We refer to our telephone conversation of this morning and quote as follows the contents of a cable which we have received from Avvocato Neill:

"KORA ARRESTED FOR FIFTEEN HUNDRED POUNDS CAPITAL INTEREST COSTS STOP YOUR LETTER TWENTYFIRST RECEIVED POSITION NOTED BUT OWNERS ENTITLED OBTAIN RELEASE VESSEL AGAINST BAL"

You will see that the "Kora" has now been me-arrested for the amount of the claim of Norton & Co. Lisbon.

We have also received instructions from Howard Tenens, Ltd. this morning to effect a new arrest of the "Kora" in connection with disbursements incurred at Antwerp amounting to £340.18.4. The claimant in that case is Agence Maritime De Keyser Thornton S.A. of 43, Longue Rue Neuve, Antwerp, and the necessary instructions have been sent to Avvocato Neill telegraphically to-day.

We do not think there is much we can add except to draw attention to the final paragraph in ir. Neill's letter of the 29th May.

Mr. Cable will recollect that we discussed with him whether or not the claim for necessaries ranked as a Maritime Lien against a ship, according to Italian Law.
The answer appears to be "yes", if the necessaries
claim is not more than six months old, and this means,
so we understand it, that in the event of the sale of
this vessel, which is subject to an outstanding necessaries claim, subject to the time limitation, the claimant has the right to proceed against the vessel notwithstanding the change of ownership and provided of course that the arrest was made at an Italian port.

I confirm my yesterday's cable reading:

"KORA ARRESTED FOR FIFTEEN HUNDRED POUNDS CAPITAL INTEREST COSTS STOP YOUR LETTER TWENTYFIRST RECEIVED POSITION NOTED BUT OWNERS ENTITLED OBTAIN RELEASE VESSEL AGAINST BAIL."

On the 22nd inst. I was called up by the British Consulate General inquiring whether I had received instructions from London regarding this vessel. I informed them of your cable of the 20th inst. and was told that they had instructions from the Foreign Office to lend me such assistance as might be required. I was glad of this since the data I possessed were not sufficient to enable me to apply for an order of arrest. I thereupon asked the Consulate to write me an official letter, the terms whereof I drafted, with the particulars contained in your cable, and instructing me to do whatever under Italian law might be necessary to protect the interests of Messrs. Norton & Co.Ltd. With this letter in hand, in addition to your cable, I was able to obtain without delay the order of arrest, which was effected yesterday morning.

The total amount of your Clients' claim is £972.2.8; but the arrest is for £.1500. the difference standing as guarantee for interest and costs.

Your letter of the 21st inst, with documents referred to therein reached me yesterday morning. Concerning the confidential information you have given me I mentioned it to the British Consul, who know all about the matter, of course, and have requested me to keep the information private and confidential. I advised them, however, that under Italian law the owners would be entitled to obtain the release of the vessel by supplying bail in the amount for which she has been arrested, and that I had been informed that the owner Mr. Gasparinatos is expected to arrive in Genoa tomorrow from Cairo.

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If Ir. Gasparinatos should approach me on the question of furnishing bail, I propose to insist that it should be given in London. We could not legally refuse, of course, to release the vessel on bail being supplied.

I shall keep you duly advised of all further developments.

which crossed mine of that same date informing you that the arrest had been effected.

I have received also your further cable of the 28th reading:

"AIRMAILING VOUCHERS SUPPORTING FURTHER CLAIM DISBURGEMENTS ANTWERP TOTALLY £340 APPROXIMATELY CLAIMANTS AGENCE MARITIME DE KEYSER THORNTON S A 43 LONGUE RUE NEUVE ANTWERP STOP PLEASE ARREST KORA PENDING PROVISION BAIL."

Regarding the arrest for this other claim, I propose acting in such a manner as to effect it only when the first arrest is about to be lifted when payment is made or bail supplied; the object being to detail the vessel here as long as possible in order to assist as best we can the British Authorities.

These claims for disbursements are in the nature, of course, of maritime liens under Italian law, and rank in the 6th (last) category xx. The lien stands good for six months as from the date on which the disbursements were made.

