Early White French Roman Hyacinth

The Early White French Roman Hyacinths are particularly suited to growing in bowls and pans for winter blooming. They are somewhat tender and are not recommended for outdoor planting in the North unless they are well protected. Their loosely formed, graceful, delicately perfumed flower spikes have great charm and appeal. They may be grown to flower in succession from November until April. For this purpose plant every week or 10 days apart.
