INTRODUCTION

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Early in the 1900s, Mrs. Natalie R. Fernald of Washington, D. C., ran The Genealogical Exchange in which she exchanged data on many families. She published in this magazine some Skinner material. Later, she, with others of Skinner heritage, set up The Skinner Kinsmen - she was treasurer and publisher - for "dues" of \$1.00 per year and the paying of .50 each, members received 8 page signatures as published. These are known as the Skinner Kinsmen Group and include Descendants of Richard of N. C., Robert Skinner of Maryland, Thomas of Maryland, John of Pa., and the Probable Descendants of Richard Skinner of N. J. In addition she compiled Descendants of Thomas of Malden, Mass., and of John of Hartford, Conn.

After Mrs. Fernald's death, a few years ago, Mrs. Wahl acquired her unpublished data - as well as copies of all her published work - and began to take up where Mrs. Fernald left off, adding information from her files, from books published after her decease, from correspondence with Skinner descendants, etc.

As a result of correspondence with Mrs. Rummel, Mrs. Wahl and Mrs. Rummel agreed to divide up the Skinners into the Northern and Southern Branches - Mrs. Wahl taking the Northern since that was where her connection lay - Mrs. Rummel taking the Southern for the same reason.

Their intent is to compile and publish (either printed or mimeographed) all Skinner material that can be found, in a series of booklets, under the Skinner Kinsmen heading. These booklets to be given to Genealogical Libraries and Societies. Mrs. Wahl is doing the indexing - Mrs. Rummel the mimeographing - each cutting the stencils for her own branch - both sharing the expenses of paper, stencils, postage etc.

It is hoped that additions and corrections will be sent in - and, principally, that researchers will be helped and guided by these compilations.

Note: The above I. Richard Skinner may or may not be the father of II. Richard of North Carolina, however, the indications are strong that he is. In the History of Perquimans County (N. C.), Winslow says: "Most of these notes were found in Isle of Wight Co., Va., from which in my opinion, Richard Skinner emigrated to North Carolina."

## Contemporary Records:

Listed among passengers which passed from ye port of London, Oct. 13, 1635, aboard "Amitie", George Downes, Master, bound to St. Christophers, was Richard Skinner, age 20. (Hotten: The Original Lists of Persons of Quality)

From History of Perquimans County by Winslow:

A Richard Skinner appears in York Co., Va. at an early date as "servant of Capt. Thorpe", but there is nothing to prove that he was the same in Isle of Wight, although he may have been.

Mary Skinner of "Runnison", Isle of Wight Co., Widow: sold to George Crips of Blackwater, for 6000 lbs. of tobacco, a "Divident of land" on said River - 5000 acres. She was married to John Collins of Upper Parish of Isle of Wight Co., before Sept. 7, 1680.

Other early Skinners in Isle of Wight Co., Va.:

WILLIAM SKINNER of Bristol, Eng., Merchant, appears as "Att' for Mary Markes of Barbados, Widow" in 1668.

1773, Dec. 17. Your committee having taken into consideration the boundary line of Chowan and Perquimans Countys as referred by the house do report, That it appears to your Committee by the affidavit of William Ashley that he has been acquainted with the reputed dividing Line of the Counties of Chowan and Perquimons for fifty years past; that it always has been deemed and taken to run from the mouth of Yeopim River to a Water Grist Mill formerly the property of Jas Eger-ton, thence through a large body of pecoson land to a plantation of William Jackson and the place called the Horse pasture; that the said Ashley and all the Inhabitants to the line aforesaid for fifty years past to the best of his knowledge have done public duties and paid their taxes to the Sheriffs of Chowan County. That it also appears to your Committee by two certain patents granted to Richard Skinner in the year 1718, by Lord Carteret Palatine, that the Lands mentioned therein are declared to be situated in Perquimons County adjoining Bear Swamp, the one of which begins at a pine in a meadow at William Wordley's corner tree (v. 9, pp. 766-7).

1709. Nov. Treasurers report, rec'd from Richard Skinner L409-17s-7d (v. 21, p. 1064).

1724, Mar. 31 ... Ordered that Charles Denman Richard Ratcliff Richard Skinner & Jonathan Phelps who were appointed appraisors of the said Estate (of George Sutton dec'd) or any three of them do make division of the same acoording to the prayer of the petor as the law directs (v. 2, p. 550).

1725, Oct. 31. Richard Skinner being cited to answer the Complaint of Mary Skinner, widow, appeared and by the agreement of both parties the whole matter now in dispute is referred to Col. Thomas Harvey and Henry Clayton Esq (v. 2, p. 574).

To the Kings Most Excellent Majesty The Humble address of the Grand Jury for the whole Province of North Carolina now met at Edenton, April the first 1731. Signed: John Lovich, foreman, Henry Bonner, William Morton, Thomas Kearny, Henry Huston, Will Gray, Edw Gale, Thos Lovick, Wm Harding Jones, Chas. Denman, Richd Skinner etc. (v. 3, p. 134).

A journal of the Proceedings of the General Assembly of North Carolina began and held at Edenton on Tuesday, the 13th Day of April, 1731. Members returned, Perquimans, Mr Mackrora Scarborough, Mr Saml Swann, Mr. Richd Skinner etc. (v. 3, p. 285).

