PACE TOO HOT FOR E. M. FRY.

NOTASULGA WINS THE NATIONAL STAKES IN FAST TIME.

Southern Cross Getting Ready for Benning—Baby P. Lacks Identification—Jockey Seder Is Under Suspension.

New Orleans, La., March 6.—E. M. Fry had his colors lowered in the National Stakes, three and one-half furlongs, for two-year-olds, the feature of the card at City Park today. Notasulga found the track to her liking and won with something to spare, in close to record time for the course, Black Mary being second, Ziephien third, E. M. Fry fourth, with Bitter Sir and Coincident, added starters, filling the next two and last positions. Montbert, Blue Lee, Drop Stitch, Letohatchie, Flynn and Lorimer were withdrawn. Barney Schreiber's race colt was soundly beaten. His rider was Nicol, rated as the best handler of young horses here; he got away well, but was outrun at all stages. Black Mary outfooted him in the rush to the first turn and carried him along at a fast pace. Notasulga was not as fortunate when the start came and left the post slowly. When settled in her stride, however, she closed on the leaders with a rush. Nicol did not persevere with E. M. Fry when he realized that he could not be as good as second. The pace throughout was very fast, the first quarter being run in :23, the three furlongs in :35, and the three and one-half furlongs in :44.

Southern Cross, generally rated as the fastest horse racing at the Fair Grounds last winter, made his first appearance of this season in the third race, a five furlongs sprint. He still retains that wonderful flight of speed. Going to the front directly after the start and leading throughout he won in a drive from Columbia Girl. Southern Cross is being pointed for some of the earlier stakes at Benning and Aqueduct and should be a dangerous factor in these fixtures.

Baby P. was ordered scratched from the fifth race on account of lack of identification. Baby P. was carded as a bay mare, 5, by Peddler—Kitty L. H., and was entered by J. Wilson & Co.

Before the first race, Robert Tucker purchased of Sam Louis the three-year-old filly, Golden Wave, which Louis claimed out of a selling race at the Fair Grounds last week.

R. W. Walden has wired James Johnson to bring the stallion Formaster with his stable when he ships to Benning. Formaster will be bred to several of the mares at the Walden Farm near Middleburg, Md.

Jockey Seder was suspended indefinitely by the stewards for unsatisfactory riding. Seder has been getting into trouble with the clerk of the scales, the starter and other officials through his sharp replies. His handling of Louise Macfarlan in some of her races brought about his suspension.

Good racing is in sight for tomorrow afternoon, very speedy horses figuring in several of the races and Grense, Lute Foster, Bosom Friend, Incantation, Arabo, Aules, Higginbotham, Fieldwick, Bel-say, Peter Sterling, St. Valentine, Pink Star, Emergency, Southern Cross, Foxmead, Evie Greene, Bellindian, Foreigner, Good Player, Auditor and Reticent all having shown good form of late.

TO LEGALIZE RACING IN DELAWARE.

Bill Is Similar to Percy-Gray Law—New Track to Be Near Philadelphia.

Dover, Del., March 6.—A bill legalizing horse racing in Delaware under the strict jurisdiction of the Jockey Club of New York, was introduced in the House of Representatives of the Legislature today by Representative Bannum of Sussex County.

The measure is almost an exact duplicate of the Percy-Gray law of New York, having been drawn literally from it. The only difference is, instead of imposing 5 per cent. on the gross receipts for the encouragement of agriculture, as is done in New York, the Delaware bill stipulates that an annual tax of \$50,000 shall be paid by each racing association to the state for the construction of good roads. It is announced authoritatively that the movement has the sanction and support of the Jockey Club. The proposed racing commission will effectually check illegal meetings. Races can be run in Delaware only from April 1 to December 1.

The project is wholly a Delaware one and has the support of the most prominent horsemen of the state. It is proposed to establish a race course, not less than one mile and an eighth in length, with a modern steeplechase field and appropriate buildings, between Wilmington and Philadelphia. By this means the enterprise will be supported by Philadelphia, the course being only eighteen miles from that city, along the Pennsylvania and Baltimore & Ohio railroads.

