WINTER TRACKS OPEN TODAY

ALL IN READINESS FOR RACING AT JUAREZ, MEX., AND COLUMBIA, S. C.

Prospects Excellent for Successful Meetings at Both Places—Opening Program at Juarez Forecasts Sport of Exceptional Brilliancy.

Columbia, S. C., November 29.—Judging by the steady stream of arriving horsemen and followers of racing, the thirty-three-day meeting under the auspices of the Columbia Racing Association, scheduled to begin tomorrow at the State Fair Grounds, promises to be more pretentious than at first anticipated.

The plant in general is somewhat in the rough, but with continuous work everything should be in good condition by next week. The track proper is in splendid condition and is of a sand and loam mixture.

Chaotic conditions governed during the forenoon, due to the belated arrival of the special containing horses, owners, jockeys and trainers from Norfolk. For a period it threatened to delay the opening because of failure to secure entries to the different races carried for tomorrow.

During the afternoon the management concluded arrangements with Martin Nathanson, now in Chicago, to come here and serve as presiding steward. Mr. Nathanson will arrive during the next few days to assume his duties.

According to Arthur Elrod, the general manager, about ten layers will be in line the opening day and there will be an increase thereafter.

The racing here will be conducted under the rules of the Jockey Club, but licenses granted by reputable turf bodies will be recognized until the first of the year.

There are about 300 horses at the course now and the additions from Norfolk and Kentucky will bring the total to 500, which will be ample to fill the daily cards here.

Nearly every prominent rider that did not go to Juarez will be here. Today's arrivals included jockey C. Turner, who accompanied the Le Rond consignment from Norfolk. Others who came during the afternoon from Virginia included R. D. Williams, H. G. Bedwell, George Ham and Tom Shannon.

El Paso, Tex., November 29.—Tomorrow's opening gives every promise of being the most successful in the history of the Jockey Club Juarez.

The number of visitors here already surpasses by hundreds the showing of any preceding season and each train from east and west brings its quota of turf followers. The track is in excellent condition and the stand, offices, etc., have been treated to a new coat of paint.

The card for the opening day is an excellent one, horses of good class being well represented in every race.

The list of officials for the meeting is as follows: Charles F. Fricker, M. J. Wilson and J. C. Follman and C. Greenbrier County, to offer a stringent anti-betting and anti-pool-selling bill. WEST VIRGINIA STATUTE DEFECTIVE.

Court Decision Holds Anti-Poolroom Act of this Year Meaningless and Without Effect.

Charleston, W. Va., November 29.—Racetrack betting may flourish in West Virginia, without let or hindrance, unless the decision handed down by Judge L. S. Jordan, of the Criminal Court of Ohio County, is reversed by the higher courts. By his decision Judge Jordan has declared the act of the West Virginia Legislature of 1911, designed to prohibit the operation of a poolroom, meaningless and without effect. The opinion of Judge Jordan was delivered in the case of the Wheeling Turf Exchange, recently indicted for operating a poolroom.

Two poolrooms have operated in the state for several years, one at Parkersburg, on a small scale, and one at Wheeling, which does business on a scale sufficient to allow the owners to pay an annual license of \$3,000 to the city of Wheeling. Rumors that a third exchange was to be opened on a great scale at White Sulphur Springs, caused Delegate John Dice, of Greenbrier County, to offer a stringent anti-betting and anti-pool-selling bill. In amending the bill so as not to interfere with county fairs a fatal omission was made, leaving the statute meaningless. The phrase, "is sold or offered for sale," was inadvertently omitted from the bill.

When the law was passed by the Legislature, Governor Wm. E. Glascock, although opposed to racetrack betting, announced that he would not approve the bill in the form that it was presented, but he refused to veto the measure on the ground that it might have some effect in the suppression of the poolrooms in the Northern panhandle, against which the state had made a fight when several large establishments were opened within an hour's run of Pittsburgh.

ULTIMUS WINS IMPORTANT ENGLISH STAKE.

