WEEKENDER PEOPLE

AFTER 30 years on the Isle of Wight, Paula Moon and husband Dick moved to Chard 19 months ago and have become very involved in the local community. When they thought about retirement they realised they wanted to be on the mainland where there were more things to do.

Paula, a former chief petty officer in the Women's Royal Naval Service, was elected as chairman of the Chard branch of the Royal Naval Association and is now working part time as an administrator for the peer support group Working All Together in Chard (WATCH) which offers a community space for anyone feeling isolated for any reason, allowing people to make new friends and learn new skills.

• WHAT brought you to Chard? We had been looking at Dorset because of our son and then decided to search a little further. We found a lovely bungalow that was just right and only five minutes form the doctor, dentist and chemist and 10 minutes from the major supermarkets. My husband doesn't drive and we thought we would be alright into our dotage.

HOW did you come to work for

WATCH? In the WRNS at 17 I worked in admin. seconds When I came out I worked for Hampshire Constabulary for 15 years and then a housing association. When we moved here I got a job with Devon County Council and had just been offered a full-time position when the agency told me about WATCH and working in Chard was a bonus.

WHAT do you enjoy about being at WATCH?

I have never had a job like it, it's manic and yet relaxing because you can't help having a chuckle at the things that happen. The family atmosphere is lovely, it's one of the best jobs I've ever had. It's lovely to think it will be my last, I can go out on a high!

WHAT do you think the members get out of the group?

It is an extended family social circle but the ethos is that they run the project ,gaining them self-esteem and new skills and advice. Members can become volunteers and take on more responsibility which could lead them in to work.

WHY did you join the WRNS?

I was 17 and still quite inexperienced , I chose the WRNS because my father and twin brothers were in the navy and my other brother was in the Merchant Navy so I knew I would get good training. The comradeship was great, taught me great morals and respect and it was a fantastic stepping stone.

• IF you could meet anyone, who would you choose? My mother, I never had chance to know her having been brought back from Southern Rhodesia when I was two

and a half. I wrote when I was in the WRNS but she died

before we got to meet. WHAT do you like about living in Chard?

It's very friendly, certainly in the time we have lived here, we have found several circles of friends. It is close to the boundaries of the other counties and has lovely local

walks like the reservoir. It is sad to see shops closed though, I would like to have somewhere in town where I could buy an outfit for going out in.

HOW do you spend your free time?

I like to enjoy my life with my family, since coming to Chard I joined the RNA group and my husband joined the camera club, we like being involved in the community.

WHAT would you like on your deserted island?
I would like to have family photos and recordings of all their voices so I could listen and remember them, photographs are nice but they can't say'l love you'. I would also like a hairbrush because I don't like going anywhere with my hair in a mess.

DO you have any unfulfilled ambitions?

Not really, I am really happy with everything I have done in my life and I have a good family circle, I still have ties with the service and I have a lovely husband and children and now a grandson, I feel fulfilled.

WHERE would you like to visit?

There are so many places in the UK we still want to ex-plore but I would like to see more of Scotland. The one place abroad I would like to go to would be Canada, the Rockies and the old cruise and train journey to Alaska and Whale watching.

IF you won a silly amount of money what would you do?

I would see my children set, like many young people they are finding the property ladder hard. I would like enough behind us to have a good social life with weekends away but I would love to buy a property in Chard to have as a base for the RNA and incorporate WATCH to go on and expand and open it up to the community.

New Year present for police and youth clubs

Eileen switches on Christmas

SOUTH Somerset police and organisers of youth clubs in Crewkerne, Chard and Ilminster celebrated an early Christmas present that should make for a happy New Year when they were awarded grants totalling £3,500.

The money came from Somerset Crimebeat, a charitable trust supported by Avon and Somerset Police, local authority Youth and Community Services and the Probation Service.

The application for cash was made by Crewkerne neighbourhood sergeant Richard Barnett

and colleagues from Active Learning and Skills, the not-for-profit organisation that runs the district's youth centres. Sergeant Barnett said: "It's a great result for us

and will allow us to do much more in 2014 to really engage with young people and help them make their community a better place to be.

"Any youth project can apply for cash funding and I'd encourage more to do so. The money is there - all you have to do is to present your case. "Anyone who wants to apply should contact

their local beat team for advice and we can support your application in partnership to the sheriff of Somerset's office.'

He urged more youth organisations to take advantage of opportunities and grants available from Somerset Crimebeat.

The scheme was launched back in 1998 with the aim to give young people up to the age of 25 an opportunity to help combat crime and the causes of crime in the community. It is led by the High Sheriff of Somerset and successive High Sheriffs have also pledged their suppor providing valuable continuity throughout the years

Grants are available to groups who want to be part of the solution rather than the problem. Crimebeat ensures that such groups are responsibly led and that the projects are suitably supervised and coordinated.

liance and other hunt supporters are still calling for a repeal of the Hunting Act to cull foxes. They stated that hunts across England and Wales welcomed more than quarter of a million people, on foot and on horseback, to their Boxing Day meets, claiming support for hunting was as strong as ever.

