P R E F A C E .

The annexed tables of the Descendants of the Rev. Philip Henry, are founded upon a genealogical tree, drawn up originally, about fifty years ago, by Mr. Matthew Witton, one of the descendants of that excellent man, a copy of which was made, some years ago, by a Friend, for the Editor. Having availed herself of the several opportunities of communication with different branches of the family which have occurred during the long period that has elapsed since the original document came into her possession, to make such additions as were, from time to time, needful, she is induced to print a few copies for the benefit of such of the Descendants as may desire to possess one ; in the belief that a reverential regard for the memory of our forefathers, where it is founded on the intrinsic qualities of the mind and character, rather than on the adventitious circumstances of rank and situation—on what they have *been*, rather than on what they have *possessed*, can scarcely fail to exert a valuable moral influence on the minds of their Descendants. The Editor prefixes a summary of the life of the head of the family, which was drawn up by the same Gentleman (Mr. Witton) who originally made out the tree, and which was ingeniously arranged, so as to compose the trunk, whilst the names of the different children diverged off in the form of branches. As these, however, had become, in the lapse of so many years, too heavily laden with names, to admit of their retention in their original form, a different mode of arrangement has been adopted, and one which it is believed will prove more convenient for reference.

A few extracts from a letter of Philip Henry to his wife,

and from the leaves of a pocket almanac, for 1666, and one for 1670, in which he was accustomed to make notes, are inserted in the Appendix ; in these, the original spelling and abbreviations are retained.

The following works (from the first of which the summary here given is taken) may be consulted, as throwing additional light on the family history.

1st. Life of Philip Henry, by his son, Matthew Henry ; an enlarged edition of this has been published within the last few years, by Sir John Bickerton Williams.

2nd. The Life of Matthew Henry, by Mr. Tong, and one also by Sir J. B. Williams.

3rd. The Life of Mrs. Savage (P. Henry's eldest daughter), by Sir J. B. Williams, to which is added a Memoir of Mrs. Hulton, and one of Mrs. Radford, by the Rev. M. Henry.

The Editor has been anxious to render this little work as complete and correct as possible ; but fears that, in spite of all her care, some omissions and errors will be found ; for any such, she must entreat the reader's candid indulgence.

S U M M A R Y

OF THE

LIFE OF THE REV. PHILIP HENRY.

John Henry, Father to Philip, was the son to Henry Williams, of Brittons-Ferry, near Swansea; according to the custom then prevalent in Wales, to make the christian name of the Father the surname of the Son. John Henry was first Gentleman to the Earl of Pembroke, and afterwards Page to James II., when Duke of York. He married Mrs. Magdalen Rochdale, of St. Martin's-in-the-Fields, Westminster, a virtuous, pious gentlewoman, and one that feared God above many. She died March 6th, 1645, leaving behind, her son Philip, and five daughters. A little before her death, she had this saying, "My head is in Heaven, and my heart is in Heaven; it is but one step more, and *I* shall be there too."

Philip Henry was born at Whitehall, Westminster, 1631; named Philip, by Philip, Earl of Pembroke, who, with James, Earl of Carlisle, and the Countess of Salisbury, were his sponsors. He was chosen in 1647, from Westminster School, to Christ Church, Oxford. In 1651, B.A., in 1652, M.A. He preached his first sermon at Hincksey, in Oxfordshire, Jan. 1653. In this year, he removed to Worthenbury, a small town in the detached portion of Flintshire, about eight miles from Whitchurch, to be Chaplain to Judge Puleston,

whose Lady was eminent for wisdom, piety and learning, above most of her sex. In 1657, he was ordained by the nearest class of acting Presbytees in the north of Shropshire. In 1659, presented to the living of Worthenbury; in this year, Judge Puleston died, and Philip Henry's interest in that family died with him. April 26th, 1660, he married Katharine, only child of Daniel Matthews, Esq., of Broad-Oak, near Whitchurch, by whom he had a competent estate, which supported him when he was ejected in 1662, and enabled him to assist others, in which he sowed plentifully, saying, "it was more blessed to give than to receive." The maiden name of Mrs. Henry's mother was Sarah Benyon, originally ap Einion, as appears by a short table of her descent from that family, inserted at the end of the volume. On being ejected from Worthenbury in 1662, he removed to Broad Oak. From this time to 1666, he endured great persecution. In 1667 he removed to Whitchurch, and the following year, back again to Broad Oak. In 1674, he set up a week-day lecture there, which was continued about eighty years. In 1685 he, with Mr. Owen, held a public disputation with Lloyd, Bishop of St. Asaph, and Mr. Dodwell, at Oswestry. In 1685 he, with many others, was committed to Chester Castle, where he continued three weeks. Nevertheless, in May 1688, he was nominated a Justice of the Peace for Flintshire, but declined acting. On Lord's day, June 21st, 1696, he preached as usual. On Tuesday, the 23d, he was seized with a fit of the stone and cholic; and, after about sixteen hours' illness, he departed, June 24th, 1696. He took an affectionate leave of his wife, with a thousand thanks for all her care and tenderness; and, like dying Jacob, said to his son, "The Lord bless you, and grant that you may do worthily in your generation, and be more serviceable to the Church of God than I have been. His last words were, "Oh Death where is thy —?" the last word was lost in death. He was buried in Whitchurch Church, June 27th, where is a monument, erected by his

