use of charitable societies; also to do such acts as may promote the interest of Congregational churches," etc.

Its library is intended for reference, having as its specialties everything published by the Pilgrims and Puritans, and their predecessors, contemporaries, and successors, which states or illustrates the principles and polity of Congregationalism, its history, its doctrine, its influence, and indeed the same things in regard to every denomination; thus everything ecclesiastical, — theology, controversy, results of councils, sermons, church manuals, minutes of religious bodies, *every one*; Year-Books and all such like; also all local histories, county, State and United States histories, genealogies, centennial, ordination, funeral, and all historical sermons, all commentaries on the Scriptures, every biography, national, State, and municipal statistics, printed reports of all kinds, catalogues, obituary records, and inaugurations of all our literary institutions, together with any manuscripts, autographs, or mementos which relate to the objects above named.

On the 20th of May, 1885, the library had 31,381 books — 6,535 of which were duplicates — and over 130,000 pamphlets, including duplicates, secured almost exclusively by gifts, as there has never been a dollar appropriated from the building fund with which to buy a book, nor can there be until the present onerous debt is greatly reduced. Duplicates furnish a basis for exchanges, for which the Librarian has large facilities, and of which he avails himself to the uttermost; and in this way he can assure all kindly disposed persons that they can send him no printed pamphlet or book that he cannot make useful here.

The library has now more of the early publications of our country and of the mother country which illustrate the principles and relate the deeds of our first settlers than any other public library in the United States; but it is still lacking very much of this sort that is scattered here and there, essentially useless where it is, but would be invaluable here; also much more of the later and contemporaneous issues of the same general character found in every parish and town more or less. Now, let these be collected and sent here by some good friend in each church, as a few have already done.

The Congregational House is a four-story granite structure, one hundred and three feet on Beacon Street, and ninety-three feet on Somerset Street, having stores on lower floors on Beacon Street, and rooms above for the A. B. C. F. M., the Woman's Board, the American College and Education Society, American Missionary Association, City Missionary Society, Woman's Home Missionary Society, Massachusetts Home Missionary Society, American Peace Society, the *Congregationalist*, etc. The fire-proof library room is in a connected building; accessible, light, pleasant, safe, and has capacity for more than 100,000 volumes.

The great WANT of this Association is the hearty sympathy and co-operation of every Congregationalist, expressed in "one fair contribution" from each of the more than 2,500 Congregational churches that have not made it; also gifts of tens, twenties, fifties, hundreds, and thousands from the more highly favored; testamentary gifts, if not earlier bestowed. Then this great property would be disencumbered, and all our strictly benevolent societies would be forever free from rent, thus insuring a good dividend to the cause of Christ upon every benefaction.

For parsonage building, balance May 1, 1885, \$25,255.25. Receipts for parsonage building from May 1 to Oct. 31, 1885, \$2,115.32. Total resources for parsonages for six months, \$27,670.57. Paid seventeen parsonage loans, \$4,905. Twenty-eight parsonage loans outstanding Oct. 31, 1885, \$8,998. Balance in treasury for parsonages Nov. 1, 1885, including the amounts pledged, \$22,762.57.

FACTS TO BE READ AND PONDERED. At the date of this writing (Nov. 6, 1885), forty-three applications for aid in church building, some of which have been waiting for the tide to rise in the treasury, for months, are in the hands of the Secretary. They call for a total of \$20,750. Nineteen of them are in places in which there is no other English-speaking Protestant church. In other words, the work on the field is in a most healthy and vigorous condition. It has never at any time been surpassed. Yet the available balance in the treasury, from which aid can be voted, is less than \$1000. The total cash receipts for church building for the six months ending Oct. 31, 1885, are less than those of the same six months last year, by \$3,352. Receipts from all sources for these six months are less than for the same period last year by \$2,046.37. We cannot for a moment doubt that the churches will come promptly to the rescue. The interest taken in the work during these later years of enlargement and grand success in the home missionary work has encouraged an unusual number of houseless churches to undertake to build. They counted on aid from outside. They must have it, or fail. Months, some times years, of hard toil must be worse than lost. The increasing number of contributing churches confirms in us the hope that the means to urge on the work will be forthcoming. One thousand four hundred and one churches contributed to this work last year. During the six months of the current year, seven hundred and forty two have given to it. If this ratio continues, we shall have more contributing churches than in any year since 1866.

The most urgent need. We are thoroughly satisfied that nothing is so much needed to fill up this and all our benevolent treasuries as the thorough presentation of the facts to the people of God. There is a most cheering spirit of benevolence in our churches. It can be widely spread and deepened. Conviction on any subject is produced, if at all, by facts. If every pastor in the land would prepare and preach one sermon a year on the work of God represented by each of our various benevolent societies, lighting up these sermons with the latest and freshest facts, contributions for the extension of the kingdom of Christ would greatly increase. Men are not apt to give to forward a work of which they have little or no knowledge. Will our friends and helpers, the pastors of the churches, consider and act on this suggestion?

The work of the Union seems to the Board of Trustees as thoroughly organized as an economical use of the funds given will allow. The home office has a Secretary, Treasurer, and Clerk. The Secretary spends half his time on the field, among the churches. The Field Secretary spends nearly his whole time among the churches. Every State and Territory in the Union, where we have any considerable amount of work, has a voluntary and unpaid secretary of this society, in addition to the Superintendent or Secretary of the American Home Missionary Society. The unpaid services of these brethren is beyond all price. In addition to this, the registrar of every local conference or association of Congregational churches is asked to act as correspondent of the Union for the body to which he belongs. The Society is in this way kept promptly and thoroughly informed of facts pertaining to its work and interests. A house of worship may be burned, a church may die or suspend service. Notice goes promptly to the home office. A brotherly interest is taken in the non-contributing churches to see that they do not die for want of invitation and opportunity to help on the coming of the millennium of church and parsonage building.

The last two words of the sentence just written suggest one of the most encouraging features of the Union's recent work. Three years ago the Union had on its books a record of only two parsonages. It has now fifty-two completed and paid for, with outstanding pledges to twenty-eight more, eighty in all. The number will soon reach one hundred. Present and prospective occupants are happy.

THE HOME MISSIONARY, a monthly magazine, published by the Society, at sixty cents a year, including postage, gives a running account of the progress of the work in all parts of the country, largely from the pens of the superintendents and missionaries personally engaged in it. The monthly issue is 25,550 copies. AN ANNUAL REPORT sums up the results of the year. Leaflets and Tracts for the times are published as occasion calls, designed to help pastors, Sunday-school officers, and friends of Home Missions generally, in awakening and keeping alive an intelligent, practical, growing interest in the work. These may be had, free of charge, at any time, by addressing the officers of the Society at the Bible House.

For nearly sixty years the Society has been organizing churches in the West and South, and aiding in the support of their ministers till those churches are able to assume the whole expense. Its missionaries have from the first organized Sunday schools, provided proper teachers for them, and by watchful oversight have secured their permanence and highest usefulness.