His Britannic Majesty's Embassy present their compliments to the Royal Hellenic Ministry for Foreign Affairs and, with reference to the Note No. 22834 of the 3rd April from His Excellency Monsieur Tsaldaris to Sir Clifford Norton, concerning the co-operation of all departments of the Royal Hellenic Government in endeavours to prohibit the flow of illegal immigrants into Palestine, have the honour to request the assistance of the Royal Hellenic Government in the following matter.

The s.s. "Anal" left Sete in the south of France in ballast early this month and embarked a cargo of 372 illegal Jewish immigrants secretly in France or Italy very shortly afterwards. The vessel put into Palermo and, while there, the master claimed that her destination was Alexandria. His Majesty's Government have now been informed by the Tgyptian Government that no Tgyptian visas for this party have been authorised. This information merely serves to corroborate the previous evidence that the ship was engaged in the illegal immigration traffic, which had already been confirmed by the fact of her secret embarkation of Jews.

The "Anal" left Palermo on May 19th to continue her voyage eastwards, and His Majesty's Embassy have now been informed that she is at present at sea between Sicily and Palestine, that she may run short of fuel, and that it is possible that she will put into a port in Crete or some other part of Greece. His Majesty's Embassy have therefore been instructed by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to request the Royal Hellenic Government to be so good as to give immediate instructions to Greek port authorities that no fuel is to be supplied to the s.s. "Anal", if she puts in at a Greek port.

The known net tonnage of the s.s. "Anal" is 159 and it is clear that she can not carry this number of passengers without violating the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, 1930.

The facts at the disposal of His Majesty's Government as given above, have been brought to the attention of the Panamanian Consul General in London for the information of his Government who are being asked to have the ship detained at the next port of call. It is believed that the Government of Panama will then wish to cancel the Panamanian registration of the **bes**sel.

The owners of the vessel are the Compania Anal Provencial S.A. of Panama, one of the directors of which is a certain Greek subject named Pilides. In view of the fact that the ship has been clearly shown to be carrying illegal immigrants to Palestine, and in view of the virtual certainty that her gross overloading is a breach of the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, His Majesty's Embassy have been directed by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to bring all the above information to the notice of the Reyal Hellenic Government and to urge the letter to take the strongest possible action against the Greek subject Pilides.

His Majesty's Embassy avail themselves of this opportunity to renew to the Royal Hellenic Ministry for Foreign Affairs the assurance of their highest consideration.

Your 18/18/47 of 14th May attaching a copy of your despatch No.163 to the Turkish M.F.A. about the s.s. "GALATA".

It may interest you to know that we consulted Lloyd's agent here about the identity of this vessel. His reply is that there is no vessel of this name in the Turkish Shipping Register.

On the other hand, Lloyd's agent says it is possible that the s.s. "GALATA" may recently have been purchased abroad by a Turkish shipowner and that the latter may have been authorised by some Turkish Consulate abroad to fly the Turkish flag, and even to show Istanbul as the port of registry, in order to make a single voyage to Turkey for purposes of official registration. This appears to be normal practice, though in this instance as in many others affecting ships of other nationalities, the vessel was in all probability deviated to Palestine.

We know of at least one Turkish shipowner, a certain Naim Molvan, who is implicated with Stefano D'Andria (our A/482 of 18th April 1947 refers) in organising the shipment of illegal Jewish immigrants from Mediterranean ports to Palestine. Naim Molvan last left Istanbul for Marseilles on 10th February 1946 and there is no indication in our records that he has since returned to Turkey. He may well have had a hand in despatching the s.s. "GALATA" to Palestine.

Dear Department,

Please refer to para 6 of your telegram No.5089 of 22nd May concerning publicity for the illegal immigration traffic.

The head of the Jewish Agency here, Eliahu Epstein, told Bromley recently that they were well aware of the efforts H.M.G. are making to secure the co-operation of European governments in the prevention of this traffic, "since nothing is secret in Europe". He said that the Agency was strongly opposed to the type of incitement contained in Ben Hecht's letter to the terrorists but that they would oppose us all the way on illegal immigration.

