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



Jewish immigration into Palestine through Haifa.

In reply to an enquiry from Azzam Pasha, we informed him through the British Middle East Office in a telegram dated May 6 (E5136/4/31) that the port of Haifa would be fully occupied by the process of withdrawal as long as we were there and that there was no question of facilities being given for Jewish immigration through it for practical reasons.

It seems that there was some misunderstanding between the War Office and the G.O.C. Palestine, because out of a clear sky we later received notice that 920 Jews had been allowed to land at Haifa by the G. O C. on May 22. The G.O.C. then apparently realised his mistake and hurriedly closed the port for the period of withdrawal to all incoming passengers other than Government and Service personnel and selected persons.

The War Office have expressed regret for this lache and have telegraphed for a report from the G.O.C. which has not yet been received. Meanwhile we have telegraphed to Arab posts that -

- (a) The G.O.C. has now issued a decision that Haifa cannot be used for other than official passenger traffic during the withdrawal.
- (b) The 3.0.C. has been requested to do all he can to prevent Jewish immigration into any part of his withdrawal/

telegram was drafted in the Foreign Office in the light of repeated statements by War Office representatives at inter-departmental meetings to the effect that Jewish immigrants should not be allowed to impede military withdrawal by using the port of Haifa. A copy of the draft telegram to the British Middle East Office (No. 414) was sent to the War Office for concurrence and was duly agreed by them before dispatch.

This paper has been held up pending investigation the matter by the War Office. The results of this investigation are being submitted separately in a note but it may be stated briefly here that there were two cases of Jewish immigration into Haifa during the first few days after the termination of the Mandate, - the "Providence" with about 900 and another ship with about 200.

As has been pointed out elsewhere the fault lies in the liaison between the G.O.C. and the War The War Office were confident that he was taking measures to prevent any Jewish immigration into Haifa port. I do not think there is any use in pretending that this has been anything but an error and I submit a telegram expressing regret.

J.G.S. Beith. 11th June, 1948.

Since this telegram was minuted we have had another telegram on the same subject from the British Middle East Office conveying a complaint from Azzam Pasha. As we now have a number of enquiries from Middle East posts about this incident it seemed best to await the report promised by the War Office and put the whole thing up then to the Secretary of State, who has asked for an explanation.

The War Office have now found that they have comparatively little information over and above the unsatisfactory telegram in E 7990, and have accordingly proposed to telegraph for more. I have written the attached letter explaining exactly what points we require information on.

I understood from Southey this morning you had found on investigation that there is little more information available in the War Office about the arrival of Jewish immigrants in Haifa immediately after the termination of the mandate. It was agreed that you would have to ask for a further report from the Middle East and I am therefore writing this letter to give you a basis for your telegram of enquiry.

We have had a number of telegrams from our representatives in the Middle East on this subject all of them asking what reply they should return to communications from Arab States or the Arab League. May I draw your attention to the following papers (copies of which are enclosed where available): -

- 1. Beirut telegram No.430 of June 5th referring to a picture in the "Illustrated London News". This appears to be a different ship from the "Providence". The "Sphere" has a note about an immigrant ship called the "Argentina" which may be the same.
- 2. Cairo telegram No.785 of June 4th asks for an explanation about the "Providence".
- 3. British Middle East Office telegram No. 196 of June 10th reports the gist of an enquiry by Azzam Pasha also about the "Providence".

I think you will agree that the telegram from the C in C M.E.L.F 78556/G/(0) C does not give a satisfactory or comprehensive explanation of what occurred nor does it go beyond the case of the "Providence".

The Secretary of State has asked the Department for an explanation of what occurred at Haifa and we should like to submit a report as soon as possible. 



We have been pressing the War Office, on the instructions of the Secretary of State, to secure a report from the General Officer Commanding at Haifa on this subject in the light of the many complaints which we have received from Arab governments. A letter was sent to the War Office on E7571 explaining the points on which we required information for the purpose of preparing a reply to the Arabs. The War Office have now received telegrams from the C.-in-C. Middle East Land Forces from which the following picture emerges.

The SS "Providence", a Messageries Maritimes ship, left Marseilles with about 950 passengers and arrived at Beirut on May 23rd with only 20 passengers. She had dropped about 920 Jewish immigrants at Haifa on May 22nd.

The SS "Campidoglio" landed about 220 immigrants at Haifa on May 21, apparently in the same circumstances as the SS "Providence".

According to these Middle East reports, this is the sum total of Jewish immigration into Haifa during the days immediately following the termination of the Mandate. has been explained in previous minutes that the fact that this immigration was permitted by the British military authorities appears to have been due to a lack of liaison between the Service authorities in London and the military authorities on the spot. The War Office have expressed their regret to the Department in discussing this matter; they recognise that they concurred in the despatch of a telegram informing our representatives in Arab countries, in reply to an enquiry from Azzam Pasha, that Jewish immigration through the port of Haifa would not be permitted during the period between the end of the Mandate and the final withdrawal of British troops (E 5136). The War Office were under the impression that the G.O.C. would on no account permit such immigration and one can only suppose that the whole thing was a mistake due to the confusion arising out of the termination In any case, after these two ships had of the Mandate. landed their passengers, categorical instructions were immediately sent to the Commanders in Chief on the subject and the necessary measures were taken by the G.O.C. at Haifa.

The Commanders in Chief have reported that there is no truth in the allegation that arms and immigrants were landed from the SS "Providence" with the assistance of a British officer. They also state that the SS "Argentine", which formed the subject of pictures in the Illustrated London News and the Sphere at the end of May, did not land immigrants at Haifa as suggested in those papers. The Commanders in Chief suggest that the pictures referred to by Mr. Houston Boswall were of immigrants from the SS "Providence".

We have now received a telegram from the Commanderin-Chief Middle East Land Forces, in reply to our request for further information concerning the ships which it was alleged had landed Jewish illegal immigrants at HAIFA after the termination of the Mandate.

I have attached a copy of the first telegram we received from the Commander-in-Chief Middle East Land Forces. explaining circumstances under which the SS PROVIDENCE landed Jewish illegal immigrants at HAIFA on the 22nd May. In the telegram dated 21st June which I have also attached. it is stated that there is no truth in the allegation that a cargo of arms and immigrants were landed with the assistance of a British officer.

The Commander-in-Chief further states in this latest telegram that a total of only 22 immigrants landed at HAIFA from the SS CAMPIDOGLIO on the 21st May, and the circumstances of this incident were the same as those reported concerning the immigrants who landed from the SS PROVIDENCE.

Apparently Headquarters British Troops in Palestine have no knowledge of a ship named the SS ARGENTINE having called at HAIFA and suggest that the pictures in the Sphere and Illustrated London News were of immigrants from the SS PROVIDENCE.
