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INTRODUCTION.

In the summer of 1889, while visiting in Alfred Centre, N. Y., the writer was shown an old autograph album compiled nearly fifty years ago. In it I at once recognized the autograph of my great-grandfather, written at the age of eighty-four, and with it a lock of his iron-gray hair. Before this I had known only his name. I resolved to know more. This book is the result of the interest then and there awakened.

At first it was my purpose to trace the line from the immigrant founder down to Joseph' of Westerly, and then to enlarge and include all his descendants, carrying the female line, however, only one remove. This purpose has been carried out with few exceptions, but meanwhile so much material has been gathered regarding collateral lines of this great family that many urgent requests have come from members of the family to include this also. I have therefore arranged this material systematically, and added it in twelve "Appendices."

The family name will be found spelled both *Greene* and *Green* without apparent reason. Undoubtedly the original spelling in Rhode Island was *Greene*. Many branches of the family have dropped the final "e," and in this book I have endeavored to follow their own custom, though not always with success, especially when the information has been obtained

through a third party.

The writer has been aided in his work by the fact that a large part of those included in this book have been Seventh-day Baptists, and by church and social interests were led to follow certain quite well-defined lines of westward emigration. They have been mainly an agricultural people, rarely seeking civil office, though bearing their full share of military service. That they were an industrious, temperate, and sturdy stock is

shown by great age and large families.

I have been greatly indebted to Professor Ray Greene Huling's article on "The Greenes of Quidnesset," appearing in the Narragansett Historical Register, October, 1883, to July, 1884 (Providence, R. I., James N. Arnold, Editor), to which frequent reference has been made. Many errors in that article, which Professor Huling acknowledged to be imperfect, have been corrected herein. Great assistance has been given also by Mr. Paul Greene, of Adams Centre, N. Y., by Joshua Greene Hull, of Gladbrook, Ia. (now deceased), and by others. It has not been an easy task, though a labor of love; it has demanded much work, great care, hundreds of letters, and not a little detective work in tracing out missing branches. It is our hope that the wide perusal of these pages may arouse in many an honest pride in an humble, hard-working, and worthy ancestry. This will be our ample reward

EXPLANATION.

The few abbreviations used will be easily understood:

b.=born. dau.=daughter. m.=married. wid.=widow, etc. d.=died.

The frequent intermarriages between various branches of the family have rendered cross-references numerous. When these are made to any portion of the book by number merely, the reference is to the consecutive numbering for heads of families. When the page is referred to it is so stated.



THE GREENES OF QUIDNESSET, OR KINGSTOWN, R. I.

In 1639, or shortly before, as appears from an affidavit given later in this sketch, Richard Smith, Sr., built a trading-post near the present village of Wickford, in North Kingstown, R. I. With him was living one John Greene, concerning whose parentage and

previous history nothing is certainly known.

Professor Huling says: "A tradition exists, both among his own descendants and in the Warwick family of Greenes, to the effect that he came hither from England, and had formerly borne the name of Clarke instead of Greene. The change of name, if, indeed, it occurred, may have been made for the purpose of gaining permission to leave England for America. 'Godly deceptions' of a similar kind were not unknown in those trying days. Smith had left Gloucestershire (England) for New England, and again Taunton for Narragansett, 'for his conscience' sake,' says Roger Williams; possibly young Greene was of a family sufficiently obnoxious to the authorities to render desirable a change of name as well as a change of residence."

Whether there was any family connection between him and Smith is not known. The latter is known to have been a man of strong, independent, and outspoken opinions, and doubtless young Greene held similar views, and may have come from the same locality. It will be seen that their settlement was within three years of the founding of Providence by Roger Williams, and about one year after the first settlement of the island of Rhode Island. It was several miles beyond the remotest white settlement, and seems to have been made not only for the purpose of trade with the Indians, but to escape the persecution of the Massachusetts Puritans.

Two other men bearing exactly the same name settled in Rhode Island about this time—John Greene of Newport, and the surgeon John Greene (ancestor of General Nathaniel Greene), who settled in Warwick three or four years later; but, so far as known, no relationship existed between them and the subject of this sketch.

In 1663 Greene, in company with his friend Smith, declared himself in favor of being under the jurisdiction of Connecticut rather than of Rhode Island. His active opposition to the authority of Rhode Island may be accounted for by the fact that the title to the tract of land which he occupied, and probably owned, in Quidnesset neck, was based upon a purchase from the Indians made in direct opposition to an order of the Rhode Island General Court. If Rhode Island should prevail, his title would be worthless; while the success of Connecticut would confirm him in his possessions.

