Students must return all books before leaving town. Officers should arrange for the return of books wanted during their absence from town.


Volumes of periodicals and of pamphlets are held in the library as much as possible. For special purposes they are given out for a limited time.



UNITED STATES.

The Navy Department was established pursuant to provisions of act of Apr. 30, 1798 (1 R. S. 553, 70). On Feb. 7, 1815 (3 R. S. 202), an act was passed providing for the appointment of a board of three commissioners, to be selected from officers of the navy not below the rank of post-captain, whose duty was to discharge the ministerial duties of the office of secretary of the navy, under his superintendence. By act of Aug. 31, 1842 (5 R. S. 579), this board of commissioners was abolished, and the following five bureaus were authorized and attached to the department, viz.: *Navy Yards and Docks; Construction, Equipment and Repairs; Provisions and Clothing; Ordnance and Hydrography; Medicine and Surgery.* By act of July 5, 1862 (12 R. S. 510, 71), the department was reorganized and the following bureaus established therein, in lieu of the foregoing, viz.: *Bureau of Yards and Docks, Bureau of Equipment (and Recruiting), Bureau of Navigation, Bureau of Ordnance, Bureau of Construction and Repair, Bureau of Steam Engineering, Bureau of Supplies and Accounts, Bureau of Medicine and Surgery.*

The *Hydrographic Office*, authorized under the act of Aug. 31, 1842 (5 St. L. 576), as the "Observatory and chart depot," was established in 1846 and styled the "United States Naval Observatory and Hydrographic Office"; it took its present name and organization under the act of June 21, 1866 (14 St. L. 60; R. S. 72). Its annual report (1860-date) is included in the annual report of the Secretary of the navy. The *Nautical Almanac Office* was established pursuant to provisions of act of March 3, 1849 (9 St. L. 375), and March 3, 1857 (11 St. L. 246, R. S. 73). The *Naval Observatory* was established by acts of Aug. 31, 1842 (5 St. L. 576), Mar. 3, 1847 (9 St. L. 69), Aug. 3, 1848 (9 St. L. 266), and March 3, 1865 (13 St. L. 533, R. S. 73). *Office of Judge-Advocate-General.* Pursuant to provisions of act of Mch. 2, 1865 (13 St. L. 468), an officer in the Navy Department was authorized to be appointed Solicitor and Naval Judge-Advocate-General during the war, and one year thereafter. The office was appropriated for annually until March 4, 1866, when, according to provisions of act of July 20, 1863 (15 St. L. 103), the office ceased. Act of March 3, 1869 (15 St. L. 313), continued the salary from Mch. 4, 1866, to June 30, 1870, when, according to provisions of act of June 22, 1870 (16 St. L. 162; R. S. 29), the office was transferred to the Department of Justice and designated Office of Naval Solicitor; this was abolished by the act of June 19, 1878 (20 St. L. 205; R. S. Suppl. 201). On June 8, 1880 (21 St. L. 164; R. S. Suppl. 290), was authorized the appointment, by the President, of a judge-advocate-general of the navy. He is appointed for a term of four years, from the officers of the navy or marine corps, with rank, pay, and allowances of a captain in the navy or colonel in the marine corps; his duties are to receive, revise and record proceedings of all courts-martial, courts of inquiry, and boards for the examination of officers for promotion or retirement. The *Office of Naval Records of the Rebellion* was organized pursuant to provisions of act of July 7, 1884 (23 R. S. 185).