He indicated that the Bergson group was making strong efforts to obtain Congressional support to prevent an official U.S. announcement condemning incitement to murder, but that this move would not obtain general Zionist support. Bromley gathered however that if it were proposed to enlarge the condemnation to include aid for illegal immigration, Zionist opinion might be mobilised against this. Although we do not yet know whether the Administration is prepared to help us, we foresee that they will think twice before going so far as we would wish in condemning all the types of activity of which we have been complaining so long.

be treated as confidential and not be made use of, since Epstein has throughout been friendly and ready to talk frankly about Zionist views - and often intentions. We have fairly frequent contact with him and we get the impression that he is one of those who, while strongly pro-Zionist, genuinely regrets the present state of relations between the British and the Jews. We would therefore prefer that it should not be known that he does at times give us confidentially and informally items of information such as the above.

We are sending a copy of this letter fo Jerusalem.

Confirming our telephone conversation of this morning when you were good enough to inform me that the S.S. "ANAL" was intercepted in Palestinian waters and will be confiscated by H.M.Government, I have now the pleasure to refer to your communication dated the 19th May.

From the investigation which I have carried out, I have come to the conclusion that Mr. Pilides, who formed the Panamanian shipping Company owning the steamer, "Compañía Anal Provencial S.A." should bear the blame.

The above mentioned company was constituted quite legally through the good offices of a well known firm of solicitors, Messrs. Bonstant & Constant, 24, St. Mary Axe, London E.C.3- The registration of the vessel was also effected through them but the solicitors acted only as go-betweens, representing their clients Mr. Pilides. They were - as was this Consulate General- the victims of the bad faith of Mr. Pilides.

There can be no doubt that Mr. Pilides purchased this vessel with the intention of disposing of it in the way he has done. You will recall your suspicions about this vessel earlier this year. I had an interview with Mr. Pilides who was duly warned not to make any transaction with doubtful people. Mr. Pilides informed me then that the vessel had been damaged and was costing him a lot of money and that if he received a good offer for it he would dispose of it, whatever the issue. I warned him then that he would have to bear the consequences.

As far as this office is concerned Mr. Pilides is from now on, persona non grata, and never again will he place another vessel under the Panamanian flag. I sincerely regret that we were unable to stop the vessel in time. I wish to thank you, on behalf of my Government your help in preventing further disagreable news in the press in connection with such incidents. Or if they have to be published, the co-operation of the Government through this Consulate should be also published.

I am conveying to the Government what you have told me about the s.s. NORTH LANDS". I have since obtained confirmation that this vessel is definately not under the Panamanian Flag.

I would also like to confirm what I said with reference to Mr. Fokias of Cardiff. This gentleman and his brother have now severed all connections with the "Compañia Maritima Geojunior, S.A.", also of Panama, and are now the sole owners of the steamers "Lowestoft" and "Shoreham". - I am following their activities very closely but I am afarid that I cannot act only on suspicions. I personnally believe that the Fokias Brothers are in the clear. I cannot say the same about the Directors which now have control of the "Compañia Maritima Geojunior"; however, there again I have not sufficient evidence to refuse a proper application.



With reference to my despatch No: 23 of 14th February regarding the call of the Honduranian Steamship "ULUA" at Algiers on 8th February, I have the honour to report that, in addition to the visit which I made to the Prefect of Algiers about this matter, I took an early opportunity of requesting the Governor General of Algeria to prevent the illegal embarkation of clandestine immigrants to Palestine from Algerian ports.