Hot Springs, Ark., March 6.—Jockey Mountain has made application to the Jockey Club for license to ride at the eastern tracks.

TEMACEO IS DEFEATED AT ASCOT.

Winner of the California Derby Evidently Short—Another Heavy Rain.

Los Angeles, Cal., March 6.—A big shower at noon today rendered the track muddy again. Although Colonel Jack failed to meet Temaceo in the fourth race, much interest centered in the race, as the winner of the California Derby had never run here. He was pitted against two of the best three-year-olds here, but failed to make good, succumbing to J. R. Laughrey in a hard drive, with Arimo lapped. It was the general opinion, however, that Temaceo was short and can do better.

With a slow track in prospect the card for tomorrow does not promise much, but of the fairly useful horses Brennus, Decimo, Indian II.; Joyner, Netting, Hi Col Cap; Avalon, Libertinus, Comas; Stilicho, Gorgalete, Reservation; Revolt, Elmdale, Woodthorpe; Redwood II., Myrtle H. and Nattie Bumpo have at times been credited with good performances.

ZIEGLER NAMES YOUNGSTERS.

Henry M. Ziegler, the Cincinnati theatrical man, has eight two-year-olds for the eastern campaign of 1907. They are being prepared at Lexington, Ky., by Charles Hughes and will be sent to one of the New York tracks the latter part of the present month. The list is as follows:

Wise Child, b. c. by Bute or Bendoran—Surface. Riddigore, ch. c. by Pirate of Penance—First Land.

Robbin' Around, b. c. by Sorcerer—Whirlwind. Polar Star, br. c. by Star Shoot—Ravenna. Smilinda, b. f. by Woolsthorpe—Tommie Bell. Allegory, b. c. by Gallantry—Allegro.

Zephyrus, ch. c. by Sempronius—Miss Dawn. Tatrum, ch. f. by Garry Hermann—Tasmania.

Riddigore, Robbin' Around, Smilinda, Allegory, Zephyrus and Tatrum were all bred by Milton Young at McGrathiana Stud in Kentucky and were sold by auction at Sheephead Bay in September last. Smilinda and Zephyrus each cost Mr. Ziegler \$1,500. Allegory's price was \$1,000. Robbin' Around and Tatrum cost \$900 each, and \$500 was paid for Riddigore.

Riddigore is a February foal and is a half-brother to the good filly Mollie Donohue, which is the first foal of First Land, a daughter of Pioneer, a son of Galopin. First Land was never raced and was brought to this country from England in 1902. Tatrum is an April foal. Her dam, Tasmania, is a daughter of Hanover and a full sister to Hand-vice and likewise a sister to Design, the dam of Two Bills.

Robbin' Around is another February foal. Whirlwind, his dam, is a half-sister to Ramiro II., the winner of twenty races in five seasons, a good sprinter.

Allegory is an April foal. He is a half-brother to the good mare Sweetie. Allegro, his dam, is a full sister to Partridge, the dam of Canteen and The Quail, and likewise to Nahma, the dam of Adbell and Belmere.

Zephyrus is a May foal. He is a half-brother to Early, Miss Hanover and Simon D. Miss Dawn, his dam, is a sister to Cash Day, winner of twenty-nine races.

Smilinda is an April foal. Tommie Bell, her dam, is the dam of nine winners—W. G. Harding, Nellie Agnes, Jim Blackburn, Nigger Baby, Buena Ventura, Eloin, Hans Wagner, Wrenne and Sir Francis II.

Polar Star was bred by Colonel E. F. Clay at Rumymede Stud and is an April foal. He was sold to Jake Marklein as a yearling for \$350 and passed from him to Mr. Ziegler. His dam is a young mare by Sir Dixon, out of Rena Orr.

Wise Child was bred by J. B. Haggin at Elmen-dorf Stud and was sold privately to Mr. Ziegler.

CLYDE LOCATES IN MARYLAND.