His opposition was met by the following order:

"NEWPORT, 1664, May 5.

"Ordered, that a warrant goe from the Court to require John Greene Sen'r living at Narragansett to come before this Court."

He was arrested a few days later and brought before the Court, where he replied with so much spirit as to give offence, but upon his asking pardon for his actions, it was declared, "The Court doe pass by his offence, and doe promise to the aforesayd John Greene all lawful protexion, and doe declare that he is still looked on as a freeman of the Collony."

May 20th, 1671, having been assured of the title and peaceful possession of his home, he took the oath

of allegiance to Rhode Island.

January 1st, 1672, he and five others bought of the Indians a large tract of land in Narragansett. In 1672 and 1674 his name appears as witness to transfers of land.

July 21st, 1679, he made an affidavit in support of the title of Richard Smith, Jr., to the lands in the vicinity of Wickford:

"To All Whom This May Concern:

"I, John Greene, inhabiting in the Narragansett Country, called King's Province, I being sworn a Conservator of the Peace, do on my Oathe affirme, that forty years and more ago, Mr. Richard Smith that I then lived with did first begin and make a settlement in the Narragansett, and that by the consent and with the approbation of the Indian Princes and people, and did improve land, mow meadows severall yeares before Warwick was settled by any English man: and I being present did see and heare all the Narragansett Princes being assembled together give by livery and seizing some hundreds of acres of land about a mile in length and so down to the sea; this being about thirty years agoe, many hundred Indians being then present, consenting thereunto. "

"This I certify to be true as I am in publique office,

on oath and under my hand."

July 29th, 1679, he and forty-one others of Narra-

gansett signed a petition to the King praying him to put an end to the long dispute between Rhode Island and Connecticut regarding the jurisdiction over their

territory.

March 24th, 1682, he deeded his son Daniel 120 acres bordering on Allen's Harbor, and to his son James 60 acres adjoining, each of said sons to pay thirty shillings annually as long as their father or mother should live. The land was bounded partly by land of son John.

July 16th, 1686, he signed an address to the King. May 13th, 1692, he signed as witness to a deed. He probably died within the next four years, as his name does not appear in the list of Kingstown freemen of 1696.

He left a will, as is shown by an allusion in a deed

by his son Edward.

His wife, in 1682, at the time of the transfer of land to his sons, was named Joan, but nothing further is known about her.

His descendants, now numbering thousands, and scattered from ocean to ocean and beyond, have for the most part been Baptists, and a large portion of these Seventh-day Baptists, ready, if need be, to sacrifice and to give good reason for their faith. In the struggle at the birth of our nation, and in the times of her subsequent peril, they have freely given themselves to her defence, and, like the immigrant founder of the race, have largely been tillers of the soil. Children:

I. John, Jr., b. June 6, 1651; d. Oct. 6, 1729; m. Abigail Different; lived in East Greenwich and in that part of Warwick afterward set off as Coventry, and had eleven children.

II. Daniel², b. Way; m. at Newport July 16, 1689

(perhaps a second marriage), to Rebecca Barrows; lived in North Kingstown, where he d. 1730; had seven children.

III. James², b. 1655; d. 1728; m. (1) Elizabeth —; (2) Ann ——; lived in North Kingstown, and had sons, John and James, of whom nothing more is known.

IV. Edward, b. ; m. Mary Tibbitts, dau. of Henry; lived in North Kingstown. They had sons, as is shown by the will of their grandfather Tibbitts, but their names have not been preserved.

V. Benjamin, b. about 1665; m. Humility Coggeshall.

BENJAMIN² GREENE (probably of John¹) was of North Kingstown and afterward of East Greenwich. Evidence seems to identify him as the son of John of Kingstown, though it is not conclusive. If so, he was born, probably in Quidnesset (North Kingstown), about 1665; m. about 1687 Humility Coggeshall, 6th child of Joshua and Joan (West), of Newport and Portsmouth, who was born in Portsmouth Jan., 1671. His name appears in the freeman's list of North Kingstown in 1696. In 1698-1703 he was deputy to the General Assembly; 1701-1704 member of the Town Council; 1702, ratemaker; 1703, appointed to lay out highways. March 26, 1705, he sold land in Kingstown and soon removed to East Greenwich, where he died in the winter of 1718-19. His will, dated Jan. 7, 1719, was proved in East Greenwich March 5 following. In it he mentions his wife Humility, who survived him, and twelve children, of whom the three youngest were under eighteen. Children: I. John³, b. about 1688; m. Mary Aylsworth.

