Sir,

With reference to my telegram No.9 of 26th February, 1947, regarding S/S "Ulua", engaged in carrying Thegal Jewish immigrants to Palestine, I have the honour to report that I have been informed verbally by the Minister for Foreign Affairs that in future no provisional certificates of ships registry may be granted by Honduranean consular officers at United States ports without reference to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs here, and that instructions to this effect have been issued to the consular officers through the Ambassador in Washington. This measure has been adopted in order to ensure greater control over the issue of provisional certificates of registry, which previously were issued after approval by the Ministry of War. Marine and Aviation only.

- The Minister for Foreign Affairs would also like to have the issue of provisional certificates of registry suspended until the termination of the illegal transportation of Jews to Palestine; but the Minister of War, Marine and Aviation has not yet agreed to his suggestion.
- 3. Further developments in this connexion will be reported in due course.
- I am sending a copy of this despatch to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington and to His Majesty's Consul General at New York, together with a copy of my telegram No.9 of 26th February, for their information.

Illegal emigration into Palestine.

Honduranean Embassy now informs us that instructions have been just received from the Honduranean Ministry of Foreign Affairs to the effect that owners of the "President Warfield" are to be told that if the ship takes on refugees or enters waters blockaded by the British administration in Palestine, Honduras registry will automatically be cancelled. Acting Honduranean Consul General at New York is so informing owners but because of these instructions did not again proceed to Philadelphia to remove papers here [sic].

- 2. This is obviously not very satisfactory since ships can proceed empty with Honduras registry to some European destination. She may then succeed in taking on refugees clandestinely and re-appear as did the "Abril" in Palestinian waters. The removal of her Honduras registry at that moment would not contribute to prevention of sailings from the United States of America nor to the aim of lessening the burden on Cyprus. Honduranean Embassy indicate that as a result of these instructions they could do no more in Washington and that the matter must be taken up with the Honduranean Government if His Majesty's Government desire further action.
- 3. Ship is still in Philadelphia but is likely to be ready to sail at any time. Consul General will report her movements to us.

Dear Mr. Beith,

I am very grateful for your letter No. E 2010/84/31 dated the 10th March, and in reply I wish to say the following:

S/S SAN EUSEBIO- Thanks to the information given by the Foreign Office, I was able to instruct the Panamanian Consul at Copenhaguen, and prevent the sailing of this vessel .-

S/S SAN FILIPO: -Luck turned the other way here and our Consul was unable to prevent this vessel from leaving, partly because of the lack of cooperation of the Port Authorities at Marseille. - This vessel, having been struck off the Panamanian registry, is flying the Panamanian flag illegally.-Its whereabouts at present are not known. The British Navy are most welcome, if they search her, to treat her as a pirate.

S/SSHOREHAM & S/S LOWESTOFT: These vessels have infact been purchased by a panamanian shipping company but they have yet to be placed under the Panama Flag. They will not be, in view of the fact that your information has been substantiated by the results of my own personal investigation. I have informed the Panamanian Authorities accordingly, just in case the Owners seek to obtain the flag at some other panamanian Jonsulate.

S/S ANAL: - This is a cargo vessel at present undergoing repairs at Marseille. - There is nothing to indicate that your suspicions X are correct. I would, in this case, need further proof before being able to take some sort of action.

S/S SNAPDRAGON: - First class people, good reputation, suspicions definately unfounded. - However, I would welcome further information based on facts.

S/S LACONIA: - Same as the previous ship.

S/S DEMELIOS: - This vessel was reportedly at Antwerp and believed to be controled by Japtain John Eliadis who tried to secure the Panamanian flag. Our Consul there, duly warned by me -thanks to your timely information- refused to even consider the application. The Jentral Panamanian Authorities have also been duly informed.

S/S SAN SPYRIDON: - This vessel is owned by a panamanian shipping company also under the control of the said John Eliadis. It is at present flying the Sewdish Flag anf will not receive panamanian nationality.

Needless to say that I would welcome further information in respect of Panamanian vessels and I can promise you the unconditional cooperation of this office.

My present status of Jhargé d'Affaires a.i. is of course only temporary. As Jounsellor of Legation "de carriere", I am in charge of the Jonsulate General in London. His Majesty's Consul-General Philadelphia has now received reliable [? gp. omitted] that "President Warfield" is being cleared through Customs today, ostensibly for Marseilles, though it is understood that she will stop first at the Azores (or possibly Funchal) to fuel. She has a general cargo consisting mostly of stores and a deck cargo of oil in barrel. Of the crew of 44. 37 are Jews. The remaining 7, including the Master who is an American citizen, are to be replaced in Marseilles and repatriated. She is still flying the Honduranean flag.

We have information that S.S. President Warfield, belonging to the Weston Trading Company, New York, and under Honduranean registry, left Philadelphia on the 29th March with the object of picking up Jewish illegal immigrants at a Mediterranean port and carrying them to Palestine.

- 2. We are also informed that this ship may call at the Azores for oil bunkers. We understand that bunkering facilities there are in Portuguese hands.
- 3. Unless you see objection, please ask the Portuguese Government to take steps to prevent the bunkering of the President Warfield if it should attempt to re-fuel at the Azores.
- 4. For your information, British oil companies are co-operating in the denial of fuel to ships engaged in this traffic, and we are urgently considering an approach to other Governments.