- From information received from H.M. Consul General, Tunis, on 26th April I wrote to the Sécurité Générale stating that it had been reported that a group of over one hundred Jews were supposed to have left Tunisia for Algeria in hopes of eventually reaching Palestine and repeated the request already made that precautions be taken to stop people embarking who had not their papers in order, particularly when it was a case of ships which were not on a regular passenger run. At the same time I called upon them accompanied by Mr. Vice Consul Peel, the head of Visa Section, and discussed the position generally. We informed them that it was known that there was a large Jewish recreation camp near Tenes but that, while this camp appeared to be run along proper lines, it might have some connection with collecting Jews there to get them away to Palestine as opportunity offered. We therefore asked for a very special watch to be kept upon that particular part of the coast.
- Shortly after the above visit I received a letter from the Governor General of Algeria in which he stated that he had issued instructions to all authorities concerned to apply the regulations strictly and that any attempted departure from Algeria would be prevented as regards persons whose papers were not in order or as regards attempts at clandestine emigration.
- I have recently had several very friendly conversations with the Governor General in which he confirmed the above points and there is no doubt that the French authorities are now wide awake to the position and are co-operating to the best of their abilities as the following information obtained from a highly reliable source will show.
- A vessel, name unknown and flying no flag, cruised off the port of Tenes, which lies 150 miles to the west of Algiers, during daylight on 10th May. During the evening she proceeded inshore and anchored about one cable's length off the coast in the Bay of Tararnia, which is near the Jewish Holiday Camp bearing the name: "Accueil et Sante par le Camping" ("Welcome and Health through Camping") - a quite unexpected version of the Nazi "Strength through Joy" idea. The local coast-guard had watched this ship's movements with suspicion in view of the instructions received from the Government General and during the hours of darkness two trucks and a motor-car containing 79 Jews from the holiday camp were stopped by gendarmes on their way making towards the Bay of Tararnia. Their occupants were taken to Tenes for interrogation, but released after a sufficient delay. The ship left during the night at about 2.00 a.m. without having been able to embark anyone.
- This may have been the same ship as that stated to be the "Anna Andrée" flying the Panamanian flag, which, however, cannot be traced from Lloyds Register, and sighted on 12th May off Port Gueydon, which lies about 100 miles east of Algiers. It is stated that she

had on board 130 persons of various nationalities and that the name of the Captain of the ship was Captain Nicolatoff. On the following day at dawn she left for Dellys, further west, where she remained at anchor for about one hour, leaving that port eventually at 19.30 hours in the evening. This ship was not boarded and examined although the French Navy were preparing to send a motor-launch from the nearby port of Bougie to try and find out what she was up to.

- The addition to the above-mentioned camp it is said that the "Ferme Douieb", a farm near Blida, about 25 miles inland to the west of Algiers, is serving as a collecting centre for Jews mostly from Morocco who wish to get away to Palestine. I am, however, informed by the Governor General himself as well as from other sources that in view of what has happened as regards their failure to get away from Algeria, feeling that they are being watched, and that the Algerian authorities will do their best to frustrate any future attempts, already quite a number of Jews has returned to Morocca and also to Tunisia, greatly disappointed that the promises of the organisers of these camps to get them away to Palestine within any reasonable period appear to be unrealisable.
- 8. The friendly attitude of Mr. Yves Chataigneau, the Governor General, and of the Algerian authorities under his orders appears to be most helpful and satisfactory as regards preventing clandestine emigration to Palestine and I have their assurance that they will keep me fully informed as to any future developments.
- 9. A copy of this despatch is being sent to His Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, to the Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean, and to His Majesty's Consulz General at Rabat and Tunis.

Your telegram No. 1097. Jewish Illegal Immigrations.

My experts have just received word that ship Northwises sailed from Port Du Bouc on June 3rd in ballast bound ostensibly for Genoa. She was to-day reported at Port Du Bouc to be flying the Panama flag.

- 2. I have warned the Ministry of Foreign Affairs that this ship is probably in Italian waters and have given them the information in your telegram to me No. 1097 urging that if the ship is found to be flying false Panama colours she should immediately be arrested.
- 3. Meanwhile the ship may of course appear under Swedish colours and I should be glad to learn urgently whether you have approached or are approaching the Swedish Government with a view to having her detained for verification (see paragraph 5 of my telegram No. 1173).



Dear John,

I wonder whether any decision was taken on Washington telegram No. 2943 of 19th May suggesting publicity on the subject of Jewish illegal immigration.