II. Mary³, b. about 1690; m. in East Greenwich Dec.

9, 1709, to Thomas Spencer.

III. Benjamin³, b. about 1692; m. March 19, 1714, Eleanor Randall of Westerly, and settled there. (For his descendants, see Appendix A.)

IV. Ann³, b. about 1694; m. Daniel Tennant, son of Alexander of Kingstown, and lived in Kingstown.

V. Henry³, b. about 1696; m. in East Greenwich May 15, 1724, Margaret Rathbone. His children's births are recorded in East Greenwich. He d. in West Greenwich Feb. 21, 1752, his wife Margaret surviving him. They had eleven children:

i. Humility, b. Feb. 12, 1725; m. her second cousin, Silas⁴ Greene (John³, John², John¹), and had five

children in West Greenwich.

ii. Mary, b. May 18, 1726; d. young.

iii. Amey, b. Sept. 10, 1727.

iv. Benjamin, b. July 17, 1729; m. Mehitable Tripp, of Exeter, dau. of Job; lived in West Greenwich and Exeter, and had eleven children. (Mr. Douglass N. Greene, of Syracuse, N. Y., is preparing a sketch of Benjamin's descendants.)

v. Nathan, b. May 29, 1731.

vi. Mary, b. Jan. 6, 1733.

vii. Job, b. March 2, 1735; m. Meribah Carr. (For his descendants, see Appendix B.)

viii. Anne, b. Nov. 4, 1736; perhaps m. in W. G.

Jan. 26, 1758, George Tibbitts.

ix. Christian, b. Jan. 22, 1740; probably m. in Exeter March 6, 1760, Job⁵ Greene, son of her cousin Philip⁴ (John³, Benjamin², John¹), and lived in W. G.

x. Jeremiah, b. April 11, 1743; perhaps he who m. in Exeter July 20, 1765, Deborah "Cammell."

VI. Phebe³, b. about 1698; m. in Westerly Sept. 22, 1717, Thomas Wells, and lived in Westerly, where they had seven children:

- i. Phebe, b. Oct. 7, 1718; m. in Westerly Oct. 24, 1735, Christopher Edwards, and had eight children.
- ii. Lois, b. Nov. 30, 1720; m. in Westerly March 7, 1740, Thomas Ross, and had seven children.
- iii. Thomas, b. April 5, 1723; m. Sarah Thompson, and had eight children, one of whom (Phebe) m. Joseph Potter, and was grandmother of the late Miss Maria L. Potter, a well-known local genealogist of Potter Hill, R. I.

iv. Benjamin, b. Nov. 23, 1727.

- v. Caleb, b. March 15, 1731; m. Lois Coon, and had three children.
- vi. Joshua, b. Oct. 29, 1733; m. Elizabeth Partelow, and had son, Rev. Joshua.
- vii. Nathan, b. Feb. 12, 1737; m. Mary Thurston, b. Aug. 27, 1737, dau. of Geo. and Keziah, and had George, Keziah, Nathaniel, and others.
- VII. Catherine³, b. about 1700; probably m. Dec. 23, 1721, her cousin, Daniel³ Greene, Jr. (Daniel², John¹), and lived in North Kingstown. She d. before 1738, leaving:
 - i. Benjamin, b. 1722; m. Jan. 5, 1744, Anne Utter, and d. before 1760, leaving dau. Catherine.
 - ii. Joshua, m. (1) Diana Carpenter, (2) Alice Potter, and had seven children by former and one by latter.
 - iii. John, m. Sarah Spink, and had five children in North Kingstown.
- VIII. Caleb³, b. after 1700; admitted a freeman in North Kingstown, 1727, and died the same year; probably not m.; willed his property to his brother Joshua.
- IX. Sarah³, b. after 1700.
- X. Dinah³, b. after 1700.

- XI. Deborah³, b. after 1700; m. in East Greenwich Sept. 18, 1729, Wm. Reynolds, son of Jas., and lived in West Greenwich, where these children's births are recorded:
 - i. Sarah, b. March 31, 1730.
 - ii. Caleb, b. June 21, 1731. iii. David, b. June 17, 1734.
 - iv. Griffin, b. June 11, 1737.
 - v. Benjamin, b. Oct. 25, 1740.
 - vi. James, b. Aug. 21, 1748.

XII. Joshua, b. after 1700; was a minor in 1727, when he inherited his brother Caleb's estate. No descendants of his can be traced.

JOHN³ GREENE (Benjamin², John¹), b. probably in Quidnesset (North Kingstown), R. I., about 1688; m. (1) about 1708 Mary Aylsworth, b. as early as 1688, oldest dau. of Arthur and Mary (Brown*) of Quid-

nesset, but originally from England or Wales.

Oct. 13, 1726, he gave a receipt for her share of her father's estate. In 1732 he is styled "Lieut. John." On Jan. 9, 1733–34, being then of East Greenwich, he purchased 149³/₄ acres in what is now West Greenwich, it being "the first farm in the first division in the right of Samuel Cranston." In 1743 he sold farms formerly belonging to his father and brother Caleb, both deceased.

The Cranston farm in West Greenwich was the site of his homestead. He m. (2) in West Greenwich

^{*} This Mary Brown was dau. of Rev. John and Mary (Holmes), of Providence, and grand-daughter of Rev. Obediah Holmes, the Baptist minister of Newport, who was persecuted by the Puritans of Massachusetts.

Aug. 24, 1741, Prescilla Bowen (or Barney), of Swan-

sea, who survived him.

In the records preserved by Ethan Greene, his son Joseph's grandson (see 12), he is styled "White-Hat John," and a daughter Mary is mentioned, not named in his will.

He d. in West Greenwich March 29, 1752. His will, made March 26 and proved April 25, 1752, alludes to two sons deceased in addition to those named below.

Children, probably all by first wife, the order of the

daughters uncertain:

I. Thomas⁴, b. about 1710; m. 1730 Sarah——; lived first in W. G., where his children were born; removed to E. G., whence he again removed about 1765 and settled near the present site of Shannock Mills. He had six children. His oldest son, John⁵, b. May 29, 1731, had son Allen⁶, who was a Revolutionary soldier and left many descendants in Charlestown and vicinity. (For descendants of

Allen, see Appendix C.)

II. Philip⁴, b. about 1712; m. (1) Sept. 14, 1732, Theodosia Spencer, dau. Capt. Robert; m. (2) Feb. 23, 1783, Mrs. Mary (Reynolds) Sweet, wid. of Josiah. He was an influential man, and a Justice of the Peace in W. G. for many years. His will, made April 1, was proved Aug. 27, 1785, in W. G. He had eleven children, all by first wife. One of these, Eld. Elisha⁵ (b. July 14, 1740), had son Lodowick⁶, a pensioner of the Revolution, who settled later in Oneida Co., N. Y. (See Appendix D.) Eld. Elisha had also son Eld. Stafford⁶, who left many descendants in West Greenwich.

III. Mary, probably d. before 1752; not mentioned

in her father's will.

IV. Josiah⁴, b. about 1715; m. about 1738 Hannah Mowry, and lived in Charlestown. His widow d. in Westerly between April 22 and June 24, 1771, leaving ten children:

i. Hannah, b. about 1740; m. Daniel Bliven, prob. son of James and Ann (Rhodes), of Westerly, b.

there March 12, 1737, and lived in Westerly.

ii. Benjamin, b. about 1742; m. Jane Clark. (For

descendants, see Appendix E.)

iii. John, b. about 1744; m. (1) Abigail Moon, (2) Prudence Saunders. (For descendants, see Appen-

dix F.)

iv. Ruth, b. March 16, 1746, in Charlestown; m. March 17, 1766, to Samuel Bliven, Esq., of Westerly, son of James and Ann (Rhodes), b. there March 12, 1744. She d. Dec. 18, 1803.

v. Josiah, a resident of Charlestown in 1774, then

having one son and two daughters.

vi. Samuel, probably he who is given in the census of 1774 as res. in Westerly, then having two daughters.

vii. Anne; m. James Allen, and lived in Charlestown. They had these sons and perhaps other children: I. John, who m. Abigail Macumber, of Charlestown, and lived there. Their son Abram was father of Pres. Jonathan Allen, D.D., of Alfred University, N. Y. 2. Samuel; 3. Greene; 4. James.

viii. Mary; m. John Ash.

ix. Jonathan; probably removed to Stephentown, N. Y.

x. Elizabeth.

V. Amos⁴, b. Jan. 17, 1717; m. Amy Knowles. (For

descendants, see Appendix G.)

VI. Benjamin⁴, b. about 1719; m. (1) Mercy Rogers, (2) Anna Sweet. (For descendants, see Appendix H.)

VII. Caleb, not identified in the records.

VIII. Jonathan⁴, not identified, perhaps lived in West Greenwich.

1 IX. Joseph, b. about 1725; m. Margaret Greenman.

X. Elizabeth⁴; m. — Morey.

XI. Ruth, probably she who m. Jan. 17, 1750, as second wife, Increase Greene (John, James, John, of Warwick, R. I.), and lived in Coventry, R. I., and later in Berlin, Rens. Co., N. Y. She had at least four children, among them John, of Berlin, who m. Ruth Matteson, and had a large family.

