GIVE YOUR FULL NAME, POST OFFICE, STATE AND COUNTY, alko street number, if you have any.

PRINT YOUR NAME AND ADDRESS, If Jou du not wilte a very plain hand, toke time to jrint out jour name and address. About haif the mistukes made lu fililug orders are beciuse eustomers do uot write name aud udaress dainly.

GIVE CATALOGUE NUMBER and מame of each artlele santed, together with quantity wanted atid price.

Carry out the cost for the entlre quantity of goods of each kind ordered.

The clam is made that the gonds of the "authorizel " or denominational $1^{\text {mbliblithg house must be the best for the schools }}$ of its own chorch, becanse of representing the work of men and women conneeled with that church. There are some things to he sald in this connection whirlt will be of interest to all who desire to know the truth and act intelligently.

## Same Pablication Sold as Baptint. Methodist, ete.

It is not generally known to what a large extent syndicate material is used in geods furnished by "anthorized" publishers. Sunday-school publications provided bs them contain much of the same inaterial. Nowe are primed partially, and others entirely. from the same matter, io one case heing sold as Baptist, in mother as Methotist, etc.

The Lessun Belps for the Leginners Department now adrertised and furnished by " authorized " publishlng bouses in general are the same as to contents, thongh the names of editors are different. This line of pulifications includes belps for both teachers and pupits.

For the I'rimary Department. Pleture Lesmo Rolls whleh are allke are supplled by the leading "authorized" publishers under varlous names. such as "Leaf Clustra." "Lible Lessun「ictures," efl. l'icture Lesson Cards, Hoder various names, alike in part or as a while, are also supplied hy these houses.

A Primary Teacher's Help, prejared by one and the same person. Is now supplied hy two or more of the leading "author. izell "publishirg houses. The rontents of these pmblications are the same, although the editurs' and ruhlishers' names are tlifferent. In the same way these houses provide Primary Scholars' Itelps which are allke.

A sertes of Junior Irpartment Helps-ane for the teacher. and the other for the class-is now furnished by the " anthorized." publising houses of two or more leading denominations. The lesson matter insile of both is the same, though the editor's name aod the imprint of the publisher on the one are quite diffurent from those on the other.

More than haif of the contents are the same. on monh the same flan, a number of other Sunday-school papers are provided by the different "authrized " houses.

## Outaide Writers Employed.

Where a Lesson Help or Papre is prepared as rell as printurt by the "anthorizal" publlsbing house. It is not, as some may supmese, altogether the work of writers raneented with that particular denomination. Each housn employs wfiturs without regard to their church connection or atitiation, the same persuas furnish. ing Mss. for publiathons bronght out by different "authorized " hutuses, as anyone may see by comparison.

## Goons Come from Ontside llouses.

A large part of the Sundar-schonl supplies catalagued by "authrized" nublishing houses are not their own. Many bearing their implint are not, in reality, puhlished by them.
Sot a single Bible or Testament is published by an "authorized "puhlishing house. Must of the Standard Reference Bonks. Teacher Training Books, aud Books on Sunday School Methods, are published hy "outside " honse's; sn are Sunday-school carils. calendars, wall mottoes, ete., is well as charts, maps, hlackboards etc.

## Advertise Other lemson llelps Than Thelr Own,

"Anthorized " publishers frequently adrertise the l.esson Hielps of nther honses. Three rears ago two of the leading " authorized " mblishlug hirnsps adrertised in furnish the entire line of Lesson lTelps of an laterdenominational house.