The Manchester November Handicap, the last important race of the English flat racing season, was won by A. Gorman's four-year-old bay colt Ultimus, by William the Third—Merry Misser. Fort finished second and Donez MoI third. Ultimus was favorite at 9 to 4, while 10 to 1 was laid against Fort and 100 to 7 against Donez MoI. The three placed horses were light weights, Ultimus being handicapped at 98 pounds, Fort 106 and Donez MoI at 80. The latter is an American-bred colt. The distance of the race is one and a half miles.

SUPPOSED "GOOD THING" GOES WRONG.

Miss Jonah Upsets Calculations at Norfolk by Beating Heavily Backed Troy Weight.

Norfolk, Va., November 29.—The program at the Jamestown Jockey Club's track this afternoon was made up of a series of selling races in which ordinary fields went to the post. The going was deep and heavy in spots and there were many withdrawals, the fields being materially reduced in a majority of instances. The first four races went to the favorites, while outsiders took the last two. The running of the fifth race left an unsatisfactory impression. It was not that the best horse did not win, but the fact that an unnatural price was accepted against one of the starters, while the horse that looked on form to hold his opposition safe, was neglected. In the race in question Troy Weight was made a hot favorite, being backed from 8 to 5 to 3 to 5, while Monroff receded from 6 to 5 to 2 to 1. Miss Jonah upset calculations by dashing to the front soon after the start, and drawing away into a commanding lead, won under restraint by a couple of lengths from the supposed "good thing."

Chryseis was an easy winner in the opening dash. She was ridden by Schuttlinger, who also had the mount on The Golden Buttery, winner of the third race. Chryseis found the task of beating the hot pitted against her an easy one. Schuttlinger permitted Bard of Hope to race into the lead in the early stages, but in rounding the far turn Chryseis easily assumed command and at the finish was well in hand.

Lady Rosalie flattered her backers by showing a surprising burst of speed on the backstretch in the seven-furlong maiden race. The filly rushed through her field and raced into a five lengths lead at one stage. She quit suddenly, however, in rounding the far turn, when Butwell got Brandy going, the latter wore Harlem Lass down and easily disposed of her, winning by three lengths.

The feature race, a seven-furlong selling handicap, resulted in a runaway victory for Marjorie A, which made all of the pace and won in a canter by five lengths. Capsize was the runner-up. The latter made a determined challenge while rounding the turn for home, but when he was unable to get to the leader, he quit.

Jockey M. Miles, who has been riding abroad for several seasons, was a visitor at the course this afternoon. He will remain in America until next spring, when he will return to Austria.

John F. Ryan, who built the Blue Bonnets course in Montreal and founded the Canadian National Bureau of Breeding, was also a guest of the club. Mr. Ryan is here on a wedding trip, having recently been married in Montreal. He will spend a few days visiting the Virginia stock farms before returning to Canada.

An effort is being made by the Columbia management to engage Joseph A. Murphy to go to Columbia and act as presiding judge. The deal, however, has not as yet been consummated.

John W. Pangle sold the two-year-old filly Reine Margot to Paul J. Miles this morning. Mr. Pangle recently bought the filly from R. T. Wilson.

Jockey Butwell leaves for Jacksonville tomorrow night. Butwell will put in the time until the opening of the Charleston meeting on a Florida fishing trip.

H. Burttschell sold the Cunard colt Cu Bon to S. A. Andrews this morning. The latter will ship the horse to Columbia.

IN WINTER QUARTERS AT AIKEN.

Several Formidable Racing Establishments at Winter Resort Awaiting Charleston Opening.

New York, November 29.—H. C. Hallenback's horses, in charge of trainer Frank M. Taylor, are now quartered at Harry Payne Whitney's establishment at Aiken, S. C. A more desirable wintering location could hardly be found in this country. Besides the natural advantages, the grounds are appointed in a manner to meet the requirements of the most exacting horseman.

Two tracks, one a mile on the turf and the other five furlongs over a regularly graded course, will give Mr. Taylor every opportunity to train his horses at top speed whenever the occasion requires. The nature of the soil, such that with little effort the five-furlong course can be made lightning fast and remain at the same time absolutely safe. The barn was constructed with a view to preparing horses for spring racing on the metropolitan tracks. Its length and ample shed room renders it most satisfactory during rainy spells. The late John W. Rogers handled a big collection of the Whitney horses at Aiken and captured several events of note with horses making their initial appearance after a course of training at Aiken.

