## OUR PIONEERS



The Pioneer coach contains a number of the original purchasers and settlers of a tract of ground situated in that part of the city bounded by Fair Oaks avenue on the east and the Arroyo Seco on the west. They established themselves and entered into the citrus fruit industry between the years 1873 and 1875, and were known as the Indiana Colony. The tract on the east of Fair Oaks avenue was surveyed and placed upon the market by the Hon. B. D. Wilson in the early summer of 1876, at which time others began to arrive who followed the example, in horticulture, of those who had come before.

**Places of Interest.**

From the time the Franciscan friars located the San Gabriel Mission in the valley of this name, three miles from Pasadena, and made it, in time, the richest Mission in California, up to the present, a romantic interest has attached to this region. Helen Hunt Jackson intensified it when she laid the scene of her great story of Ramona here, and other writers have contributed incidents to make certain places in this section of Southern California famous. The beauty of the scenery and the climate are the perennial attractions to visitors to Pasadena, but not a little of their interest centers in the historic spots that may be reached by short drives or walks.

The city is so situated also, as to command easy approaches to many other places well worth visiting. The heights of the Sierra Madre range of mountains, which tower above the town on the north, are reached by taking the Mount Lowe Electric railway, or the Mount Wilson Toll Road. At the termini of both trips will be found first-class hotel accommodations.

The mountains are full of delightful gorges, too, where trout fishing is had, and where gray squirrels, quail and other small game may be shot, and an out-door life spent amidst scenery of rare beauty.



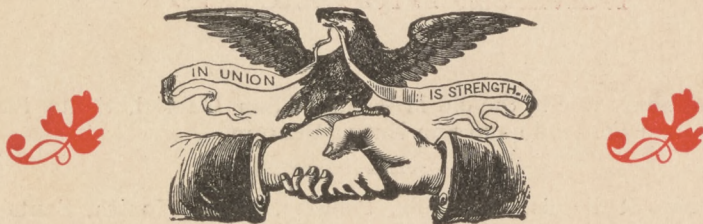
