

The difficulty of procuring one of the early editions in good condition is so great that few people ever see one. The famous plates are as fine as anything Leech or Cruikshank ever did, and, as seen in an early copy like this, are greatly superior to the vast number of reprints and zinco-type copies that have been made.

Beaumarchais experienced great difficulty in presenting this celebrated satirical play upon the stage. Louis XVI., after hearing the lecture of the play by Marie-Autoinette, exclaimed: "C'est détestable, cela ne sera jamais joné. Il faudrait détruire la Bastille pour que la réprésentation de cette pièce ne fût pas une inconséquence dangereuse. Cet homme se joue de tout ce qu'il faut respecter dans un gouvernement." Nevertheless, this comedy was acted at the Petit Trianon, with the Queen as Rosine, and was applauded at the Comédie Française by all Paris, and also by the grand seigneurs, who were especially scourged by it. Saint-Quentin derived a great advantage from the principal scenes of the work, and his illustrations are full of gaiety, of expression, and of humor. INSERTED is an interesting one-page A. L. S. by Beaumarchais, dated Paris, 3. 7bre, 1773. Of special interest to the American collector, the author having resided here as a secret agent of Louis XVI. prior to the King's decision to assist the cause of the revolutionists with men and money.



Some Record Prices

(From the Boston Evening Transcript, October 25, 1905.)

A collection of first editions of nineteenth century English and American authors, sold on Monday afternoon in the rooms of **THE MERWIN-CLAYTON SALES COMPANY**, included a fine copy of that rare Thackeray item "The Corsair: a Gazette of Literature, Art, Dramatic Criticism, Fashion and Novelty," New York, 1839–1840, to which the great novelist was a contributor. This extremely scarce periodical, in the original fifty-two numbers and perfect throughout, occasioned some spirited bidding, and was finally sold for \$80, the record price. Augustin Daly's copy, lacking several numbers, realized \$55 in 1900. "The Corsair," beginning March 16, 1839, concluded its brief career March 7, 1840. * * * *

The most interesting feature of this sale was the appreciation in the prices of Lincoln material. There were sixty-two Lincoln lots in the sale, most of them being pamphlets, and these brought an average price of \$2.30, which is a record for Lincoln matter in auction sales. Nicolay and Hay's Life, badly waterstained, sold for \$7, and there were other items which brought correspondingly high prices. Other items of interest in the sale were as follows:

"Mirror of Taste and Dramatic Censor," Philadelphia, 1810-11, four volumes (portrait of Warren, a reproduction, other portraits foxed), \$21.

Longfellow's "Hyperion," 1839, first edition, original boards, labels, uncut, \$11.

Mrs. Stowe's "Uncle Tom's Cabin," 1852, first edition, two volumes, rebound in blue crushed levant morocco, gilt edges, \$30.
