ILLINOIS RACING POSSIBILITIES.

From every nook and corner, outside those of the local racing factions, come news of a desire for a 1897 racing bill for the state of Illinois. One would have been passed two years ago, but for the machinations and complications growing out of the damaging methods of fighting, which usually comes out of racing bitterness in all sections. As it was the Washington Park Club, North Western Breeders Association and the general trotting interests of the state—influential factors—grow more bitter after failure to agree. These influences, used against the bill on parade enabled the direct and interested agents of an anti-Chicago racing confederacy to beat the measure. As Illinois law stands today race track betting is merely gambling under the criminal code. The Swigert-Garfield Park case nullified the old and badly framed state law which aimed to regulate betting and did not. Unless the influences of 1895 are again used to sharpen the effect of the same war of interests, Illinois will have a law—through the legislature which is to meet next month. The proposed racing bill provides for thirty days racing, probably between May 15 and Nov. 1 on each racetrack in Chicago. The main points of the measure will follow Western racing law.

Local betting on races run upon such race tracks will be permitted. A keenly drawn clause in the bill will seek to prohibit the operation of more than one track by the same interest. In other words, the Washington Park Club, the Chicago Racing Association (Hawthorne) and the Chicago Fair Grounds Association (Harlem) will each be assigned thirty days racing.

New tracks, if built and operated by the owners or interests of the three present groups of Chicago track owners, will be illegal. Booking on foreign racing is also prohibited. This prohibition, the turn of racing and the prevention of track interest combinations are to be the new bill's feature. The final draft of the measure—its general conditions are already on figures—is likely to nominate May 15th and November 1 (five and one-half months), as the annual term of legal racing within the state of Illinois. This gives 105 racing days per year to the Chicago tracks already in existence.

Another course may be built by new men to racing, but of the highest class. If it is equipped its offerings will be some \$7,500 per day, including stakes, for a thirty days meeting—or \$225,000. The insertion of such a factor into the Chicago field would not disturb the general idea of harmony in the local field. Its thirty days turn would not usurp the dates equitably considered as due the three Indiana tracks and Ideal Park. In addition to the ninety days for three tracks devoted to thoroughbreds, fifteen days can be modestly calculated as belonging to the annual meeting of trotters and pacers held at Washington Park, under the auspices of the North-Western Association of Trotting and Pacing Horse Breeders.

Western racing law gives seven months for racing action above the geographical line of legislation. This assigns the local field—all tracks in Chicago, Indiana and Wisconsin considered—seventy-five days more on top of the 135 racing days, calculated under the probable bill, a total 210 days, of which thirty are set aside for a probably new course, is thus reached.

Forty-five days is the naturally yearly due of the Indiana tracks. The Sellers law and the decisions out of it, make terms of fifteen days per annum the right of Roby, Forsyth and Sheffield. Ideal Park is a natural racing factor. It is entitled to and will be given a place in a schedule of Chicago dates, which must naturally be made by a general and impartial com-

mission, should the proposed racing bill be passed.

The bill in preparation does not contemplate a Racing Board of Control or the taxation of race tracks. It should do so. A board of three commissioners, appointed by Gov. Tanner, might well be created to rule the racing of the State of Illinois, pass in a final way on the character and completion of all its tracks and recognize them by license. In addition to these qualifications, a tax on gross daily receipts—from 1 to 2 per cent, might well be imposed for the benefit or a license fee of the State Agricultural fund, on the plan of the Ives law of New York.

This tax should be levied on all racing corporations within the state. A license fee is most definite and reasonable. If such is chosen, it should be graded from \$25 to \$2,500 per annum, according to lucrative possibilities and be based on population and geographical position. The former sum is not a burden to rural associations and the latter sum a moderate one for Chicago tracks.

The new bill, when finished, will go to a high class legislator and be offered on its merits as a measure for the benefit of the breeding interests and general business of Illinois. Unless the factions make scandal and trouble, the bill will pass. If it does, the local tracks will profit nearly as much by their short meetings—necessarily of high class on the ground of attraction—as they profited in the past by long meetings and less sharp daily doings.

A glance at the Chicago date angle of 1896 should the proposed bill become a law would give this sort of a schedule:
