The present work contains the Coptic versions of ten Greek homilies on fasting, repentance, the end of the world, the incarnation, etc., which are attributed to John the Faster, Athanasius of Alexandria, Proclus of Cyzicus, Eusebius and Basil of Caesarea, and Archbishop Theophilus. The texts were translated from the dialect of Upper Egypt into English by E. A. Wallis Budge. Linguistically, the texts are of great importance, and they form a mass of material which is of the highest value to Egyptologists generally. From a theological point of view, the texts are no less interesting, for they illustrate Egyptian theology in its Christian form, and reveal the opinions which were current among the dwellers in monasteries.
