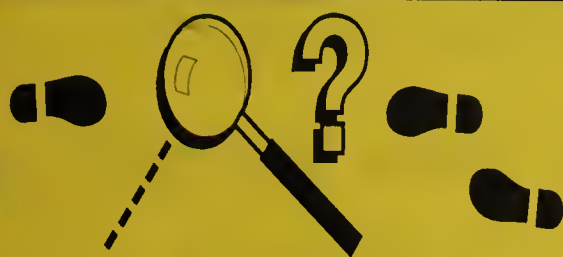
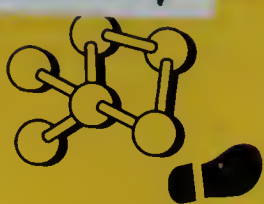

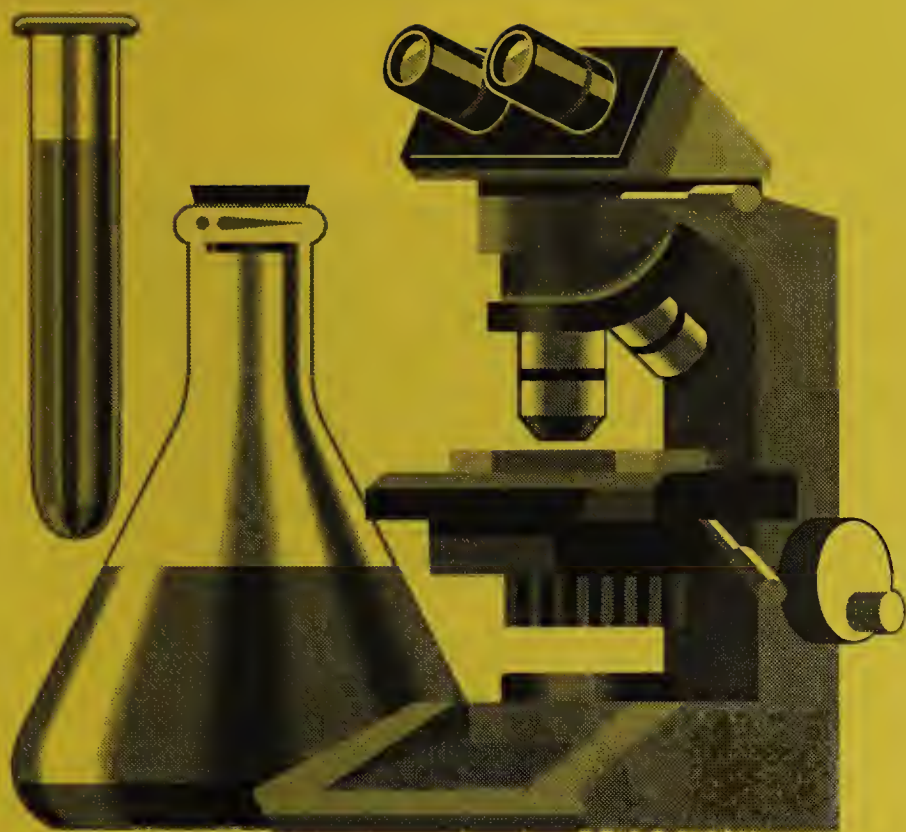

Trainee salaries start at \$2285/mo., with journey level analysts earning up to a current \$4822/mo. Minimum qualifications include a bachelor's degree in natural or forensic science plus curiosity, a sense of adventure and a willingness to serve the citizens of Illinois.

As Forensic Scientist Trainees, those selected will receive comprehensive instruction in the use of the most advanced forensic science technology and procedures for analyzing evidence, and we will pay you to learn. Specialty areas include drug chemistry, firearms/toolmarks, DNA/forensic biology, microscopy, latent prints, trace analysis, questioned documents, forensic imaging, forensic toxicology, and polygraph. Length of training ranges from 15 months to 3 years, depending upon the assigned discipline.
