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

Record of conversation with Mr. Goodman, Political Secretary of Agudas Israel.

Mr. Goodman called on me yesterday afternoon and discussed the following questions.

(1) Immigration quotas for Falestine.

He out out a feeler about a possible increase in the interim rate of immigration, but not very confidently and without pressing it. He complained at length, however, that under the present system of allocation of certificates, no provision was made for Rabbis or theological students. Israel would attach great importance to even a token quota for these categories, since it would show that they also, and not the Jewish Agency alone, were given consideration by the mandatory Power. A distinct question was the temporary admission of theological students into Palestine and he hoped that concessions could also be made under this heading.

(2) Attitude of the United Nations to Agudas Israel.

Mr. Goodman tried to find out what attitude had been adopted by the United Kingdom delegation to the application of Agudas Israel for a hearing at the recent Special Bersion of the United Mations General Assembly. I was able to tell him with complete truthfulness that I did not know, since I had not been present at the subcommittee where this decision was taken. He evidently felt a good deal of resentment on this point and it is clear that Agudas Israel feel that their prestige vis-à-vis the Jewish Agency has been seriously damaged.

(3) Recent death sentences in Palestine.

Mr. Goodman had been asked by his organisation to inform me of their view that the mandatory Fower would be acting wisely if it commuted the death sentences with which the United Nations Committee had concerned itself. I explained that both the United Nations Committee and Agudas Israel were acting on the erroneous argumention that H.M. Fovernment would advise the High Commissioner on his exercise of the prerogative of pardon. Mr. Goodman said he understood that to mean that, if Agudas Israel wished to make representations on this subject, they should make them in Jerusalem.

(4) Application of Agudas Israel to the Economic and Social Council for consultative status.

Mr. Goodman said that he had expected to hear the results of the June meeting

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(presumably of the working-party in New York). He again urged that H.M. Government should support the application of Agudas Israel. I did not give him the information contained in New York Savingram No. 79 Comply.

(5) Evidence to the United Nations Committee.

Mr. Goodman confirmed that Agudas Israel would give evidence to the Committee in They had decided, apparently Jerusalem. after some division of opinion, not to support the demand of the Jewish Agency for a Jewish Mr. Goodman said that this decision State. was largely due to the results of a conversation between representatives of Agudas Israel and Mr. Ben Gurion had been Mr. Ben Gurion. asked whether the Jewish State would concede certain guarantees to Agudas Israel and had refused to commit himself. Mr. Goodman inferred from this exchange that the Jewish State would not permit Agudas Israel to form a separate community, as it does at present, and that there would be interference with its schools.

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

Harold Beeley Esq,

Dear Beeley,

I feel I should write to impress on you the urgency of the matters which I mentioned when I called to see you the other day.

The recognition of the Zionist international World Jewish Congress, and the recognition of the so-called non-Zionist American Jewish Conference group, by the Social & Economic Council of UN is not only a grave injustice to the third international Jewish viewpoint, that of religious Jewry, but must inevitably hamper even the work of the S & E Council Which is supposed to consider every aspect of international life. That quite a number of Christian international groupings have received recognition, quite justifiably, is more reason why the Agudah, after 35 years work precisely for those causes which the S & E Council is concerned, should also receive reognition. I do earnestly hope that the UK delegate will be authorised to support our request.

The failure of the Agudah over a whole series of years, to receive any kind of concession in regard to Certificates for Palestine, makes the work of those of us who wish to remain independent of the Agency, exceedingly difficult. I fully redise the position of the Agency in the Mandate, a position - as we have publicly testified to the Anglo American Committee both in London and Jerusalem - which they have abused.

In these circumstances the suggestion which I put forward for the granting of a limited monthly quota a) for Rabbis b) for theological students who will remain in Palestine and c) for theological students from the USA and this country, who will return to their homes after a course of study, is one of some urgency. It would appear equitable that this request be granted, b earing in mind the centrality of Palestine in Jewish religious life, and the fact that in previous years such facilities were available. That we would wish in some measure to be associated with the eventual allocation of these special certificates, in however modest a manner, would appear not to be unreasonable.