XII. William⁴, b. about 1732; probably he who m.
(1) in Charlestown, Jan. 25, 1756, Judith Rathbone;
m. (2) about 1771 Sarah Cheesebro. (See Ap-

pendix I.)

XIII. Joshua⁴, probably he who lived in Charlestown. See census of R. I., June, 1774. (For his probable descendants, see Appendix K.)

1. JOSEPH GREENE (John, Benjamin, John), b. probably in East Greenwich, R. I., about 1725; m. in Westerly, R. I., Sept. 20, 1747, Margaret Greenman, dau. of Edward, Jr., and Sarah (Clarke), of Charles-

town, b. Oct. 17, 1725.

The births of their eight children are recorded in Westerly, and it is probable that they lived there for twenty years or more, removing to West Greenwich between 1768 and 1774. In the census of June, 1774, he is given as a resident of West Greenwich, where also lived his sons Charles, Luke, and John, and his son-in-law, Randall Spencer.

They were Seventh-day Baptists, as all their children and a large part of their numerous posterity

have been. This may have been due to the influence of his wife Margaret, who was reared in that faith, though some of his brothers and their children held to the same belief.

In 1779, or early in 1780, all his children with their families removed to Little Hoosick (Berlin), Rensselaer Co., N. Y., and settled there; and there is little doubt that he and his wife went with them and died there, though no record of their later years and death has been preserved. Children:

- 2. CHARLES GRÉENE (Joseph John Benjamin John), b. in Westerly, R. I., June 19, 1749; m. (1) in West Greenwich, R. I., Nov. 24, 1768, by George Dyre, Justice of the Peace, to Waite Bailey, dau. of Caleb and Mary (Godfrey), b. in East Greenwich March 9, 1751, and "d. in 1791 in her 40th yr."—she was the aunt of Eld. Eli S. Bailey; m. (2) Mrs.——Burdick, who d. in Brookfield, N. Y. He d. in Pinckney, Lewis Co., N. Y., at an advanced age.

He was a farmer and a soldier of the Revolution.

In the census of June, 1774, he was a resident of West Greenwich, then having one girl and two boys. During 1777 and 1778 he was a member of Col. John

Topham's regiment with his brothers, John and Edward, serving in Rhode Island. Soon after, probably in 1779, he removed to Little Hoosick (afterward Berlin, Rensselaer Co., N. Y.), and settled there. During the two following years he served as an officer in Capt. Samuel Shaw's company, of the 6th Albany Regt. (4th Rensselaerwyck Battalion), having been commissioned ensign Aug. 11, 1780, and lieutenant Aug. 15, 1781. His four brothers served in the same regiment and company.

Some years later, just when it is impossible to learn, he removed to Pinckney, Lewis Co., N. Y., and died

there.

Most of his children followed him, and that town and Adams, Jefferson Co., adjoining, have been the home of a large part of his descendants since. Children, all by his first wife, and the first five (or six) born in Rhode Island:

3. LUKE⁵ GREENE (Joseph⁴, John³, Benjamin², John¹), b. in Westerly, R. I., Sept. 18, 1751; d. in Berlin, Rensselaer Co., N. Y., in 1801; m. in West Greenwich, R. I., Dec. 25, 1773 (or 4), by Philip Greene, Justice of the Peace (his uncle), to Lois⁵ Greene, his first cousin, dau. of Benjamin and Mercy (Rogers), of West Greenwich; b. there about 1755; d. in Berlin, N. Y., April 15, 1832, æt. 76. [Lois⁵, Benjamin⁴,

John³, Benjamin², John¹.

He was a farmer and a soldier of the Revolutionary War. In the muster of Col. Christopher Lippitt's regiment in Sept., 1776, his name appears as Sergt. Luke Greene, of Capt. Gorton's company. They left Rhode Island that month to join Washington at Harlem Heights, soon after the battle of Long Island; were in the battle of White Plains in October; were with Washington in the battles of Trenton and Princeton, and went into winter quarters at Morristown. In the spring the regiment's term of enlistment expired, and they were sent home. He seems to have joined the army again at once, as tradition says that, in company with his brothers, he took part with the Rhode Island troops in the Saratoga campaign during the following autumn, and thereby gained a knowledge of that country.