It is announced that Thomas Clyde, the millionaire horseman, has taken up his residence permanently on the 500-acre farm which he recently bought near Salisbury, Md., to be used as a breeding establishment for thoroughbreds. Mr. Clyde will spend a large sum in beautifying the place and will make it the handsomest farm on the Delaware and Maryland peninsula.

Mr. Clyde, who is forty years old and a bachelor, is a son of the late William Clyde, founder of the Clyde Steamship Line, recently sold to the International Navigation Company. As the largest individual stockholder, he received several millions in cash and stock.

JOCKEY KOERNER'S NARROW ESCAPE.

Prince Magnet Runs Away with Him and Bolts Among the Harrows.

Oakland, Cal., March 6.—The augmented attendance at the Oakland race course today was largely due to improved weather and track conditions. The card, barring the reappearance of J. O. Keene's Raconteur in the introductory sprint, was featureless and uninteresting. Raconteur qualified brilliantly for Saturday's big juvenile fixture, the Undine Stakes, at a half-mile, in which he meets the unbeaten Firestone. This pair are voted real cracks by the local experts.

The suddenly improved Vinton scored easily in the second. Jockey Koerner, who had the mount on Prince Magnet in the fourth, narrowly escaped serious injury in the runaway of two miles that followed the finish of the race. The crazy animal ran two miles the reverse way of the track, his side scraping the outside fence at nearly every stride. Koerner's position was perilous in the extreme and when the horse finally darted into the chute, where the harrows are stored, he had no alternative but drop off or be killed and he chose the former. The jockey had a hard fall and rolled over and over again, lying quite still for several moments. He finally recovered and rode in the next race at two miles in which, however, he showed extreme weakness and inability to do Huston justice.

L. Williams has been released by S. C. Hildreth, who has secured second call on Koerner.

Julius Fleischmann was a visitor at Oakland today. Keene Brothers will race the pick of their stable on metropolitan tracks during the coming summer. Twenty or thirty culls will be sold. Fred Mulholland has been engaged as starter during Harry Stover's three weeks' race meeting at Petaluma in May. C. E. Durnell will ship east April 5. Jennings and Hildreth go ten days later.

No high-class horses are in evidence in the card for tomorrow, but in the main, those entered class so well together that interesting sport seems assured, such as Memorize, Jeremiah, Mrs. Nugent; F. Neugens, Calmar, Burning Bush; Mabel Hollander, Blanche C., Duke of Orleans; Fred Bent, Judge, Silver Sue; Crossshade, Little Mirthful, I Told You; Sea Lad, Delagoa and Pal having shown good form at various times.

LEXINGTON MEETING UNCERTAIN.

Lexington, Ky., March 6.—The racing stables of W. H. Laudeman, T. C. McDowell and H. M. Ziegler will be shipped from here to New York between March 20 and April 1. There are now 378 horses in training at the Kentucky Association course. Little work has been done this week. The track is muddy. It is by no means a certainty that a meeting will be held here this spring. There appears to be no concerted local endeavor in that direction. The breeders, on a proposition of putting up money, are as tight as ever. If the meeting is held it will be under outside management and backing. The lease of the American Turf Association on the grounds expires April 1 and it has been stated that the trustees of the estate of the late Captain Brown are not disposed to renew it. They want to sell the property. The Blue Grass Fair Association has an option on it for \$70,000. This organization is trying to raise the purchase price by popular subscription. Little progress has been made.

Hot Springs, Ark., March 6.—Matt J. Winn, when asked regarding the Lexington meeting, said: "The matter may be decided tomorrow or next day. Our lease on the track expires April 1. The Blue Grass Fair Association is trying to buy the plant. In the event the fair association gets the property, I have been asked to manage the meeting. If J. B. Haggin gets the track I do not know what disposition he will make of it. If the track is not sold I may lease it again and hold a spring meeting."

BURNS BOYS GO BACK TO DALY.

New York, March 6.—The Burns boys, Guy and Willie, have returned from Canada, and the contention for their services between W. C. Daly and R. Boyle will be settled out of court. Boyle has decided that his claim will not stand the test. When the elder Burns succeeded in getting the boys away from Daly last fall through the courts his plea was that he desired them taken away from the influence of the racetrack. This highly moral plea brought the desired results, but, according to report, he at once began to look around to place them to the best advantage to himself.