In connection with the labor of its missionaries, 4,664 churches have been organized, and 2,301 have come to self-support. It has collected and disbursed in cash \$10,579,168.27, and in clothing, books, and other supplies, largely the offerings of Christian women, nearly \$1,532,000; in all, \$12,110,256. The additions to the churches have been 326,892.

In 1883 a Woman's Department was opened, with Mrs. H. M. SHELTON as secretary. Its object is to interest the women of our churches all over the country, and through them the children, more directly in the work; not to the diminishing of their helpful labor in the way of home-missionary boxes (of clothing, etc.), but to

secure also their gifts of money for the support of teachers in the Indian Territory and elsewhere, and for various special uses, as called for from time to time. Their aid in this line is steadily growing, but much more is needed. The Woman's Home Missionary Association, having its office in Boston, is, by the payment of \$500 a year or more, sustaining a teacher in the Indian Territory, commissioned by the American Home Missionary Society.

The number of missionaries employed in its fifty-ninth year (1884-5) was 1,447, 993 of them in States and Territories west and south of New York. They preached regularly in 2,900 stations, and at frequent intervals in many hundreds more. The number of Sunday-school and Bible-class scholars was 118,000. The additions to the churches were 8,734; 4,848 of them on confession of Christ. Churches organized, 155; reached self-support, 50.

The fifty-ninth year's receipts were, in cash, \$451,767.66; in supplies, \$52,550; in all, \$504,317.66.

At least \$500,000 in cash is needed this year properly to sustain the missionaries *now in the field*. To take up only such new work as the providence and Spirit of God manifestly call upon the Society to assume *at once*, \$100,000 more is imperatively required. The Society is doing much more work than ever before among the foreign-born in the newer parts of the country. At nearly every meeting of the Executive Committee chosen men are sent to new fields at the front, where they are most needed, but where their support involves heavy outlay by the Society. For securing the means essential to the carrying on of this great work the Society depends, under God, on the zealous co-operation of the pastors and members of the Congregational churches of the land.

Object:

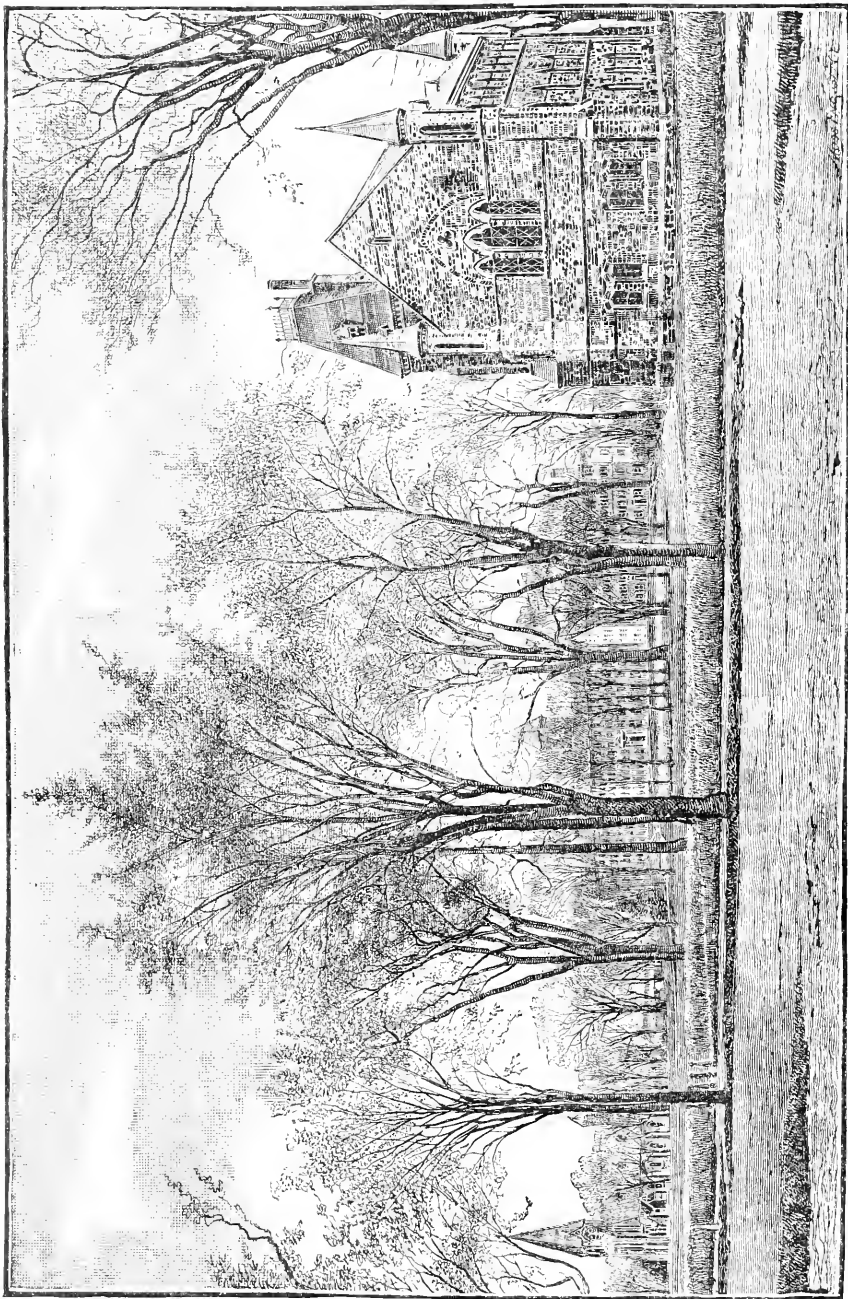

CALENDAR. — The annual period of study is divided into three Sessions. The last Session of the present Seminary year will commence on Monday, March 22, and continue till the Anniversary, Thursday, June 10. The next Seminary year will begin on Thursday, September 9.

COURSE OF STUDY. — The Junior year is devoted mainly to Biblical Exegesis and Introduction; the Middle year to Biblical and Systematic Theology; the Senior to Sacred Rhetoric, Pastoral Theology, and History of Christian Life and Doctrine. Systematic Theology is begun in the first year; also Biblical History, which is continued through the second. Lectures on Christianity and Science, the Scriptures, Elocution, with exercises in rhetoric and vocal culture continue through the course. Opportunity is given for instruction in Syriac, Arabic, and other cognate Oriental languages.

FOURTH YEAR for advanced study. Each member of the Advanced Class chooses his studies, subject to approval by the Faculty, and receives from the professors in the departments chosen personal direction and assistance. Special facilities are afforded for private reading and research. Lectures are given to the whole class on topics pertaining to the higher and more difficult questions which are engaging the attention of Christian scholars and pastors. Ten scholarships (\$200.00 each) are available for members of this class.

LIBRARY AND MUSEUM. — The Library now numbers more than 43,000 volumes, is constantly increased, and is open every week-day for the examination and drawing of books. A full reference library has been opened on the ground floor of Brechin Hall. The Museum comprises objects relating to missionary life and work, a monumental slab from Nimroud, a relief model of Jerusalem, and a large and choice collection of Palestinian birds, animals, flowers, coins, inscriptions, photographs, etc.

