

Foreword

The Dayton C. Miller Collection is an extraordinary assemblage of musical, bibliographic, pictorial, and organological materials, garnered from all corners of the globe. Indeed, during his lifetime (1866–1941) the late Dayton C. Miller assembled not one but five collections, all relating to his favorite instrument; in addition to the instruments themselves he accumulated some 10,000 titles of music, a fine collection of books on flutes and musical instruments in general, a varied assortment of art work featuring the flute (from woodcuts to statuary), and a small group of portraits and autographs of flutists. Together, these collections form a unique body of material for the study of the flute, and the Library of Congress was proud to accept Dr. Miller's bequest.

Being a physicist and one of the foremost scientists in the field of acoustics, Dayton C. Miller was especially interested in the flute as a sound-producing device. From his schooldays he was also an amateur musician, and he never lost sight of the musical qualities of the materials he collected. He was, with flutes as with scientific equipment, a fine craftsman as well as a theoretician, and this aspect of the subject came to interest him more and more as his collection grew in numbers and in kinds. The flute is likewise both a social and a historical document, and Dr. Miller was aware of both these aspects—especially the latter, in which he tended to hold a progressivist viewpoint. Finally, it must be remarked that—apart from all learned and scientific considerations—his collection served Dr. Miller as a serious avocation, and it affords edification on many different levels.

The book portion of Dr. Miller's collection was recorded for the public in 1935 in his privately printed Catalogue of Books and Literary Material Relating to the Flute. The present Checklist is intended to make known, in similar fashion, the content of the instrument collection. Most of the information here conveyed is based on Dr. Miller's own records and observations; certain points requiring lengthy research and expert investigation remain unresolved. We hope that the wealth of data contained in the Checklist will go far toward answering the questions of musicians, scholars, and enthusiasts all over the world and that it will serve the public by making known for the first time the exact contents of this part of the unique Dayton C. Miller Collection.

Preface

No one better exemplifies the traditional concept of the practical-minded, ever-curious American scientist than Dayton C. Miller, who was born on a farm (at Strongsville, Ohio, March 13, 1866), grew up under modest circumstances in the small Ohio town of Berea, and worked his way through Baldwin University (later Baldwin-Wallace College). It is characteristic that at his commencement exercises in 1886 he gave a lecture on "The Sun" and also played a flute solo with orchestral accompaniment (on a flute that unfortunately was not preserved). Later he obtained a doctorate in astronomy at Princeton University under Prof. Charles A. Young, and in 1890 he began an association with the Case School of Applied Science in Cleveland that lasted for over 50 years—first teaching astronomy, later (1893) becoming a professor in charge of the physics department. In early 1896, on reading accounts of Roentgen's experiments, Professor Miller became one of the first Americans to take an X-ray photograph; beginning in 1900 he associated with Prof. Edward W. Morley in those ether drift experiments that still concern astronomers and mathematicians dealing with Einstein's theory of relativity; in 1908 he introduced the phonodeik, a device that until the invention of electronic oscillators was one of the chief means of converting sound waves into visual images and thus of analyzing all manner of sounds from musical instruments to human speech. During World War I, at the request of the Government, Dr. Miller studied the physical characteristics of pressure waves caused by the firing of large guns-studies that on the one hand provided material for medical investigations of "shell shock," and on the other hand led to the results eventually reported in his Sound Waves, Shape and Speed (1937). Among his other published books one finds such varying titles as The Science of Musical Sounds (1916, revised 1922), Sparks, Lightning and Cosmic Rays (1939), and (translated and annotated) Theobald Boehm's The Flute and Flute Playing (1908, revised 1922, reprinted 1960). Death came to Dr. Miller at Cleveland on February 22, 1941, just as he was preparing to move with his entire collection of flutes, books, and related materials to the Library of Congress, and here complete the varied investigations that remained unfinished and unpublished.

A similar variety of interests is reflected in Dr. Miller's collection of flutes and allied instruments, which are here listed publicly for the first time. No. 1 in the collection is his father's Civil War fife, used as a toy and broken during young Dayton's childhood. No. 4 betrays the eager enthusiasm of the adult flutist, finally able to afford a first-class instrument made especially for him. Nos. 8 and 10 show Dayton C. Miller as both the theoretical scientist and the expert craftsman; the first is of silver and the second of gold, and this concern

with the properties of different materials for musical instruments was a major factor in his development of the phonodeik and in the many acoustical experiments he subsequently carried out, using examples in his collection. (When interrupted by his war work of 1917–19 he had started plans for a platinum flute that were never resumed.) But though his interest in acoustics and in musicmaking were chiefly responsible for starting the collection on its way, it can be seen from this *Checklist* that Dr. Miller found many other reasons for admiring and acquiring whistles, recorders, flageolets, fifes, flutes, and even a few other species of instruments of many kinds from many lands. It is interesting to note that a great part of the collection, close to 85 percent, was acquired after Dr. Miller had passed his 50th birthday.

The information given in this *Checklist* is based very largely on the information found in Dr. Miller's neatly pencilled ledgers, in which each instrument is accorded a single page that is supplemented upon occasion by drawings, letters, and other documentation. Only rarely has it been possible to add to or corroborate Dr. Miller's data by securing the opinions of specialists in the many fields that come into question. Often, for example, it was not clear to Dr. Miller or to us which of several similar-appearing woods had been used; and since the wood expert who was approached refused to render judgment without cutting a small test sample from an instrument, such questions were left hanging. Many other problems—of precise dating, of naming the geographic origin of exotic instruments, of commenting on peculiarities of craftsmanship—all these will have to await the assistance of appropriate experts and fuller discussion in a more extensive catalog which we hope will eventually be published.

In the meantime, this Checklist will at least inform the interested as to what is in the instrumental part of the Dayton C. Miller Collection and what is presently evident about each specimen—its type, maker or source, approximate date, number of pipes, finger holes, or keys, over all (not resonating) length, the source and date of its addition to the collection, and often other data. The numbering is that assigned by Dr. Miller and is roughly—though not entirely—chronological by date of acquisition; his series runs from 1 through 1426, though some of those numbers encompass as many as six or eight instruments in a set. At the end, beginning with 1501, have been added those instruments Dr. Miller failed to number and a few that have been added to the collection since its arrival at the Library of Congress. Curt Sachs's terminology, as suggested in The History of Musical Instruments (New York, 1940), has been followed in such respects as "cross flute" instead of "transverse flute" and in the formula for indicating the number of finger and thumb holes (for example, "6/0"). Pitch at 440 A is indicated when possible, or the lowest tone is given in the case of non-European orchestral instruments; the absence of such a pitch indication usually means that the instrument was not in sufficiently good playing condition to allow an accurate test. A few simple abbreviations used, such as "DCM" for Dayton C. Miller, hardly require explanation.