In this country it could do no harm, though we cannot expect any very startling results. It is worth trying but the only way to get any such publicity in France will be if agency messages are received reporting publicity in the United Kingdom. It would of course be essential for the publicity to be factual but interesting enough for correspondents to want to telegraph it.

It would be desirable (a) to concentrate on information showing up the inhuman rôle played by the organisers of this traffic, and (b) not to take the initiative in launching a publicity campaign from this Embassy at a moment when we are negotiating on this subject with the French Government. If, however, you authorise publicity in the United Kingdom we could do useful work here by answering questions, by discreetly briefing British correspondents and by feeding background information to provincial press officers. For this purpose we should need hard facts and if possible some exclusive information.

We should of course have to avoid giving away the actual measures being taken by the French authorities to help us.

Your Excellency,

I beg to inform you that my steamer, the Costa Rican s.s. "COLONY TRADER", arrived at Gibraltar on the morning of the 19th instant for bunker coal but this was refused by the Coal Controller on instructions from London.

On the night of the 23rd instant a number of soldiers were put on board by the Authorities and steamer was placed under detention on suspicion that she will be used on illegal traffic with Palestine.

I hereby strongly protest for this detention as we are at present on a lawful voyage from Jacksonville(U.S.A) via Bermuda and Madeira with a cargo of scrap tyres, loaded at the first named port, for Genoa, which cargo is properly documented, and I would be much obliged if you will kindly convey my protest to the proper Authorities.

I would further like to bring to your notice that I have no knowldge whatsoever that steamer will be used for any illegal traffic, and to prove this statement and that I am in no way involved in any illegal traffic, I could easily have avoided calling at Gibraltar for bunkers by replenishing at Madeira sufficient to take steamer to Genoam where she is bound.



we have been giving detailed consideration to the question of suitable publicity for Italy in the light of your telegram 1069 and diplomatic programme in London press service of June 10th.

- 2. We feel that while the two telegrams under reference provide us with useful talking points they do not in themselves contain typical factual information of Zienist's support for terrorism and illegal immigration which would enable the press to build up a case against the premeting of this traffic.
- 3. As you are aware we have abundant detailed material but I am not clear from paragraph 5 of your telegram 426 to Angera to what extent we can properly disclose this evidence to journalists and encourage them to investigate for themselves disnist activities.

  Apart from this any publicity campaign launched here might run us into a number of dangers.
- 4. Firstly we should risk falling foul of Italian Government whose weakness and inefficiency would inevitably emerge from any form of publicity. We might thus prejudice our chance of gotting even such cooperation as has hitherto been forthcoming. Secondly in disclosing evidence much of which would inevitably implicate U.N.R.R. and A.J.D.C. if only by inference we should be treading on highly dangerous ground. of [grp undec.], the centribution which these two organisations make in practice is open talk and we are bound to be questioned (c.f. your telegram No.1164 and my telegram No.1282).

- 5. Both of these dangers would be lessened if as originally suggested in my telegram No.1098 paragraph 4 publicity campaign could be launched in London. The Italian Government which would resent this Embassy's initiating the campaign would find it much more difficult to object to us following up enquiries from the Press respecting [grp. omitted] in London while you rather than we would be better able to judge how far it is safe or desirable to implicate U.N.R.R.A or A.J.D.C.
- 6. Would you therefore consider the possibility of persuading the Times to publish a turnover article about Jewish illegal immigration with particular reference to Italy as at present perhaps the worst centre of the traffic. Such an article should immediately provoke local comment which we ought to be able to work up into an effective anti Zionist Campaign. We suggest the "Times" because it seems to us important that initial publicity should be objective rather than sensational.
- 7. If you think proposal is practicable I venture to suggest that so far as Italy is concerned the Article should be:
- (A) Highly factual. His Majesty's Government's attitude is generally known here but statements unsupported by evidence do not provoke much sympathy. We could of course provide you with material of the type required if necessary.
- (B) It should not be too hard on the Italian Government. The best line from our point of view would be that the Italian Government were anxious to stop the traffic and had been helpful in various instances but there remained much that they could do and which it was hoped they would do under the new regime of I.R.O.
- (C) Immigrants should be regarded as dupes who almost deserve our sympathy (see your telegram 426 to Angera paragraph 2 and paragraph 4) and main attack must be concentrated on Zionists in the United States and elsewhere who are abusing the idea of hespitality to refugees.