A well-furnished Gymnasium is open to the use of the students.

LOCATION. — The Seminary was located with a view to the advantages of uninterrupted study. These advantages have been retained, and are accounted of increasing value. At the same time, through the rise and growth of cities in the immediate vicinity, the students of the Seminary have special opportunities for studying the various conditions of church work, and the different methods of preaching. Andover is within four miles of Lawrence, ten of Lowell and Haverhill, fifteen of Salem, and twenty of Cambridge and Boston. The situation is remarkably healthful.

BANGOR THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY, BANGOR, ME.

This institution was chartered by the Legislature of Massachusetts in February, 1814, and was opened for students in October, 1816. It has been in constant service since, and has graduated several hundred pastors, missionaries, teachers, editors, and college presidents and professors.

TERMS OF ADMISSION. — Bangor Seminary is open to all denominations of Christians. Candidates for admission must produce testimony of their church membership and of their collegiate education. If they have not pursued a college course, they will be examined, and must exhibit mental training and attainments sufficient, in the judgment of the Faculty, to warrant their entering upon a course of theological study. Those whose age or circumstances forbid the pursuit of the complete course of study may, at the discretion of the Faculty, be admitted to the studies of the Middle year, and continue their course with the full privileges of the Seminary.

COURSE OF STUDY. — *Junior Year*, Hebrew Grammar, Principles of Interpretation, Exegesis of the Hebrew and Greek Scriptures; New Testament Greek; Introductory Philosophy, with text-books and lectures; Essays, and Lectures on Style and English Literature.

Middle Year, Systematic Theology; Ancient Church History; Exegetical studies continued; New Testament Greek continued; Vocal Culture and Oratory,

Senior Year, Mediaeval and Modern Church History; Homiletics; Pastoral Theology and Church Polity; Exegetical studies continued; New Testament Greek continued.

THE DEPARTMENT OF NEW TESTAMENT GREEK has been added to the usual course in order to supplement the department of Exegesis by grammatical and lexical study of the language of the New Testament. It has been established not only for the benefit of those who have had a classical training, but also to provide instruction for those who enter the shorter course with only a rudimentary knowledge of the Greek. The instruction is at present given by the Exegetical professors.

SPECIAL LECTURES. — A course of practical addresses on pastoral subjects is given each year by pastors selected for that service.

PREACHING. — As it is believed to be conducive to the best professional training to combine practice with theory, students are encouraged during the Senior year to preach as opportunity offers, and so far as they may without interfering with their Seminary duties. They usually take a license to preach at the close of the Middle year; and during the vacation are employed as missionaries of the Maine Missionary Society. Through the remainder of their course they are frequently called upon to supply vacant churches or missionary outposts.

POST-GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP. — A scholarship has recently been established in Bowdoin College for the purpose of aiding any student who, after graduating at the Seminary, desires to take a post-graduate year at the College.

EXPENSES. — Each student is charged two dollars a year for incidental expenses. There is no other charge for tuition, rooms, furniture, library, or any privilege of the Seminary. The dormitory has been thoroughly repaired and refitted. The rooms are carpeted and furnished. The income of the Washburn fund and some other funds, given expressly to aid members of the Seminary, will be distributed to those who need, and will amount to about half the expense of board.

LIBRARY. — The Seminary has an excellent library, numbering sixteen thousand volumes, specially selected to meet the wants of the students. There is a permanent library fund, with the income of which constant additions are made of the latest and most valuable literature.

The next Anniversary will occur on Wednesday, June 2, 1886.

ADMISSION.—The Seminary is open to students of all denominations. Candidates for admission to the regular course must be of good moral character, and must have received a collegiate education, or an equivalent preparation. Students from other seminaries may be admitted by certificate.

TERMS AND VACATIONS.—The next term will begin Wednesday, Sept. 18, 1886, and continue till the third Wednesday in April, when there will be a vacation of four months, for private study and remunerative Christian work.

SITUATION.—The Seminary Buildings front Union Park. The location is quiet, but the centre of the city may be reached in twenty minutes.

COURSE OF STUDY.—The Juniors have four exercises a week in Hebrew, four in Greek, and one each in Theology, History, Homiletics, and Elocution. The Middlers have four exercises a week in Theology, two in History, two in Hebrew, and one each in Greek, Homiletics, and Elocution. The Seniors have three exercises a week in Homiletics, two each in Hebrew, History, and Theology, one in Greek, one in Pastoral Theology, and private exercises in Elocution. The "Special Course" includes the full course in all the years except Hebrew and Greek, and has the following supplementary studies, which are limited to the first year: Rhetoric, Logic, Moral Philosophy, and daily exercises in English Composition and Bible Exposition.

THE GERMAN AND THE SCANDINAVIAN DEPARTMENTS.—Students in these departments, which are under competent instructors, take the regular or special course in the English language, according to their grade of preparation, that they may be able to preach also in English. They are, however, excused from some English studies, principally of a homiletical or practical kind, in place of which they pursue such exercises in their own native languages as are best adapted to prepare them to minister to our German or Scandinavian fellow-citizens.

EXAMINATIONS.—In each year there are two public examinations, oral and written, of all the classes.

