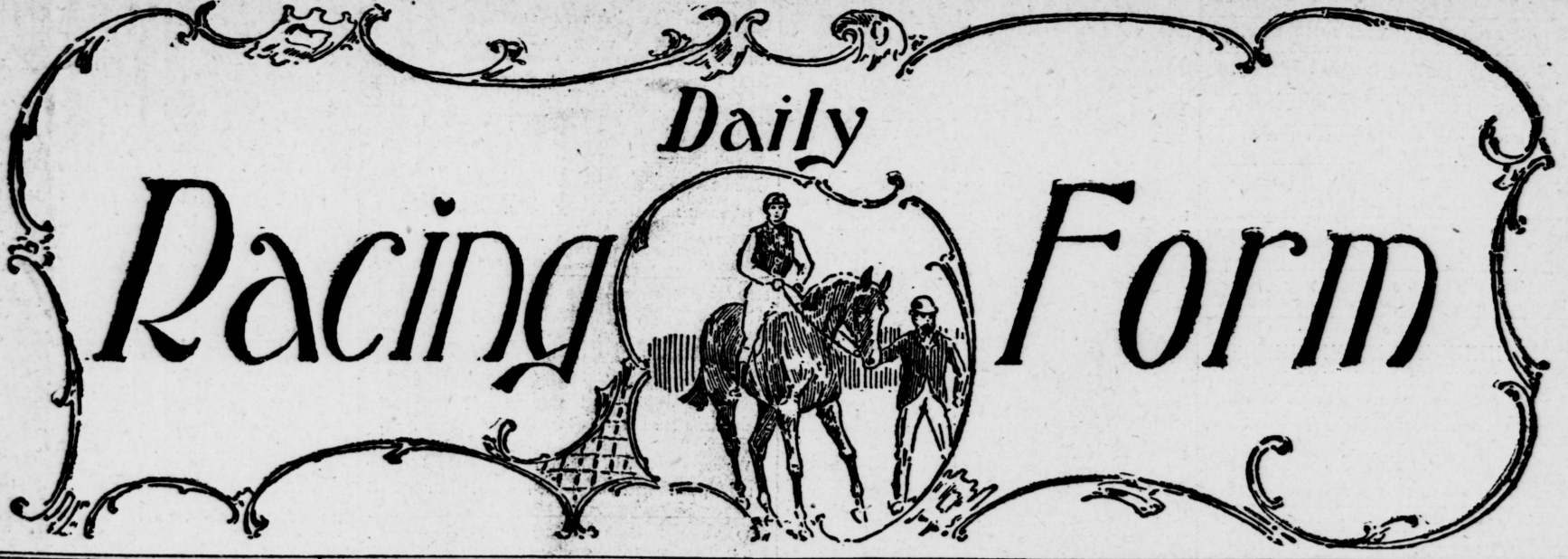

FLAMMA'S KENTUCKY OAKS

E. F. CONDRAN'S GOOD FILLY WINS CLOSING STAKE AT CHURCHILL DOWNS.

Rain Falls on Final Day of Louisville Meeting and Sloppy Going Prevails—Scratching of Solar Star Gives Forward Easy Victory.

Louisville, Ky., May 28.—The Churchill Downs meeting of fifteen days, the most successful held in Kentucky since the installation of the mutual system of betting, terminated this afternoon with the running of six races, of which the Kentucky Oaks figured most prominently. Inclement weather marred what otherwise would have been the second best day of the meeting. Considering the adverse conditions a remarkably large crowd witnessed the racing and enjoyed the sport. The volume of betting was up to the high standard that has prevailed throughout the meeting.

The rain, which began to fall copiously about noon, converted the track into a sloppy condition, and reduced the fields. The Kentucky Oaks, worth \$1,910 net to the winner, was taken by Flamma, the odds-on favorite, with Floral Day leading the others and Beautiful accounting for the small end of the purse. The going was just to Flamma's liking, and aided by a good ride from jockey Butwell, who came here from Toronto, Canada, especially to pilot her, she had little difficulty in disposing of her opposition after rounding into the stretch. Prior to the start, Flamma appeared in jeopardy, for she began slowly and was a distant trailer for the first half. When she attempted to move up on the inside on the lower turn she was caught in a jam, but got clear of interference on the last turn. The showing of Floral Day represented a vast improvement over her previous efforts.

The withdrawal of Solar Star from the fifth race on account of his inability to run well in the mud left only Foundation to offer Forward any great contention for the purse. Foundation was unequal to the task and retired after going three furlongs, leaving Forward to win as his rider pleased.

Chapultepec, supposed to dislike muddy going, roused away from a good band of sprinters that started in the third race. J. B. Respass took another purse when Voltorpe outstayed Labold in the second race. The opening dash went to Duquesne and the closing dash enabled the lightly weighted Zim to lead all the way.

