SECOND DAY-.-REGINA vs. ANGELO.
August 12th, 1859.
The jury appeared in court, and answered to their names, at 10 o'clock, a. m .

The next witness called was Mr. Inamly Examined by the Att. General. Witness assumed permit shewn him for 701 barrels of flour, to be an export permit; had seen the permit before in Custom House; it was brourht at the same time as the book in which it should have been entered; it was shown witness by Mr. Angelo, who made a statement that he had receised \$1.; wit ness told him he thought it was a forgery it was dated Nov. 25th, 1858; if Angels had wished to prove the genuineness of the document, it could only have been done by bringing forward the party in whose name it was issued ; when witness told Angelo it was a fergery, he scarcely replied, and never referred to it afterwards; could not make out the name on the permit : the duplicate has not been found: this is the du plicate, not the original permit; has examined the duplicate in the office; there is none answering to this in the office.
Cross-examined by Mr. Wight. Mr Angelo brought the permit, not Mr. Bigham; witness thought a forgery had been committed; he had gone over the books, and it was not entered; the mistake was in Ingelo's faror; can not say where the flour was sent; believed it was forgery, because it was dated wrong; the ink was fresh, and made out in Angelo's writing; witness believed that Mr. Jeffrey kept no account of goods which went up the river; it wa after witness took office that the book were examined; when doing so asked Mr:
Angelo for explanations, who never reAngelo for explanations, who never re-
fused to give information: when he found a discrepancy he asked Mr. Angelo for in formation not money; there were other errors besides Mr. Angelo's, in the books he applied to Angelo for explanation because he received the money; he judged by the books there was a deficiency on the 25 th November, 1858; has never known a deficiency since he took hold of the books: has seen money received by Angelo placed in cash-box; Anderson put money in the same cash-box; the safe was partially open during the day; the money in the cash-box was put in the safe at night; the money was counted at night; it was Angelo's custom to count the money; other parties were present; witness pat permits on the file; has never known duplicates mislaid since he has been in the office; entered the office on the 23 May last; has not abused Angelo in the office ; gave Angelo abused Angelo in the office; gave Angelo
every chance as long as it was possible to
do so; never applied to Mr. Sam'l Bigham to look over accomits; did not think that Mr. Angelo produced the forged permit again, and never heard of it atterwards unintentional irregularities might take place in the office; witness was not trained to Custom House business; has expressed an opinion that various errors were not intentional; Mr. Angelo handed no sum to witness as a surplus; witness thinks \$135 was producod before him as a surplus; the sum oi 829 might have been contained in that sum: Mr. Angelo handed over the surplus williugly.
Direct examination by Att. General.-It was the duty of the issuer of permits to enter the name of the party concerned on the permit and in the book; there are no means of detecting the amount of duty paid when permits are made out and entered in blank it is impossible not to miss money when
the accounts are made up in the evening. if it has been paidin; witness has cone over all the books and permits in the office: has found in the office two duplicates not entered: a great many which came down the river were not entered; the 42 permits were almost all signed by Angelo; the signature purports that the duty is paid on permits to British Columbia; from the time witness took office, Mr. Angelo took charge of money; has found entries in Angelo's hrod-writing relating to surplus, in the books.
The next witness was Mr. Lindhart, who stated that he had paid sums of money for permits, in December last; on 22nd December receised permit shewn him and paid the money to Mr. Angelo.
Cross-examined by Mr. Jones. Dors not know the number of the permit; does not remember how he paid the money whether in coin or compensation tickets does not remember whether he received money in change from Ingelo at the time ; does not know what Angelo did with the compensation tickets; the compensation tickets were taken the same as cash

Att. General.-Witness does not remember if he paid in cash as well as in compention tickets; he consulered the tickets the same as cash.
Thomas Williams sworn. He had paid money to Mr. Angelo for a Marhor License, on the 12 th May, amount $\$ 17.50$.
Crossexamined by Mr. Jones: Does not know at what time of day he paid it: paid the money to Angelo in the Custom House in gold coin.
Attorney General-IIas seen this paper hefore; it is the license granted to me. Has seen this sailing license before; paid $\$ 10$ for that paper to Mr. Angelo.
Cross examination ly Mr. Jones. Docs not know Mr. Angelo's writing; Mr. Angelo gave me the paper and the money was paid to him.
Attorney General-Witness gave security ; he signed a paper which Mr. Angel made out; he did not know whether it had anything to do with the 810
The Attomey General then found that S10 had been citered the nest day, and as it was entered in blank, and might he the amount paid by Muir; he requested the jury to dismiss that evidence from their minds.

