### HARLEM'S GOOD RACING.

There was health and strength about the racing at Harlem Saturday. The air wasn't any too balmy, yet a crowd of 8,000 was at the track. There was keen action in the ring. In the seven events three favorites scored. In the other four races the results were healthy and the best horses seemed to win. Elsie Bramble's race was the cloud of the afternoon. The fifth race, an eight and one-half furlong condition race, was the racing piece of the card. Only three started. Yet there was much interest about it.

Serrano, with Tommy Burns up, was favorite at far too long odds and when he got to, and passed. The Plutocrat there was applause that reminded one of the days when racing was at its best in Chicago.

An accident in the first race gave the crowd a scare. But there was no disaster. Onalaska, with Cass Sloan up, and Little Tom, under Master Hough, got into a mixup in the first turn, in full view of the stand, and both went down. Sloan got up and walked away without a bruise, but Hough had to be carried off the track. He was merely stunned and revived in a few minutes. Olivia L was a 6 to 5 favorite for the race, and escaping all interference, won in a canter.

A pretty finish and popular victory came out of the five and one half furlong two-year-old handicap. Elsie Bramble was favorite around even money. She ran one of the shabby races, for which she is infamous and was never a contender. Gnome was a smart pacemaker to the stretch, when that good filly, Pearl—at all too long a price—and Li Hung Chang challenged her. The trio fought it out the entire length of the stretch, and Pearl, sharply aided by Sloan's powerful finish, won by a narrow margin from Gnome.

The ring was at sea about Pearl, and at stages laid 8 to 1 against the filly. There are not many fillies in the west that can beat her. She has been most consistent, too.

Scoggin Bro's Red was the natural favorite for his race, and catching the second choice, Tenole, a sixteenth out, he won in a hard drive.

The fourth race, a selling affair at a mile, drew out sultry betting, with Prince of India the receding favorite. The stable declares that the Prince cannot extend himself in soft going. The colt finished in the ruck while Necedah won rather handily.

The maiden two-year-old was a mere piece of humor for Mackin, and that underrated colt Botanic galloped away from a fast lot in the closing race. It was his third consecutive victory.

Harlem's midsummer meeting begins Monday and six well balanced races are carded.
