JOHNSON", now in Hampton Roads - had been offered on the London Market for insurance (sailing to Mediterranean including Haifa.) It is my view there is no doubt the ship concerned is "COLONEL FREDERICK C. JOHNSON" and the information therefore appears to debunk the Owners' statement of his intention to sail the ship to Holland for re-fitting etc.

"COLONEL FREDERICK C. JOHNSON" has already been notified to the insurance contacts concerned under the arrangement for denial of insurance to suspect ships. They have now been informed that there is little doubt that "DE WITT CLINTON" offered for insurance is the "COLONEL FREDERICK C. JOHNSON" previously notified to them, and it is hoped satisfactory arrangements will be made to deny insurance accordingly.

Would you please refer to our letter G165/-/47 of the 30th June about the registration of ships under Honduran flag.

- 2. We have recently given our approval for the permanent registration under Honduran flag of the following three ships:
- (a) LCI(L)-639, 400 grt, owned by the Mortenson Shipping Company of 90 Broad Street, New York. She will be renamed the MARY X and will be used for the carriage of general cargo and fruit between United States ports and the West Indies. A written assurance was received from Harry H. Mortenson (Cdr., U.S. Navy) that the ship would not be used outside the western hemisphere and that we would be notified should there ever be any change of plans in this respect.
- (b) The former U.S. Coast Guard Cutter MODAC, owned by Mr. Manuel Vellianitis, of Mobile, Alabama. This ship is 1600 grt and has been converted to a dry cargo carrier for runs between the Gulf of Mexico, the West Indies, and the east and west coasts of South America. H.M. Vice Consul at Mobile received assurances that the vessel will be used exclusively in the western hemisphere and was told that the U.S. Government had been informed that she would not be used in the Mediterranean. that should the ship be sold, or chartered to another, or be transferred to another flag, both H.M. Vice Consul and the U.S. Government would be informed.

(c) The SS INSCO MERCHANT (ex LST-341), owned by the Intercontinental Shipping Corporation, of 608 Tampa Street, Tampa, Florida. This ship is being converted at Charleston to a cargo carrier for use in the Gulf of Mexico and the Caribbean. A written assurance has been received from the company that she will not be used outside the western hemisphere and that we shall be notified and given full information should any change of plan be decided upon by the company in the future. According to H.M. Vice Consul at Tampa, the president of the company is George F. Milliken, a shipping man who is well known in Bermuda. The company owns a number of vessels, none of which, so far as H.M. Vice Consul is aware, have operated outside Gulf, Caribbean and Central American waters.

Your E.10438/84/31 of the 1st December enclosing correspondence between Beith and Higham at the Colonial Office about the possibilities of the Turks stopping the Jewish illegal immigrant ships "Pan York" and "Pan Crescent" if Panamanian registry were withdrawn.

- 2. We entirely agree with your views that, however justified the Turks might be in stopping ships which are flagless, the practical difficulties in this case are great. The Turks would be most reluctant to attempt a forcible arrest in the face of a probably determined resistance. Even if they did manage to arrest the ships, they would, as you say, be left with the alternatives of maintaining 16,000 Jews or forcing them to return whence they came. His Majesty's Government have themselves had an unfortunate experience in trying to carry out the latter alternative and we can hardly press again a similar experiment to the Turks.
- 3. We think therefore that it would be much better to say nothing to the Turks, particularly in view of the Secretary of State's decision not to press the Turkish Government further which was reported to them by the Turkish Ambassador in London. But the Naval Attaché points out that an advantage in the withdrawal of registration would be that His Majesty's ships waiting outside the Dardanelles would be entitled to challenge and investigate these ships as soon as they were sighted and could

His Majesty's Embassy avail themselves of this opportunity to renew to the Royal Hellenic Ministry of Foreign Affairs the assurance of their highest consideration.



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AIDE MEMOIRE

The British Embassy has just received from the Foreign Office some further information concerning the ship named THE COLONEL F.C. JOHNSON which, as mentioned in their Aide Memoire to the State Department Gl65/-/47 of the 13th December, is suspected by the British Government of being intended for the transport of illegal immigrants to Palestine.

2. This information is to the effect that the COLONEL P.C. JOHESON has been offered for insurance on the London market for operation in the Mediterranean, including Haifa. This port would presumably not have been mentioned unless the owners intended to send her there. In view of the point referred to in paragraph 2(g) of the British Embassy's previous Aide Memoire on the subject, and of the fact that the owners have made no mention of their intention to send the ship to Haifa, this new development appears to the British Government to give further cause to suspect that this ship may be intended for the illegal immigration traffic.

State Department inform us in confidence that the United States Embassy in Panama telegraphed to them today to the effect that on the receipt of news that Pan Crescent and Pan York had left Bourgas Panamanian official had said that if United States Consul at Istanbul could confirm their departure, Panamanian Government would withdraw their Panamanian registry.



Panamanian Charge d'Affaires here telephoned this afternoon to say that he had just received a telegram from his Government informing him that the provisional patents of Panamanian registration granted to the "Pan York" and "Pan Crescent" had expired on the 25th October and 5th November respectively and, in view of His Majesty's Government's representations, had not (repeat not) been renewed. These ships are not, therefore, entitled to fly the Panamanian flag and, so far as we know, now possess no nationality.