RESOLUTION NO. 5: THAT THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AUTHORIZES THE OFFICERS OF THE COMPANY TO MAKE SUCH BORROWINGS AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE POLICIES AND OBJECTS OF THE COMPANY.

RESOLUTION NO. 6: THAT THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AUTHORIZES THE OFFICERS OF THE COMPANY TO MAKE SUCH PAYMENTS AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE POLICIES AND OBJECTS OF THE COMPANY.

RESOLUTION NO. 7: THAT THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AUTHORIZES THE OFFICERS OF THE COMPANY TO MAKE SUCH DISTRIBUTIONS AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE POLICIES AND OBJECTS OF THE COMPANY.

RESOLUTION NO. 8: THAT THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AUTHORIZES THE OFFICERS OF THE COMPANY TO MAKE SUCH OTHER ACTIONS AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE POLICIES AND OBJECTS OF THE COMPANY.

RESOLUTION NO. 9: THAT THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AUTHORIZES THE OFFICERS OF THE COMPANY TO MAKE SUCH OTHER ACTIONS AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE POLICIES AND OBJECTS OF THE COMPANY.

## WILL OF RICHARD SKINNER

In the name of God Amen, this 18th day of May, in the year of our Lord 1752. I, Richard Skinner of the county of Perquimans and Province of North Carolina, being Sick in boddy but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be to Almighty God. Therefore, Calling unto mind the Mortality of my boddy and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, doe make and ordain this my last will and Testament. That is to any principally and first of all, I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it and my boddy I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Decent and Christian manner at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named. Nothing doubting but at the Generall Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the power of Almighty God my Redeemer. And as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give, Devise and Dispose of the Same in the following manner and form:

In Primis I will and desire that as Soon as my Death all my Just Debts, that in Right or Conceine I owe to every person or persons, be dischargd and payd with Justice. Item, I give and Bequeath to my dearly belov'd wife SARAH SKINNER, the plantation whereon I now live, with the liberty of Timber, for the plantation's use but none to be Sold nor carried Away During her widowhood, as farr back as the main Road. And in case she Marrys my will is that she have the one half of said plantation, with the dwelling house, milk house, Smoke house and Kitchen During her Natural life. Item, I give and Bequeath to my belov'd Son, SAML. SKINNER, the plantation whereon he now lives with the lands belonging thereto, to be Enjoyed by him and his heirs for Ever. Item, I give and bequeath to my belov'd Son, EAVENS SKINNER, the plant'n whereon John Simpson now lives, Lying in Chowan County, with Two Hundred ninety acres of land, to be Enjoyed by him and his heirs for Ever.

Item, I give and Bequeath to my Belov'd Son, JOSHUA SKINNER, my plantation Lying on the Sound Side, formerly call'd Fendell's Contain- ing One Hundred and fifty Acres of Land, whereon he now lives, Beginning at the Sound Side and Running to the back head line, being the one half of the land I purchased of Christian Reed to be Enjoyed by him and the heirs of his Boddy Lawfully Begotten and in Default of such heirs to my belov'd Son, JOHN SKINNER, and the heirs of his boddy Lawfully Begotten. WILLIAM SKINNER - Both in peace and war the Skinner family of Eastern North Carolina has borne an honorable record. At the time of the Revolution it's most noted member was Brigadier General William Skinner of the County of Perquimans, one of the most active patriots in the Albemarle section.

He was the son of Richard Skinner who died in 1752. To avoid confusion we may here mention that there were at least two members of this family living in Colonial times who bore the name Richard Skinner. One of these died in 1746.

William Skinner was elected one of the Commissioners or Directors, Town of Hertford; also served in the Assembly during the Colonial period. He was a Member of the Provincial Congress -1774, 1775, 1776; elected Lt. Col. of North Carolina Militia for Perquimans, Sept. 9, 1775. On Dec. 20, 1777, Col. Skinner was elected Brig. Adj. General of N. C. Militia, District of Edenton.

William Skinner is buried in Perquimans Co. on a farm about 4 or 5 miles from Hertford, N. C.

EXPERIMENT 1: PREPARATION OF CHLORINE

1.1. Objectives: To prepare chlorine gas from potassium chlorate and hydrochloric acid.

1.2. Theory: Potassium chlorate is a strong oxidizing agent. It reacts with hydrochloric acid to produce chlorine gas, potassium chloride, and water.

1.3. Procedure: Weigh 10.0 g of potassium chlorate into a 250 mL Erlenmeyer flask. Add 50 mL of 12 M hydrochloric acid.

1.4. Observations: A yellow-green gas is evolved, which is chlorine. The gas is collected by downward displacement of water.

1.5. Calculations: The theoretical yield of chlorine gas is 11.2 g. The actual yield is 10.5 g.

1.6. Discussion: The reaction is exothermic. The gas is toxic and should be handled with care.

1.7. Questions: Why is the reaction exothermic? How is chlorine gas collected?

1.8. Answers: The reaction is exothermic because the products are more stable than the reactants. Chlorine gas is collected by downward displacement of water.

1.9. Summary: Chlorine gas was prepared from potassium chlorate and hydrochloric acid. The yield was 10.5 g.

1.11. Appendix: The following table shows the properties of chlorine gas.
