#### TO RACE AT LAKESIDE.

cretary Nathanson's formal announcement of a fifteen days' race meeting, to begin at the Lakeside track a week from next Thursday, came as a pleasant surprise to local admirer of the sport of all sports. The mere announcement that the meeting is to take place will bring in hundreds more. Workmen are now busily engaged in placing the track and its buildings in order. Outside of the fact that Richard Dwyer is to do the starting no officials have been selected or, at any rate, announced, but that is a detail that will be attended to in good time and style. #### GREAT STAKES THIS WEEK.

As a rule of recent years the Kentucky Derby has had small fields of starters, but this year it nas had smail helds of starters, but this year its seems probable that Manuel, Corsini, Mazo, Hapsburg, His Lordship, The Barrister, Billy House, Fontainebleu, False Lead and The Ken-tuckian will go to the post, Nine others are eligible including Schorr & Son's Sea Lion, W. Overton, Ordnung and Albert Swind, but it is probable that the starters will be confined to the ten named, Mr. Schorr, it is reported, will pass the Kentucky Derby by and try to capture the St. Louis Derby later on. With such a good field in prospect Derby Day at Louisville will this year possess a measure of interest in excess of the average and will no doubt be the occasion of a very great assemblage. Amid all the excitement and jubilation incident to such a gathering will be the inevitable tinge of sadness because of the absence of the familiar figure of Col. Clark from the judges' stand for the first time since Aristides won the first Kentucky Derby in 1875.


