### FOUCON RULED OFF.

NEW ORLEANS, LA., Feb. 10.—The stewards this afternoon handed in the result of their investigations of the Tom Collins and Rush Fields races. Jockey Foucon, who rode Rush Fields January 30, is ruled off the turf, and W. Wood, who rode Tom Collins February 6, is suspended indefinitely. The owner of Hilliard was fined \$50 for sending his horse to the post without his having been schooled to the barrier.