son-in-law, Dr. Tylston, of Chester, on which is inscribed an epitaph. His funeral sermon was preached by his friend Mr. Talents, of Shrewsbury. Katharine Henry, his wife, died in 1703. His usual compliment to his children, when settling, was, "I wish you all holiness, and then, there is no doubt that you will have all happiness."

Extract from a letter from the Rev. P. Henry to his Wife, written from London, Sep. 9, 1671.

“ I doe a little dread the thoughts of my Journey down, lest the wayes and weather should prove fowl ; but our times are all in the hands of our Heavenly Father, whom I desire to acknowledge in every thing ; you did well to resign your interest in mee, for I am yours by an uncertain tenure ; and the likeliest way to hold our comforts is to bee willing to part with them ; wee must not now hang by our Armour, but make ready for the next Tryal, as those that know not what a day may bring forth ; upon wednesday, I was at Islington at the buryal of Mr. Burgess, whom I mention'd in my last, where were present above a hundred non-conformist Ministers, who accompany'd him with sorrow to his grave ; many, very many old Stakes have been lately pluckt out of ye hedge, & small appearance of new ones coming in their stead, which threatens the laying of our vineyard wast ; And yet mee thought it was some comfort, to see, for one dead, a hundred living. I met with several of my old acquaintance there, whom I had not met with before, & whom I know not when I shall meet with again, whether ever or no, till the great meeting, when wee shall bee gather'd together to our Master. I need not mind you of blessing God, with mee, for his mercy to mee, nor of continuing your prayers for mee, because I know you love, love, love mee ; And though I am sensible of it, as my sin & trouble, that I am so undeserving of the love both of God & Man, yet, if love deserve love, however let mee challenge yours, who am truly

your loving, loving, loving Husband,

Cousin Benyon's company down, I am not likely to have, because whenever he comes, he comes by coach, but I believe hee will not bee long after mee. I have not been at Westminster yet, nor at Chelsey; visits there, with some few farewells to some here, is all of that kind I have to doe, & then, God willing, homewards. My blessing to the Children, with love to Family & Friends! I have a letter for Mr. Sadler, from his Mother, which shee sent hither yesterday; if you see him, give my love to him & tell him shee is well; Bess Groom was here this evening; shee lives with Serjt. Parker, at Camberwell, near Southwark, but wants health & a better place; shee remembers her service to Cosin Margaret Hotchkis and to all the Family. It hath rayn'd so here, that I have not been forth of doors but once cross ye street, all this day, else, I had designed several visits. I hope for a letter from you on Monday next, & after that, no more at this time, though p'haps I may write again to you on Tuesday, & p'haps on Thursday night, for I love, love, love it.

Extract of notes by Philip Henry, from an interleaved Almanac for 1666.

June. A terrible Sea fight between us & the Dutch, wherein according to the first report, wee had the better, which caused great joy, but it proved afterwards wee had the worst, many ships & men lost, which caused great sadness. Fears of sudden invasion followed, whereupon the Countreyes were armed, but it pleased God to scatter the cloud for present: Lord bee Englands' God & Guide, Sun & Shield, Amen.

Aug. 4. I was summon'd by warrant to Hanmer, to subscribe to the loan for the urgent occasions of the Dutch war; I appear'd & pleaded I had it not, neither have I, & therefore desired to bee excused; I was told my denial proceeded from disaffection, but it doth not. Some little I would have lent, but less than £20. would not bee accepted. My Father Matthews refused to lend also, which gave Sir T. H. (Thomas

Hammer ?) occasion to say, " Wee know where money is, & if the King have need of it, hee must & shall have it"

Relative to the great fire in London, P. Henry makes the following remarks. Sept. 2nd. A lamentable fire began in London, in a Bakers' house in Pudding lane, behind the King's head Tavern, in now Fish Street, which continued burning till Thursday following, laying waste that famous & beautiful City, except a very small remnant of it, in its own rubbish. The use I would desire to make of this sad providence is as followeth.

1st, to get my heart deeply affected with it, & with sin, the cause of it; the Nation's sin, the sin of London, my own sin.

2nd, to weep with them that weep, & to mourn with them that mourn, as being myself also in the body. How many thousand familys that have not where to lay their head!

3rd, to see herein, as in a glass, what a pittiable portion is a portion in this world, & how far it must needs be from making a man happy, seeing, in one moment, it makes to itself wings & flies away.

4th, to bless God for his wakeful eye of Providence over my house & goods continually, from morning to evening, & from evening to morning again.

