Cincinnati, O., May 29.—Latonia patrons will enjoy a treat this spring and summer in seeing in action on the Kenton County track the greatest array of eastern horses assembled on a western course since the passing of Washington Park, Chicago's famous racing ground.

H. C. Hallenbeck's horses will again be seen at Latonia during the coming meeting in charge of Frank M. Taylor. Mr. Hallenbeck is an especially welcome addition to the ranks of owners engaged in racing on Kentucky tracks.

Many other eastern horses will contest for the rich prizes hung up at Latonia this year and the sport will closely resemble that of the metropolitan race courses.

Under different names and varying conditions and distances what is now the Tobacco Stakes is as old as the Churchill Downs track, having first been run there in 1875, the inaugural year of racing at that course.

Beats John Griffin II, at Latter's Own Game of Short Distance Sprinting—Wondawhy Again

Louisville, Ky., May 29.—John G. Greener's Tennessee-bred colt, Countless, today defeated the Oklahoma "speed marvel," John Griffin II, in decisive fashion at the latter's favorite distance, five furlongs.

Thomas F. Ryan's Wondawhy, which attracted favorable notice on her first appearance under colors, again figured this afternoon by a brilliant performance in the fifth race.