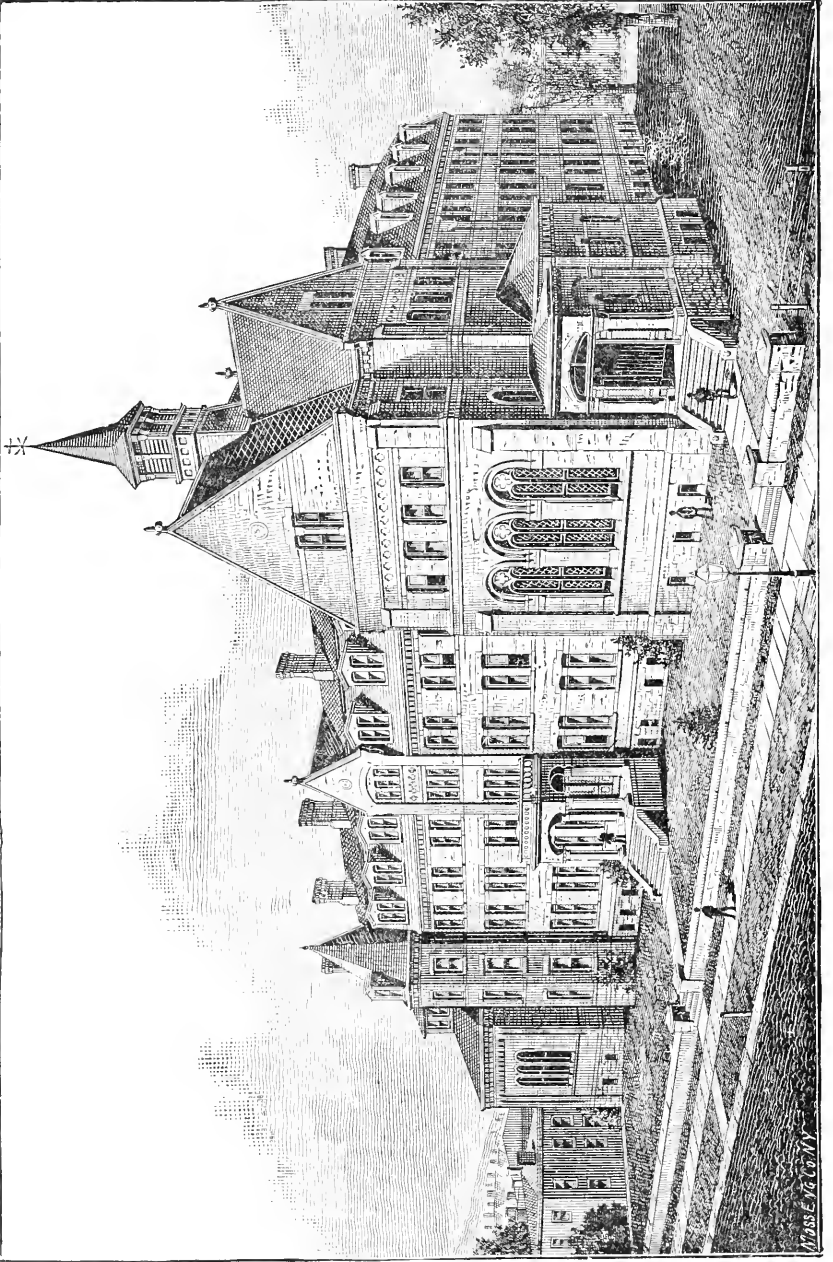

HAMMOND LIBRARY.—This contains the GENERAL and the REFERENCE LIBRARY with over 7,000 volumes, and the READING ROOM. Both of the latter are furnished with the best helps for students, and are open daily. There is also a special arrangement for the use of the Chicago Public Library, which offers 110,000 volumes, many of which are rare and valuable sets of reviews and important works of reference.

EXPENSES.—No charges are made for instruction, the rent of rooms, or for the use of Hammond Library. Suites of rooms have been furnished by churches or individuals. The only necessary expenses of the students are for board, fuel, gas, textbooks, the care of rooms, washing and for such special damages as the property of the Seminary may suffer at their hands. Good board can be had in private families in the neighborhood of the Seminary for \$2.50 or \$3.00 a week.

PECUNIARY AID.—From the American Education Society, supplemented by the Western Education Society and the Scholarship funds of the Seminary, a total of one hundred and fifty dollars a year for students in the regular course, and one hundred and twenty dollars for those in the special course; additional aid in clothing is furnished, when needed, by Ladies' Benevolent Societies; medical attendance without charge in case of illness; and such sums as may be received for preaching or teaching.

By its organization the Seminary is closely allied to the churches through the Pastoral Union, which annually elects the trustees.

The plan of instruction is so arranged as to make the study of the Bible the chief feature of the entire course. The patrons, guardians, and teachers of the Institution are persuaded that an exegetical and experimental knowledge of the Divine Word should be sought first of all by candidates for the gospel ministry. They also believe that scholarly investigation, controlled and tempered by the spirit of truth, justifies unflinching adherence to the doctrinal system set forth in the creed of the Pastoral Union, to which the professors annually give their assent, and which is in accord with the historical belief of New England Congregationalism, as embodied in accredited formulas. The effort is made to bring the several departments into such relations as shall give both scientific and vital unity to the course of instruction.

It is the aim of each professor to strengthen, on the part of the students, the habit of personal investigation. Daily drills bring teachers and pupils into such close relations as favor mental activity and appropriate criticism, the purpose being to train as well as to teach, to illustrate correct methods while their results are presented.

TERMS OF ADMISSION.—Candidates for admission are expected to produce evidence that they are members of some Christian church, and that they have graduated at some college, or have made such literary acquisitions as, in the opinion of the Faculty, are an equivalent preparation for theological studies. They will be examined in reference to their personal piety and their motives in seeking the ministry.

Besides lectures on Congregationalism, moot councils are held from time to time, for the purpose of making the student familiar with the principles and usages of our church polity.

Instruction is provided for all the classes in ecclesiastical music throughout each year.

EXPENSES.—No charge is made for tuition, room rent, or the use of the library. The rooms are supplied with the necessary articles of furniture.

Arrangements for board, at a common table, are made by the trustees.

The average cost of board has been \$3.50 per week. To aid in meeting this expense, several scholarships have been endowed. Further assistance will be furnished, in proportion to the necessities of each student, at the discretion of the Faculty. Fuel and lights may be estimated at from \$10 to \$15 the year for each room. The American Education Society renders aid to the amount of from \$75 to \$100 annually. Students who are licensed have occasional opportunities to preach for compensation.

CALENDAR.—There is but one term of study in the year, which begins on the second Thursday of September, and closes on the second Thursday of May. Students have opportunity in the long vacation to engage in some form of Christian activity, from which they may derive religious advantages and practical knowledge, as well as pecuniary benefit.

Persons desiring to join the Seminary are invited to address the Dean of the Faculty, from whom they will receive any needed additional information.

The Department of Theology is open for the admission of students of every denomination. Applicants must furnish satisfactory evidence of Christian character. A full collegiate education is regarded as furnishing a normal preparation for the course in Theology. Those who are not graduates of reputable colleges are required to furnish evidence of culture in all essential points fully equivalent to that which is given by a college course, and are admitted only upon careful examination in the ordinary collegiate branches. Upon the satisfactory completion of the regular three years' course, the Academic Degree of Bachelor of Divinity (B. D.) is conferred.

COURSE OF STUDY. — This has recently been greatly enlarged and rearranged upon the elective system. Candidates for a degree are required to have completed work amounting to 1,050 hours of lectures and recitations (besides elocutionary and rhetorical work). Of this work 485 hours are required, including courses in Exegesis of the Greek New Testament, Natural and Revealed Theology, Church History, Homiletics, Relations of Science and Religion, and the Forms of Modern Scepticism.

In addition, 1,220 hours of elective work are offered, of which the student must elect at least 565 hours. The elective courses include Hebrew and Old Testament Exegesis, Old Testament Introduction and Theology, Aramaic, Septuagint Greek, New Testament Exegesis, Church History, History of Doctrine, Church Polity, Homiletics, and Pastoral Theology.

LIBRARY. — The Libraries of the College contain over sixteen thousand volumes.

COUNCIL HALL, the building devoted exclusively to the Department of Theology, provides fully furnished rooms for fifty students. No expense is incurred for instruction, for the use of the libraries or of public rooms; and the students in Theology enjoy, without charge, the privileges of all the other departments of the College. The price of board is from \$2.00 to \$2.50 per week, or from \$72.00 to \$90.00 for the thirty-six weeks of the theological year. Fuel and lights will not cost more than \$15.00. Add the charge of \$5.00 per term for the care of the building, and the entire *necessary* expenses of the year — not including clothing, travelling expenses, and books — need not exceed \$100.00.