- (D) Jewish agency and Zienist erganisers of traffic are deliberately flouting authority of U.N.O.
- 8. My Information Secretary has received request for assistance in writing up Zionist activities in this country from both Italian and British journalists which show the degree of interest on the subject. I have however told him to held back until we have received answer to this telegram.

Please refer to our letter G124/-/47 (now numbered G165/3/47) of the 16th May about applications from various firms and individuals for British approval for permanent Honduranian registry for ships under their control.

Since writing this we have had a number of further applications, all of which have been discussed with the Shipping Attache and with the local Security Service Representative who has reported all of these ships to his head office.

These ships are:

- 1. CITY OF ATHENS. 15,000 tons; owned by the Compagnia de Navegacion de Honduras; run by the American Mediterranean Steamship Line; agents, Gratsos Bros. She will carry passengers and cargo between Athens, Genoa and New York. Approval given.
- 2. MITCHELL A. PALMER REBECCA BOONE DOLLY MADISON

Liberty ships of 7191 tons; owned by the Honduras Steamship Company; agents Suwannee Fruit & Steamship Company of Jacksonville, Fla. The first is under charter to Lamport & Holt for the South America trade. The other two are under charter to the French

Eastern Department, Foreign Office, London, S.W.1. /Government

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Government for the carriage of coal from U.S. ports to France. A written undertaking was given by the Suwannee Fruit & Steamship Company that these ships would not be used in the Mediterranean unless the French Government required that the coal should be unloaded in a French Mediterranean port rather than, as expected, at an English Channel port. The firm undertook to keep the Embassy informed of their future plans for these ships. Approval given.

- 3. The FLORESTA. See correspondence ending with Foreign Office telegram No.5240 of 29th May. Approval given.
- The rail ferry boats GRAND HAVEN and HENRY M. FLAGLER operated by the West India Fruit & Steamship Company between West Palm Beach and Havana. Approval given.
- 5. Ex U.S. Naval vessel LCI-651 of 400 tons gross; owned by the Caribbean Shipping Company, who have stated in writing that she is being converted to carry fruit and general cargo in the Gulf of Mexico and Caribbean areas. Their letter contains an assurance that the vessels will not be used in any illicit traffic or outside the area specified. Approval given.
- Yacht MARNELL, not yet renamed. Gross tonnages 261 and 254 respectively. They are owned by the West Indies America Line Inc. and are stated to be destined for general cargo trade in the Caribbean. They will be based at Tampa and will travel to Cuba and Jamaica. The owners have not yet decided what registry these two ships are to have, but will probably choose either Panamanian or Honduranian. The Shipping Attache is making enquiries about these vessels and a decision has not yet been taken.
- 7. Motor vessel FIFTY-TWO MILES (ex U.S. Naval Vessel SC-689);

Motor vessel ARAWAK II (ex Naval Vessel PSC-1381);

and the privately owned YMS-108 (ex U.S. Naval Vessel not yet renamed).

They are owned by the Harrisville Combing Mills Inc. of Rhode Island. The first two are stated to be in use for the transportation of supplies from Florida to a dairy and poultry farm owned by Eleuthera Ltd. at Hatchet Bay, Eleuthera, Bahamas, a Bahaman corporation whose stock is owned by the Harrisville Combing Mills Inc. They will also be used, it is stated, as will also the YMS-108, for the transportation of the produce of the farm to Nassau. The Governor of the Bahamas has written to the Embassy to say that he believes Mr. Austin T. Levy, President of the Harrisville Combing Mills Inc., to be a person of the highest integrity.

The Security Service Representative has been informed by his head office that there is no adverse information concerning this firm or the ships. We are awaiting a report on the firm from the Consulate-General in Boston and for some further details and a guarantee about their future use from the Vice-Consulate at Jacksonville. Approval has therefore not yet been given.