General Manager Win, in commenting on the meeting which came to a close today, said: "I feel highly gratified over the results. The patronage has been exceptionally good and would have been better had not two of our biggest days, Derby day and this afternoon, been marred by inclement weather. The racing has been clean and not a mar- rying incident took place during the entire term. There was also less complaint on the score of errors in handling the mutuels than in former seasons and we hope to perfect the betting system by next fall so as to eliminate all chance of error. We intend to begin our contemplated improvements to the plant at once and it will be in thorough readiness for our fall meeting."

Jockey Butwell left tonight for Montreal, to rejoin the Whitney stable, to which he is under contract. In the event that Progress is a starter in the Latonia Derby, he will have the mount.

J. B. Respass will ship twenty-two horses to Hamilton, Ont., on Sunday next. With the same consignment will go the horses owned by G. W. Innes, and the stable of Gallaher Bros. Jockey Loftus will also go to Canada.

S. Miller Henderson, the junior member of Henderson & Hogan, who has been on the ailing list for some time, departed today for Hot Springs, Ark., where he hopes to regain his health.

J. B. Campbell will be at the Downs tomorrow to accept entries for the opening day's racing at Latonia. They will be telegraphed to the Latonia track at the usual closing time.

There was a slight difference in the show pay offered Forward in the fifth race, the \$2 bettors received a five-cent profit on their investment, while those who wagered \$5 or more profited three cents on each dollar.

Trainer W. H. Karrick claims that the weight which is said to be allotted to Sprite in the Latonia Derby is incorrect. Her weight should be 117, he avers.

About 300 racing folk departed on the Elrod special tonight for Cincinnati. All the betting paraphernalia that has been used here, and which will be used at Latonia, was taken along on the same train.

C. W. Moore, who is the owner of Mere Hill Stud, has fourteen yearlings this season, seven being colts and seven fillies. One of the fillies in his collection by Yankee and a colt by Plant, and the rest are by McGee. He has a yearling filly out of the great race mare White Plume, a brother to White Heather, a sister to Horon, a half-brother to Descomnets, and his Plaudit colt is out of Gurood, by Mirthful, the mare that is a half-sister to Gundry, Trizzer, Ruzlau, Hot Shot and Yankee Gun. Mr. Moore has twenty-two sucklings at Mere Hill Farm this spring, ten being colts and twelve fillies. They are by McGee, Deep E. F. Bassett's four-year-old bay colt Prince San by Santoi—Regime, 104 pounds, was second, and H. P. Nickalls' four-year-old brown colt, Eton Boy, by Littleton—Feistead, 111 pounds, was third. Fourteen horses foaled.

GOVERNOR DIX ON RACING REVIVAL.

Governor Dix of New York, in the course of an interview in England, where he is enjoying a vacation trip, was asked as to the revival of racing in New York. To this he replied: "There is no question that since racing was stopped the quality of horses has deteriorated because there is no demand for them. To the question 'Is it an argument for the revival of racing?' the governor cautiously replied: 'I do not care to speak on that subject; it's purely academic and one for the people to decide. More important issues are sidetracking this question.'"

RICH RACE WON BY MR. WHITNEY.

London, Eng., May 28.—At Hurst Park today, the Victoria Cup of 1,250 sovereigns for three-year-olds and over, at seven furlongs, was won by H. P. Whitney's five-year-old chestnut horse, Whisk Broom, by Broomstick—Audience, carrying 128 pounds; A. F. Bassett's four-year-old bay colt Prince San by Santoi—Regime, 104 pounds, was second, and H. P. Nickalls' four-year-old brown colt, Eton Boy, by Littleton—Feistead, 111 pounds, was third. Fourteen horses foaled.

STATISTICAL FEATURES OF LOUISVILLE'S GREAT MEETING

It is conceded that the spring meeting of the New Louisville Jockey Club which ended yesterday, was from all standpoints the most successful in the history of Kentucky racing. It embraced fifteen racing days, during which ninety races were decided and \$75,310 was distributed in stakes and purses, representing a daily average of \$5,020. In this distribution 93 owners shared, with the following 52 winners of \$450 and over:

NEW ORLEANS BILL GOES IN

MEASURE INTRODUCED FOR STATE RACING COMMISSION IN LOUISIANA.

Proposition for Re-Establishment of Racing Is to Be Voted Upon by People of Each Parish or Municipality Involved.

Baton Rouge, La., May 28.—Representative Charles F. Labarre, of New Orleans, today introduced a bill in the Legislature to create a state racing commission for Louisiana and submit the question of re-establishing racing under its direction to a majority vote of the people of any parish or municipality.

Under the provisions of the bill, no association will be allowed to conduct more than forty days of racing in any one year and not more than three associations will be granted racing rights in any one year. The months of May, June, July, August, September and October are to be entirely eliminated, except for agricultural fairs.

The commission under this bill would consist of three members appointed by the governor for a term of four years, with a secretary to receive \$1,800 per year.

LATONIA STALLS ARE FILLING.

Crack Racers Arriving for Tomorrow's Opening—Meridian and The Manager Among Arrivals.

