





The Syrian Ministry for Foreign Affairs present their compliments to His Britannic Majesty's Legation and, with reference to their letter No. 52 of 12/2/47 regarding an enquiry about the next of kin of some Palestinian soldiers, have the honour to state that as a result of investigations made in the Mouhafezats of Houran, Jebel Druze and in the city of Damascus, the following information has been established:-

- 1) Despite repeated search and investigation regarding Sayid Abdul Hamid, cousin of the Palestinian soldier, Saleh 'Ambrar, it has not been possible to find anyone who knows him.
- As regards the soldier named N.M. Rostum, son of Hachem Rostum of the inhabitants of Salkhad, it has not been possible to trace his father in this Qadha nor to find any relation of his nor anyone who knows him and not even anyone in Salkhad of the Rostum family.
- As regards the woman Assib Bint Abdu of the inhabitants of Deraa, when asked about her son the named R.A.S. El-Kurdi, she replied that she had received a letter from him in the year 1941, stating he was taken prisoner by the Germans at the Alemain Front and that she has never heard from him since. She did not produce that letter because she said she lost it.

The Syrian Ministry for Foreign Affairs, while informing the Legation of the result of investigation, avail themselves of this opportunity of assuring them of their highest consideration.