Help is granted from scholarship funds contributed by friends of the Department and from the American Education Society. The amount ordinarily received from both these sources does not vary much from \$150.00.

The opportunities for students to aid in meeting their expenses are sufficiently numerous. Some are employed as teachers in the Preparatory School connected with the College, and the amount received for teaching an hour each day exceeds the cost of board. Many vacant pulpits in the vicinity are supplied by theological students, for which compensation is rendered. During the summer vacation of fifteen weeks, all members of the Department may supply vacant pulpits in home-missionary and other fields; and such opportunities are abundant.

The year of study in this Department consists of thirty-five weeks, in three terms. The anniversary occurs Friday, June 4, 1886. The next year begins Tuesday, Sept. 14, 1886.

REGULAR STUDIES. — *First Year.* Greek; Hebrew; Sacred Geography and Antiquities; Origin, History, Authority, Inspiration, and Canon of the Bible; Interpretation of the Scriptures; Religions of the World, other than the Christian; Natural Science; Mental and Moral Science; Rhetorical Exercises.

Second Year. — Biblical Theology; Greek; Hebrew; Exercises in the Exposition of the Scriptures; Systematic Theology; History of Doctrines; Rhetorical Exercises continued.

Third Year. — Pastoral Theology; Church History; Church Polity; Homiletics; Rhetorical Exercises Continued; Connection of Natural Science with Religion. [An exercise in Hebrew and Greek Exegesis twice each week during the second and third years.]

SPECIAL STUDIES. — In special cases, particular and modified courses of instruction will be given to those who cannot remain three years, or who, for other reasons, cannot take the full course of three years; and these courses of instruction will be adapted to the necessities of each person, it being understood that every one of this class will continue his studies as long as practicable.

PREPARATORY STUDIES. — Young men who have not had the advantage of a collegiate course, and who are, for good reasons, debarred from the prospect of such a course, are enabled to pursue literary and scientific studies under the direction of the professors in the Hopkins Academy, immediately associated with the Seminary. These preparatory studies will vary with the requirements of each student.

CALENDAR. — The year consists of but one term, and begins with the first of September and ends with the middle of May. There will be a recess during the Christmas holidays. Students should begin promptly with the term.

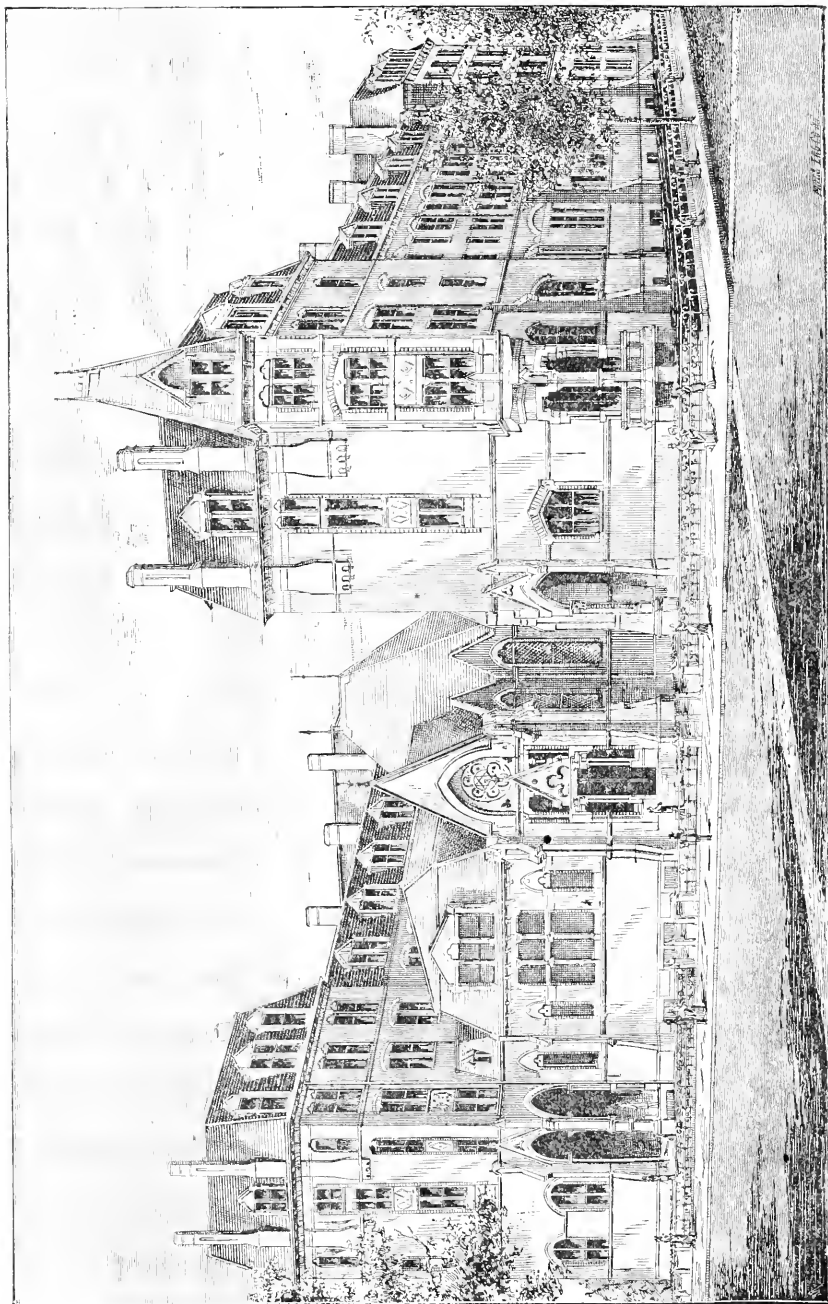
TERMS OF ADMISSION. — Credible evidence of piety, membership in some evangelical church, a collegiate education, or such other literary and scientific attainments as promise a fair degree of usefulness, will entitle all young men to the advantages of this Seminary. The benefits of the institution are accorded alike to students of all denominations of Christians.

EXPENSES. — There will be no charge for tuition, rent of rooms, or use of furniture. The trustees will, as far as practicable, furnish text-books free to those who are in need, themselves being the judges of the necessity. Those who desire it can board on the premises at the rate of \$3.00 per week. Fifty cents additional will be charged for washing.

PECUNIARY AID. — The American Education Society will render aid to the pupils of this Seminary who are needy, who are college graduates, and who take the full course of three years. The amount bestowed will be, when possible, \$100 a year to each beneficiary. Seven paying scholarships yield an average of about \$130 each per year to six beneficiaries.

An endeavor is continually made to provide for *all* the wants of every young man who wishes to take the full course of study, and every such person is urged to come to the Seminary, whether he has any means of his own or not. It is believed that the necessary expenses of a Theological School are less here than anywhere else in the Union.

