Toronto, Ont., June 14.—The Dufferin Park outlaw meeting, which started hist Tuesday at the half-mile track here, is probably near its finish. Betting on race courses in Canada is legal only when the track is that of a regularly incorporated chip. In the track is that of a regularly incorporated chip. In the figure-leaves and Driving Club, which is the figure-leave in meeting, has an old charter which is said to have inseed a dozen years ago because of failure to operate.

It develops that the officers and directors of the club were notified to appear before Hon. W. J. Hanna, the provincial secretary, to show cause why their charter should not be canceled forthwith. It is said that the notices were served on men not now in office, but who were formerly connected with the club, and whose names are those furnished the department in the last official report, required by the act, on December 31, 1998, and who consequently are on record as the custodians of the charter.

The learing in the case was opened this morning before fire provincial secretary, whose department deals with the issuing of charters for joint stock companies in Ontario. The action-y-general was the charter should not be canceled. It was originally issued to a company organized by the late Mort Keachle in 1885, and never held any race meetings. ATTACKING THE WALKER-OTIS LAW.

Attorney Cook Outlines Grounds on Which He Expects to Upset Recent California Legislation.

San Francisco, Ual. June 14.—Former Superior Judge Carroll Cook, who will represent the defendant, George Adams, at the forthsoming test of the Walker-Otis anti-betting law in the Bistrict Court of Appeals, makes the statement that he will make his light against the validity of the Walker-Otis act from three standpoints. "I have been retained by the poolroom men and coursing men." said Judge Cook. "To make this test. There have been other arrests for vlolation of the anti-gambling act but none of them has suited my purpose. This one does. I shall attack the act on the ground that the title is defective; that the act is unfinelligible on account of certain qualifying clauses and that the penalty imposed is unconstitutional."

Oakland, Cal. Jupe 14.—The passage of the Walker-Otis law may have the effect of setting free possellers who were tried for violating municipaa ordinances that prohibit selling pools on the races, and whose cases are now on appeal. Attorney Phillin M. Walsh argued before Judge Brown that his two clients, Charles R. Pritchard and M. Paul, who were convicted in the Oakland police court of selling pools in spite of the municipal ordinance, were entitled to their freedom.

Walsh's contention was that the municipal ordinance, under which the two men were tried and convicted, was repealed by the state law. Under such conditions, he said, their convictious and the subsequent fines of \$500 each were illegal.
