This brief outline came about as the result of trying to acquaint my own children with their many relatives and just how they were all related. In talking to several people in the family, I found that they also wanted such information since we have all scattered far and wide during the past few years.

Letters were sent to relatives out of Memphis, and most people have responded. The aim was to secure both vital statistics and personal information that would tell the rest of the family what each was doing, where he lived, what his interests were, etc. It is not so complete as I had intended, but so much time has elapsed since inception of the project that I decided to send it out "as is" and add more later. My thanks to all who have helped. Any corrections or additions will be most welcome.

This booklet is an effort to set down in one place a record that might serve as the basis for more detailed genealogies if anyone should be interested in developing one for his particular branch of the family. What started out to be a mere recording of statistics has turned out to be the stimulus for starting me on the road to really searching out all the information on my ancestors that I could find. It is a fascinating adventure in detective work. Although finding out what sort of people my ancestors were, as well as when and where they lived, is interesting in itself, the piecing together of clues, rumor, and tradition into a complete picture is highly rewarding and intriguing. Another satisfaction is the correspondence developed with others who are working on the same lines. I have found several cousins who I never knew existed.

Even though this particular record may not be of much interest or value to anyone else but me, it has started me on a most exciting hobby, which I consider makes it worth while.

## INTRODUCTION

Before setting forth the descendants of Stephen Horton Herbert and his wife, Mary Duncan McRae, let's take a look at their respective family backgrounds.

Stephen Horton Herbert was one of 10 or 11 children born to John Sharpe Herbert and Charlotte Susan McGee.

John Sharpe Herbert was born 19 February 1824 at Greenville, Ala., died 12 February 1890 in Acona, Holmes County, Miss., where he is buried in the cemetery behind the Acona Methodist Church. It is said that his father, Thomas Sharpe Herbert, died when John was a boy and that his mother, the former Winnifred Ruth Lane, married again. John resented his stepfather and ran away from home to Mississippi when only 14 years old. After marriage, he moved to Marshall, Texas, for several years. There he collected a large herd of cattle and came back to Mississippi and established a tannery near Acona. During the Civil War, he and his brothers served in the Confederate Army, but John was later sent home to operate the tannery to supply the army with leather for boots, etc.

Charlotte Susan McGee (called Susan) was born 9 December 1829 near Milledgeville, Ga., died 22 September 1902 in Acona, Miss., and is buried there beside her husband. She was the daughter of Joseph McGee and his second wife, Susan W. Bonner (died 1849 in Holmes County, Miss., age 58). Joseph McGee was born 1786 in Maryland, moved from Maryland to Noxubee County, Miss., in 1834 and then to Holmes County in 1843, where he died in 1855. Susan Bonner was the daughter of Joseph Bonner, Revolutionary War soldier (DAR No. 332606) who moved from Warren County, Ga., to Jones County, Ga., in 1808 and died there in 1825. Susan's mother, Susannah, died in Jones County, Ga., in 1823.

Mary Duncan McRae was the daughter of John Wright McRae and Emeline Diggs.

John Wright McRae was born 13 August 1811 in Anson County, N. C., died 10 May 1900 at Acona, Miss. He was the son of Daniel L. McRae, presumably of Anson County, and Martha Ann (Patsy) Wright, daughter of John Wright, Jr., of Anson County, N. C.

He married Emeline Diggs about 1843. It is said that they were cousins but the exact relationship is not known yet. They were married when she was 15 years old. No record of their marriage has been found, but it is thought that the marriage took place in Marshall County, Miss., where the Diggs family was living at the time. After their marriage and after the death of her parents, the couple was living in Black Hawk, Carroll County, Miss. The writer has a letter in the handwriting of John Wright McRae and copies of several deeds in his name. Nothing about the McRae ancestry has been learned other than that set forth herein.

Emeline Diggs was born 7 February 1828, presumably near Paris, Henry County, Tenn., and died 21 April 1909 at Acona, Miss. She and her husband are buried in the cemetery behind the Acona Methodist Church. She was the daughter of Harris Diggs (born 1800 in North Carolina, married 1824 in Tennessee, died 1842 or 1843 in Holly Springs, Miss.) and Mary McRae (died Holly Springs between 1843 and 1850). It is not known where Harris and Mary were married. Harris came with his father, Pleasant Diggs, and three brothers (John H., Benjamin H., and Pleasant) from Anson County, N. C., to Paris, Tenn., in 1820 or 1821. Harris and Pleasant, Jr., moved to Marshall County, Miss., in 1836, but John and Ben stayed in Paris, where their descendants still live. They were descendants of William Diggs (Revolutionary War soldier) and Judith Haley, Quakers, who moved from Virginia to North Carolina in 1768.

Now let's find out about our subjects, Stephen Horton Herbert and Mary Duncan McRae.



Introduction - contd.

Stephen Horton Herbert was born 23 December 1857 near Acona, Holmes County, Miss. He was named for Dr. Horton, who delivered him. He attended school in Acona and clerked in a store there until his marriage 27 November 1882 to Mary Duncan McRae in the Acona Methodist Church.

After marriage, Mr. Herbert farmed mostly but also did various other jobs. He traveled in sales work for awhile. About 1897, he was elected Justice of the Peace. In 1900, he moved to Lexington, Holmes County, Miss., and went to work in the office of the Chancery Clerk. He was Deputy Chancery Clerk for about 8 years and Deputy Circuit Clerk for about 4 years. In Lexington, he and his wife were the proprietors of a hotel called the Herbert House. He supervised two plantations for R & B Sondheimer Company of Lexington. When the court house in Lexington burned, he and his cousin, Mattie Elmore, copied all the badly scorched records.

Mr. and Mrs. Herbert gave up the hotel in 1916 because he had a heart condition and could not do much work. During the next years, they divided their time among their children.

During World War I, Mr. Herbert worked at A & M College (now Mississippi State University), Starkville, Miss., in some kind of service work. At one time, he was in charge of the program in Mississippi to educate farmers in the methods of cattle dipping to eradicate ticks in the state.

Mr. Herbert was a talented musician although he had no formal training. He directed the choir of the Acona Methodist Church and that of the Methodist Church in Lexington until his death.

Mr. Herbert died 18 November 1928 in Lexington and is buried in the cemetery there.

Mary Duncan McRae was born 17 June 1859 near Coila, just north of Black Hawk, Carroll County, Miss. She attended a girls' boarding school in Winona, Miss., and moved with her family to Acona before she was married. She died 2 November 1947 in Memphis but is buried beside her husband in the Lexington cemetery.
