To Levy an Annual Tax of \&1 per Centum our of Vancouver Island and its Depenaencies. Whereas, it is expedient to levy an Annual in the Colony of Vancouver Island and its Dependencies, for the use of Her Majesty, Her Heirs and
Her Successors; Her Successors;
Be it enacted by the Governor, on behalf of Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative This act may be cited as the "Real Estate Tax Act, 1860 ." "Real Estate," includes all buildings, whether moveable or immoveable, erected on fossils, in and under the same.
III.' There shall be raised, levied and collected, upon all Real Estate in the Colony of Vancouver Island and its dependencies, except as hereinafter
mentioned, as from the first day of June, 1860, an mentioned, as from the first day ot June, 1860 , an
Annual Tax of $£ 1$ per centum on the market value thereof, and to be paid for the use of Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Her Successors.