- 2. Senor Morales said that he had no previous knowledge of this decision and was unable to give any explanation of the Panamanian Government's delay in communicating it to us.
- 3. United States Embassy here, whose assistance we had requested in view of Washington telegram No. 7211, have been informed of this new development.

Addressed to Foreign Office telegram No. 1602 of December 29th: repeated to Bucharest, Washington, Jerusalem and United Kingdom Delegation, New York.

My telegram No. 1596: illegal Jewish immigration.

My first intimation that ships had sailed was B.B.C. announcement that they had passed through the Bosphorus. I have since received report that they left Bourgas at noon on December 27th and that each ship had some four to five thousand passengers on board.

2. I at once asked to see Minister for Foreign Affairs but as he was indisposed I saw the new Assistant Minister, M. Ganovsky, this evening. I told him that I was shocked to learn that, in face of all my warnings, the Bulgarian Government had allowed this mass illegal immigration to take In doing so they had assumed a very heavy responsiplace. bility; I must make an immediate oral protest while entirely reserving my Government's attitude. But the question was not merely one between my Government and the Bulgarian Government. Bt was an international question in regard to which all Governments had an international responsibility. United Nations had now taken a decision regarding the future of Palestine and it was a particularly critical moment while the operation of the decision was being worked out. I drew attention to the resolution passed by the Assembly of the United Nations on November 17th about illegal immigration. While it was true that resolution was addressed to Member States, I had hoped that the Bulgarian Gevernment would act in accordance with it, particularly in view of certain passages in their recently signed treaty of mutual assistance with Yugeslavia. In that treaty Bulgaria undertook to conduct herself in conformity with the spirit of the United Nations

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
Charter, and Article 7 of the Treaty said that the Bulgarians would support any initiative designed to ensure peace and security in the world. That surely implied an obligation not to support any initiative likely to compromise peace and security. I repeated that I thought that the Bulgarian Government, in letting these people into Bulgaria from Roumania and in allowing them and persons from Bulgaria to embark in ships engaged in this scandalous traffic, had taken a very serious step which would enormously complicate the position in Palesting.

- 3. The Assistant Minister, who evidently felt that this was a case for a soft answer, said that he was unfortunately not familiar with the facts or with what had taken place previously between myself and M. Kimon Georgiev and M. Kolarov; it was certainly the aim of the Bulgarian Government to conduct its policy in the spirit of the United Nations and he would investigate the facts at once.
- 4. I made it clear once more that I was expressing my immediate personal reaction and that I entirely reserved the attitude of His Majesty's Government.
- 5. It seems to me that this is a case where I should be instructed to make a strong formal protest in the name of His Majesty's Government apart from any possible action by Security Council.

Your despatch No.129 received December 29th: Panamanian registration.

I had prepared two strong notes to take to the Ministry of Fereign Affairs today but a Cabinet crisis has suddenly arisen ever bases question and it is unlikely that I can see the new Minister wheever he may be for some days. Meanwhile I have sent notes by hand to the Minister.

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The Report from His Majesty's Representative in Bucharest, that the U.S. Legation there had been given all available evidence of Soviet participation in the Jewish illegal immigration traffic, prompted His Majesty's Embassy in Washington to ask for particulars, so that they might pass this information to the State Department. Bucharest have replied with the summary contained in their telegram No. 1526, and the Secretary of State has given instructions for this to be communicated personally to Mr. Marshall and General Hildring.

Washington Embassy will presumably already have passed on this information to the State Department. When approaching Mr. Marshall and General Hildring in person, however, I think we should give them a more complete and balanced picture of the situation. are now preparing a comprehensive survey of information from confidential sources and we, for our part, should endeavour to take into account Mr. Kendall's interesting report on the relations between the Zionists and the Roumanian Communist Party (copies of which have already gone to the State Department and the U.S. Embassy in London), and the latest shift in Communist policy indicated in Bucharest telegrams Nos. 1382, 1502 and 1507. The true significance of this apparent reversion to the original Communist line of discouraging Jewish illegal immigration, a change also reflected in recent reports of the closing to Jewish refugees of the Polish, Hungarian and Roumanian frontiers, will be easier to assess when we know the destination of the two illegal immigrant ships "Pan Crescent" and "Pan York". first of these, having waited at Constanza for over $2\frac{1}{2}$ months, sailed in ballast yesterday, and the "Pan York" If these ships are is expected to follow her today. bound for a Bulgarian port and intend to embark Jews there, as did the "Northlands" and "Paducah", we shall know that the changed attitude of the Roumanian Government is of purely local significance. If, on the other hand, they leave the Black Sea empty and are forced to try their luck in Italy or some other non-Communist country, we shall have to revise our ideas about the Communist policy towards Jewish illegal immigration.

I suggest, therefore, that we should wait until after Christmas before approaching Mr. Marshall and General Hildring. As there is nothing the U.S. Government can lo to prevent these ships from embarking Jews in a Black Sea port, we shall lose nothing by this delay.