Certainly, he and his brothers soon after removed their families and settled in Little Hoosick (afterward Berlin, Rensselaer Co., N. Y.), probably in 1779. There he served as sergeant during 1780 and 1781 with his brothers, Lieut. Charles, Sergt. John, and privates Edward and Perry, in the companies of Capt. Samuel Shaw and Capt. David Husted, of the 6th

Albany Regt. (4th Rensselaerwyck Battalion), commanded by Lieut.-Col. Henry K. Van Rensselaer.

He left a journal of his experiences during the

war, but this was accidentally destroyed.

The farm which he cleared lies just north of the village of Berlin, N. Y. The first two children were born in Rhode Island, the others in Berlin.

21 I. Joshua, b. July 7, 1775; m. (1) Sally Clark, (2)

Abigail Clark, (3) Hannah Chipman.

He was a farmer and a soldier of the Revolution. During 1777 and 1778 he served in Col. John Topham's regiment in Rhode Island with his brothers, Charles and Edward. Removing to Berlin, Rensselaer Co., N. Y., in 1779, he served during 1780 and 1781 as sergeant in the companies of Capt. Samuel Shaw and Capt. David Husted, of the 6th Albany Regt. (4th Rensselaerwyck Battalion), commanded by Lieut.-Col. Henry K. Van Rensselaer, in company with his four brothers. Tradition says that he also served in the Saratoga campaign in the summer and autumn of 1777.

He was a strong man in the community, being Justice of the Peace for some forty years, and also a member of the State Legislature. The Seventh-day Baptist Church of Berlin was organized Sept. 24, 1780, of which he was a constituent member, serving as its deacon until his death, a period of fifty-eight years.

His farm lay in the valley extending east from Berlin, and known as "Green Hollow" ever since, having been peopled almost exclusively by his de-

scendants for more than a century.

a babe.

He was a soldier of the Revolution, and probably was a member of Col. Christopher Lippitt's regiment with his brother-in-law, Sergt. Luke Green. In the attempted expedition against Rhode Island under Gen. Spencer, Lieut. Joseph James (who had been sergeant in Capt. Gorton's Company of Col. Christopher Lippitt's regiment) and "Ensign Randall Spencer" were ordered to join Capt. Gorton's Company. They served their tour of duty, but were refused payment, and petitioned the General Assembly in June, 1778, for such payment.

It is asserted also that he took part in the campaign of Saratoga and Bennington with his wife's brothers.

Soon after this he removed and settled in Berlin, Rensselaer Co., N. Y., where their lives were spent. During his later years he was known as "Col. Randall Spencer"; in the inscription on his tombstone he is styled "Lieut.-Col."

He lies buried in the cemetery some two miles south of Berlin, and his tombstone bears the follow-

ing couplet:

"Here I lie according to the decree, Shaded by the tree of liberty."

Soon after he removed with all his brothers and sisters to Berlin, Rensselaer Co., N. Y. There he served during 1780 and 1781 with his four brothers, in the company of Capt. Samuel Shaw, 6th Albany Regt., commanded by Lieut.-Col. Henry K. Van Rensselaer. How long he lived here is not known, but he removed to Brookfield, Madison Co., N. Y. (perhaps for a time to Adams, Jefferson Co.), and while there served as captain during the War of 1812, in which three of his sons, at least, took part.

About 1816 he accompanied his children to Alfred, Allegany Co., N. Y. (the oldest, Luke, had preceded them), and took up a farm in the eastern part of the

town. Here the rest of their lives was spent.

He was a man vigorous in mind and in body: he was the first judge of Madison County, and in his later years was known as "Judge Edward." A veteran of two wars, his autograph, written at the age of 84, is bold and firm. for the out from fine. "



I., son of Benjamin² and Humility (Coggeshall), and grandson of the immigrant settler John Greene, of Kingstown, or Ouidnesset, was born in Kingstown about 1692; married in Westerly March 19, 1714, Eleanor Randall, of the latter place, and removed thither, probably from East Greenwich, where his father then lived. His wife Eleanor was the daughter of Matthew and Eleanor Randall, and was baptized in Stonington, Conn., June 24, 1694. In June, 1780, a Baptist church was organized in Leyden, probably through his labors, and July 5 following he was ordained its pastor, serving until his death. In an old yard in a distant part of Leyden stands a slate-colored slab bearing the following inscription: "In memory of Eld. Joseph Green,

(Josiah⁴, John³). It is known that he kept a family record, but unless this can be found it seems impossible to get further information. It is probable that he was a Seventh-day Baptist, as he lived but a short distance from the church in Scott, N. Y., and his son Joel was an active minister in that denomination. He served in the Revolution, and in 1840 was a pensioner, then living in Spafford at the age of 79.

