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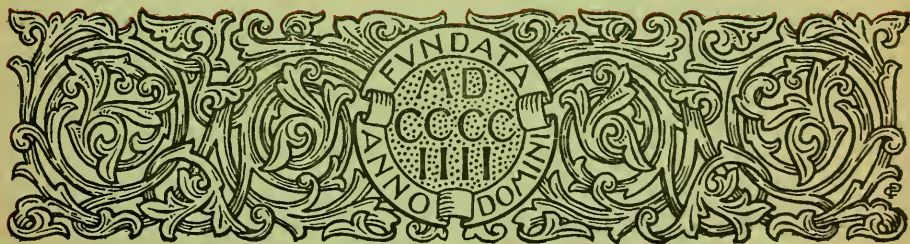

This list of corrigenda is a long one for so small an instalment as Part I. Yet it is quite possible, even probable, that it may hereafter be augmented before the printing of the whole of the two general rolls has been completed.

The Latin title, "*Societas Cantuareboracensis*", which was suggested and adopted on the cover of Part I as being of a distinctive character, and suitable for an association dealing mainly with medieval Latin records, has been replaced by the English name of the Society. Some have suggested that the word might suggest the title of some remote bishopric in the recesses of Asia Minor. Much valuable criticism has been received from members of the Society, and it is needless to say that such, whether consisting of suggestions or emendations, will continue welcome to the Editors.

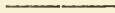

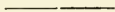

A long notice of Part I, of an appreciative character, appeared in *The Athenæum* of 1 July 1905. Some criticisms and suggestions made by the reviewer may be dealt with. First, as to the complaint that the names of Editor and Transcriber are not given. To place names upon the outside wrapper of an instalment of a work such as this might appear to savour of personal advertisement. Such information will be better given when the time comes to issue the title page and preface. It is obviously right that members should know who is responsible for all work done. The reviewer, after pointing out how difficult it is to identify such place-names as "Sutton" or "Weston", says that it was "sheer laziness" to leave unidentified "Weston", mentioned on p. 2. It is a curious expression for a reviewer to use, but the corrigenda show that the place may be identified with Edith Weston, Rutland. The reviewer raises a question as to the expediency of issuing the publications of the Society in quarterly parts, and suggests that it would be better to put out a bound volume of fairly respectable dimensions. With a Society like this, appealing to a very extensive area, it is needful to interest a wide circle of readers, and, moreover, also to issue the publications at as short an interval as possible, and therefore this method, which has proved advantageous in the case of the British Record Society, has been adopted for the Canterbury and York Society. The reviewer also pleads for a reconsideration of the proposal to print some of the Reformation Registers, and would prefer that the Society should at first deal only with those of the earlier periods. For the sake of the members whose interests vary, both in chronology and locality, it has been thought best to decide upon an equally varied treatment of the issues of the publications. It may interest the Reviewer to know that one member has pleaded for the issue of some of the eighteenth century Registers as being "likely to prove more generally useful than the earlier ones". Attention is also called to the omission of any mention of some of the work of the Surtees Society in this direction. That association issued, in 1872, the Register of Archbishop Gray of York, 1215-55, as their volume lvi, and last year the Register of Archbishop Gifford, 1266-79, as volume cix. This last was edited by Mr. William Brown and the former by the late Canon Raine.

Members may be glad to have for reference a short account of the *Liber Antiquus* of Bishop Hugh.

The *Liber Antiquus* of Bishop Hugh is a small square volume of thirty-three parchment leaves, and according to Canon Perry was mostly written in 1218. It is in excellent preservation, and was transcribed by Mr. Alfred Gibbons, who printed it in 1888. In the printed copy of the book the *Oxfordshire* vicarages commence on page 1 and in the MS. on fo. 1, and fifty-six vicarages are entered. *Buckinghamshire* commences on p. 12 and fo. 4a, and forty-five vicarages are noted. The *Bedfordshire* list begins on p. 20 and fo. 6b, and names forty-two vicarages. *Huntingdonshire* will be found on p. 26 and fo. 8b, and twenty-one churches are entered. *Northamptonshire* follows on p. 31 and fo. 10a, and records forty-seven vicarages. The archdeaconry of *Lincoln* on p. 41 and fo. 13a, includes one hundred and forty-one vicarages. The archdeaconry of *Stowe*, commencing on p. 68 and fo. 19b, names twenty vicarages. The remainder of the volume, pp. 72-106, fos. 23a-33a, is occupied principally with copies of deeds of *appropriations* which relate to seventy-nine places. The printed volume is in demy octavo, and though it appears generally to be an accurate transcript, there is unfortunately no index of names, and its format is not altogether satisfactory.

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