5th, what a terrible day will it bee, when all the world shall bee on fire, & the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also, & all the works that are therein shall bee burnt up.

6th, was there not mercy in it to poor silenced Ministers, that they were banish'd out of the City before the sweeping Judgement, came upon it; & is not the case somewhat like that of Lot fetcht out of Sodom?

7th, may it not bee a further voice to our Governors, like that to Pharoah, saying " let my people go, that they may serve mee, & if ye will not behold, thus & thus will I doe unto you?"

8th, is there not something to bee observ'd in the circumstances of time, that it began on the Sabbath day, as if the Lords' controversy with London more particularly, for prophaning that holy day.

Extracts from an interleaved Almanac for the year 1670.

Sept. 2, 1670. William Penn & William Mead were arraigned in the Old Baily for a Riot Aug. 14th, caused by William Penn's preaching in Gracious (Gracechurch) Street, to 3 or 400 p'sons; they pleaded not guilty in manner and form: two or three witnesses deposed they were present, & saw William Penn speaking, but what hee say'd they knew not; whercupon the Jury found William Penn guilty of speaking in Gracious Street; which verdict not satisfying the Court, they were kept without meat, drink, fire or Tobacco from Friday to Munday, & after appearing 5 times & standing still to the same verdict & no other, they were fin'd 40 marks a piece & to lye in prison till pay'd. Also Penn & Mead fin'd 40 marks a piece for not putting off their hats in the court. As they came in, their hats were pull'd off, & by command, put on again.

Present Thomas Howel recorder, Sir Sam. Starling, Mayor, Sir John Robinson, Sir Thomas Bludworth, &c. Recorder Howel say'd, "well, now I see cause to admire the Wisdom of ye Spanish Inquisition, & 'twill never bee well in England, till some such thing bee 'stablished here." Hee say'd "also, the next Session there will be an Act of Parliament that none shall have the benefit of the law that will not conform."

A narrative of their tryal was printed, with some Votes of ye House of Commons, 1667, whereby 'twas judg'd illegal in Judge Keeling to fine & imprison Jurys, & hee try'd for doing it. Eight of ye Jury pay'd their fine, the other four were imprisoned & had a hearing in Westminster hall this Mich: term.

Magna Charta grants that no man shall be amerc'd but accord: to the offence, nor imprison'd but by ye Judgment of his peers.

The following Extract, shews the feeling that prevailed at the time, respecting usury.

1st. July. Whereas £100. of my children's money left

by their Grandfather is in uncle Holchkis's hands, by bond, bearing date 1667 for ye first year I took no interest, for ye 2d, £5, & now for ye 3rd, other £5; it is some trouble to mee, not knowing what to doe. On ye one hand, hee is my friend & relation near mee. On the other hand 'tis my children's money, who are nearer, & what account the world & they will expect from me hereafter I know not. The thing itself, with certayn cautions, which I shall endeavour to observe, I judge lawful, but for me, as a Minister, p'haps inexpedient; & on that account, were it my own, I should refrayn; but being theirs & so great a sum, & so long in his hand, & he able & gaining by it in trade, upon advice from such as are judicious and godly, so much I have received, wayting for further light & convictions about it from the Lord, in the use of means, according to which, I shall either continue to receive it, or else make restitution of what I have received already.

At the end of the little vol. is the following memorandum.

“From ye 1st of January, ye year 1670, I purpose to bestow 12d. out of every pound Rent which I receive, in charitable uses, having respect especially to my poor suffering brethren in the Ministry, & to the poor of Bronington, Willington, & Iscoyd”—then follows a list of rents received, & beside them, one of money set by, the former amounting to £117—the latter to £5. 17s.

“May 10th. This day commences ye new Act of restraynt, made the last Session; but 4 to meet besides the family; if more, the preacher £20. ye house £20.; each one present above 16 y. old 5s. for ye first offence; for ye 2nd, all double. One justice to execute by distress; penaltyes on him & Constable, if they doe not. No appeal. Every thing to bee construed agt. ye Offender. Such wisdom in ye contrivance yt some can but admire, but hee that sits in heaven laughs, & even this also shall bee for good.

I hear since, this day was kept by many in London as a day of fasting & prayer. Lord, hear in Heaven & have mercy!

22nd, Mr. Lawrence in trouble at Whitchurch, for a meeting this day at Ralph Eddowes,' upon pretence yt Sarah Eddowes lately com'n from Chester, was none of her Father's family.

27th, Convicted at Prees, & fin'd by Justice Sandford & Justice Hill. 31st, distress made upon their Goods, Ralph Eddowes £20. 5s. Mr. Lawrence, £10. John Bird & Thomas Kettle, £5. apiece, Elizabeth Yardley 5s. by Constables & Church-wardens.

The Town & Country full of noyse about it, also many elsewhere in trouble on ye like occasion. Lord, preserve thy people in ye way of peace & holiness, & lay not this Sin to the Enemys' charge."
