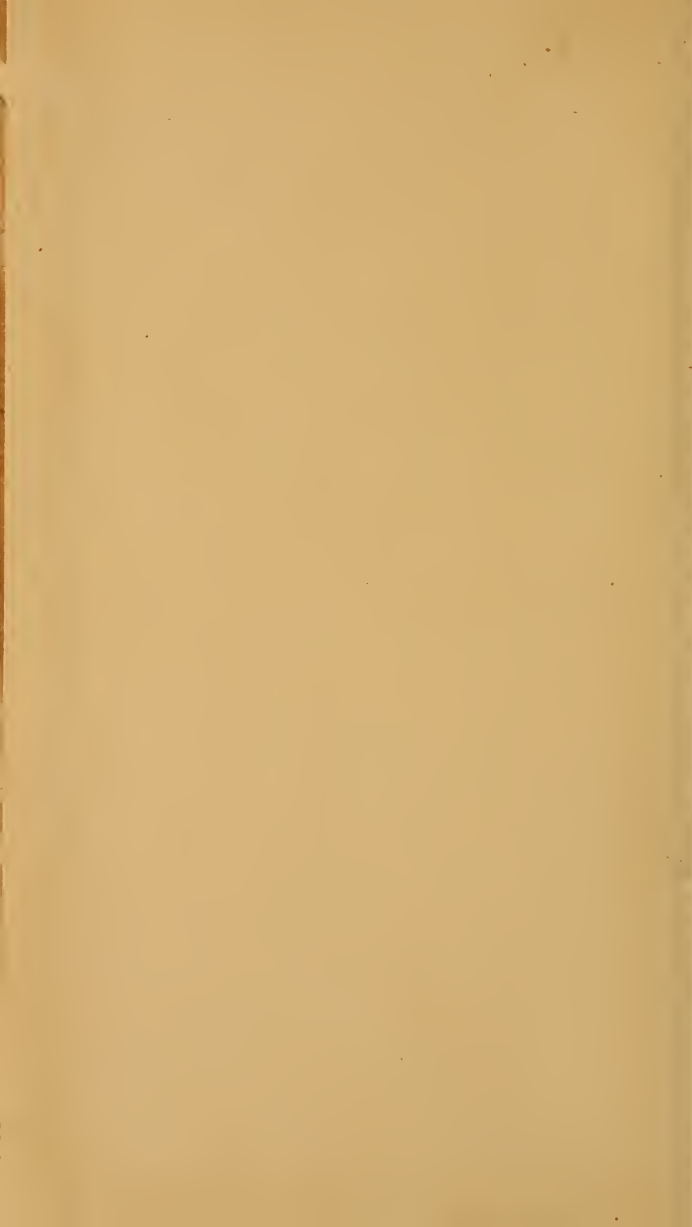

Of the ECLIPSES in this Year 1767.

THIS Year will produce only two Eclipses, which are expected to happen in the following order :

The first Eclipse is of the Sun, and will happen on Friday the 30th Day of January, near our 4 o'Clock in the Morning ; consequently invisible to us, and to all these Parts of the Globe.

The second Eclipse is likewise of the Sun, and will happen on Saturday the 25th Day of July, near our 7 o'Clock in the Afternoon ; but invisible to us, and to all Europe.

A Description

*A Description of the Four Quarters of the
Year 1767.*

THE *Spring Quarter* begins this Year on the 20th Day of *March*, at eight in the Afternoon, at which Time the Sun enters the Equinoctial Sign *Aries*, making equal Day and Night all the World over.

The *Summer Quarter* begins upon the 21st Day of *June*, at seven in the Afternoon, the Sun then entering the northern Tropical Sign *Cancer*, making the longest Day to all the northern, and the shortest to all the southern Parts of the World.

The *Autumn, or Harvest Quarter*, begins the 23d Day of *September*, at eight in the Morning, the Sun then entering into the Equinoctial Sign *Libra*, making again the Day and Night equal in all Parts of this terraqueous Globe.

The *Winter Quarter* begins the 21st Day of *Decemler*, at Midnight; the Sun then entering into the southern Tropical Sign *Capricorn*, making the shortest Day to all the northern, and the longest to all the southern Inhabitants of the World.

THE Year, consisting vulgarly of Twelve Months, is contained in Twelve Pages, each Month is divided into *Eight* Columns: In the *1st* of which are placed the Days of the Month; in the *second*, the Days of the Week, D, being the Domonical Letter for this Year. The *third* contains the Feasts Fixed and Moveable, the Beginning and End of Terms, and other remarkable Days in the Year. The *fourth* shews the Time of the Moon's Rising and Setting. The *fifth* shews the Hour and Minute of High-Water at *London Bridge* every Day. The *sixth*, a Judg-

ment of Weather, &c. The seventh, on the Blank-Side, is Sun-rising. The eighth is Sun-setting, every Day in the Year. The ninth Notices of Husbandry and Physic.

When any thing extraordinary is to be moved, they demand a Deputation of the chief Citizens to assist them, from twelve, sometimes to ninety-six, that there may be no Room for Reproach.

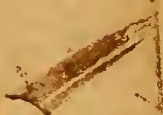