The Hallenback string is indeed formidable, including as it does racers of such sterling caliber as Worth, Adams Express, Azyade, Housemaid, Stinger and Prince Gal. Others in the string include Miss Minnie, Fauntleroy, Sir Denrah, Sir Mariah and Recompense.

Several members of the string will be named for stake events to be run during the latter part of the Charleston meeting. The new course at Charleston is within four hours' ride of Aiken. The horses can be fitted at the home training grounds and sent to the track on the morning of the races.

William H. Karrick, trainer for H. K. Knapp and F. R. Hitchcock, is also located at Aiken with a string of sixteen horses.

Richard F. Carman is another turfman who is at the South Carolina winter resort. The Carman band numbers twenty-six, the majority of which will be kept in condition by open gallops so as to be ready to start at short notice when the Charleston meeting commences.

THOROUGHBRED BLOOD IS APPRECIATED.

The use of thoroughbred blood by Canadian breeders is largely responsible for the magnificent triumphs of exhibitors from this country at the New York Horse Show last week. Across the line the farmer has used the trotting stallion to good purpose in producing harness horses, but that is not the type best suited to carrying a saddle, and it is in impressing the value and affording the opportunity for the practical development of the increased use of thoroughbred blood that the Canadian Bureau of Breeding is doing a great national work. An additional credit to the successful Canadians in the military classes lies in the fact that while, with but one exception, they were volunteer officers, their American, British and continental competitors were selected from the regular cavalry and artillery services of their respective countries.—Toronto Globe.

Lieut.-Col. William Hendrie of Hamilton, Ont., who was one of the judges at the New York Horse Show, when interviewed by the New York Times, spoke highly of the showing made by the Canadians. In years gone by the Canadians had always been prominent in the jumping and hunting classes, and this year they were more successful than ever, making a clean sweep in some of the classes. The jumping and hunting classes and the military events were the most interesting features of the show, particularly the international military events in which the officers of England, Holland, Belgium, United States and Canada took part. The Canadians in their branch, said Colonel Hendrie, did extremely well, and there was a marked improvement, both in their horses and horsemanship, over the preceding year. WINNERS OF THE YEAR IN FRANCE.

The full statistics of the French flat-race season have now been published, and they disclose a very prosperous state of affairs. Two three-year-olds are at the head of the winning horses, As d'Atout having

placed the sum of \$93,925 to the credit of his owner, the Marquis de Ganay, and Alcantara II., belonging to Baron de Rothschild, has won \$81,615. Basse Pointe, the winner of the Prix du Conseil Municipal, comes third on the list with a sum of \$62,870. Of the two-year-olds, Mr. W. K. Vanderbilt's Montrose II. has done best, winning \$41,980. Other horses that have won over \$25,000 during the season are Radajoz, Combour, Faucheur, Ossian, La Francaise, Dor, Tripolette, and Sablonnet; while there are about 120 that have won over \$5,000. The following is a list of the principal winning owners, which will enable a comparison to be made in a few days with the leading English owners:

Eight other owners have each won over \$25,000 and ninety have won over \$5,000. English owners have done badly in France this year. Mr. Sol Joel heading them with a total of \$18,905. The Princess Duleep-Singh has won \$15,105; T. Baring, \$4,000, and Mr. Mansfield Clarke, \$2,200. Substantial amounts have been distributed among breeders as premiums for successful horses. The Marquis de Ganay having received \$4,900, the Baron de Rothschild \$3,350, M. Edmond Blanc \$3,050, M. E. Veil Picard \$3,500, M. A. Aumont and M. E. de St. Alary each \$2,500.

New York, November 29.—Charles Kohler's three yearlings were worked a quarter in 2:24 by trainer Samuel C. Hildreth, over a heavy track at Sheepshead Bay. The trial was impressive and indicated that the juveniles are a promising lot.