No happier situation is known than the one occupied by this Seminary. The climate is unequalled for stimulating qualities, for mildness, and for general fineness. It is favorable to study every month in the year. It is a cure for many forms of invalidism. The scenery about the site is not inferior to that of the far-famed Bay of Naples itself. Both the beauties and the grandeurs of nature are within reach; and, to some extent, those of man, also.

RELATION TO THE UNIVERSITY. — The Divinity School is one of the Departments of Yale College. Its members receive from the Corporation, on completing their three-years' course of study, the degree of B. D. They have access to the public collections of the University, such as the Library, the Peabody Museum, and the collection of paintings and statuary in the School of Fine Arts. They are permitted to attend, free of expense, so far as will not conflict with their professional studies, the lectures and recitations in the College and the Sheffield Scientific School, and, if expecting to become foreign missionaries, those of the Medical Department.

COURSE OF STUDY. — The first year is devoted chiefly to the Exegesis of the Hebrew and Greek Scriptures; the second year to Systematic Theology, Church History, Old Testament Biblical Theology, and Church Polity; the third year to Sacred Rhetoric, the History of Christian Doctrine, and New Testament Biblical Theology. Additional lectures on Preaching and other important subjects are delivered before all the classes by eminent ministers and scholars in this country and Europe. There are also optional classes conducted by the Professors in New Testament Introduction, German, Syriac, and Chaldee. Once a week there is a rhetorical exercise for all the classes. Instruction in vocal culture and elocution is continued through the entire course.

GRADUATE OR FOURTH-YEAR CLASS. — Students who have completed a three-years' course of theological study, here or elsewhere, are admitted to the Graduate Class, established six years since, in which advanced studies in Theology are pursued under the direction of the Professors.

THE LIBRARIES of the University, to which the students have access, including the Reference Library of the Divinity School, contain over 156,000 volumes.

THE HOOKER FELLOWSHIP, for the encouragement of further theological study in this country or abroad, the income of which is \$700 a year for two years after graduation, is offered to the class entering in September, 1886.

EXPENSE. — There is no charge for instruction, use of libraries, or room rent. The rooms, which will accommodate one hundred and fifty students, are designed in general for only one occupant. Each room has a bedroom attached, and is carpeted and furnished with all needful furniture except bedclothing. The chief expenses for the session are for board, \$3.25 to \$3.50 a week; fuel and light, \$25 to \$30; and \$10 a year for care of room and incidental expenses.

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS AND OTHER AIDS. — Students whose circumstances require it are aided to the amount of \$100 a year, from the income of scholarship funds. Additional aid to the amount of \$75 to \$100 is afforded by the American Educational Society to its beneficiaries.

COMMENCEMENT OF THE TERM. — The present annual term of study began on Thursday, Sept. 24, 1885, and continues till the third Thursday in May (Anniversary), when the vacation of four months, in which the students have the opportunity to engage in some form of remunerative labor, will commence. The next annual term will begin on Thursday, Sept. 23, 1886.

APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION. — The Seminary is open on equal terms to students of all Christian denominations. 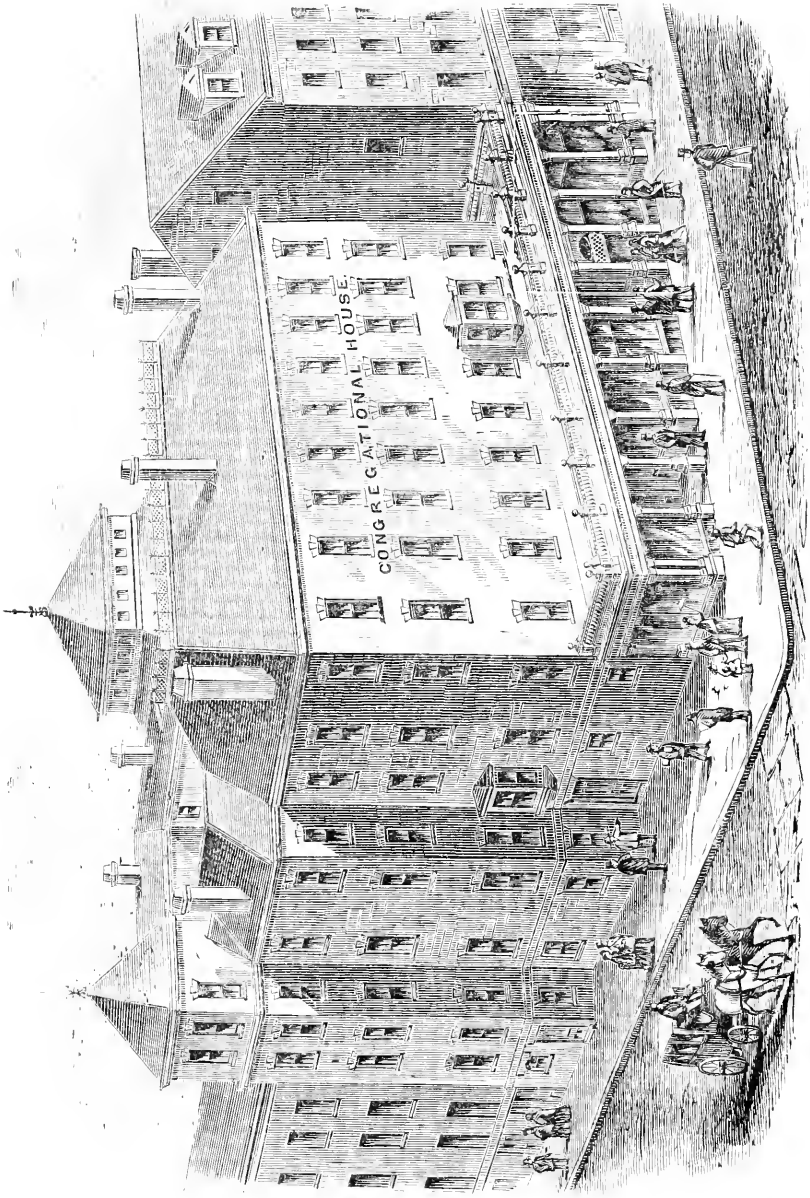

CONGREGATIONAL CHURCHES IN ALL LANDS.

THE *Congregational Quarterly*, 1877, Jan., page 62, contained an article and table, in which the attempt was made to group the Congregationalists in the world in one comprehensive view. It was necessarily imperfect at many points. The following repetition of the effort can hardly claim much more completeness. But it may serve to awaken a wider interest in the subject, and prepare the way for more satisfactory results in the future. The numbers marked by a (*) are not reports, but estimates. Among these is one of the largest and most important numbers in the table, — the membership of the English churches. Instead of this item, these churches report their *sittings*, 1,568,357 for England and Wales. As a basis for comparison, reports have been invited, from churches in this country, of their *sittings*, to which 370 churches, having a membership of 53,412, have responded. As the average membership of our churches is only 98, these reports represent churches larger than the average, and an estimate, based on these figures, would probably give too large a number for the membership in England. The number which it does give is 473,925. On the other hand, if the average membership of the English churches were the same as our own, the number would be 325,843. The difference between these figures suggests their uncertainty. It seems probable that the truth lies between them, and as the mean between these extremes is very near 400,000, we assume that number as our estimate of the English church members.