## 8. S.S. CORTES GUAYAQUIL ELISA

Refrigerated ships of about 1000 tons; operated by the Tropical Fruit Company of Guayaquil between the ports of New Orleans, La., and Guayaquil. These ships are stated to be for exclusive use in the importation of bananas. H.M. Consul-General in New Orleans has been asked to ascertain whether the ships are what they are stated to be and to obtain an assurance from the New Orleans branch of the firm that they will not be used outside the western hemisphere. Approval has not yet been given.

You will have received as our telegram No. 35 Saving a repeat of your telegram to the Consul at Ponta Delgada in the Azores, asking him to do what he could to obstruct or delay the "Paducah's" voyage. He will of course help to the best of his ability, but Fayal is nearly 200 miles by sea from Ponta Delgada and inter-island communications of every kind are bad.

I hope you will agree to our not making an official approach to the Portuguese Government. As you know (see inter alia our despatch no. 48 22/48117 of the 2nd June and Robin Hooper's Top Secret letter no. M.S. 364/3/47 of delta/84 the 19th April to John Beith), the Portuguese are not enthusiastic about the DEPT idea of stretching their authority to delay these ships, which they regard as pointless and likely to cause them trouble. They would be unlikely to take any effective action in this case and we would prefer on the whole to save our fire for cases in which we have a reasonable chance of getting them (3013/48/21) Eurt to do something.

In your despatch no.134 of the 10th May, you told us that "even a short delay is of assistance to H.M.G. though of course the longer a vessel can be immobilised the better". It would be very helpful to us both in making representations to the Portuguese Government and also in impressing on Consuls the importance and urgency of the action which from time to time we have to instruct them to take, if you could give us an explanation which we could pass on of just how these delays help. 8756/48/9 DONT

One final point -- In your telegram no. 308 you instructed us to ask the Portuguese Government to deny bunkers to suspect ships. H.M.Government, in their efforts to carry out their obligations to both Arabs and Jews under the Mandate allow controlled immigration at the rate of 1,500 per month into Palestine but they feel bound to resist by all means at their disposal the attempts of Zionist elements to organise unauthorised immigration beyond that figure. Particularly at the present moment, while the matter is sub judice before the United Nations, it is the duty of H.M.G. to maintain the peace in Palestine and to prevent any action which might prejudice the eventual decision of the United Nations. Illegal immigration, from which, incidentally, the Terrorists draw so many of their recruits, is the one issue before all others most likely to prejudice the position.

An important practical consideration is, of course, that all illegal immigrants who through our interception in Palestine territorial waters and transfer to Cyprus for detention involve H.M.Govt. in considerable expense for their maintenance quite apart from the trouble that they cause.



Illegal Jewish Immigration.

As you will recall, you informed me on the 20th May that the ship "ANAL" had been allowed to sail from Palermo, but that, as a result of instructions issued by the competent Ministry, her bunkers had previously been inspected, and that she had only been supplied with sufficient additional coal to reach Tunis.

- 2. It was therefore with the greatest surprise that I learnt that on the 31st May the "Anal" had arrived at Haifa in Palestine, without having put in at any intermediate port of call, and still carrying her complement of 375 illegal Jewish immigrants. Apparently, as a result of failure by the Italian port authorities to detect the full stocks of coal which she was already carrying, the ship succeeded in obtaining sufficient additional coal at Palermo to enable her to complete her journey to Palestine.
- this incident has been a shock to His Majesty's Government. Not only were the British authorities wrongly informed that the "Anal" could not reach Palestine without refuelling, but the supply of coal at Palermo granted to this ship, which was openly engaged in the illegal traffic of Jews, contributed directly to the arrival of a new contingent of illegal immigrants in Palestine, to the detriment of the situation there and the embarrassment of British interests.
- 4. I am of course fully aware that it was contrary to the policy of the Italian Government for the ship thus to have been enabled to reach Palestine, and I am confident that I can count on you to arrange for an immediate enquiry into the causes of failure by the port authorities concerned to take adequate action. At the same time I have been instructed to urge that every precaution be taken in future to ensure thorough inspection of the bunkers of suspect ships.
