THE EVE OF BATTLE.

COMMEN, April 4—A thousand private chisens, from all parts of the Contederacy, have dacked to our standard.

A battle may not come of until the day

after to-morrow.

The following is an address just issued by

our General:

HEADQUARTERS ARMY OF THE MISSISSIPP, CORINTR, Miss., April 3, 1362.—Soldiers of the Army of the Mississippi! I have put you in motion, to offer battle to the invaders of your country. With resolution and disciplined valor, becoming men fighting as you are for all that is worth living or dying for, you can but march to decisive victory over the agrarian mercenaries who have been sent to despoil you of your liberties, your prosperity and your honor.

Remember the precious stake that is involved in this contest; remember the dependence of your mothers, your wives, your ais tere, and your children, is upon the result.

Remember the fair, broad, abounding land, the happy homes and the ties that would be dissolved and desolated by your defeat.

The eyes and hopes of eight millions of people rest upon you. You are expected to show yourselves worthy of your race, and your lineage; worthy of the women of the South, whose noble devotion in this war has never been exceeded, at any time.
