CANDIDATES FOR THE KING'S PLATE

The King's Plate, the oldest racing fixture run continuously on this continent, will be an interesting feature of the opening day's racing meeting, scheduled to begin at Woodbine track, Toronto, next Tuesday.

The usual keen rivalry exists among Canadian owners over the running of the King's Plate, and the Valley Farm Stable appears to hold a strong hand in a colt called Farmer, by The Commoner.

The King's Plate—Fifty guineas (the gift of his majesty), with \$4,000 added by the club; estimated value \$5,000; the first horse to receive the guineas, stakes and \$2,750; the second horse \$700 and the third \$300.

Jupiter Joe is reported to have again gone lame at Churchill Downs. Kimball Patterson, who had a disagreement with James McManus that resulted in the engagement of O. A. Bianchi to train the McManus horses at Belmont Park, will continue to train for T. C. Clay and himself. William Keating has arrived at Gravesend with a string of four horses. The Schlosser bill, drawn to relieve the racing associations of New York state of the five per cent. tax on gross receipts that was a feature of the Percy-day law, has gone to Governor Hughes for approval after unanimous passage in both branches of the New York legislature. A change has been made in the Belmont Park program and the Meadow Brook Hunters' Steeplechase, which was carded to be run Friday, May 27, will be run Saturday, May 28, making it a seven-day program on that day.