We follow the English "Year-Book" in including the McCall Mission in France, and estimate of its extent, without affirming the exactness of its organization or relations. And of the Swedish movement, we accept the estimate of Mr. Montgomery, who seems the best authority at hand.

THE ANNUAL STATISTICS OF THE CHURCHES AND MINISTERS.

THE following pages contain the statistics as collected in 1885 by the statistical secretaries of the several State organizations, and compiled for this publication by the secretary of the National Council, under vote of the publishing committee appointed by the Council.

The secretary, as heretofore, in no case presumes to insert or omit the name of church or minister on any authority but that of the State secretaries representing their own organizations, or of Councils subsequent to the date of annual reports.

The contents of the statistics are as follows:—

1. Tables of Congregationalists and of their Foreign Missions in the world.
2. The Statistics of the Churches and Pastors, by States.
3. List of Congregational Ministers in foreign lands.
4. General Summary Tables for the year.
5. Tables of Summaries. 1858-1885.
6. Remarks upon the Statistics and Minor Explanations.
7. The National, State, and Local Organizations of the Churches, with Officers, and dates of sessions in 1885.
8. Alphabetical List of Ministers, with P. O. address, and indexed to pages.
9. Alphabetical List of Licentiates.

RULES OF COMPILATION.

1. To arrange in alphabetical order everything capable of it; except that the churches in any one town or city are placed according to age.

2. To make each State list to conform strictly to the *State boundaries*. Churches or ministers reported by the Association of a State other than their own are, therefore, transferred to their proper places; and the summaries are correspondingly corrected.

3. To make *new tables* each year. "Last year's report" (if known to be such) is always omitted. No allowance is made for the membership of any non-reporting church or Sunday school, except such as is made by the State secretaries, who are the proper judges of its propriety. The list of churches of this year is compared, name by name, with that of last year, and all variations are specifically mentioned with the State summary, so that each church can be traced from year to year.

4. To examine carefully all the tables, with a view to *correction or addition* by correspondence, especially to correct "pastoral supply" to the latest moment. Proof-sheets have been sent to secretaries and some Home Mission superintendents who could be reached in season. But no such changes have been allowed to affect the summaries.

5. To *complete* the statistics by (1) giving in some form every statistical fact obtainable,—items given by some States, but not by all, being aggregated with the respective State summaries; and (2) putting into finished State and general summaries, with "totals" in all cases, everything capable of it; so that no person in search of any statistical fact shall be obliged to perform any arithmetical calculation to find it.

MINOR EXPLANATIONS.

1. Any church given in brackets is one organized since the date of State report; not included in the summary, but inserted for information. A few churches temporarily not associated are inserted by their own wish.

2. Installed pastors are marked "p"; others in service are not marked. Blanks in the column of pastoral supply, meaning *no* regularly engaged minister, are left blank for the convenience of those who note pastoral changes.

3. Post-office addresses of ministers in pastoral service are not found in the tables of churches, but in the General Alphabetical List of Ministers.

4. The two columns following the names of ministers in the tables of churches denote (1) the year of ordination, (2) the year when the minister was installed, or commenced service with that church.

5. A star (*) in the General Alphabetical List of Ministers denotes that the person designated is found in the original State alphabetical list, but is reported not to be a member of *any* such organization in the United States; or that he is found supplying some church, or did so last year, but is not in the State alphabetical list.

6. Licentiates are not reckoned as ministers. Churches supplied by such, or by ministers of other denominations, are reckoned as vacant; but the number of such churches is given in each State summary. No ministers of other denominations (if so known) are inserted in the General Alphabetical List. Some ministers belong to the two denominations at once.

7. The names of some Congregational ministers are, doubtless, missing; but it is solely because they are not reported by any organization of churches or ministers.

8. Under "Church Members," "Absent" are included in "Males," "Females," and "Total." "Additions," "Removals," and "Baptisms" cover the twelve months next preceding the date of report given with the name of each State. Under the head of "Removed," "Died," "Letter," and "Discipline" are represented by the abbreviations.

9. Blanks in any column of figures are such as were so left in the State Minutes. They ought always to signify "no report," but some States do not follow the proper rule of inserting a cipher where "none" is meant, and the examiner must conjecture, in any given case, whether "none" or "no report" is intended. In our General Summaries, a blank invariably signifies "no report."

10. A vigorous effort has been made this year to give, with the name of a church, its *post-office address* if it be different from the name of place given. The effort is greatly, but not entirely successful. It will be tried again next year.

Notes.—1. The distinction is made between contributions for benevolent purposes and moneys raised for any home expenses. For instance, money given to the general Sabbath-school cause is benevolent; money expended by a church in supporting its own Sabbath school is a home expenditure, as much as a pastor's salary.

2. The amount of Home Expenditure does not mean all that is spent in a given place, but solely what is raised by a church itself, exclusive of all outside aid.

3. The amounts reported above for the *specific* objects of benev-

olence are such as are reported (and added up) by the State organizations, and are below the facts. They are inserted as indicating proportions, but are not worth adding up. It should be noted that in some States the sums were amounts contributed to a particular society; in others, for causes represented by that society,—a distinction which we cannot preserve this year. Some States so group objects that some items cannot be distinguished.

4. It will be seen that the reports are very imperfect. Many churches make no report.

Ten States report contributions to the New West Education Commission, which are included in the column for Home Missions above. These are as follows: Connecticut, \$5,428.65; Illinois, \$7,210.06; Maryland, \$112; Massachusetts, \$11,628.91; Michigan, \$338.83; Minnesota, \$1,110.81; Nebraska, \$124.21; New Jersey, \$991; New York, \$565.08; Pennsylvania, \$885; total, \$28,147.55.

QUINQUENNIAL STATISTICS.

The National Council, at its session in Detroit (see *Minutes* 1877, page 87), adopted the following recommendation.

It is also recommended that certain other statistics be reported once in five years beginning in 1880:—

1. Value of house of worship and chapel, and land on which they stand.
2. Date of erection of house of worship.
3. Value of parsonage.
4. Amount of funds, not including parsonage.
5. Amount of indebtedness.
6. Salary of minister, including value of use of parsonage.
7. Amount of all parish expenses (in the year of the report), including salary.

For some reason this proposition was not carried out in 1880; but during the past year the effort has been made to collect these quinquennial statistics, with the measure of success shown in the following table.

The value of houses of worship is given by 2,515 churches in twenty-three States. The total amount is \$24,607,476, giving an average value for the reporting churches of \$9,784.

Twenty States and 1,092 churches report parsonages, reaching an aggregate value of \$2,390,253, and an average of \$2,189. Probably most of the parsonages in the country are included in this statement.

A more exact definition of the term "funds" was needed by some of the reporters, and small balances in a church treasury, which would not properly be included, are occasionally permitted to serve in this column; and these 592 churches in thirteen States report funds to the amount of \$1,878,866, an average of \$3,174 to each reporting church.

