RACING GOSSIP.

One of the best known Eastern horsemen in San Francisco, in a personal letter to the editor of DAILY RACING FORM, says: "Both Ingleside and Oakland are racing to a big profit. There were twenty-three books on today, the best attendance I have seen this year, not barring New York, and more of those beautiful golden double eagles than I ever saw before. If you are lucky enough to get behind a bookmaker's box with a hundred dollar ticket the cashier hands you out a stack of 'yellows.' The Oaks yesterday was a red hot race from start to finish and the whole field finished in a heap. Eugene Leigh's horses are all doing well. Suisun will not race again before March. Lady Loomam has just recovered from a case of inflammation of the stomach. Leigh has five yearlings, two home raised, tried and imported, and three he has bought. One, a Morello colt, dam by Hyder Ali and third dam by Eclipse, is his favorite cross. He acts like a race horse and took the stable crack into camp quite readily after being in training but five weeks. The Darebin-Teacher colt in the Leigh band is a magnificent looker with fine action.

"Lucky" Baldwin's string in charge of Frank Taylor is in fine form. The horses in it will be hard to beat from now on. There has been some sickness—catarrhal fever in a mild form—here, but the majority of the horses are in the best of health. I have learned to ask a tenderfoot what he thinks of 'our climate' just as good as a native Californian."

The St. Louis Republic, usually intelligent in criticism about the turf, declares that "we have no riders today like Garrison, McLaughlin and Murphy. Tod Sloan, the foremost American jockey of the year, is not to be compared with any of the above trio when they were at their best. A rise in the scale of weights will give Johnnie Mooney, Charlie McDonald, Frankie Jordan and other old time favorites another chance in the saddle."

All this is part of a plea for weight raising by the American Turf Congress in line with Jockey Club action. Bosh! The turf isn't injured because Garrison, McDonald and Jordan are outside utility. Tatal in the heavy, Griffin and Simms in the medium and Slaughter, Jones and Sloan in the light class are as good riders as those of any period of the American turf. Sloan leads the jockeys of 1896 chiefly because of his opportunities. The weights could not be expanded to the weight of some of the former riding stars of the turf. The scale should be that of utility—what racing material, according to the judgment of its owners can carry and be useful. Before or at the same time that the scale of Western weights is raised, Western turf rules should be so arranged that high priced horses are sent into costlier avenues than those who are worth less money and have less ability. The business sense of operating a turf or a grocery store, is the fitting of stock to condition and opportunity. The legislation of the American turf is even now too embracive. Nearly every district has its necessities of condition, climate and clientele. Commonsense legislation is that which dovetails the material on hand.

John Madden owns Wabasso, a colt that gave great promise last year and will try him out after a special fitting for some of the 1897 derbies.