Boyle sent an agent to Chatham, Ont., the home of the Burns family, and got the father's signature to a contract, but Mrs. Burns would not sign it. She claimed that the father had not contributed one penny toward the support of the boys after they left Daly. She had him summoned to court, but he did not appear and the court made her the guardian of the two boys. This was February 28, and she at once made arrangements to return the boys to Daly.

The youngsters were well pleased to get back and will begin work at once. They are both sure to be heard from the coming season. Guy had 185 mounts last year and rode four winners, the first at Sheephead Bay June 28. Consequently he will be entitled to the apprentice allowance until that date of this year. Daly would not allow Willie, the younger, to take mounts, although a number of good judges who had seen him during the exercise hours expressed the opinion that he was the better of the pair. But it was not until November 18 that Willie was permitted to accept a mount at Benning. He justified the belief in him by winning his first race, and is almost sure to become a crack rider. But Daly can claim the apprentice allowance for him virtually all season, which might not have been the case had the boy been allowed to ride earlier. The boys will ride at Benning.

JUDGE STOPS CONSTABLES.

RESTRAINING ORDER AFFORDS BETTING AT OAKLAWN.

May Not Hold Good for Long—Prosecuting Attorney Causes Arrest of Cella and Others—The Racing.

Hot Springs, Ark., March 6.—The petition of the Oaklawn Jockey Club for an order of restraint against Constable John Smith and his deputies was granted by County Judge O. H. Sumpter today and there was no interruption of the betting at the racecourse this afternoon. The bookmakers occupied stools in the betting ring and displayed their prices on hand boards. Constable Smith was in the betting ring when served with the court's order. He promptly retired, and there was a shout from the crowd of about 1,000 present for the racing. The restraining order reads as follows:

"Order for injunction, state of Arkansas to John L. Smith: As constable of Hot Springs township, county of Garland, state of Arkansas, as well as individual, your agents, servants and deputies, are restrained and enjoined from entering the inclosure or grounds of the Oaklawn racing plant of the plaintiff except for the purpose of serving due or legal process and in reasonable time, therefore, in the search of service; that you are restrained and enjoined likewise from interfering with the business of the plaintiff or its patrons and from threatening to break up the races at said plant or arresting persons who may merely be spectators of said races, and against whom there are no charges of betting, and from annoying any person or persons who are not betting on the said races, until further order of the Garland Chancery Court or the Chancellor thereof."

It was believed by the horsemen and the regulars that this order means that the meeting will continue without interruption, and they were accordingly in high spirits. Tonight, however, they are again in a state of uncertainty. Prosecuting Attorney Maus declares that the order will be dissolved by Chancellor Curl. The prosecutor says he will insist on a strict enforcement of the law and it appears that he means it. This morning he caused the arrest of L. A. Cella, Leo Mayer, John Wolf, Barney Wolf and others on warrants charging violation of the Amis law and says that other arrests are forthcoming. The restraining order is addressed to Constable Smith and his deputies. It does not stop the Citizens' Improvement Union.

The racing today seemed to be more enjoyable than was that of yesterday, though the feature race, the handicap at a mile and seventy yards, resulted in a form somersault on the part of Wing Ting, which had been beaten in her previous race when ridden by D. Austin. She had the diminutive J. Butler as her pilot today and forced a steady, fast pace from the start, racing Flip, the early contender, into defeat and had enough in reserve to stall off a determined challenge from Tern's Rod in the final drive. High Bear landed in third place.

Jockey Moreland won with Lord Dixon and Cursus. Both were little thought of. In the race won by Lord Dixon Request was given much consideration, but poor racing luck caused her defeat. Her rider lodged a claim of foul against Proteus, which had finished second, and the judges allowed it. By the ruling Request got second and Kittle Platt was moved into third place. Beltoone was the only easy winner of the afternoon. She spreadeagled the others and won as her rider pleased.