Seventeen States and 574 churches report debts amounting to \$953,294, averaging \$1,853 to each reporting church. The funds of the churches would balance their debts, and leave a surplus of \$925,472.

Salaries are reported from 2,230 churches in twenty-two States, reaching a total of \$2,189,631, and an average for each reporting church of \$982. It is doubtless the fact that the proportion of low salaries is larger among the non-reporting churches and this average would be reduced by full statistics.

Parish expenses, including salaries, are reported by 2,030 churches in thirty-three States. The total amount is \$4,480,190, and the average \$1,482. This average, like the last, would be smaller if all the churches were reported. Most of the items in this column correspond with the Home Expenditures (Summary III., page 219). But the reports from a few of the States under the latter head plainly omit salaries and such figures could not be included in this table.

REPORTED BY THE SEVERAL STATE ORGANIZATIONS.

The following is a compilation of the alphabetical lists furnished by the State Associations and Conferences, corrected by correspondence with their secretaries to the latest possible date. The secretary of the Council in no case presumes to insert or omit a name upon his own responsibility. The State organizations (or later Councils) are alone responsible; but the secretary has used his utmost endeavors to obtain a complete and correct list. If any names are omitted, it is because they are not reported by any organization in any State.

The figures refer to pages where the name will be found in the tables, in the Vital Statistics, in the service of the Benevolent Societies, of the Theological Seminaries, or in the list of foreign missionaries. In some cases the *page* is left as in tables, when the post-office is changed since the tables were put to press.

Names starred (*) are of persons who, although mentioned (usually as supplying churches), are not reported as members of any organization of Congregational churches or ministers. A few names are also retained with a *, of those who were in active service last year, and may be presumed to be *in transitu*. Such names are not continued a second year, without specific report.

Some post-office addresses are antiquated; but it is the best that could be done.

Licentiates are not included in this list, nor are ministers of other denominations.

A list of licentiates follows this list.

Names of persons in last year's list, deceased since the issue of 1885, are retained, and are indexed to the pages of the "Vital Statistics."

Some errors will be found in first names, initials, and spelling. No pains have been spared to secure accuracy; but, efforts failing, the compiler has not ventured to follow even his own convictions, against the unmistakable testimony of the reports.

Names differing only in use of final "e," as Clark, Clarke, are treated as one name but spelled according to report.

Letters for our missionaries will be addressed to the care of society mentioned with the name, such societies (initials) being (as are all foreign addresses) in italics.

Ministers without charge are indicated by the year of ordination. This date, following the name, takes the place of the page reference, used in case of those who are named in the preceding tables. The two classes of ministers, those in charge of churches, and those who have no charge, are thus conveniently distinguished in this list, the former by a page number, and the latter by the year of ordination, against their names.

The post-office addresses are often delusive, the place being that of temporary service only. 3. Names followed by State only are of persons approved in the State mentioned, no residence being reported. 4. The list is incomplete, because some States make no full report of licentiates. 5. The contracted name of a State in brackets means that the name was reported by that State, although the person resides elsewhere.

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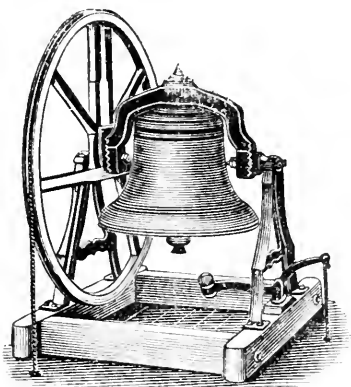
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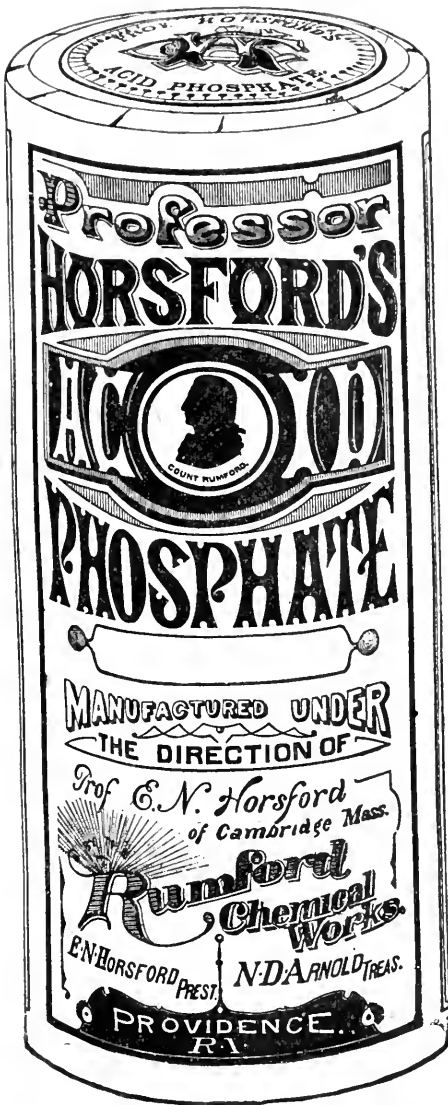
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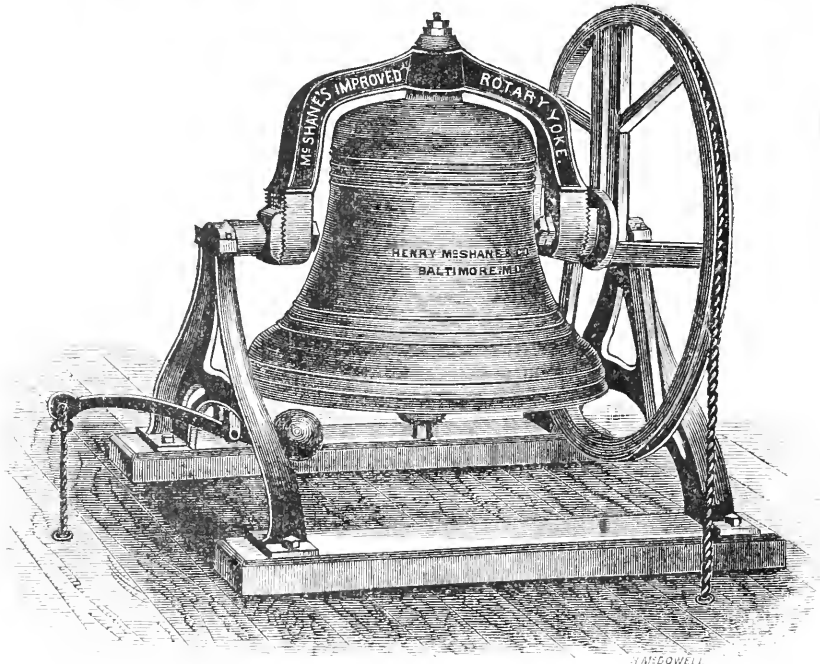
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