OTHER LINES OF GREENES

AND

DETACHED FAMILIES.

Bartholomew Green and wife, Elizabeth, came to America in 1630, and settled in Cambridge, Mass., with their three children, Samuel, Nathaniel, and Phebe. Samuel had a family of nineteen children. Some of his sons were printers, and many of their descendants have followed the same business in Boston, Hartford, and New London.

Percival Green and Ellen, his wife, came to this country in 1635, each at the age of 32, and settled in Cambridge, Mass., and their descendants have for the most part remained in that vicinity. Many have been graduates of Harvard Univ., some prominent in professional life, some merchants in Boston. A sketch of the descendants of Percival and Ellen was published in 1876 by Samuel A. Green, M.D., of Boston.

THOMAS GREEN(E), of Malden, Mass., was born in England about 1606; came probably from Leicestershire about 1636, and settled later in Malden. From him have sprung a large family, who have lived mainly in Eastern and Central Massachusetts, with branches in Killingly, Conn., and Hanover, N. J. Some of the more prominent names in this family are: Rev.

Thomas Green, of Leicester, Mass.; Rev. Ashbel Green, Pres. of Princeton College; his son, Prof. James S. Nathaniel Greene, of Revolutionary fame, was born Feb. 9, 1597; came from Salisbury, Wiltshire, England, to Salem, Mass., about 1635, to Providence 1638, and was one of the original purchasers of Warwick in 1642. He was a man of prominence, and his descendants are numbered by the thousand. They have filled many positions of honor and trust in the State. The original home was in Warwick and East Greenwich, but they are widely scattered. One branch settled in Berlin and Stephentown, N. Y.; of this branch the writer has nearly a complete record. The most prominent men of this line have been Gov. William Greene and his son, Gov. William Greene, Jr., Gen. Nathaniel Greene, Senator Ray Greene, Lieut. Gov. William Greene, Prof. George Washington Greene, of Brown University, and Gen. George Sears Greene, now living (1894) at Morristown, N. J., at the age of 93. Sketches of some branches of this family have appeared in various publications. A partial sketch, with especial reference to the public life of the Greenes of Warwick, by Henry E. Turner, M.D., was published at Newport in 1877. The life of Gen. Nathaniel Greene, by his grandson, Prof. George Washington Greene, contains much genealogical matter; but no comprehensive history or genealogy has been published. Gen. George

Sears Greene has been engaged for fifty years in collecting material for such a work, and it is the hope of

many that he may live to see it in print.

John Greene, of Newport, was nearly contemporaneous with the preceding. The home of the family was Newport and Middletown, R. I., but it is probable that some of this family settled in Kingstown and Westerly and mingled with the other Greenes, especially with the Greenes of Kingstown, whose record is given in this book. This has made the task of tracing them extremely difficult. No publication regarding the descendants of John, of Newport, has been issued so far as known.

ROBERT GREENE settled in Wales, Mass., in 1743. He married Sarah Rogers, sister to Ichabod and Dea. Joel Rogers, Oct. 11, 1744, and his nine children were born here and at Tolland, Conn. Two of his sons removed to Whitingham, Vt., and were the ancestors of the Greenes of that town; the others settled in Wales, Monson, and vicinity. One Thomas Greene, son of Thomas of Brimfield, came to Wales in 1737, and married Elizabeth Greene, of Stafford, Conn., March 29, 1744. He may have been a brother of Robert. It is probable that they came from one of the older lines of Greenes in Massachusetts or Rhode Island. A sketch of the descendants of Robert was published in 1885 by Reuben Greene, M.D., of Boston, greatgrandson of Robert.

John Green bought of Ann Rogers, widow of William, May 18, 1672, a tract of land in or near the present site of the village of Huntington, Long Island. In the following year he paid taxes. In 1684 his family consisted of wife, Elizabeth, and the following children: John, born 1675; Elizabeth, b. 1677; Thomas, b. 1679; William, b. 1682; Amy, b. 1684.