Rustle annexed another purse for L. A. Cella. She won the opening race rather handsily after overcoming a lot of interference. The second race resulted in a close finish between Sweet Kitty and Theodocia, the former was given the decision.

The Hayman-Garson contingent will depart for Benning next Saturday. In addition to shipping the entire lot of horses that they have been racing here, they will take with them Jockey Englander. This rider has at times shown ability, but on the whole has much to learn before becoming a finished rider. Jockey G. Swain was again suspended for disobedience at the post. This time he was given a week by the starter.

With peaceful times in prospect for tomorrow afternoon the racing promises well with such useful horses as Billy Bowlegs, Water Lock, Albert M.; Ben Strong, Jim Simpson, Dr. Wentker; Sorrel Top, B. J. Swanner, Penrhyn; Hyperion II., Hannibal Bey, Redgauntlet; High Bear, Scalplock, Princess Orna; Beecher, Athena and Adesso figuring in the various races.

Miller says that he had a fine time at Oakland and was royally treated there. He will begin exercising the horses of the Newcastle Stable at Gravesend in a few days.

YOUNG BUYS MABEL RICHARDSON.

Lexington, Ky., March 6.—C. E. Rowe has sold the eight-year-old bay mare Mabel Richardson, by Halma—Vimeta, to Milton Young. She will go into the stud at McGrathiana and will be bred to Sempronius.

PLENTY TO DO AT THE SPA.

Electioneer will have ample opportunity to make turf history at Saratoga. He has been named for seven stakes, including the Saratoga Handicap, Saratoga Cup and Merchants' and Citizens' Handicap.

BEST YOUNGSTERS AT OAKLAND.

"While it is doubtless a little early for prognosti-
cations, especially as the principal two-year-old
stakes are yet to be decided, it looks as if the
best three two-year-olds shown in California this
year are Firestone, Raconteur and Creation," says
the San Francisco Chronicle. "Firestone is the
most highly tried youngster of the trio. He showed
to be possessed of great speed in his trials around
New York and he lived up to his early promises in
his races out here. Sam Hildreth developed Fire-
stone and recently sold him to Thomas H. Williams
for \$10,000, which is the biggest sale here since
Yellow Tail was a two-year-old. Firestone is a
good-looking chestnut colt, by the English stallion
Royal Flush, out of the California mare Modreda, by
Sir Modred. Firestone made his turf debut on
January 1, when he spreadeagled the others in a
field of eleven youngsters whose owners were anxious
to win the first race of the year. Firestone's next
appearance was on January 5; when he won a

three-furlongs race by almost a half-dozen lengths.
The third and last appearance of Firestone was on
January 12, when he won by over a half-dozen
lengths. Firestone is extremely fast and should
develop into a valuable colt, especially if a route
proves to his liking. The future career of Firestone
is uncertain at present, but it is not unlikely that
he will be sent east, where he is well engaged.

"However, nothing definite will be decided upon
for a few weeks. Firestone will doubtless be a
starter in the Bell Stakes and the Gebhard Handi-
cap, which are to be decided on March 23 and
March 30, respectively.

"Raconteur is a chestnut gelding by Toddington—
Suspicion, and, like Firestone, first saw the light of
day in California. He was purchased as a yearling
by the Keene Brothers for \$350. Raconteur was
beaten in his first start on January 1, by Firestone,
but he has scored in his two subsequent starts in
the most impressive fashion. On January 28, he
won in a field which included Creation by five
lengths. Two days later he scored another win,
beating Love of Gold by seven lengths. Raconteur
showed conspicuous improvement over his first start,
when he was beaten by Firestone. Raconteur made
his fourth start yesterday and won.

"Creation, like Firestone, is owned by Thomas H.
Williams, who purchased him from Burns & Water-
house. After three defeats, in which he displayed
improving form, Creation scored his first victory
on February 1, winning easily by six lengths. He
repeated on February 9, beating Love of Gold by
four lengths. He scored his third straight victory
February 28.

"Creation is a brown colt by Altamex, grandson
of Musket, dam Recreation. The latter mare is
well known to California racegoers. Creation is
being trained by Dr. Rowell, who is handling all
the youngsters owned by Thomas H. Williams.