Cincinnati, O., May 28.—John Hachmeister, manager of the Latonia Jockey Club, is all smiles over the prospects for the twenty-four-days meeting, which will begin at Latonia Thursday.

There is every indication that a big crowd will be at Latonia on Thursday and that it will be a representative one, too, for the boxes are rapidly being disposed of.

Local interest in Latonia racing never was keener and the success of the meeting seems assured. While the Latonia Derby will be the chief racing feature of the meeting, other stakes are also attracting attention. The Derby will undoubtedly be the greatest three-year-old contest of the year.

Another race that will exceed in interest any other two-year-old event run this season is also on the Latonia program. It is the Cincinnati Trophy Stakes, to which all of the star juveniles of the season are eligible. This race has generally had a bearing upon the Derbys of the following season. In this race this spring the \$12,500 Hawthorn will have another contest with Forward, which recently defeated him at Louisville. Forward, in the Trophy, will not have the advantage he had at Louisville when the son of Hastings gave him fifteen pounds.

In the list of entries for the Trophy will be found every colt and filly which has won an important stake this season, there being seventy-four nominations in the race to which the Latonia Association will add \$1,500. A handsome silver cup will also be given to the owner of the winner.

Another equine star arrived at Latonia yesterday in the Manager, a prominent candidate for the derby, and looked upon as a likely starter in the Memorial Handicap. Great things were prophesied for this colt this spring, not alone by his owner, T. C. McDowell, but by astute horsemen who were impressed by his training trials. He has failed to race up to his work. General Manager Hachmeister believes he will run to his true form at Latonia, where the track surface is firmer than at Louisville. The colt and the others of a carload that Mr. McDowell shipped from Louisville arrived in good condition.

Another Memorial Handicap candidate reached the track in Meridian, which, with M. Cambon, came from Toronto, where he ran unplaced in the Toronto Cup. Meridian is a grand-looking horse.

Among other arrivals were the horses of J. C. Mann, John Woodcap, James Ross, Jack Keene and J. Tandy Hughes, from Lexington. They were not raced during the Louisville meeting. Other arrivals were J. S. Everman with eleven horses; George Ham, with six; W. J. Young, with Manager Mack and five others; Lon Johnson, with seven; Frank Gerling, Sr., with two, and H. H. Hewitt, with four.

Worth and Hawthorn were on the track yesterday, but nothing sensational was attempted.

NOTES OF THE TURF.

Great Jubilee, which ran unplaced at Coeur d'Alene Monday, is a brother to Worth, the recent Kentucky Derby winner, but lacking the speed possessed by his noted relative.

The first stallion to win one of the Breeders' purses at Coeur d'Alene will be presented to the University of Idaho, that institution having made a request to the association for one of the animals that are given away, one each week.

The race for the fillies' half of the Prix la Societe of 30,000 francs was run at the Bois de Boulogne track in France Sunday and was won by August Belmont's Qu Elle Est Belle with Bellhouse in the saddle. There were eight starters and the matula placed thirty-five francs for ten. The same event for colts was won by Foulds Houll with M. Ephrassi's Qui second and Mr. Vanderbilt's Didius third. The jockeys on the placed horses were Wootton, Jennings and O'Neill. There were twelve starters.

The death of Dan Swigert at Lexington last Saturday marked the passing of the owners of the first five Kentucky Derby winners, Aristides, Vagrant, Baden Baden, Day Star and Lord Murphy. Mr. Swigert owned Baden Baden, which won the Derby in 1877, and he also bred Hindoo and Ben Ali, two other winners of the big race. The trainers of the first five winners, Ansel, Dudley Allen, Brown Dick, Lee Paul and George H. Rice, are also now dead at the hands of Clark, who founded the race, and B. G. Bruce, who framed the conditions, have been dead for many years.

PAWUSKA WINS FEATURE RACE AT ALAN.

Spokane, Wash., May 28.—Close finishes were the order at Alan this afternoon, and furnished entertainment for a large crowd. Favorites accounted for half the total.

The fourth race brought together a speedy band of sprinters and a hard struggle ensued between Rose Queen, Royal Tea, Pawhuska and Enfield. They turned into the stretch almost on equal terms. Pawhuska demonstrated that he is genuine by successfully standing a hard drive under severe punishment in the final eighth. Royal Tea outgamed Rose Queen for second money right at the end. Enfield, which was supported, lost all chance by bearing out in the final furlong. He finished with a rush right under the judges' stand.

Richard Reed was made favorite for the fifth, but Billy Meyer was returned the winner in a hard drive at the odds of 5 to 1. E. J. Ramsey bid up Lieut. Sawyer \$250 in one bid over his entrance price of \$300, but the horse was retained by R. J. Austin.

Selden was suspended for three days by starter Dwyer for disobeidence at the post in the first race. Jockey Gross was restored to good standing today as they could find nothing to substantiate the accusation made against him by the layers last week.