Judge Beghie was then sworn, and identified a letter handed to him, as one which he received from Mr. Angelo ahout the 21st of July ; it was dated 21 st July, and con tained a request from Mr. Angelo that his case Begbic wonld appear as a witness in Judge Beghie as a witness, in order to give the defence an opportunity of cross-examining him, but Mr. Wight declined to take advantage of it. Mr. Mackay, the nex witness, being in the $\Lambda$ ssembly, th was adjourned until half-past one.

## Fort yale correspondence.

Fort Yale, Aug. 10, 1859.
Editor Batisn Colonist:--On the 30th inst., Ruell 'lurner, a maner on Cross Bar, between the Kimyons, died of congestion of the brain. Deceased was a mative of Maine. He was intered by his partners. Drownod.
Two Indian boys, on the morning of the 3 d inst,, were drowned, opposite New York Bar, by the capsizing of a cance while they were engaged in fishing.
On the 8 th inst, the body of a drowned man was picked up at this place, by Indians. A post mortem examination was held by Dr. G. E. Crane, which diselosed the fact that the man must have been murdered, and afterwards thrown into the water to hide the crime. Who the man was is a mystery; but it is hoped that the perpetrators of the deed will yet be captured.
A man named Patrick Crowley, working on Prince Albert's Flat, was instantly killed, on Monday morning last, by the caving of a bank of dirt, which he was preparing to remove. The body was brought o Fort Yale, and buried by his friends.

## Liquor-selling to Yneians

At the Cowitchen encampment, within the city limits, on Sunday evening, a pailfull of " lightning" was distributed among the poor natives, and, as a consequence, the residents were disturbed all night by their demoniacal shouts. Towards morning a fight occurred, in which one Indian was severely stabbed by another. Why is not some strenuous effort made by the police authorities to put down this growing evil? Surely, their duties are not so arduous, that they cannot af ford to devote a small portion of their time

## From Fort Alexender.

By Mr. James Batterton, who arrived this morning from the Forks, we have the most encouraging news from above. He says that men have arrived at Lytton from Alexander, who state positively that they can make fifty dollars' per day, to the hand, anywhere-that the diggings are extensive, and that all the gulches and ravines are rich with gold. Dry diggings' prospects as high as two dollars to the pan, of coarse gold, have been obtained. All along the Upper Fraser men are rushing eagorly towards the new placers.
The excitement in this place and through the Kanyons is intense, and, I do not doubt, if the news holds geod for a forthight, we shall see a rush, only equalled, in proportion, to that of last year to Fraser River from California.
Britisi Colembia License Act, 1859.A Proclamation, dated August 10, has been issued, repealing all former laws in relation to licenses for selling liguors, and enacts,

By each person vending spirituous or fermented liquors, by retail, for each bouse or place in the colony, where cartad on, of in a town £25 per year.
If liquors are retailod in any rural district, not a part of a town £10 per year.
A person not having a retail license as above, but selling wholesale, f 10 a year.
Each person carrying on any other trade £1 every three months, this license allowing them to change their abode at pleasure, but to do business only at one place under one license. Each prirtner has to pay the same.

Any person necupying Crown hads, and carrying on any business included in the above, to pay ten shillings for every month. The licenses are payable in adrance.

## TO LET,

## ANGELO CASE---SECOND DAY

Eriday afternoon, August 12th. The Court met at half past one, pursuant to ndjournment.
J. W. MeKay: To the best of my recollection I paid the duty on the goods receired on this permit to Mr. Angelo to the amount of $\$ 64650$.
Cioss examined: I am employed by II 13. Co.; there were one or two disputes between the Company and Custom House, about the value of the dollar; in some instances the duties on goods sent were not paidat the time; I an quite positive I paid his permit dated April 7 th 1859, to Mr. Angelo, for I receised the amount $\$ 64650$ in cash from Mr. Finlayson; this permit No. 1235, was not on account of Government; the II. B. Co. have paid duties in cash and by drafts on Treasury; I paid s 646.50 in the Custom llouse; counted the money over to Mr. Angelo; saw Mr. Angelo in pussession of the money; neter paid duties to Mr. Anderson.
The Attorney General here remarked that he thought it would facilitate the progress of the case if a statement of the account between the II. B. Co. and Custom House was made out. The court consequently adjourned until 10 A . M. on Saturday

