

In submitting the Winter Edition of our Wholesale Price List it gives us much pleasure to return our thanks for the very liberal patronage accorded us during the past season, and in soliciting your orders for the present year we beg to assure you of our continued and unceasing efforts to give the utmost satisfaction, and to maintain the high reputation that we have so long enjoyed for supplying only the best strains of Vegetable and Flower Seeds at reasonable prices.

LOW EXPRESS RATES ON PLANTS.

We are shipping by all express lines to any part of the country, plants packed in closed boxes at a reduction of 20 per cent. from regular rates of merchandise. Boxes weighing less than 100 pounds are charged at pound rates, minimum charge not less than 35 cents. For example: where the general rate is \$5.00 per 100 pounds, a box weighing 20 pounds will be carried for 80 cents. Prepaid 4 pound packages of seeds, plants and bulbs are carried to California and all distant points for 30 cents each.

By our careful and thorough system of packing, we GUARANTEE SAFE DELIVERY on Plants and perishable goods, when ordered to be sent by EXPRESS.

PLANTS and PERISHABLE GOODS shipped between NOVEMBER 1ST and APRIL 15TH are at PURCHASER'S RISK as regards freezing, when ordered to be sent by RAILROAD or STEAMER.

As the saving in transportation charges is solely for the benefit of the purchaser, it is only reasonable that they assume the risk when perishable goods are not sent by Express.

TERMS OF BUSINESS.

Unknown correspondents desiring to open an account will please furnish satisfactory reference, otherwise cash must accompany order.

Remittances should be made by Post Office Money Orders, Drafts on New York or Philadelphia banks, or Express Money Orders. Where it is not possible to obtain these, the letter should be registered. We cannot guarantee receipt of money sent in any other way.

Perishable goods desired C. O. D. must be accompanied by a partial remittance to guarantee acceptance.

CHANGE OF TERMS.

In order to equalize and to give the same time of credit on all purchases, we have decided to abolish our old system of credits in which all accounts regardless of date of purchase were due in January and July, and have decided to adopt a new system, as follows:===

On and after January 1st, 1896, all bills will be due and payable Ninety (90) days after date of Invoice.

No charge is made for boxes or packing, nor for delivery to Freight Depots or Express Offices.

In filling out your order, always give SHIPPING DIRECTIONS, and write NAME and ADDRESS DISTINCTLY.



bloom resembles the Dwarf Lima. The pods are very broad and flat and of excellent quality. The plant is branching and vigorous, with an immense amount of foliage, pods are borne in the greatest profu-

sion, often a single plant having from 50 to 60 or more pods. When in bloom the plant is

completely covered with flowering spikes, and as the pods form in clusters they sink beneath the dense foliage which shields them from light showers, heavy dews and hot sun, which is a protection against their spotting or rusting and becoming soiled, as compared with other sorts. They require thin planting (two beans being sufficient for a hill) on very rich soil, and will run true and not sport.

The pods are the broadest of all Wax Bush Beans, color transparent glossy lemon wax, having the vellow waxy appearance soon after the pods are formed. When picked will retain their bright, attractive appearance for a long time and do not be-come tough. Quality very tender, juicy, and flavor delicate. Seed small oval, pure white, which is much in their favor compared with

a colored bean.

Having wonderful productiveness,

attractive appearance and keeping qualities, it is likely to become a favorite for main crop with truckers. Owing to its tenderness, fine quality and delicious flavor it cannot help but please those who want the best. 



The New Tomatoes of 1896. Descriptions from... the Introducers.

Landreth's Cross=bred Tomatoes.

Crops grown the past summer of 1895, the seeds sown being selected from the crops of '94, which were grown from hybridized seed of 1892 and 1893. The varieties are, as is usually the case with cross-breeds, of exceeding productiveness and remarkable earliness, both qualities raising them to a first-class position, to say nothing of their distinctive shapes, which are altogether new.

Scarlet Cross, 90 Days. Earliest to ripen of the cross-bred sorts, being edible in about 90 days from germination of the seed. Color scarlet, and proof against sunburn. Form of fruit deep oval between stem end and blossom end. Fruit three weeks earlier than stone and larger than Stone, and distinct in form, being so very thick. 

In novelty only approached by the Three-celled Cross, which is not so curious as this very distinct Tomato; is large as a big goose egg and solid as an apple; free from cracks, green core or blemishes. Color like Acme. Foliage very small and silvery, but a strong vine. An admirable sort for forcing under glass or for early sales at Fruit Stands, its novelty of shape, size, coloring speaking its own praise. Ripening in about 115 days. Per pkt. 25 cts.




THORBURN NEW YORK.




