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
# **Speccy Tour 2000**

I had my doubts when I started the Speccy Tour 2000 whether it would become a success or not. But with a total of 30 people who registered to take part in the tour, out of which 14 submitted scores, and then out of those 14 players, 12 players qualified for the final leaderboard as they submitted a score to all 10 games. I think that's quite successfull if you consider how little the Speccy community is.

I know there are things to be changed for the next tour. One of the biggest mistakes I made in ST2000 was that I made it too difficult for people not taking part in the Tour to follow it. I realised that when there were just a few months left of the Tour. In the ST2001 I'll tell people about all the scores made during a week, by putting them online at the DID website along with the weekly updates.

I've also realised that the scoring system must be changed, but more about that in the 'Next year's Tour' column on page 6.

But besides that I think that the ST2000 was great. I really enjoyed it, even thought I must admit I wish I was some kind of programming genius so that I could make a program to do all the calculating for me, so that the leaderboard set it up by itself. You don't hear me complain, but try and imagine if 100 players were taking part:-)



I did in my own way try to take part in the Tour myself by playing the games and then writing down my scores to compare them to the player's scores. But I quit that idea quite fast. I don't know if it was because I was too busy with the Tour, my Fanzine and my Website, or if it was because I realised

that I couldn't compete with the players in the tour. Probably the last

one. I think you'll agree that all the top scores are great.

There are probably some people out there saying that the Tour is rubbish because the players can cheat. But I'm 100 percent sure no one cheated. But still, I would really love to see a Spectrum emulator capable of recording games so that it is impossible to cheat. Until then I'll put my trust in people not to cheat. I can't see any point in cheating in something like the ST, as there isn't any prize to be won, and where's the fun if you don't use the Tour to improve your playing abilities.

Well, it was a huge pleasure to run the Tour, the only downer was that I couldn't take part myself. But as I've said earlier, I probably wouldn't have had a chance of winning.

My future plan is that I also want to run some kind of Knockout tournament, but that won't be before 2002 I think. Bitz, the winner of the tour also gave me a good idea for another challenge that doesn't take too long to set up and run. I might do that one as well. So you see, there are a lot of things to look forward to if you enjoy playing Speccy games.

On the next pages you'll find the Final Leaderboard where you can see how many points each players got in the end. Then there's my idea about the ST2001, as I believe we need some changes. A presentation of the 10 games that we played in ST2000, together with the top 5 highscore table to each of them. Then after that a presentation of the top 10 players, where 9 of them were kind enough to answer some questions I gave them. Go, take a look. All the facts and other interesting stuff in the following pages.

Let me end by thanking everyone who took part in the ST2000. Not only for taking part, but also because you've all helped me a lot during the six months. I'm sure if we co-operate in the ST2001 we can make it just as much fun, and who knows, maybe one day there'll be 30 active players taking part. # Final Leaderboard

Below you'll find the final Leaderboard, which includes all 12 players who submitted a score to all 10 games and thereby qualified to be on it. Take a closer look at the 2 players at the bottom, Mike Beal and Alan Maxwell. The exact same number of points and therefore it was decided that Mike would end up number 11 because his best position in a games highscore table was a ninth place, while Alan's best position was a tenth place. Bad luck.

Out of the 12 players, only 4 had the glory to be in the lead over the 6 months. Derek Jolly took the lead after the first week, before Tomaz Cedilnik stayed on top for 15 weeks. Then Tomaz went on a holiday in England and Arlansky took the leading position for 2 weeks, before Tomaz returned and stayed on top for another 8 weeks before Bitz took the top spot in the very last week.

# Next year's Tour

Well, I plan changes for the ST2001. First of all it will be the players who'll decide which games to take part in the tour by voting. I'll choose a bunch of games and put them into 8 categories. We'll then use the Forum on DID the Website and discuss if there are any of the games that will cause problems like Pippo, so that we can eliminate those games before the final voting. The winner of each category plus the two best second placed games will then take part in the ST2001.

I've also decided to cut down the Tour from 6 to 4 months. I don't know yet, when the ST2001 will start as I have to see how well the discussion and the voting process goes.

I also have plans to change the scoring system. Let me say right away that there's no doubt that Bitz deserved his win, but it was a bit tragic to see Tomaz Cedilnik slip to second place in the last week after staying top in 23 out of 27 weeks. Tomaz was once again on holiday in England and didn't get back before the Tour was over, so he couldn't defend his top position. However, it might have been that he wasn't capable of beating those great scores coming in from Bitz and would have ended up second anyway. But still, I feel I need to change the scoring process. So, I sat back and gave it a thought and I came up with this idea. We'll continue the percentage system which we used in ST2000, but after each week we then award the top 10 players on the leaderboard with 10,9,8,7,6,5,4,3,2 and 1 point(s). Then out of those given points the Final Leaderboard is made. This means that if we had used that system in ST2000, Tomaz would have scored 266 points and would have been a superior winner. The main reason why I want to make this change is that this forced the players to be active all the way through the Tour, which is one of the reasons why I want to cut down the tour to 4 months. Another good thing about this method is that it forces players to send me their scores right away, and not keep them, and send them to me when they are a few weeks or months old. What do you think?

#### 3D Tanx - DK'Tronics

A game that seemed to cause trouble to a lot of players. I think it might have something to do with the slowness of the game. That's probably also why some of the players choose to name it as the worst game in the Tour. I have to admit that I don't like the game either, but I think it was the best choice I could make from 1982 without having to select an arcade clone game like Pacman, Invader, Galaxians and so on. Let's face it, there wasn't much else back then.