I have the honour to refer to Your Excellency's letter of the 24th February last in order to pass on to you the following communication dated the 22nd March which I have received from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of my country:

"I have pleasure in acknowledging the receipt of your communication A-196 of 28th February last about a complaint formulated by the British Embassy in Washington in protest against the illegal activities of the Panamanian ships named "BALBOA" (previously "NORSYD"), "COLON" (previously "BEAUHARNOIS") and "CADIO" (previously "OWEN SOUND").

Department remitted the matter to the Ministry of Finance, whose concern it is, and their reply is that the local law firm of Lombardi & Icaza, to which the British Embassy refers, has stated that it has nothing to do with the activities of these ships and equally has no relations with the owners of the said vessels.

"I should be glad if you would so inform the British Embassy and tell them in addition that the Ministry of Finance has ordered an investigation to be made into the trade in which the ships complained of are engaged, and that should sufficient proof of their illegal commercial activities be discovered, the Ministry will then cancel their papers".



We have been sent by Messrs. Carlos Icaza A., of this town, a copy of their indignant letter to Lord Inverchapel of March 13th, protesting against allegations contained in your note of February 24th last (84/19/47) to the Panamanian Ambassador in Washington in regard to their alleged ownership of vessels transporting illegal emigrants to Palestine.

It is not clear to us why these matters are dealt with by your Embassy directly with the Panamanian Embassy in Washington, rather than, as one would naturally expect, through this Legation and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, but no doubt there is good and sufficient reason for this procedure.

Lombardi and Icaza are a well-known and reputable firm of lawyers, part of whose business is to act as local representatives of foreign shipping companies who register ships under the Panamanian flag. They are not themselves shipowners.

I understand that last October Hadow spoke to Alfaro in New York about this matter. Ellison, then Chargé d'Affaires here, after a mild protest at being left out of the picture, raised the matter with the Acting Minister for Foreign Affairs, Dr. Sucré, who told him that Lombardi and Icaza were not a firm to be mixed up in any shady transaction. Then came your letter of February 24th to Dr. Vallarino, based on what appears to be totally incorrect information (though here we are subject to correction).

I am sure that if the Embassy has been misinformed, it will retract the allegations about this firm (with whom we have hitherto been on excellent terms). This whole question seems to be in something of a muddle. Several of the so-called Panamanian ships turn out eventually to have Hondurian registration, and we have been receiving cypher telegrams from you which I have asked Allen to discontinue sending us other than by bag in view of the expense and the extra work entailed for our cypher officer in matters which do not (at present) directly concern us.

Enquiries have been made here about Arias and Arias, mentioned in Icaza's letter to Dr. Alfaro as Agents to Caribbean Atlantic Shipping Corporation. They are Dr. Harmodio Arias, owner of the Panama American (a bilingual daily which has recently shown signs of becoming friendly to us), and his son. They originally carried out the registration of the NORSYD and BEAUHARNOIS, but their name no longer appears, being replaced by that of Illueca. Arias and Arias have no interest in the ships, except as lawyers who allow their address to be used for the usual fee.

On the other hand, Roberto Arias (the son) is in partnership with Illuecas.

There would appear to be good grounds for approaching the Panamanian authorities and suggesting that, whereas there seems to be nothing at all against the lawyers concerned, the Caribbean Atlantic Shipping Corporation ought to be refused permission to fly the Panamanian flag, in order to stop their illegal activities.

At the same time, as I told you, the Colonial Office have received a telegram from Jerusalem saying that the American Consul-General there (in charge of Panamanian interests) has complained that allegations made against the "Cadio" were unfounded.

There seems to bb a certain amount of confusion about this vessel. Perhaps you may be able to clear it up?

I am sending a copy of this letter to Higham at the Colonial Office.

Reference is made to Mr. Makins' and your previous correspondence with the Director General, particularly to Mr. Makins' letter of 23rd December, 1946, on the subject of UNRRA supplies alleged to have been made available to Jewish immigrants to Palestine at the port of Bakar.

As indicated in the Director General's letter to Mr. Makins of 10th January, the Administration has requested information on this matter from our Mission In Yugoslavia.

A cabled report has now been received from them. It states that, according to a reply from the Yugoslav government, all refugees passing through Yugoslavia are being supplied with food by the Yugoslav Red Cross, which has obtained such food as gifts from various national and international organizations, exclusive of UNRRA contributed supplies.

The government further states that no exceptions are made to this rule.

Complaints against vessel "Cadio".

When representations were originally made to Panamanian Embassy in Washington concerning illegal immigrant ships "Norsyd" and "Beaharnois" reference was made to the possibility of the Cadio being engaged in same traffic since she had been sold in Costa Rica by War Assets Corporation on behalf of the Canadian Government to the same New York firm as the other two. I regret that, in reminding the Panamanian Ambassador of this previous communication when writing to him again on February 24th about illegal immigrants, we inadvertently linked the Cadio to the other two ships by saying that all three had been intercepted while engaged in this traffic. In fact, the latest news we have received of "Cadio" (see Chancery letter to Eastern Department 4421/03/47 of March 6th (P.L. No.04 to Jerusalem)) is that she may have been engaged in smuggling arms to Greece.

- States Consul-General be told that while early evidence indicated that the "Cadio" might be engaged in illegal immigration traffic, statement that she was so engaged was made inadvertently. Subsequent information given in Chancery letter 4421/03/47 of 6th March might then be passed to him.
- in the course of a series of communications addressed to the Panamanian and Honduranean Embassies here with the object of showing that we were very much alive to the misuse which was being made of ships under registry.