"It may turn out that Firestone, Raconteur and
Creation are not the best two-year-olds in California,
but they figure best on the showing made in various
races since January 1."

BUTTONS' FIRST WIN IN TWO YEARS.

In winning the second race at Ascot Park Tues-
day, Buttons, the seven-year-old bay gelding, by
Tenny—Housegirl, earned his first brackets in nearly
two years, his last successful attempt being on July
15, 1905, when he captured a selling race at a
mile and a sixteenth in the fast time of 1:46 1/2
at Brighton Beach. As a two-year-old, Buttons was
started six times, but did not show any remarkable
form, although he finished third in his last three
efforts, one of which was the Daisy Stakes. In
1903, Buttons was unquestionably in his best form,
when in eleven starts he finished first four times,
was second three times, third twice and twice un-
placed. Probably his most notable achievement
that year was his winning of a race at Jamaica,
November 11, at one and one-eighth miles in 1:53 1/2,
with 113 pounds up, coming right back the next day
and taking a purse at a mile and a sixteenth, with
115 pounds in the saddle, in 1:47 1/2. Buttons' only
victory in 1904 was a mile race at Coney Island,
June 22, in which he ran the distance in 1:40 1/2, with
123 pounds up, a very creditable performance. All
told, he started thirteen times that year, finishing
second five times and being unplaced seven times.
As a five-year-old, Buttons started sixteen times,
winning three of his races, finishing second five
times, third four times and finishing out of the
money four times and winning \$2,595 for his owner.
He started but three times last year as a six-
year-old and was unplaced on each occasion. This
year he has been to the post four times, finishing
first once, third once and was twice unplaced.

ANENT FLEISCHMANN'S RETIREMENT.

In the course of its account of the election of
officials for the Latonia Jockey Club for the ensuing
year, the Cincinnati Enquirer says: "The retire-
ment of Mr. Julius Fleischmann is unfortunate for
the Western turf, as men of his caliber and rep-
utation are needed to give the sport a tone. Mr.
Fleischmann served two terms as president, and
while holding that office he opposed continuous
racing, and steadfastly advocated higher class rac-
ing. Over a year ago it was rumored that he had
resigned, as his ideas were not carried out by the
Latonia Jockey Club. He did not resign, and so
that story fell by the wayside.

"By laying aside the presidency of the Latonia
Jockey Club Mr. Fleischmann has practically wiped
out all of his turf connections. Four years ago his
colors were seen for the last time, but he still
cherished a lively interest in the doings of the
thoroughbred. The Fleischmann trophy, a beautiful
cup, has been donated annually by him to the La-
tonia Jockey Club for a two-year-old stake, the
richest of the meeting. Mr. Fleischmann is also a mem-
ber of the Board of Appeals of the American Turf
Association. Whether he has resigned that honorary
position is not known, as he is now in the far west.

"The selection of John Hachmeister as director
and treasurer has caused a general belief that the
Cella syndicate is in control of the affairs of the
Latonia Jockey Club. Mr. Hachmeister holds a
similar position with the holding company of the
two Louisville tracks, representing Cella and Con-
don."

VON STADE MAKES STAKE ENTRIES.

The Saratoga entries reveal a new recruit to racing
in Frank H. Von Stade, the Albany polo player
and all-around sportsman. He has always taken
a lively interest in racing at the Spa and plays
regularly in the polo games there during the meet-
ing. Mr. Von Stade has raced one or two horses
at the small meetings, but the naming of half a
dozen two-year-olds for the various stakes indicates
that he has taken up racing in earnest.

HALF-BROTHER TO SALVIDERE.

Lexington, Ky., March 6.—Harry Payne Whitney's
Sallie of Navarre (dam of Thomas Hildreth's Sal-
videre), has foaled a chestnut colt by Broomstick
at E. C. Cowdin's Kirklevington Stud. Mr. Whitney
bought Sallie of Navarre at the sale of the late
Captain Brown's mares last fall.