## Third Day.

Saturdar, August, 13, 1859.
Owing to a misunderstanding on the part of the Sheriff the Court was not opened till 11 o'elock. Mrs. Augelo was present this morning.
Attorney Ueneral stated that Mr. Kerr had prepared a statement from the books of the 1I. B. Co., Custums, and Treasury.
Mr. Kerr sworn: Has made a careful ex amination of the books and prepared a statement. It is a correct extract from the books; is quite sure $\$ 6+650$ the amount o permit issued to the IHdson's Bay Company, is not entered in the books; there is no entry of harbor license taken out by Pike; nor entry of Williams; , neither are the following three amounts paid by Lindhart: $\$ 2390, \$ 1773$, and $\$ 102.32$
Cross examined by Mr. Angelo: How do you know my hand writing? have you ever seen me write? Witness said he had been told which was Mr. Angelo's writing in the books.
Mr. Jeffries sworn. The unentered permits and licenses were in all cases written by Mr. Angelo, with the exception of three written by Mr. Anderson. Has had conversations with Mr. Angelo since the char ges were brought against him; cannot state what was said.
Cross-examined by Mr: Angelo.-There was sometimes contusion in the Custom House toward the close of business hours it was the practice of merchants to defer getting permits until late in the afternoon Hudson's Day Company's goods were al lowed to go up without permits, by keeping an account of goods so sent ; did not guarg IIudson's Bay Company's liquors ; did guage those of other parties.
By Att. General.- $\$ 646.50$ is paid on this permit; this permit did not go up with the goods; received the duplicate of this perait from Mr. Angelo.
Mr. Finlayson sworn :--This statement is a true representation of the entries in our books.
Cross-cxamined by Mr. Angelo.-Duties were received prior to December 9th, at my office; had invoices from merchants and made my books up from them; has a anced money to Mr. Angelo on orders.
Attorney Geaeral resumed direct examination: 'There is a discrepancy on March 1 st, 4 th, and 5 th, between the Custom House and ILudson's Bay Company's books cam not explain the discrepancy ; that docmoment, viz, the statement prepared is the only explanation witness can give
The Attorney General then handed the etatement prepared to the jury, for their inspection, and stated the difference between the two accounts amounted to 837 , on the 1st. 4th, and 5th of March; and that there was also a deficiency of $\$ 646.50$.
Examination resumed by the Attorney General.-The duplicates from May 1858-9) were placed on the file.
In unswer to the foreman of the jury, the Attorney General stated that drafts received in payment at the Custom House, were passed over to the Treasury and received as cash.
The Attorney General then stated that the case for the prosecution was closed. Upon which Mr. Wight asked for an adjourmment of the court, until Monday morning, which was granted.

## Fortifying San Juan.

Yesterday a party returned from the disbuted territory, bringing the news that eight 32 -pounders were landed, on Satur day, from on board the U. S. S. Massachu setts. The intention is to erect batteries on the two highest eminences, about two miles apart, on the south end of the island near the camp.
300 soldiers were expected from Steilacom, yesterday. Bys the end of the present week enough soldiers will be landed, to augment the American forecs to 700 .
Gen. Harney was hourly looked for.
A large wharf will be constructed for the U. S. Government, near that of the II. B. Company, in the harbor. Two or three hundred thousand feet of lumber was landed for U. S. Government buildings.
Coaches for Red River.-Messrs. Burbank \&-Co. to-day despatch for Breckinridge, on Red River, two four-horse post coaches. This is the first attempt at connecting St. Paul with the valley of the Red River by regular land conveyance. At Breckinridge the coaches will connect with the Auson Northrup for Pembina and Fort Garry. A number of passengers go up today in the coaches, and amoner them two Scottish Ladies, the Misses Sterling, who are en route for Lake Athabasca, 1,700 miles north of st. Path. Fort Garry by Burbank's stage line and the Anson Northrup, where they will take one of the annual trains sent ly the Ind son's Bay Co. from that post to Lake Athahaska. But one train leaves Garry yearly for that far-off locality. To give a romanic color to the affiair; it is only necessary o add, what we hear is the truith, that one Dan Cupid is the moving cause of this long and perilous journey.-St. Paul Pioncer,
