SIR JOHN JOHNSON WINS

STAR OF BEVERWYCK STABLE SHOWS HIS OLD-TIME SPEED AT HAMILTON.

Guy Burns Handles Him to Advantage in a Fast Run Race—Ocean Bound Scores Easy Victory

Hamilton, Ont., August 16.—The Beverwyck Stable's good racer, Sir John Johnson, showed a flash of his old-time form in the Midsummer Handicap, one of the feature races of the program provided by the Hamilton Jockey Club this afternoon.

The North American selling steeplechase furnished a pretty contest. Villahla, a recent arrival from Maryland, had schooled well over the course and came in for strong support.

Woodford Clay dropped Ocean Bound into a soft spot in the second race a mile and a sixteenth dash. She outclassed her company and Jockey Glass, after assuming an easy lead in the run to the first turn, took her in hand and had her under stout restraint at the finish.

The Canadian Racing Association will hold a meeting here on Friday when several matters laid over from the previous meeting will be taken up.

Florida's Beauty was lame going to the post which accounts for her poor race. Directly after the start in the Midsummer Handicap, Redwine stumbled and fell heavily.

Butte Mile Record Reduced to 1:38 1/2. Commercial Day Marked By Largest Attendance of Meeting and Record Breaking Number of Books.

Butte, Mont., August 16.—Today was Commercial Day at Butte and all the stores were closed, in consequence of which the largest throng of the meeting turned out. The special attraction of the day was a handicap at one mile, in which Endymion II. easily the best racer here, reduced the track record to 1:38 1/2.

HORSES DOING WELL AT BLUE BONNETS.

Improved Appearance Follows Summer Sojourn at Montreal Track—Preparations for Fall Meeting.

Montreal, Que., August 16.—The horses now stabled at Blue Bonnets course, which are mostly Canadian-owned, are being given a steady preparation for the fall meeting which opens on Saturday, September 9, and continues until Saturday, September 16.

ENDURANCE STAKES TO BE RUN OCTOBER 7.

Louisville, Ky., August 16.—Acting Secretary Edward Jasper has opened the track offices at Churchill Downs and with the assistance of Manager M. J. Winn has begun the preparation of the conditions of stakes for the coming fall meeting of the New Louisville Jockey Club, which begins September 25 and ends October 14.

It has been decided to run the Endurance Stakes, four miles, on Saturday, October 7, the twelfth day of the meeting.

Already trainers have begun to get the long-distance champions of their stables into condition by gallops at one and half and two mile runs.

For the first time in several seasons George J. Long has no mature horses in his string at the Downs in charge of trainer Pete Coyne.

W. H. Shelley probably will go to Mexico at the conclusion of the fall meeting at Churchill Downs, to act as presiding judge at a race meeting in November in Mexico City that Senor Alejandro de la Arena is promoting with the assistance of the Mexico Jockey Club.

JOHN W. GATES AND HIS PLUNGES.

The late John W. Gates made some of the biggest wagers ever recorded on the New York race tracks. He won many too, but there was one loser which he never forgot. At Brighton Beach four years ago there were three starters in a certain race. One of them was Charley Ellison's Yankee Girl, another A. L. Aste's Gold Lady and the third a rank selling plater named Home Again, which never had a chance. Yankee Girl had won several impressive victories and was a hot favorite at 1 to 2. Mr. Gates saw Ellison in the paddock before the race and was informed that the mare could not loose. At the same time a confidential agent told the millionaire that Aste didn't believe Gold Lady could win. So Mr. Gates went to a well-known bookmaker and wagered \$20,000 on Yankee Girl to win half that amount. Hurrying to the clubhouse Mr. Gates saw jockey Miller ride Yankee Girl to the barrier and was in rare good humor until the start was effected. Then, to his evident surprise and dismay, he saw Gold Lady rush to the front with terrific speed, while Yankee Girl, tangled up at the get-away, was unable to raise a gallop. Gold Lady led from start to finish and won in a romp. When Yankee Girl struggled home disgracefully beaten. Mr. Gates gave vent to his feelings by throwing his \$100 gold glasses to the floor, smashing them to atoms.

The plunging of Mr. Gates and the late Davy Johnson undoubtedly attracted so much attention that it was the beginning of the successful crusade against racing in the State of New York. Messrs. Gates and Johnson did not attempt to conceal their betting operations, with the result that stories were chronicled which did much harm. They appeared to enjoy the notoriety thus gained, in striking contrast to other big speculators who kept their business secret and thereby made it impossible to learn what they were doing.