Anti-hunt protestors maintain that the hunting of foxes by hounds should never be allowed to return, as they say it is a cruel way to cull the animals.

MP welcomes cash for Somerset schools

DAVID Laws, MP for Yeovil Constituency and Schools Minister, welcomed the news that Somerset will receive £1,071,083 in 2014-15 to help schools in the county build kitchens and £12,059,760 over the next three years to help fund extra school places.

The £1,071,083 is designed to help schools provide all infant school children with a free school meal, a policy which was announced by the Deputy Prime Minister at the Liberal Democrat Party Conference earlier this year.

The money will allow schools to improve upon existing kitchen facilities, or build new kitchens where they are needed, and will come from the £150million the government set aside to help schools build the facilities required to give every infant school pupil a free school meal.

The £12,059,760 will help the local authority fund extra school places where they are needed over the next three years. In 2014-15 Somerset will receive £3,201,650. This will rise to £4,321,029 in 2015-16 and £4,537,081 in 2016-17.

Mr Laws said: 'This extra money will help schools in Somerset build kitchens and allow the local authority to fund extra school places where they are most needed.

"We are beginning to get real pressures on school places and this money should help the County Council to provide new school places.

"I am proud we have legislated so that every infant school pupil will receive a free school meal, but we recognised that some schools would not have the facilities to make this a reality. The government set aside capital to help schools build new kitchens or improve existing ones, and I am delighted that Somerset schools will benefit from this in the coming year."

Packed church for Christingle service





In aid of Action Duchenne Charity

ACTION Duchenne is a charity dedicated to finding a cure for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy, a life limiting muscle wasting condition that affects around 2500 children, young people and adults in the UK today. The condition is caused by a fault to the dystrophin gene on the X chromosome meaning that over 99% of those with the condition are male. Children with Duchenne are likely to be wheelchair bound by the age of 12, have severely reduced upper body movement by the age of 20 and have a reduced life expectancy due to associated issues with the cardiac and respiratory systems.

Action Duchenne was set up in 2001 as a parent and patient led organisation with the aim of finding viable treatments or a cure for Duchenne. Since then we have funded research projects worldwide and a huge amount of progress has been made, with clinical trials now taking place on people with Duchenne. However there is still a huge amount of work to be done to ensure treatments and eventually a cure are available to everyone living with Duchenne.

Action Duchenne also operates in two other areas. 






Government backs Smartphone App to pinpoint potholes

DfT pledges cash to enable CTC, the National Cycling Charity to revamp it's 'Fill that hole' website and develop a new potholes app. The government has given £30,000 to back the development of an innovative smartphone application to report potholes, Roads Minister Robert Goodwill announced today (24 December 2013).

The Department for Transport (DfT) pledged the cash to enable CTC, the National Cycling Charity, to revamp its Fill that hole website and develop a new app compatible with smartphones running Android software.

Over 9 million iPhone users can download the website's current app to report potholed roads to their councils; the new app could boost that figure to over 26 million and is expected to be ready in February, at the start of 'pothole season' when the winter damage to roads is at its greatest. Roads Minister Robert Goodwill said:

"The government is serious about tackling potholes. At best they are an irritation but at worst they can damage vehicles and pose a serious danger to cyclists. That is why we want people to tell councils where to find them so they can fill them in. This app means more people are going to be able to report potholes more easily.

"Filling potholes in quickly is only one half of the story. Research has also shown a long-term approach to road maintenance. save councils and taxpayers money and potentially save lives thanks to better road conditions." CTC originally developed its app for cyclists, who can receive lifechanging injuries from accidents caused by potholes, but it is now used by all types of road user, from delivery drivers to motorists concerned about potential damage to their vehicle.

The app sends local authorities up-to-the-minute information about potholes which the council may not otherwise know about, allowing them to identify trouble spots needing action fast. In the past year around £23.8 million was paid in compensation by local author-

around £23.8 million was paid in compensation by local authorities across England due to the poor condition of their roads according to the Asphalt Industry Alliance. The support for the app comes as more local authorities

app comes as more local authorities adopt new government guidelines which urge councils to plan extensive maintenance well in advance, rather than years of costly 'patching' as potholes appear – saving the taxpayer money. The government has provided over £3 billion to authorities in England (excluding London) between 2011/2012 to 2015/2016, plus an additional £200 million in 2011 following the severe winter. In June, the department announced a further £5.8 billion for local highways maintenance from 2015/2016 to 2020/2021. This equates to around £976 million per year, a funding increase of £163 million a year.