In 1699 he sells what seems to be his homestead, and disappears from the Huntington town records. In the same year (1699) John Green (probably, though not certainly, the same John) bought land on the south side of Long Island, "one half of Siser's Neck." The records of Islip go back to 1721, and in 1723 William Green appears as assessor and overseer of the poor. From that time the name of Green does not disappear from the books until we find the name of Willett Green in 1785. Willett owned one half of the neck of land where Sayville now stands, though it is doubtful whether this is the "Siser's Neck" mentioned above. His brothers were John, who owned land adjoining on the west, Obadiah, who moved up into Oueens County, and another, who settled in New York State at a place called "Nine Partners." The brother John had sons, John, Thomas, and William. Willett Green had two wives, who were sisters, named Willis, from Patchogue. His only son, Isaac, was born in Sayville, married Charity Newton, and had the following children: Caleb, Clark (who died in Brooklyn in 1891, aged 74), Willett, Henry, Samuel, Debby Ann, who married James M. Edwards, of Sayville, Sarah, Elizabeth, Anor, Joanna, and Rachel. The writer is indebted to David M. Edwards, of Sayville, for the foregoing sketch.

ROBERT GREEN, the ancestor of the following family, was an English commoner, so the family tradition says, and in a fit of anger in Parliament used profane language about the king, and had to flee for his life. In disguise he came to America, followed not long after by a bachelor brother of wealth and position. His wife was named Mary. *Isaac Green*, their son, born May 3, 1735, died Sept. 13, 1813; married in Stafford Co., Va., Oct. 31, 1756, Mary Paxson, dau. of

Reuben and Alice, b. Feb. 5, 1735; d. July 19, 1813. Isaac removed from Stafford Co. to Grayson Co., Va., the county-seat of which was called Greenville, possibly in honor of the family, and there kept a tavern, and was considered well off. A family of Greens in Kentucky claim the same ancestry as this family from Virginia, and say that the first settlers came to New England, but afterward some removed to Virginia. If so, they were probably from Rhode Island.

Richard married ——Davis, from a Virginia family, and reared a family of three sons and four daughters, the oldest, a daughter, born in 1800, and all living in 1800. Benjamin, the oldest son, is living at Newark, Ohio, and his brother, Jesse Stone Green, at Demorest, Habersham Co., Ga. The latter has two sons, Prof. Arthur L. Green, of Purdue University. Lafavette, Ind., and J. Howard Green, of Battle Creek, Mich. There are some clews that point to the possibility, if not probability, that this family came from Rhode Island stock. It is well known that there was quite an extensive migration from Rhode Island to the vicinity of Shrewsbury, N. J., about 1745-50, and thence a generation later to Virginia and Maryland, and this family may have been an offshoot from it.

William Green and his brother Thomas and sister Martha lived at Poolsville, Montgomery Co., Md., during the latter part of the last century. About the year 1800 William removed to North Carolina, where he married Chloe Roby, who bore him eight children, among them Thomas W. and William H., the latter the youngest and only survivor, now residing at Shelbyville, Ind. Gabriel Thomas Green, of the Children's Home, Cincinnati (whose mother was a Collins, from Va.), is son of another brother. From North Carolina William removed to Kentucky, and thence about 1810 to Indiana, where he died in 1826. This family may be a branch of the preceding.

Daniel Greene, a Revolutionary pensioner, was living in 1840 with his son Horace at Edmeston, Otsego Co., N. Y., at the age of 82; hence was born in 1758. Some of his descendants evidently removed to Walworth, Walworth Co., Wis. (or town of Lynn adjoining), in 1846, as appears from the following:

Rebecca Conant Greene, widow of Daniel (probably son of the preceding Daniel), died in Walworth, Wis., Aug. 11, 1882, aged 97 yrs., lacking 3 days. She had come from Otsego Co., N. Y., in 1846 with her son, and had buried ten children, being the last of her family. Daniel Horace Green, son of Daniel, Jr., and Rebecca, b. 1812, d. in Walworth June 14, 1873. He m. in 1835 Lois Johnson, b. in Otsego Co., N. Y., July 24, 1812; d. in Lynn, Walworth Co., Wis., Nov. 22, 1887. They had eight children, of whom four sons and two daughters were living in 1887. D. H. Green, who enlisted, æt. 23, as Asst. Surgeon 4th Wis. Vol., and Leland F. Green, who enlisted at 21 in Co. D. 95th Ill. Vol., and died in hospital, were probably sons of Daniel Horace. This family were members of the Walworth Seventh-day Baptist Church, and were undoubtedly a branch of the Greens of Kingstown.

Philarmon Green, b. about 1765, lived in Sand Lake, Rensselaer Co., N. Y., and served in the War of 1812. He removed about 1830 to Scio, Allegany Co., N. Y., and became a constituent member of the Scio Seventh-day Baptist Church. He died on the Genesee River, between Scio and Belmont. His wife, Lydia Davis, died in town of Amity, near Scio, Oct. 4, 1848, æt. 80. They probably belong to the Greens
